6 <u>PROJECT NAME:</u> Broadband Training Program 7 <u>PROJECT DESCRIPTION:</u> This project will allow Mid-America Technology Center to train approximately 16 broadband technicians annually, providing our local broadband industry with qualified employees. The projected ROI is 30.8%, with \$624,000 in new earnings injected into the local economy, allowing us to meet the increased demand for qualified broadband technicians and allowing for increased access to broadband services for people living in our district. We will provide 10 months of training to approximately 16 students that will include training on fiber and wireless installation and training for CDL licensure. We will provide training to develop a workforce that can bury, hang, and service broadband infrastructure.


