Diers LLC. for the purchase and development of the Deer Pointe future school parcel (Lot 1&2 of Block 1, Diers 8th Addition) as adopted September 12 and entered into with the Diers family, for the reason of a conducting a strategy session and such is clearly necessary for the protection of the public interest passed with a motion by Board Member #1 and a second by Board Member #2.

The School District, Diers family and the City of Fremont continue to work together to identify final design parameters and cost sharing related to infrastructure development within and near the future elementary school site within the Deer Pointe subdivision.

Board President or Superintendent of Schools, or designee to sign and deliver the Purchase Agreement and Development Agreement, Extension Agreement, and Infrastructure Development addendum (collectively, the "Agreements"), to sign and deliver any documents, or other agreements called for in the Agreements, to retain any necessary professionals for assistance, to pay the purchase price and all other related costs and expenses, and to take all other action necessary to close the purchase and conveyance transaction and to carry the Agreements into effect, and approve purchase of Lot 1 & 2 of Block 1, Diers 8th Addition for a purchase price of \$950,000 and development costs of \$550,000 notwithstanding professional services required to gain City of Fremont approval for the preliminary and final plat passed with a motion by Board Member #1 and a second by Board Member #2.

Members of the Board:

During the budget development process we discussed budgeting for a mid-year pay adjustment for Classified Staff. In an effort to attract and retain Classified Employees we have utilized this approach in the past. With increased employment and pay opportunities available in the greater Fremont area the administration is recommending the following adjustment:

- \$1.10 per hour increase added to each step of the Classified Pay Schedule
- This increase will equate to an approximate total cost to the district of \$289,835
- The starting step in the Classified Pay Schedule will increase from \$13.54 to \$14.64 per hour

It is the recommendation that the Board of Education approve the mid-year pay adjustment as presented.

The FPS Technology Department is requesting permission to proceed with the purchase of Chromebooks for the 2023/2024 school year. Each year the district provides new Chromebooks for incoming Kindergarten, 5th Grade and 9th Grade students.

The Federal Government established the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and part of that Act was the Emergency Communication Funding Program (ECF). There have been three rounds of ECF funding applications. Fremont Public Schools submitted a Round 3 application for student Chromebooks and recently received a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) informing us our application has been fully funded.

For Kindergarten students we received a quote for 475 touchscreen Chromebooks, \$393.34 each. The quote for 475 touchscreen Chromebooks totals: \$186,836.50

For 5th and 9th grade students we received a quote for 975 non-touchscreen Chromebooks, \$332.09 each. The quote for 975 non-touchscreen Chromebooks totals: \$323,787.75 Both quotes included Google Management licenses.

Total funding commitment: \$510,624.25

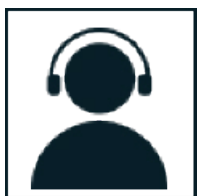
