Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Greenville Independent School District will be held on June 16, 2020, for the purpose of considering and taking action on all matters on the agenda for the meeting, including approval of agreements with the law firm of Pearson Legal, P.C. as special counsel to perform all legal services necessary to recover damages, court costs, and penalties as provided in the Texas Insurance Code, the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, and other Texas statutory and common law for breaches of contract, tort claims (including negligence, misrepresentations, and/or fraud), violations of the Texas Insurance Code, and common law bad faith.

The purpose of one agreement is to pursue recovery of damages resulting from defects and deficiencies in the construction of the Career and Technology Center, Bowie Elementary, Crockett Elementary, and the addition of the Travis 6th Grade Center, and the purpose of the other agreement is to pursue recovery of unpaid property damages and losses sustained by the District as a result of a storm event occurring on or about June 19, 2019. By way of these agreements, the District seeks to recover damages, court costs, penalties, and other relief under Texas statutory and common law.

Pearson Legal, P.C., a San Antonio law firm specializing in construction defects and insurance recovery, is fully qualified to represent Greenville Independent School District in this matter. Pearson Legal, P.C. regularly represents public school districts and other governmental entities, as well commercial and private property owners, in matters of this type. Matthew R. Pearson founded Pearson Legal, P.C. in 2019 and has practiced law for over twenty-five years. As founder and lead trial lawyer of Pearson Legal, P.C., Mr. Pearson is Board Certified in Civil Trial Law and Personal Injury Trial Law by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization. Collectively, the firm's attorneys have more than [65] years of experience handling construction and insurance matters, beginning with pre-litigation analysis and advice, continuing through mediation and litigation or arbitration, and ending with final appellate resolution as may be necessary. Pearson Legal, P.C. possesses the competence, specialized experience, technology, and infrastructure to represent Greenville Independent School District in this matter.

Pearson Legal, P.C. has not previously represented Greenville Independent School

District but regularly represents public school districts and municipalities in matters of this type. Pearson Legal P.C. has, and continues to represent, Texas public school districts with competence and professionalism for recovery of damages provided for under Texas statutory and common law.

The specialized legal services required by these agreements cannot be adequately performed by the attorneys and supporting personnel of Greenville Independent School District because the District does not employ attorneys who have specialized knowledge and experience regarding construction defects issues legal remedies under Texas law and regarding property insurance coverage analysis and legal remedies under Texas law. In addition, the District does not have the financial resources necessary to hire competent and experienced attorneys and staff regarding construction defects law and regarding property insurance law as District employees. The District also does not have the financial resources required to pay the additional, significant costs of implementing appropriate infrastructure and technology necessary to fully and properly perform the needed legal services. The District also does not have the financial resources required to properly pursue its claims and causes of action, including to retain independent experts as testifying witnesses and to finance all costs of litigation through final resolution of the matter.

The legal services cannot be reasonably obtained from attorneys charging hourly fees because a contract to pay attorneys on an hourly basis would represent an additional and significant cost to Greenville Independent School District. Furthermore, the District would be responsible for payment of all costs and expenses of the litigation through appeals, including to retain independent experts as testifying witnesses and to finance all discovery expenses and other costs of litigation through final resolution of the matter. The District does not have the financial resources necessary to pay for these additional and significant expenses necessitated by the specialized construction defect matter and insurance recovery matter.

Pearson Legal, P.C. will be compensated on a contingent fee basis. Entering into the proposed agreements is in the best interests of the residents of Greenville Independent School District. The District has sustained significant damages to properties constructed and paid for in full with taxpayer monies and for which there exists a potential recovery from those who caused the damages, and the District also has sustained significant damages to property fully insured with taxpayer monies and for which there exists a potential recovery from those insuring the damages. Pearson Legal, P.C. possesses the specialized skills, knowledge, experience, financial, and technological resources needed to competently and fully pursue maximum potential recovery of the District's damages. Furthermore, the proposed agreements enable the District to pursue its legal remedies without diverting essential monies and resources from the ongoing needs and operations of its students, staff, and community at large. SUBJECT: Purchase over \$50,000 – HVAC for GHS and Crockett

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The district is contracting out services for the replacement of multiple HVAC systems across the district, including Crockett Elementary and Greenville High School. The HVAC replacements at the high school are being timed to coincide with the GHS roof replacement project to replace aging or non-functioning units. These services will be contracted out through an interlocal agreement purchasing cooperative and will total more than \$50,000 in goods and services for the cumulative project. These unit replacements are part of a five-year replacement plan established by the facilities and operations department.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION:

When a purchase will exceed \$50,000, it is necessary to seek Board approval, CH (LEGAL) and CH (LOCAL). This project is through an interlocal agreement as part of a purchasing cooperative and meets competitive bid requirements. ARMKO, Inc., the district’s roofing consultant, has engineered plans for replacement curbs for these units and will provide engineering specifications to meet structural requirements for unit weights as needed.

RECOMMENDATION:

Administration recommends approving the bid proposals in excess of \$50,000 to replace HVAC systems at Crockett Elementary and Greenville High School. These services will be carried out by Ken Parker Services.

- Add trim at the base of the drywall

The Scope of Work for the GMS Gym Includes:

- Remove chipping paint
- Repair chipping areas of the wall with new texture
- Primer exposed areas
- Two coats of paint on walls, railing benches, doors and ceilings

The total cost for these two projects will exceed \$50,000 to complete.

When a purchase will exceed \$50,000, it is necessary to seek Board approval, CH (LEGAL) and CH (LOCAL). This project is through an interlocal agreement as part of a purchasing cooperative and meets competitive bid requirements.

Property Casualty and Legal Liability Insurance coverage has been with Texas Association School Boards (TASB) Risk Management Fund for over ten years through an inter- local agreement. GISD Administration advertised a request for proposals for property, casualty, and legal liability insurance coverage on March 26, 2019 and April 2, 2019 for a multi-year contract. The District received two proposals on April 18, 2019 from TASB Risk Management Fund and Scarbrough, Medlin & Associates, Inc. The board approved the proposal from TASB Risk Management Fund on June 18, 2019. This agreement is the second-year extension of the proposal.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION:

GISD Administration reviewed the two proposals from TASB Risk Management Fund and Scarbrough, Medlin & Associates, Inc. Based upon the review and rating provided in the request for proposals it was determined that the proposal from the TASB Risk Management Fund offered the District the best service and value. 5. *An interlocal contract.*
6. *The reverse auction procedure as defined by Government Code 2155.062(d).*
7. *The formation of a political subdivision corporation under Local Government Code 304.001.*

GISD prepared a request for proposal for approved vendors and advertised as necessary. Those vendors who complete the packet and return to GISD will be recommended for placement on the GISD preferred vendor list. This method meets the requirements of #4 – Catalog purchase.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

This list will incorporate all vendors previously on the Local Vendor list and pick up other vendors that our staff has recommended for inclusion. The verification process for the 2019-2020 approved vendor listing includes those that automatically renewed and the additional vendors that are brought each month for your approval.
