A CONCERN FOR ALL LEVELS

Youth athletes may also face mental health risks from repeated traumatic brain injuries

On July 28, 2025, 27-year-old gunman Shane Tamura entered a New York City office building that is home to the National Football League's headquarters. He shot and killed four people and injured one other before killing himself.

In a note found in his wallet, he claimed he had chronic traumatic encephalopathy, or CTE, a degenerative brain condition believed to develop from repeated traumatic brain injuries. He asked experts to study his brain.

CTE has received much attention over the past two decades as multiple NFL players have been diagnosed with the condition after their deaths. The 2015 movie "Concussion," about a forensic pathologist named Dr. Bennet Omalu who documented the first case of CTE in an NFL player, also highlighted the issue.

The gunman in the New York City shooting played high school football, but he did not play professionally. It is not known whether he had CTE.

I'm a clinical psychologist who studies mental health issues and their relationship to physical illness. Although people generally associate CTE with professional athletes, a growing body of research, including my own work, shows that adolescents and young adult athletes experience traumatic brain injuries that can have both short-term and long-term effects on mental health. In my view, young players and their families, as well as coaches, should pay attention to these emerging risks.

From traumatic brain injuries to CTE

At least 55 million people worldwide are thought to experience a traumatic brain injury each year. The actual number may be higher, as many brain injuries are never diagnosed or treated.

Some people with a brain injury recover quickly. Others do not. Over half of people with a brain injury reported mental health symptoms one year later. These include difficulties concentrating, memory problems and irritability, as well as physical concerns such as recurrent headaches and difficulties with balance. Many people who sustain a traumatic brain injury also report difficulties with anxiety, depression and substance misuse as they are recovering. Some report thoughts about ending their lives or suicide attempts.

Although the link between traumatic brain injuries and CTE is still being studied, many experts believe that the condition is caused not by a single, severe blow to the head but by repeated trauma to the head over time.

It is not uncommon for former competitive athletes across a range of contact sports to believe they may have CTE — not only because they remember the injuries or being diagnosed with a concussion, but also because they experience many of the cognitive symptoms that affect people with traumatic brain injuries and sometimes misuse alcohol, pain medications or other substances to cope with them.

However, there's no way for someone

to get a diagnosis for the condition while they are experiencing these symptoms. There is currently no test for CTE. Doctors generally diagnose it after an autopsy.

Repeated brain injuries in youth sports

The focus on CTE has brought greater interest in the effects of traumatic brain injuries in general. Such injuries are common not only in professional athletes but also in adolescents and young adults who play sports. They are seen frequently in military veterans as well.

In a study published in March 2025, my colleagues and I assessed more than 500 varsity and club sport athletes. We found that 75% said they had experienced a head injury before starting college. Almost 40% reported being diagnosed with at least one concussion, and just over half of those athletes experienced a loss of consciousness.

We also found that student athletes who had experienced head injuries were much more likely to be diagnosed with at least one psychiatric disorder in their lifetime. They were more likely to drink alcohol excessively and have a substance use disorder in their history. Greater symptoms of an alcohol use disorder were associated with having their first head injury at an earlier age, as well as having more head injuries, diagnosed concussions and losing consciousness from those injuries.

These troubling observations highlight the often overlooked mental health effects of head injuries in adolescents and young adults. Our study aligns with others that have found a relationship between sports-related traumatic brain injuries and mental-related symptoms — and it is among the first to look not only at self-reported symptoms but also at formal psychiatric di-

agnoses.

How exactly these cases might relate to CTE is unknown, but there are hints of a link: Researchers examining the records of 152 former contact sport athletes who died before age 30 identified signs of CTE in the brains of 40% of them.

Family members described mental health symptoms in the majority of them, and alcohol and substance misuse were reported in approximately one-third.

Increasing safeguards for brain health in young athletes

While head injuries in youth sports were once met with a shrug, youth sports leagues are increasingly paying attention to the issue.

Studies suggest that limiting the amount of physical contact in preseason training or between games can reduce young players' head injury risks. Coaches of contact sports such as football and soccer often receive training on identifying the signs and symptoms of head injuries and are given strategies to manage them.

Athletic trainers, routinely available at many high school sporting events, are involved in sporting events for younger children as well. As first responders to athletic injuries, they are trained to assess symptoms of head injuries and can provide guidance, as part of a medical team, on when an athlete can return to play. Athletic trainers also may be well positioned to observe some of the mental health symptoms commonly seen after head injuries.

Following a head injury, parents and guardians should also keep an eye on their athlete. Changes in mood or behavior after a head injury warrant a referral to a neurologist or mental health professional for additional assessment and treatment.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 28 TO ENACT ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR MOBILE VENDORS INCLUDING FOOD TRUCKS; TO PROVIDE FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THIS ORDINANCE.

ORDINANCE NO. 2398

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 28 TO ENACT ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR MOBILE VENDORS INCLUDING FOOD TRUCKS; TO PROVIDE FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YORK, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Chapter 28 shall be amended as follows:

Chapter 28

MOBILE VENDORS, PEDDLERS AND PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

1. Sec. 28-1 MOBILE VENDORS; DEFINITIONS; PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.

A. "Mobile Vendor" means any person, firm, organization, or corporation that sells, offers for sale, or solicits orders for the sale of food, beverages, goods, wares, merchandise, or services from a mobile unit or conveyance, including but not limited to motor vehicles, trailers or other movable structures, that is not permanently affixed to real property and is capable of being moved from place to place.

This term includes, but is not limited to, food trucks, ice cream trucks and mobile retail vendors, whether stationary for a limited period or traveling from place to place.

The term does not include:

- delivery services making deliveries to customers who previously ordered goods,
- persons acting under a special event permit issued by the City,
- vendors at a farmers market,
- vendors operating exclusively on private property with the consent of the property owner and not engaging in sales to the general public,
- vendors authorized by any other public entity.
- Solicitations, sales or distributions made by charitable, educational or religious organizations.

B. An application in writing shall be filed with the City Clerk for a mobile vendor permit prior to the sale of any item or food sold out of any vehicle, cart or stand on public or private property within the city limits. The application shall provide the following information:

- Personal information including business name, address, phone, email, etc.
- Vehicle license number(s), description(s) for all vehicles that will be used to sell the items/food and names of individual(s) expected to drive the vehicle(s).
- Description of the location of where the vender will be doing business.
- If selling food, documentation of Temporary Food Establishment Permit or Mobile Food Unit Permit issued by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture - Food Safety & Consumer Protection.
- Copy of sales tax permit.
- Proof of liability insurance.
- Special liquor license (if applicable).
- Written permission as required in Section G (if applicable).

C. The City Clerk, upon review of the application with the police department and any other appropriate department or agency, shall determine whether a license will be issued to the applicant. In making his/her decision, the Clerk shall consider the following factors:

- All information required has been provided and the application is complete;
- The required fee is paid;
- The application is in conformance with the municipal code;
- The applicant has not been convicted of two or more separate violations of the provisions of the code within twelve (12) months preceding application submittal.

D. Upon the City Clerk deciding the factors have been satisfied by the applicant, a license shall be issued upon payment of the fee provided in section K in advance. Said permit and, if selling food, either their Temporary Food Establishment Permit or Mobile Food Unit Permit issued by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture - Food Safety & Consumer Protection shall be exhibited on the vendor's vehicle or trailer at all times during operation within the city limits. The vendor's proof of a State of Nebraska sales tax permit or proof of tax exemption shall also be available upon request of any city official or customer.

E. The City shall revoke any and all permits based on fraud or misrepresentation in the original application or related to the selling of items/food, any violation of municipal code, etc. Upon revocation, the vendor shall not be allowed to reapply for a permit for a period of thirty (30) days for the first offense and twelve (12) months for a second offense.

F. Reporting sales tax is the responsibility of each permit holder and must be accomplished by the normal channels used to pay the State of Nebraska. Vendors must include York in the location section of the Nebraska Department of Revenue form.

G. Permit holders are prohibited from conducting business within fifty (50) feet of the main entrance used by customers to enter/exit a permanent business during the establishment's normal business hours. Exceptions can be made if the vendor provides the city with documentation showing that he/she has written permission from the permanent business owner to locate closer than fifty (50) feet.

H. Parking of mobile trucks:

- An approved mobile vendor may do business from a location in a city right-of-way that is open to traffic only where motor vehicles are allowed to park by law, signage or permit. Parking in prohibited places or blocking access to designated handicap parking areas unless such area is closed for a special event is not permitted.
- Mobile vendors are restricted from parking within twenty-five (25) feet of the corner of a block.
- Vendors shall be responsible for their own electricity.
- Mobile vendors shall only be allowed to remain parked in a parking site for eight hours at a time unless the street is closed for a special event. In cases of a special event, the vendor may remain from two hours prior to the special event until two hours after.
- All items/food shall be sold to customers on the sidewalk so that customers are not waited on or served while standing on any portion of the street unless the street is closed for a special event.
- The vendor shall provide trash receptacles sufficient to serve the customers and shall be required to pick up and dispose of any trash, litter, etc. within twenty (20) feet of their vehicle or trailer.
- The public works or police department shall have the authority to order a mobile vendor to move from or leave a specific location if the operation at that location causes an obstruction to vehicular or pedestrian traffic, violates any section of the municipal code (including noise), or otherwise endangers the health, safety, or welfare of the public. Should the vendor fail to refuse to move, the City shall move or tow the vendor's vehicle to another location.

I. No alcoholic beverages shall be sold unless there is a street closure and the vendor has a special liquor license for the event.

J. Any vendor who requests an exception to the rules outlined herein, or who wishes to appeal from the denial of a permit by the City Clerk, shall make a

written request to the city council and attend the council meeting in which the council reviews the request or appeal.

K. Fees.

Before any permit shall be issued under the provisions of this division the applicant shall pay a fee, based upon the period the applicant desires to engage in business in the city as follows:

- (1) Per day: \$5.00
- (2) Per week: \$10.00
- (3) Per month: \$25.00
- (4) Per year: \$100.00

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication pursuant to law.

Section 4. Penalty. Any violations of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty as provided by section 1-9 of this Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YORK, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Chapter 54 Utilities, Article II, Rates and Charges Generally, be amended as follows:

There shall be a combined charge of sixty-seven dollars (\$67.00) for connection and disconnection for the installation of a meter for withdrawal of water from a hydrant additional to the water consumed, computed at the bi-monthly rate (see subsection (a)). There shall be a charge of five dollars and ninety cents (\$5.90) per one thousand (1,000) gallons for water withdrawn at the plant.
- (d) A flat rate of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month will be levied against all unmetered construction site water services connected to the city water distribution system.

The balance of said Chapter to remain unchanged.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage and publication as required by law.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
