## **2009 Public Participation at Board Meetings**

The board of education shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act.

The board shall make reasonable efforts to accommodate the public's right to hear the discussions and testimony presented at its meetings. The board shall make available at the meeting, for examination and copying by members of the public, at least one copy of all reproducible written material to be discussed in open session of the meeting.

The board is not required to allow citizens to speak at each meeting, but it will provide the opportunity for public participation at least four times per year. The board may make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations regarding the conduct of persons attending, speaking at, videotaping, photographing, or recording its meetings.

The board shall not require members of the public to identify themselves as a condition for admission to the meeting, nor shall such body require that the name of any member of the public be placed on the agenda prior to such meeting in order to speak about items on the agenda. However, the board may require members of the public desiring to address the board to identify themselves.

## **Ralston Board of Education Public Comment Procedures**

The Ralston Board of Education appreciates the public's right to provide public comment. It is the practice of the Ralston Board to listen to the public comment, without discussion between the public and the Board. Should you have a question or ask for follow-up from the Board, the Board President or Chair of the meeting will direct the Superintendent to address the requests and provide additional information to you as appropriate. We ask that you refrain from personal comments about individuals and the use of vulgar or inappropriate language in addressing the Board.

The following will help guide the Public Comment agenda item at Board Meetings and Public Hearings:

1. Persons speaking during Public Comment will be called forward individually by the Board President or Chair to the location identified for such purpose.
2. The board will generally allow a total of 30 minutes for the presentation of all public comments. Individuals may only speak one time per topic and must limit comments to around three (3) minutes. In the event more than 10 individuals wish to address the board, the 30 minutes will be divided equally between the number of speakers. At the discretion of the Board President or Chair, speakers may be allotted additional time.
3. Each individual speaking to the Board will be required to identify himself or herself prior to giving public comment or when related business is on the agenda. A "Record of Appearance" card is provided for this purpose.
4. Persons wishing to appear will be heard in the order in which the Board President or Chair of the meeting determines appropriate.
5. In cases where more than one person wishes to speak on the same topic, their presentations to the Board may, at the discretion of the Board President or Chair, be grouped together by topic.
6. Persons speaking to the Board during public comment may make printed materials available to the Board but may not use any other form of media.

**BOARD DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNICATION**

**Board Comments**

The Board members acknowledged Mockingbird Elementary student teacher, Ms. Maci Schott, for providing interactive presentations on her family's Native American heritage and customs to Mockingbird students. The Board congratulated the seven RHS students who received \$1,000 scholarships from the Ralston Area Chamber of Commerce. Congratulations also went out to the RMS Quiz Bowl team for placing third in the Trailblazer Conference tournament. The Board members also mentioned how they enjoyed attending the NASB State Conference and the ideas they gained from the breakout sessions

**Government Relations Update**

Mr. Joe Kohout provided information relating to the upcoming legislative session and bills our District will need to follow.

He stated some of the upcoming legislation could potentially focus on ARPA Funding, the biennial budget, vaccine mandates, and social media content. The 2022 NE Legislative Session will convene on January 5th and only be a 60-day session.

### **District Strategic Plan Update**

Dr. Adler and the RPS Administrative team conducted a discussion with the Board regarding the continued development of the District's strategic plan. The Strategic Priorities include:

- The development and execution of a short and long-term facility plan. This priority is currently 10% complete, but with the passing of the Future Ready Ralston Bond Issue, plans are underway for building upgrades, technology upgrades, and addressing safety and security needs in all buildings.
- Career and College Readiness - this priority is currently 65% complete. Plans include alignment of the 7-12 Career and Technical Education offerings, programs of study in all six career areas, and integrating Career Education awareness at the PK-6th grade level.
- Social and Emotional Support for Students – this is currently 25% complete. Over the next two years, a social-emotional (SEL) framework will be developed and piloted in our K-12 curriculum.
- Organizational Culture – this is a new strategic priority. The Cognia School Improvement Plan, and the District-wide program evaluation model, will be reviewed and updated

### **District Educational Equity Program Update**

Dr. Cecilia Wilken started the update letting the Board know the RPS Equity Survey will be sent to District families on November 30th. Students in grades sixth through twelfth grade will also take the survey during the school day. Families and students will have two weeks to complete the survey. In January, ESU #3 will then analyze the data; combine it with the data from our District audit, to create an Equity Dashboard. The dashboard will help track the data and provide information to the focus groups.

### **District Copier Proposal Review**

Mr. Jason Buckingham let the Board know the District's copier service lease is up. He reviewed the six bids received by the District from various companies. After a review of the bids and considering all parameters, a recommendation was presented to the Board that the District continues their contract with Bishop Business. Approval for the new contract will be voted on at the December meeting.

### **RPS Instructional Environment Overview**

Dr. Adler reviewed the COVID-19 Dashboard with the Board. As of November 20, there were 17 active cases in the District. The highest number of cases was in the elementary buildings with 13, there were no cases reported at RMS and four cases at RHS. There are currently no mask mandates at the secondary level, and with the low number of cases in those buildings, there is no reason to reverse that decision at this time.

### **District Bond Project Update**

The Bond Project Updates include:

- A meeting with BCDM Architects regarding the new Mockingbird design.
- Prepared advertisement for the Construction Manager at Risk.
- Waiting on delivery of Box Light devices to be cycled through the buildings.
- Bond rating meeting

- a. CM shall list a reference in the following categories (provide name, company, address, phone and relationship to the reference):
    1. Financial (bank or surety)
    2. Project of similar scope (contractual point of contact for political subdivision)
    3. Facility user of project of similar scope (such as school principal, department manager or facility manager)
- (4) The quality of performance on previous projects.
- a. The CM shall list five (5) completed projects of similar scope or budget and provide the following information for each:
    1. Project name – brief description of relevance to the project of this RFP
    2. Address
    3. Owner, contact name, title, address and phone
    4. Design Professional – firm name, contact name, address and phone
    5. Type of project delivery (CM@R, design-build, design-bid-build)
    6. Project performance
      - a) Budget-GMP compared to final cost. Provide explanation of difference in budget.
      - b) Schedule (days/months)
      - c) List 3 specific problems and how they were resolved
      - d) Claims made by owner regarding budgets, schedule or performance

- (5) The ability of the CM to perform within the time specified
  - a. Provide detailed information on the five (5) listed projects above with respect to:
    - 1. Design schedule – in working with the design professional, the proposed and actual (number of calendar days total for programming, preliminary design and final design)
    - 2. Construction schedule – proposed and actual
      - a) Date of Substantial Completion
      - b) Date of Final Completion
      - c) Post-construction warranty work required
      - d) Whether client was inconvenienced by the delivery dates of any of the services provided by the CM
- (6) The previous and existing compliance of the CM with laws relating to the contract.
  - a. Whether CM or its team have been cited for failure to comply with local, state or federal law of any nature in the last five (5) years.
    - 1. If yes, explain in detail
  - b. Whether there are any civil or criminal actions pending against the CM any proposed member of the team
    - 1. If yes, explain in detail
- (7) Such other information as may be secured having a bearing on the selection.
  - a. Subcontractors: List the work on this project you expect to subcontract
  - b. Current capacity: provide a list of your firm's and your sub-consultant's current contracted projects and the scope of those projects, including type of project, location, size, and anticipated completion date.
  - c. Any proposed changes to the contract documents or amendments required by these instructions.
  - d. Whether the CM uses a lump sum, a percentage of the Cost of the Work, or some other method for determining the CM's fee.
  - e. Include a proposed lump-sum fee, if any, for pre-construction costs.
  - f. Please note that the proposed contract (AIA A133-2019, as amended) provides that all charges, if any, for General Conditions shall be included in the CM's fee. Please list or provide a matrix for what is included in and excluded from General Conditions.
- (8) The Proposal shall state the legal name and legal status of the CM. As part of the documentation submitted with the Proposal, the CM must provide evidence of its legal authority to perform the Work in the jurisdiction where the Project is located. Each copy of the Proposal must be signed by the person or persons legally

authorized to bind the CM to a contract. A Proposal by a corporation must further name the state of incorporation.

- (9) A CM shall incur all costs associated with the preparation of its Proposal.
- (10) Interested parties may attend site walkthroughs at each of the 4 sites on December 3, 2021 starting at 9am CST. Tours will begin on site at Mockingbird Elementary 5100 S. 93<sup>rd</sup> St.

B. Proposal Submission.

- (1) Seven copies and one electronic copy on a flash drive of the Proposal and all required documents shall be delivered in a sealed opaque envelope with the CM's name, address, and telephone number clearly marked on the cover to Ralston Public Schools, Attn: Superintendent Mark Adler, 8545 Park Drive Ralston, NE 68127.
- (2) The lower left corner of the sealed envelope should read as follows: "Elementary School Facilities Improvement Project."
- (3) Proposals will be received until 12pm CST on December 22, 2021.
- (4) Any proposal received after that time and date will not be opened or considered, and will be returned to the CM.
- (5) The CM shall assume full responsibility for timely delivery at the location designated for receipt of Proposals.

C. Modification or Withdrawal of Proposals.

- (1) Prior to the date and time designated for receipt of Proposals, a CM may submit a new Proposal to replace a Proposal previously submitted, or withdraw its Proposal entirely, by notice to the Superintendent of the School District. Such notice will be received and duly recorded by the Superintendent on or before the date and time set for receipt of Proposals. The Superintendent will verify that replaced or withdrawn Proposals are removed from the other submitted Proposals and not considered. Notice of submission of a replacement Proposal or withdrawal of a Proposal shall be worded so as not to reveal the changes to the original Proposal.
- (2) Withdrawn Proposals may be resubmitted up to the date and time designated for the receipt of Proposals, provided they fully conform to these Instructions.

**6. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS.**

- A. Proposal Evaluation Criteria. The Proposal evaluation criteria and the relative weight of each criterion shall be as provided in section 3.B of the Procedures within the Policy.
- B. Selection Procedure. The selection team, selection procedure, interview process, contract negotiation process, and contract execution process shall be as provided by the Policy or as otherwise provided or allowed by law.

- C. Requests for Information. CMs that fail to respond to any request for information, whether written or verbal, may be deemed non-responsive and their Proposals may not be considered.
- D. Contact with CMs. The School District reserves the right to conduct discussions with any or all invited CMs for the purpose of clarification and modification. Discussion and negotiation may include, but is not limited to, the scope of the work, delivery schedule, and other construction matters.
- E. Disqualification of CMs. CMs may be disqualified and their proposals disregarded for reasons which include but are not limited to the following:
  - (1) The School District has reason to believe that CM has engaged in collusion.
  - (2) The CM being interested in any litigation against the School District.
  - (3) The CM is in arrears on any existing contract or has defaulted on a previous contract.
  - (4) The CM has uncompleted work which, in the judgment of the School District, will prevent or hinder the prompt completion of this construction project, if it were awarded to the CM.
  - (5) The CM has not been in the business for at least five years.
- F. Any work subcontracted by the CM is to be awarded by competitive bidding unless otherwise agreed to by the School District in writing.
- G. Rejection Proposals and Waiver of Informalities. The School District reserves the right (a) to terminate the proposal process at any time; (b) to reject any or all proposals; and (c) to waive formalities and minor irregularities in the proposals received. The School District further reserves the right to conduct a pre-award survey of any firm or individual under consideration to confirm any of the furnished information or to require other evidence of managerial, financial, technical and other capabilities, the positive establishment of which is determined by the School District to be necessary for the successful performance of the contract. The School District further reserves the right to cancel or amend the request for proposals at any time and will notify all recipients accordingly.

## **7. BONDS AND INSURANCE.**

- A. To secure the faithful performance of the work and to satisfy all of CM's payment obligations that arise on the project, the successful CM will be required to provide a payment bond in an amount not less than 100% of the Contract Sum through a corporate surety company, conditioned for the payment of all laborers and mechanics for labor that is performed and for the payment for material and equipment rental which is actually used or rented in the performance of the Contract.
- B. The successful CM will also be required to provide a performance bond in an amount not less than 100% of the Contract Sum through a corporate surety company.

- C. The Contractor shall procure and maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance, Employers' Liability Insurance, Business Automobile Liability Insurance, Commercial General Liability Insurance, and any other insurance and in the amounts required by law or the Contract Documents.
- D. Time of Delivery and Form of Bonds.
  - (1) The CM must deliver the required bonds to the School District Owner within one week of the Construction Manager's execution of the Agreement and the GMP, whichever is later. If the Work is to commence sooner in response to a letter of intent, the CM must, prior to commencement of the Work, submit evidence satisfactory to the School District that such bonds will be furnished and delivered as required by these Instructions.
  - (2) The bonds shall be written on AIA Document A312, Performance Bond and Payment Bond, as amended. Copies of the sample bond forms are included with this RFP.
  - (3) The bonds shall be dated on or after the date of the Contract.
  - (4) The CM shall require the attorney-in-fact who executes the required bonds on behalf of the surety to affix to the bond a certified and current copy of the power of attorney.

**8. REQUIREMENT OF WRITTEN CONTRACT.** The terms and conditions of the contract shall be as provided in the **attached** AIA A133-2019, AIA A133-2019 Exhibit A (GMP Amendment), AIA A133-2019 Exhibit B (Insurance and Bonds), and A201-2017, each as amended by the School District. Any proposed changes or modifications to the Contract Documents (other than insertions into contract blanks) must be presented in the Proposal and will be taken into account during the selection process. Any CM who fails to submit any such changes or modifications with its Proposal waives the right to request changes in the Contract Documents after the Proposal award.

**9. POST-BID INFORMATION.**

- A. After notification of selection for the award of the Contract, the CM shall, as soon as practicable or as stipulated in the Proposal Documents, submit in writing to the School District:
  - (1) A designation of the Work to be performed with the CM's own forces;
  - (2) Names of the principal products and systems proposed for the Work and the manufacturers and suppliers of each; and
  - (3) Names of persons or entities (including those who are to furnish materials or equipment fabricated to a special design) proposed for the principal portions of the Work.
- B. The CM will be required to establish to the satisfaction of the Architect and/or School District the reliability and responsibility of the persons or entities proposed to furnish and perform the Work described in the Proposal Documents.
- C. Prior to the execution of the Contract, the Architect or School District will notify the CM if either the School District or Architect, after due

investigation, has reasonable objection to a person or entity proposed by the CM. If the School District or Architect has reasonable objection to a proposed person or entity, the CM may, at the CM's option, withdraw the Bid or submit an acceptable substitute person or entity. The CM may also submit any required adjustment in the Base Bid or Alternate Bid to account for the difference in cost occasioned by such substitution. The School District may accept the adjusted bid price or disqualify the CM. In the event of either withdrawal or disqualification, bid security will not be forfeited.

- D. Persons and entities proposed by the CM and to whom the School District and Architect have made no reasonable objection must be used on the Work for which they were proposed and shall not be changed except with the written consent of the School District and Architect.

- 10. ## NASB POSITIONS ENCLOSED

The Nebraska Association of School Boards is the only state organization created by school board members to represent the interests of school board members. Your Association's legislative agenda is initiated each year with the submission of local board proposals. The NASB Legislation Committee reviews all proposals, and then submits its recommendations to the NASB Board of Directors. The Board can then review and amend the submissions before presenting them to the NASB Delegate Assembly. The Delegate Assembly gives each member school district a voice in shaping the agenda of NASB. This publication represents the final agenda, set by the Delegate Assembly, for the 2020 Legislative Session. Standing Positions remain in effect until they are repealed by the Assembly. Legislative Resolutions are in effect for one year only.

## WHAT DOES THIS REPRESENT?

The statements you read inside the pages of this book represent a set of belief statements which guide NASB's government relations efforts. These words guide our lobbying efforts at the State Capitol, with the State Board of Education and NDE, as well as with our representatives in Washington, D.C. While this work represents an effort to describe an issue or condition to be addressed, rarely is a bill written in such plain language. Actual legislative bills are a blend of several ideas (or perhaps a good idea, and a substantial price tag). Hence, when NASB analyzes how we will testify on a bill, we take into account a number of factors, including regular reviews by the Legislation Committee which offer guidance on the course corrections necessary to navigate the turbulent amendment process.

## BELIEF STATEMENTS FOR AN EFFECTIVE BOARD

### S-1 — BOARD DEVELOPMENT

NASB encourages boards of education to take part in board in-service and development programs and to budget funds for such programs. (1995)

### S-2 — BOARD RECOGNITION

NASB believes the service of school boardsmanship is fundamental to participatory democracy and deserves recognition collectively and individually from state and local communities. (prior to 1995)

### S-3 — BUSINESS AND EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

NASB encourages boards of education to develop mutually beneficial partnerships with business to ensure mutual understanding and cooperation. (1995)

### S-4 — COLLABORATIVE SERVICES TO YOUTH

NASB urges collaborative linkages between schools and other public and private agencies that serve children. (prior to 1995)

### S-5 — LEADERSHIP TEAM

NASB believes that each board of education should create an administrative leadership team, which should include all supervisory and managerial employees including the superintendent and board members. (prior to 1995, amended 2007)

### S-6 — PARENT INVOLVEMENT

NASB urges boards of education to support partnerships between parents and schools that encourage parent involvement in the education process. (1997)

### S-7 — POLICY

NASB considers it imperative that boards of education adopt clearly defined, flexible policies after input from the administration, parents, employees, and other interested parties. Policies, based on a clear understanding of the education process, should be thoroughly reviewed annually. The execution of policy is the responsibility of professional administrators and staff. (prior to 1995)

## CONDITIONS OF CHILDREN

### S-8 — ABUSE OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, & OTHER DRUGS

NASB supports efforts by boards of education and state and national officials to strictly enforce policies regarding the sale, use or possession of illegal drugs including methamphetamine, marijuana, THC products and synthetic equivalents of THC and marijuana, alcohol, tobacco, nicotine products, vapor products (including e-cigarettes), and any products intended by appearance or effect to replicate tobacco products on school property. The designation of “drug free zones” near schools is also urged. (prior to 1995, amended 2015)

### S-9 — AT-RISK STUDENTS AND THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP

NASB recognizes that there are many children and youth who are experiencing special difficulties in achieving high education standards. NASB supports increased funding to help close the gap in educational opportunity and educational achievement, and urges boards of education to work with, and obtain increased funding from the state Legislature, as well as state and federal education agencies to assist at-risk children and youth in making adequate educational progress. (prior to 1995, amended 2009)

## CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

### S-10 — EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

NASB supports quality early childhood education programs accessible to all children and advocates programs that provide age-appropriate activities to prepare children for school. (prior to 1995)

### S-11 — ENROLLMENT OPTION; HOMEBOUND STUDENTS

NASB supports legislation stating that when an option student becomes homebound, the school district in which the student resides assumes full responsibility for educating the student. (1998, amended 2016)

### S-12 — ENROLLMENT OPTION LIMITATION

NASB supports legislation returning option students to the resident school district if the option district must contract with another school district or agency for the educational services needed by the student. (1996, amended 2016)

### S-13 — LIABILITY FOR MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION

NASB supports legislation that would limit the liability of a school district and school district representatives for the administering of prescription medication to students. (1999, amended 2013, 2016)

### S-14 — NUTRITION EDUCATION/STUDENT WELLNESS

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO SELECT THE  
CONSTRUCTION MANAGER AT RISK CONTRACT DELIVERY SYSTEM**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("Board") for **Douglas County School District No. 28-0054**, commonly known as **Ralston Public Schools** (the "School District") believes it is in the School District's best interest to use the construction manager at risk contract delivery system under the *Nebraska Political Subdivisions Construction Alternatives Act*, NEB. REV. STAT. §§ 13-2901 to 13-2914 (the "Act") to complete an **Elementary School Facilities Improvement Project**, including without limitation construction of a new elementary school building at the Mockingbird Elementary site; addition, remodel, reconstruction, and/or modification of the elementary school buildings at each of the Meadows Elementary, Wildewood Elementary, and Blumfield Elementary sites; site improvements at each location identified above; and demolition of the existing elementary school building at the Mockingbird Elementary site (the "Project").

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Board previously adopted Policy 3042 on "Construction Management at Risk Contracts."

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Board assigns the following percentage of total points for evaluation of proposals:

<b>Criteria</b>	<b>Weight</b>
Financial resources of the construction manager to complete the project (maximum of 10%)	10%
Ability of the proposed personnel of the construction manager to perform (maximum of 30%)	15%
Character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience, and efficiency of the construction manager (maximum of 30%)	20%
Quality of performance on previous projects (maximum of 30%)	20%
Ability of the construction manager to perform within the time specified (maximum of 30%)	15%
Previous and existing compliance of the construction manager with laws relating to the contract (maximum of 10%)	10%
Such other information as may be secured having a bearing on the selection (maximum of 20%)	10%
<b>Total</b> (must equal 100%)	<b>100%</b>

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby selects the construction manager at risk contract delivery system to complete the Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the School District's administration to prepare a request for proposals and publish notice of the same in a newspaper of general circulation within the School District and file it with the Nebraska Department of Education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby authorizes, empowers, and directs the School District's administration to take all actions necessary to comply with the terms of the Act in proceeding with the construction manager at risk contract delivery system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are designated as members of the Construction Manager at Risk Selection Committee:

- (1) Member(s) of the school board: Liz Kumru and Samantha Willey.
- (2) Member(s) of the school administration or staff: Superintendent Mark Adler, Assistant Superintendent Jason Buckingham.
- (3) The school's architect or engineer: Pat Carson, AIA, BCDM Architects.
- (4) Individual(s) having special expertise relevant to selection of a construction manager under the Act: Pat O'Brien
- (5) A resident of the school district other than an individual included in subdivisions (1) through (4): Nicholas Warner.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all proposals received in response to the request for proposals are hereby referred to the Construction Manager at Risk Selection Committee.

## **Calendar Feedback 2022-2023 & 2023-2024 Calendars**

We had 117 responses, with 69% being parents, 35% being staff, and 0.9% students.

### Feedback on the 2022-2023 and the 2023-2024 Calendars:

- The start date was split between just right and too early, with a slight majority saying it was just fine.
- Thanksgiving Break and Spring Break were just right.
- Winter Break was more split between just right and too short, with a slight majority saying it was fine.
- Most responses indicated that the end date was just right/fine where it is.
- Most responses indicated the quarters were even.
- There was a large range within our staff responses regarding the Collaborative Planning Day. Responses were a combination of indifference, within, and after the year ended.
- In the comment portion, a high number of responses from families and teachers noted that students ending on a Monday (versus the Friday prior) was not ideal.

### Updates:

- Switched out the Collaborative Planning Day originally slated for after Spring Break to be a student day. Switched out the last school day to being a Collaborative Planning Day in which only teachers report. This will make it so we can have students end on a Friday and make it so we do not have to shorten Winter Break.

# The “Why” of *Home Visits*

## Purpose:

Home visits **establish a positive relationship** between students/families and RPS staff. This visit provides an opportunity for the family **to meet** RPS staff members **prior to the start** of a new school year. This helps to **foster a sense of teamwork** with the students, parents, and RPS staff.

## Focus:

The focus is on the STUDENT. Staff may **ask questions** focusing on getting to know the student prior to the start of the school year. Questions may include likes, interests, talents, activities, summer vacations, etc. Our goal is to **make connections** with students and let them know they are important.

# What is a *Home Visit*?

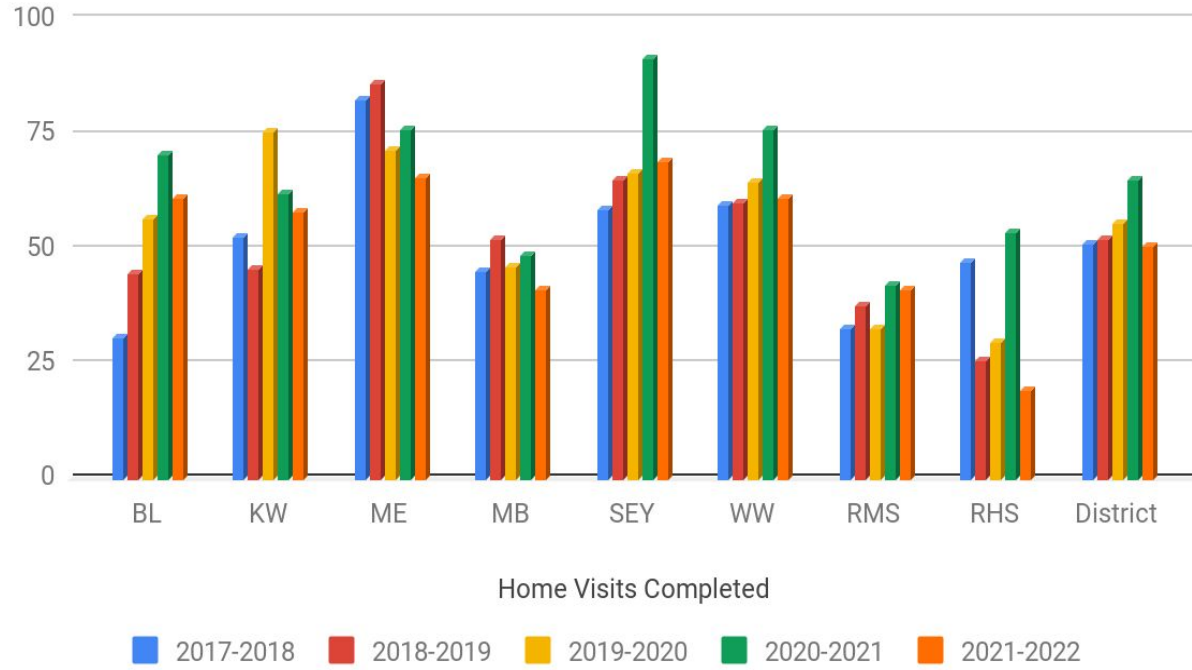
- Informal face to face visit that lasts around 10-20 minutes

- Provide a video introduction to families that we are not able to connect with

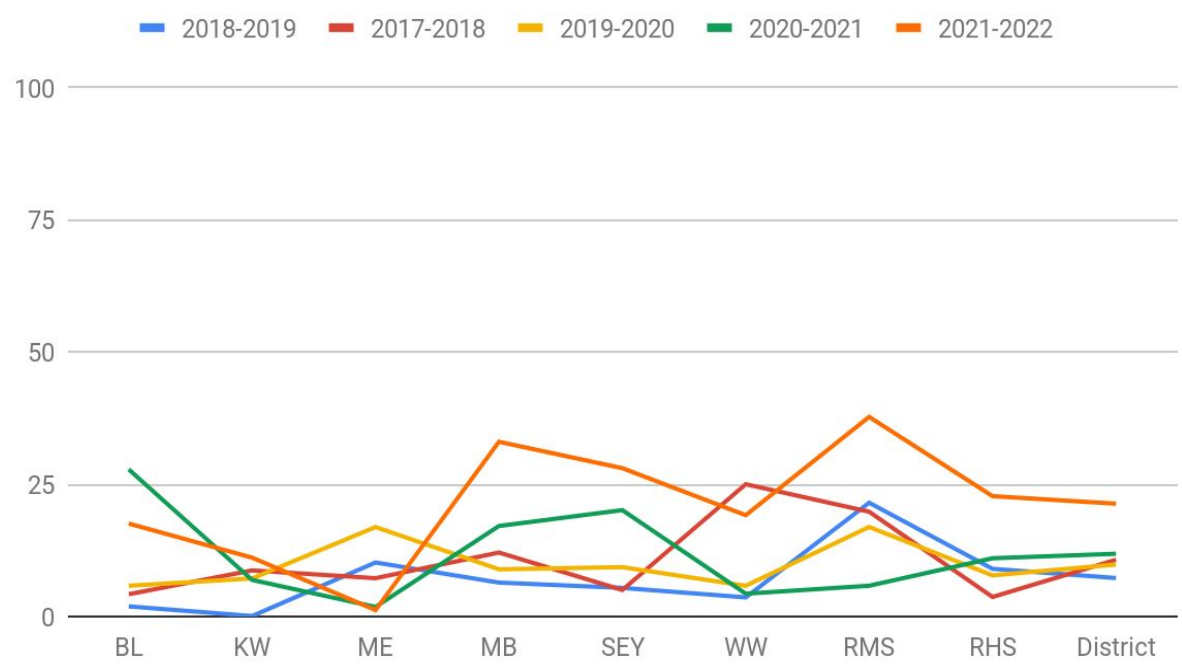

## % of Home Visits Completed at the Home

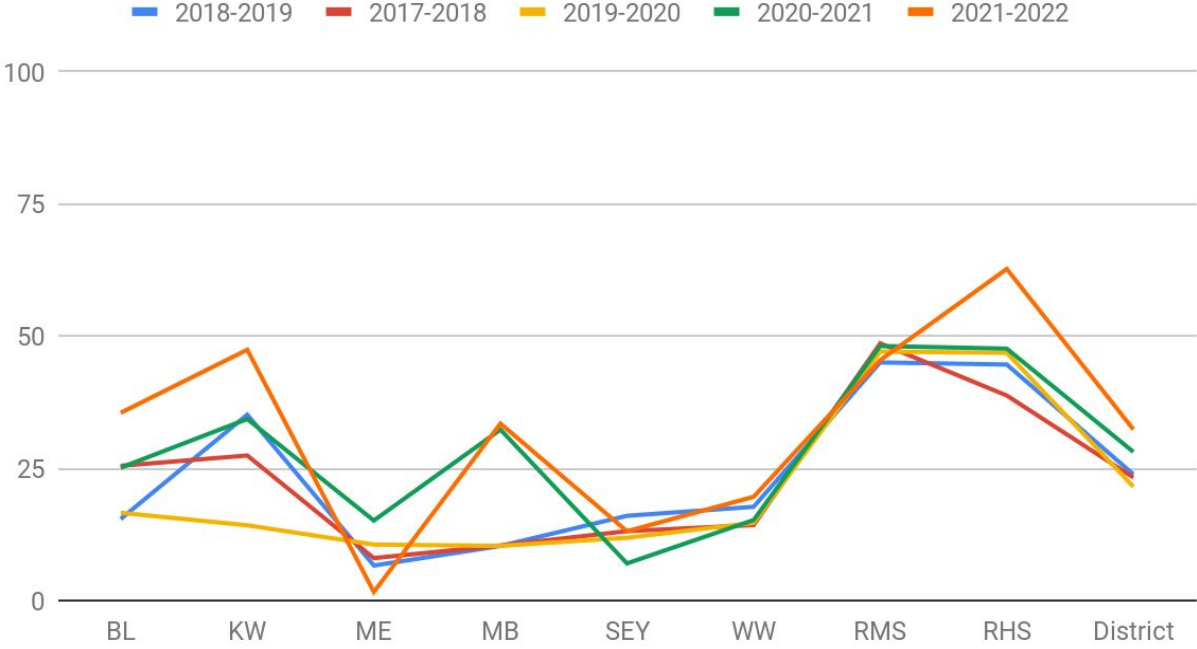


COVID Adaptation:

% Participated in an Alternate Method

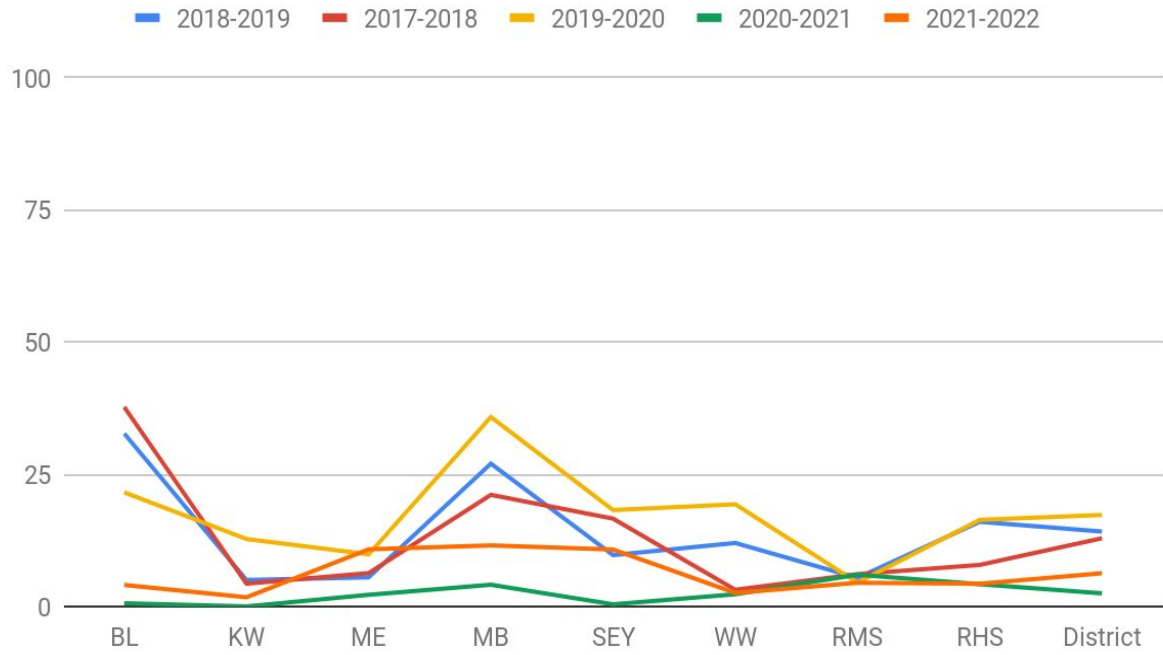


# % Attempted 2+ Times to Contact



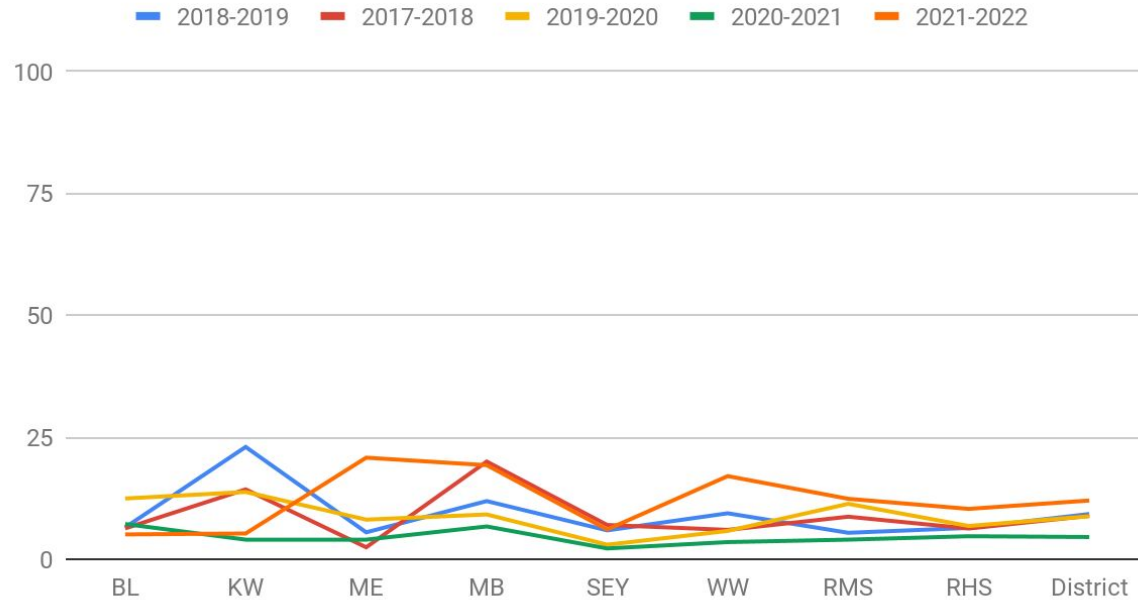
COVID Adaptation:
