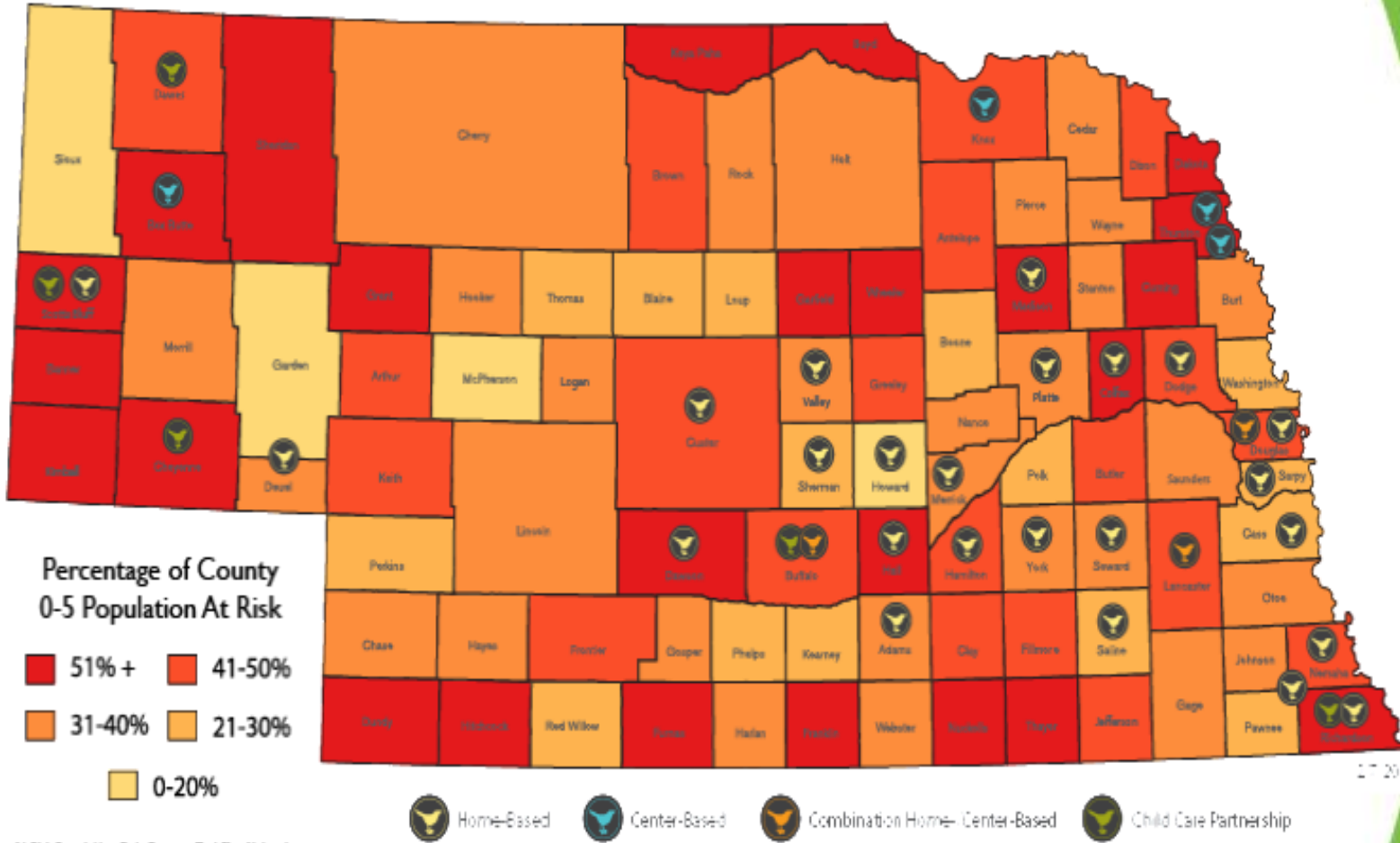

- Everything we know about brain development and skill formation confirms that the first three years are a critical and unique opportunity to set children--especially those most at risk--on the path to success in school and beyond.
- 90% of the brain is developed by the age of 3.

Fremont Public Schools

- The 1st Sixpence grant was awarded to Fremont Public Schools in 2013.
- Since then Fremont Public Schools has written for 3 Sixpence expansion grants, and now has a total of four in home visitation specialist serving the Fremont community most at-risk families.

Fremont Public Schools- The Sixpence Program



- The Sixpence program-an extension of Fremont Public Schools- provides early childhood learning experiences to at-risk children zero to three years of age, as well as, education and support to the parents.
- The Sixpence program offers three to four home visits each month to all families who are enrolled in the Sixpence program; in addition, to monthly family engagement nights.
- Transition at the age of three into the Fremont Public School preschool.

Fremont Sixpence Population Served

To qualify for participation in a Sixpence-funded program, children and families must be subject to at least one identified in statute by the Nebraska Department of Education.

Family and Child Risk Factors:

- 92% qualified for Free Lunch
- 7% qualified for Reduced Lunch
- 51% were single parents
- 34% of the mothers did not have a high school diploma.
- 26% were teen parents
- 34% had English as a Second Language.
- 64% had parents with mental health problems
- 50% had parents with substance abuse
- 31% experienced parental absence during the program year due to death, deportation, or military deployment
- 24% had an incarcerated parent
- 26% had witnessed violence
- 43% were living in foster care or had a CPS referral

Who Can Participate

- This program is open to all families who reside in Fremont with children ages zero to three and anyone who is currently pregnant. There are no charges for the services.
- Currently the Sixpence Program-extension of Fremont Public Schools- is serving 51 of the most at-risk children in the Fremont community.
- Since Fremont Public Schools wrote for the Sixpence grant in 2013 the program has served over 400 infants and toddlers.

Monthly Family Engagement Events

- Monthly activities are planned that give the chance for parents and children to practice their interaction skills while gaining new information/gaining new experiences.
- Our program attendance ranges from 60-80 individuals attending each month.

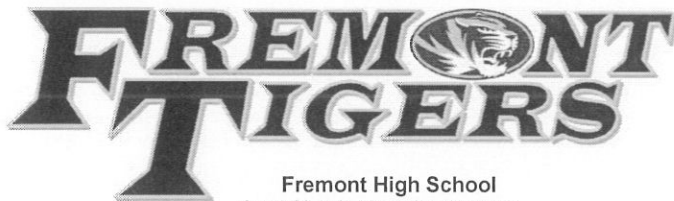

The FPS Technology Dep is requesting permission to proceed with a technology hardware purchase of Chromebooks. Last year the district fully implemented Chromebooks 1:1 in grades 5 - 12. Eventually the plan of implementation will include purchasing new Chromebooks for each new incoming 5th and 9th grade class. However, because we are still in the implementation process and utilizing Chromebooks that have already been purchased, this year's purchase will be for incoming 5th graders and to replace other Chromebooks that are aging out.

To match existing Chromebook models in use and the 5th and 9th grade replacement schedule I have requested price quotes for the HP 11 G6 EE Chromebook.

Quantities are 385 Chromebooks for incoming 5th grade and 160 to replace aged out Chromebooks.

Total = 545 Chromebooks.

We received price quotes from three vendors: CDWG, Staples and Riverside Technology (RTI).

Members of the Board,

I have solicited pricing from three local vendors; Butler AG, John Deere and Titan for a Utility Tractor and 15' Batwing type finish mower.

The Utility Tractor will be multiple use throughout the District, being utilized for mowing, paired with the batwing finish mower, in the Spring and Summer as well as snow removal applications in the Winter months.

The 15' finish mower will add an additional 80" of cut to our current finish mower and additional 120" cut over our John Deere ZTrak mowers. The return on investment will be seen in efficiency and time savings in man hours.

It is the recommendation of Administration the Fremont Board of Education purchase a MF1755MHL Compact Loader Tractor from Butler Ag in the amount of \$40,270.00 and a TBW180 Bat Wing Turf Mower from Butler Ag in the amount of \$15,525 for a total purchase price of \$55,795.00.

The source of funds for the grounds maintenance equipment will be the Depreciation Fund, at a price not to exceed \$55,795.00.
