BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Policy DC (LOCAL) states: "The Superintendent has sole authority to make recommendations to the Board regarding the selection of contractual personnel in the following categories: central office administrator from the director level and above and campus administrator, including principals and assistant principals." Final authority for employment of contractual personnel in these categories shall be retained by the Board.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

ACTION ITEM

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

HB 3908 (88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2023) known as Tucker’s Law adds new TEC, 38.040, which requires each school district to annually provide to students in grades 6-12 research-based instruction on fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness. The required instruction in fentanyl prevention and drug poisoning awareness must include the following:

- Suicide prevention
- Prevention of the abuse and addiction to fentanyl
- Awareness of local school and community resources and any processes involved in accessing those resources
- Health education that includes information about substance use and abuse, including youth substance use and abuse.

HB 3908 also adds to the duties of a school health advisory council (SHAC) the requirements to recommend to the local board of trustees the curriculum for instruction in the dangers of opioids, including addiction to and abuse of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl.

The Safe and Healthy Schools standing committee led SHAC’s review and recommendation process which included: reviewing the requirements of Tucker’s Law, reviewing the current health Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) associated with Tucker’s Law, considering input from Guidance Services Department on topics required by Tucker’s Law that are currently addressed in guidance lessons, reviewing potential instructional materials for use both in the classroom and supplementally, and gathering support of the full SHAC before making a recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

SHAC CONSIDERATION

Per the requirements set forth in Tucker’s Law, the NEISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) brings forth their recommendation for curriculum and instructional resources for use in the District’s required annual instruction in fentanyl prevention and drug poisoning awareness, including suicide prevention, prevention of abuse and addiction to fentanyl, awareness of local school and community resources and any processes involved in accessing those resources, and health education that includes information about substance use and abuse, including youth substance use and abuse for students in grades 6 - 12 which was approved by the full SHAC on February 14, 2024 by a vote of 22 - 6.

SHAC RECOMMENDATION

The SHAC brings forth to the Board of Trustees its recommendation for materials to be used for fentanyl prevention and drug poisoning awareness annual instruction in grades 6 - 12.

ACTION ITEM

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Board Policy EHAA (Legal) specifies, “*The SHAC shall consider and make policy recommendations to the district concerning the importance of daily recess for elementary school students. The SHAC must consider research regarding unstructured and undirected play, academic and social development, and the health benefits of daily recess in making the recommendations. The SHAC shall ensure that local community values are reflected in any policy recommendation made to the district concerning the importance of daily recess for elementary school students. Education Code 28.004(l)*”

Board Policy FFA (Local) directs the SHAC... “*on behalf of the District, shall review and consider evidence-based strategies and techniques and shall develop nutrition guidelines and wellness goals as required by law...the SHAC shall develop a wellness plan to implement the District’s nutrition guidelines and wellness goals... the SHAC shall review and revise the plan on a regular basis and recommend revisions to the wellness policy when necessary.*”

SHAC CONSIDERATION

As part of the duties specified in EHAA (Legal) and FFA (Local), the Fitness & Physical Activity Standing Committee of the SHAC reviewed research on the importance and health benefits of daily, unstructured play (recess) for elementary students, studied policies from other districts, and met with District leaders and campus principals to create a recommendation. This recommendation was approved by the full SHAC on February 14, 2024, by a vote of 26 - 2.

SHAC RECOMMENDATION

Per the requirements of EHAA (Legal) and FFA (Local), the SHAC brings forth a recommendation for the Board of Trustees to request a recess policy based on their recommendation that:

All elementary schools will offer a minimum 30 minutes of outdoor (per district guidelines) unstructured play breaks (a.k.a: “recess”) each day, split into at least two separate periods, throughout the school year.

Schools that choose to have a lunch recess are encouraged to schedule the recess before lunch because it can increase nutrient intake and reduce food waste.

Outdoor unstructured play breaks should be a minimum of 10 minutes long, not including transitions, to allow for adequate time for students to become engaged in play mentally, socially, and physically.

Recess cannot be used for behavioral punishment, study hall, or tutoring.

ACTION ITEM

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In January 2022, the NEISD Board of Trustees adopted a resolution requesting the NEISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) convene for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations regarding the district’s instruction in Human Sexuality and Abstinence Education (HSAE) and the prevention of child abuse, family violence, dating violence, and sex trafficking (collectively referred to as abuse/violence prevention). The Classroom Health and Sex Ed (CHaSE) standing committee led SHAC’s review and recommendation process for materials to be used for instruction in the elementary health Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) related to anatomy, puberty, and reproduction (maturation). This process included reviewing all laws pertaining to HSAE instruction; reviewing the current health TEKS associated with elementary maturation; reviewing potential instructional materials; holding two public meetings; providing parents and other community members the opportunity to review all materials and provide feedback; considering the input from academic experts and District employees; and gathering support of the full SHAC before making a final recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

A detailed evaluation process was used to complete the review and recommendation of the elementary maturation curriculum and instructional materials which was guided by Board policies EHAA (Legal), EHAA (Local), and EF (Local). SHAC meetings and standing committee work sessions were conducted under the requirements as set forth in BDF (Legal), BDF (Local), EHAA (Legal), and the NEISD SHAC bylaws.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

The Administrative Staff brings forth to the Board of Trustees the recommendation to adopt the elementary HSAE supplemental instructional materials for 4th and 5th grade students as presented by the 2023 SHAC, and certify that all 4th and 5th grade students who have opted in will be provided with instruction that complies with Texas law and covers 100% of the health TEKS related to anatomy, puberty, and reproduction (maturation).

ACTION ITEM

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Senate Bill 6 from the 82nd Texas Legislature, First Called Session, 2011, created an instructional materials allotment for the purchase of instructional materials, technological equipment, and technology-related services during an adoption cycle. The State Board of Education (SBOE) creates an adoption cycle for curriculum subject areas, which they declare in a Proclamation. EFA (Legal) guides the review and selection process.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

Proclamation 2024 called for the review and adoption of K – 12 Science Instructional Materials. District Instructional Material Review Committees convened in May 2023 through February 2024 to evaluate the resources available through an extensive and detailed evaluation process. On February 23, 2024, our district committees provided their recommendation for each resource. Our district committees considered general education, bilingual, and special education teachers, as well as instructional specialists and support staff who work with K – 12 science content areas at the campus level.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

The Administrative Staff recommends the Board of Trustees approve the 2024 Proclamation Instructional Materials purchases for the K - 12 Science adoption as presented by the 2024 District level Instructional Materials Committees and certify that all students will be provided with instructional materials that cover 100% of the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On December 11, 2023, the NEISD Board of Trustees approved the use of private leagues or clubs that provide structured activities as defined by 19 TAC 103.1003 as a substitution for physical activity for middle school students. The Agencies included on the Recommended Agency List have completed NEISD's rigorous application process to ensure their activities meet the following minimum requirements:

- The activity is based on the grade appropriate movement, physical activity and health, and social development strands of the essential knowledge and skills for physical education; and
- The activity is organized and monitored by appropriately trained instructors who are part of a program that has been certified by the board.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

Middle school students approved to participate in the Off Campus Physical Activity (OCPA) program are provided the opportunity to continue competing in Olympic-level activities not offered by the district as part of the regular school day. These agencies have completed the rigorous application process to demonstrate that their facility and instructors are of exceptional quality and the activities provided are based on the grade appropriate movement, physical activity and health, and social development strands of the essential knowledge and skills for middle school physical education.

Texas Education Code §44.031 requires all school district contracts, except contracts for the purchase of produce or vehicle fuel, valued at \$50,000 or more in the aggregate for each 12-month period shall be made by one of the methods listed in the Code providing the best value for the district. Board Policy CH (LOCAL) states, "The Board delegates to the Superintendent or designee the authority to make budgeted purchases for goods or services. However, any single, budgeted purchase of goods or services costing \$50,000 or more, regardless of whether the goods or services are competitively purchased, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place."

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

The purpose of this consent item is to ask for Board authorization to expend funds for previously approved budgeted expenditures for 2023-2024, which meet or exceed \$50,000 from the attached listed vendors. The attachment reflects categories of purchases, vendor names, descriptions of goods or services and estimated 2023-2024 expenditures. These purchases comply with applicable bid laws. The attachment includes estimated aggregate expenditures exceeding \$50,000 during the school year.

By approving this consent item, each approved budgeted item will not have to be presented again, saving considerable time and resources.

BUDGETARY CONSIDERATION

The estimated expenditure amounts are budgeted in various District accounts which were approved at the Board of Trustees meeting on June 12, 2023. Funds being expended include general funds, bond funds, grant funds, special revenue funds, internal service funds and enterprise funds.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

The Superintendent recommends the Department of Procurement & eCommerce be authorized to expend funds listed in the attachment for fiscal year 2023-2024.
