4.5.1. FMS Gym Floor Refinishing Project

The gym floor at Fremont Middle School is in need of refinishing. The project consists of sanding the floor, re-striping, painting and applying finish. The project will be completed this summer.

On Tuesday, March 5, 2024, at 4:00 pm, bids were accepted and read aloud for the FMS Gym Floor Refinishing project. Three vendors submitted pricing. The bid tabulation and recommendation from FPS administration are attached. Egan Supply Company is the low bidder with \$44,695.00 submitted, including the three alternates. The project will commence this summer and be completed prior to the start of school in August.

It is the recommendation of Administration to accept Egan Supply Company's bid for a not to exceed cost of \$44,695.00. The source of funds for this purchase is the General Fund.

The Board, by approving this contract with Egan Supply Company is approving the contract documents, and all associated documents related thereto according to the terms and conditions as on file with district records or such other or additional terms and provisions as negotiated and approved by the Associate Superintendent or a designee, and the Board is hereby delegating to and

authorizing the Associate Superintendent or a designee to sign, execute, and deliver the contract documents and all such related documents, make all contract payments, and to take or cause to be taken any and all other action and sign any other documents as may be necessary to complete the transaction, and to administer, operate, and/or implement the contract and all associated documents related thereto on a day-to-day basis during this project as contemplated thereby, for and on behalf of this school district, and hereby designates the Director of Operations, or another person as selected by the Associate Superintendent or a designee from time to time as its program administrator under this agreement.

4.5.2. New Furniture Purchase

As part of each project currently under construction furnishings are included as allowances. The exception to this are the Milliken Park and Lenihan Indoor Air Quality projects which were funded with Federal ARRA funds.

Virco, through US Communities / Omnia contracts is able to provide high quality furnishings which match our existing furniture. The reference contract number is: #R-TC-18004 Classroom Furniture.

It is the recommendation of Administration to enter into a contract to purchase, deliver and install furnishings for the three new elementary buildings, Milliken Park media center, FHS CTE Center and Lecture Hall at a not to exceed price of \$1,316,890.06. The source of funds for this purchase is the Special Building Fund Bond Proceeds and the Depreciation Fund.

4.5.3. Lenihan Skywalk Demo Bids

As part of the Pre-Bond Issue project planning the skywalk over Broad Street connecting the former junior high building to the Lenihan building was identified to be removed. Bids were recently accepted for this project. The work will include demolition of the skywalk, restoration of the park area and sidewalks on each side of Broad Street and the restoration of the current Metropolitan Community College building attachment. The bid specifications required the project to either be completed well in advance of John C. Fremont Days or commence after the festival.

On February 29, 2024, at 2:00 pm, bids were accepted and read aloud for the Lenihan Skywalk Demo Project. Three vendors submitted pricing. The bid tabulation and recommendation from BVH Architects are attached. JMN Construction is the low bidder with \$257,930.00 submitted. The project will commence this spring and will be completed no later than June 14.

It is the recommendation of Administration to accept JMN Construction's bid for a not to exceed cost of \$257,930.00. The source of funds for this purchase is the Special Building Fund Bond Proceeds.

The Fremont Board of Education and the Fremont Education Association agreed to a settlement for 2024-2025 which includes 1) a total package increase of 4% (\$41,291 base) 2) maintains the flat salary stipend at \$8,750 and 3) increases the employer paid insurance premium option to \$5,500.

4.5.2. CTE Anatomage Table Purchase

Prior to ordering the synthetic cadaver which was previously approved, a technology based cadaver was brought to our attention by the Health Occupations department chair at Metropolitan Community College. The review of this option highlighted the advantages of this device over the synthetic cadaver including; less daily maintenance, no annual maintenance, broader applicability to curriculum including other sciences.

It is the recommendation of the administration to purchase an Anatomage technology based cadaver from Anatomage Inc. including a four year extended warranty, curriculum and training at a price not to exceed \$115,190.00. The source of funds for this purchase is the GEERS Grant through the Nebraska Department of Economic Development administered through GFDC.

Sixpence

- The Sixpence program-an extension of Fremont Public Schools- provides early childhood learning experiences to at-risk children zero to three years of age, as well as, education and support to the parents.

- The Sixpence program offers three to four home visits each month to all families who are enrolled in the Sixpence program; in addition, to monthly family engagement nights.

- Transition at the age of three into the Fremont Public School preschool.

- Fremont Public Schools is a model for the 43 other Sixpence sites in Nebraska on their transition policy.

- 70% of the families being served have 3 or more risk factors. Fortunately, Fremont Sixpence has a retention rate of 95% which is the highest retention rate for all sites in Nebraska.

Car Seat Drive

- 28 families served
- 13 car seats given
- Resources available on site
- Sixpence has 2 certified car seat technicians on site

Winter Coat Drive

- 121 winter coats distributed in 90 minutes
- 200 sets of hats and gloves distributed

Early Intervention- Birth-5

- A child is referred for evaluation by anyone, typically a relative, doctor, care taker or DHHS (CAPTA - Child Abuse and Treatment Act) as a response to child abuse and neglect.
- A referral results in an evaluation, family interviews, meetings, time spent with family and child to work on goals if they qualify, meetings to share progress. We serve students year round.
- Once evaluated and qualified for special education, we serve the child and family in their home, at daycare or Head Start. If a CAPTA referral they automatically qualify for assistance.
- School Psych, Speech, OT, PT, Teacher, Service Coordinator, Vision, Hearing, Interpreter.
- Transition to Preschool - three year olds in special education can attend and all four year olds.

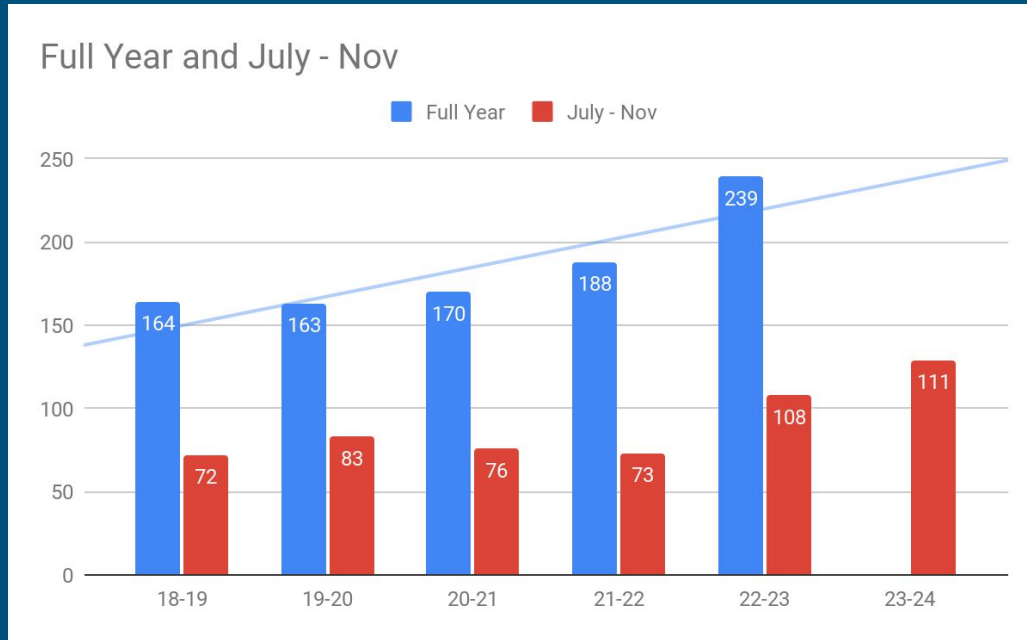

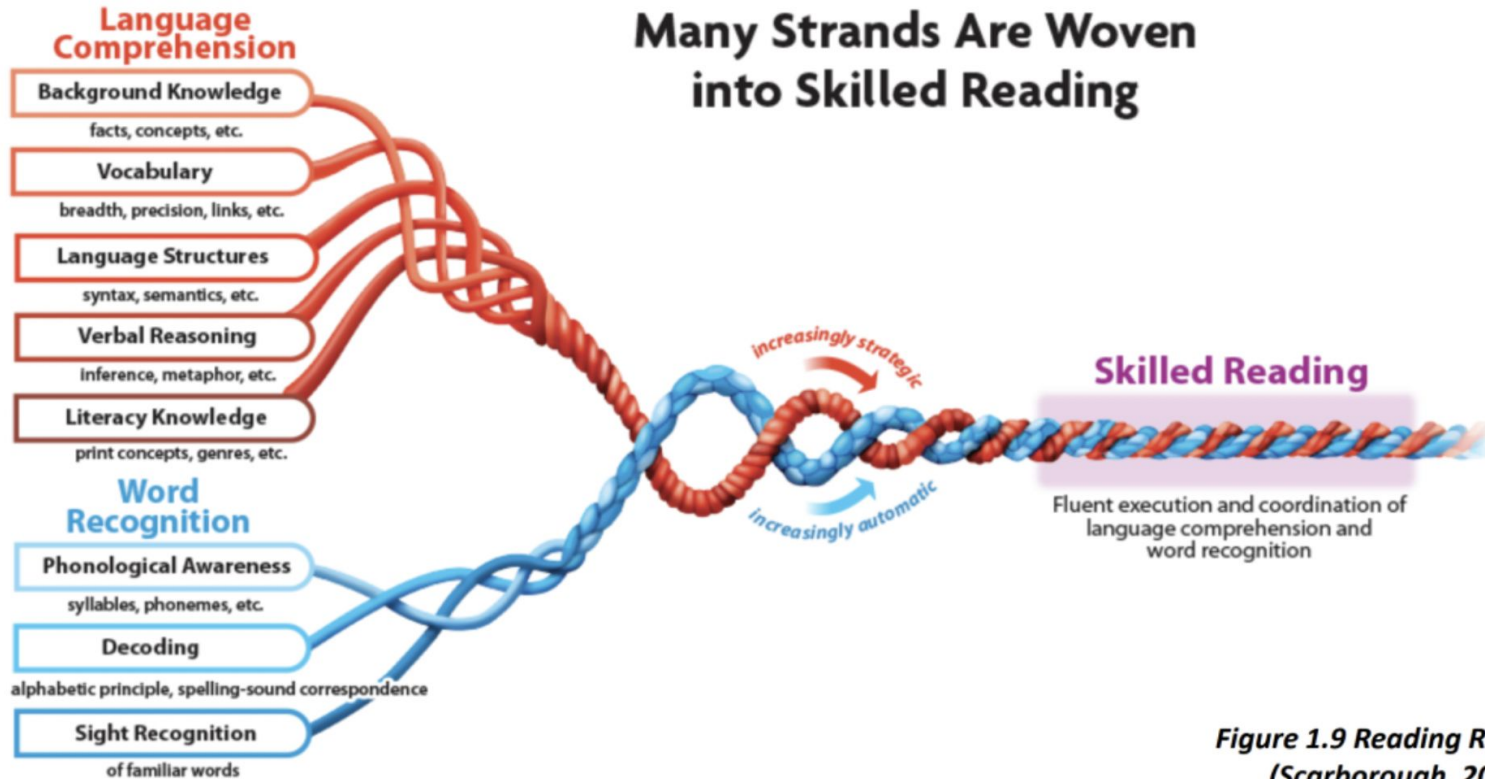
