Fall 2022 College Readiness and Remediation Report

Oklahoma state law requires Oklahoma schools utilize either a state-contracted ACT (OK ACT) or state-contracted SAT (OK SAT) to meet Every Student Succeeds Act, ESSA, English and Math requisites (2015). LPS chose the OKACT assessment to effectuate this requirement. However, for an integral survey of LPS's college readiness and remediation operations upshot, the following report reflects the 2022 state-contracted OK ACT 5-year data, 2021 and 2022 spring ACT District Exam data, 2022 PreACT data, 2022 Advanced Placement, and AP, 5-year data.

It is important to recognize that between 2017 and 2022 new Oklahoma Academic Standards (OAS) were implemented, revisions to OAS standards occurred, and contemporary frameworks for English, Math, and Science were invoked by the Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE, 2021). Further, Covid 19 related district closures, school site shut-downs, and increased absenteeism of faculty, staff, and students have contrived obstacles for schools across the state, as well as LPS. Additionally, as the number of certified, highly qualified teachers decreases in the district and state, the number of under-performing students increases.

From 2018 to 2021, Oklahoma performance on the state-contracted OK ACT fell from 18.2 in 2018 to 17.7 in 2022, a decrease of 2.7%. However, LPS has shown a comprehensive increase on the state-contracted OK ACT from 16.8 in 2018 to 17.0 in 2022, an increase of 1.2% with a slight decrease of 0.6% between 2021 and 2022, as seen in Figure 1 (ACT Profile, 2022). Additionally, on the state-contracted ACT, the percentage of students meeting core benchmarks in English, Reading, Math, and Science, has remained stagnate at 13%. However, the state-contracted OK ACT is not the only ACT assessment LPS utilizes to help drive instruction. Over the course of 2 years, LPS has facilitated the ACT District test in the fall and spring. LPS performance on the ACT District test increased 9.39% from 18.1 in 2021 to 19.8 in 2022 (2022). For the ACT District Exam, Figure 2 depicts an increase of 20%, regarding the percentage of students meeting core benchmarks from 10% in 2021 to 12% in 2022 (ACT Online, 2022).

LPS facilitates the PreACT every year. Because the Oklahoma Board of Higher Regents provides PreACT assessments for every Oklahoma sophomore student, LPS assesses all sophomore students. In 2022, LPS broadened the PreACT assessment opportunity to include all freshman accelerated class enrollees and 8th grade honors class enrollees. Figures 3 thru 6 provide PreACT composite scores and intervention percentages disaggregated by grades 8 to 10 in core benchmark areas. For example, Figure 4 reveals that 75% of freshman and sophomore students taking the PreACT need interventions in Math.

Figure 7 provides a summary of the LPS AP program over the course of 5 years, the number of students enrolled in AP classes has decreased 29.34% from 246 students enrolled to 301 students enrolled. However, the percentage of students scoring a 3 or better on their AP exams increased 1.37% from 2018 to 2022. The 2022 SY was the first year that LPS paid for AP curriculum and exams for students taking AP classes. This may have had an effect on the increase in scores for AP. Next year's 2023 data comparison will provide a more informed portrayal of outcomes.



The LPS school district and individual school sites continue to modify planning and instruction based on the aforementioned assessment data. Appropriate measures were implemented by the district education team and individual school site teams to improve student performance outcomes. For example, the number of students enrolling in post-secondary college courses having to participate in math and reading remedial courses decreased from 26.8% in the fall of 2019 to 20.7% in the fall of 2020 (Oklahoma Board of Higher Regents, 2022). The remedial course data for the fall of 2021 has not been made available yet and will not be available until late fall of 2022.

As represented by the 22.8% decrease in math and English remedial classes at the post-secondary level, LPS students, teachers, and administrators strived to improve school performance in the areas of reading and math. Presently, they continue working hard facilitating positive, relevant learning to further increase academic performance.

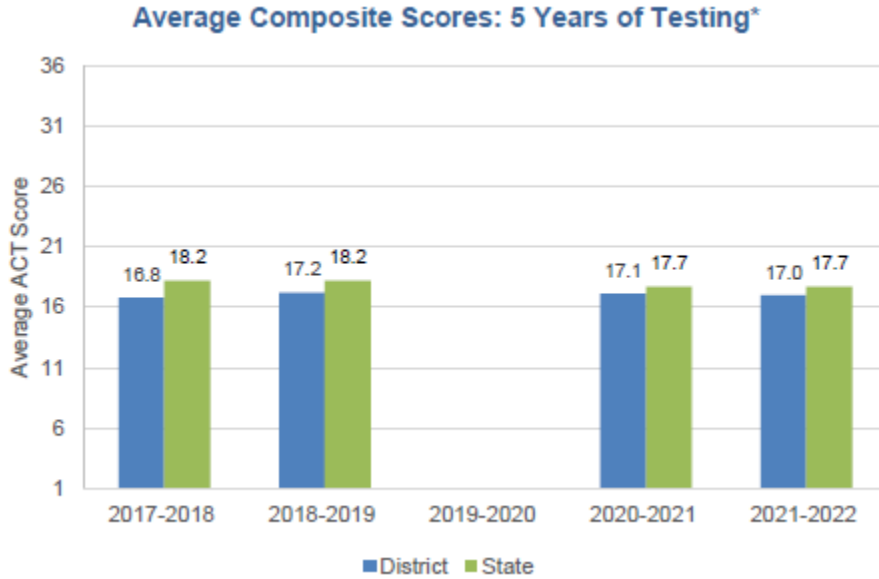
Opportunities for increased student learning continues to focus on meeting student needs where they are, while improving their academic performance skills and academic growth.

- LPS education programs offer remediation for students identified as below grade/performance level.
- All 3 high schools, Gateway, and SCORE offer ACT prep either during the school schedule or after school.
- All 3 high schools, Gateway, and SCORE offer credit recovery, either built in the schedule or after school for students working at home with requirements for monitored assessment times at designated school sites.
- LPS Virtual Academies offer students and parents a choice of learning environments best suited to student needs.
- Online learning platforms like Edmentum offer extra practice and review of OAS standards, skills, and practice.
- Life Ready Center provides innovative opportunities for students for either work force entry or college entry after graduation.
- Maker spaces provide innovative spaces for LPS students to increase their creativity and problem-solving skills.
- The Life Learning Center increases LPS students' ability to learn new concepts and learn outside of the norm.
- LTAP (Lawton Technical Application Program) provides LPS middle school students hands-on learning for future career options.

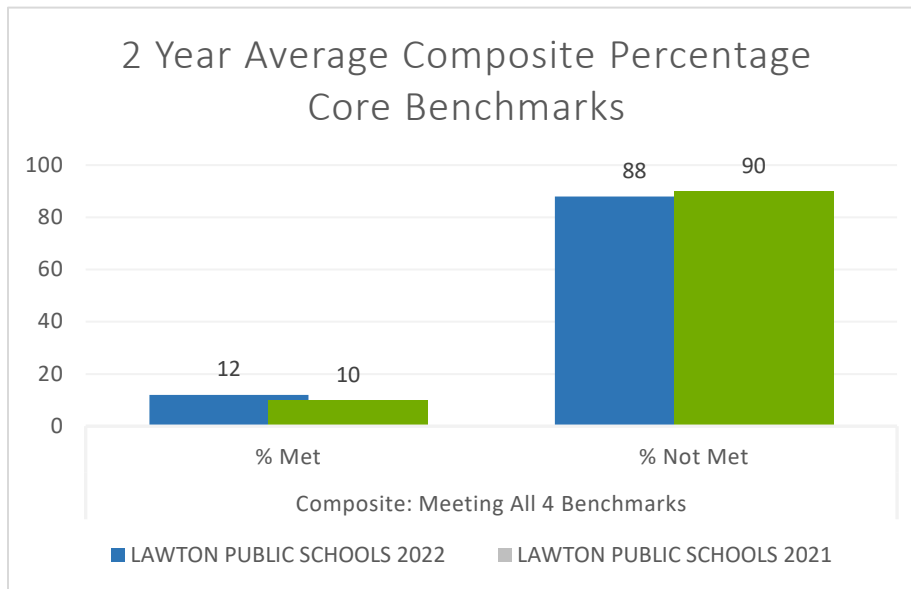

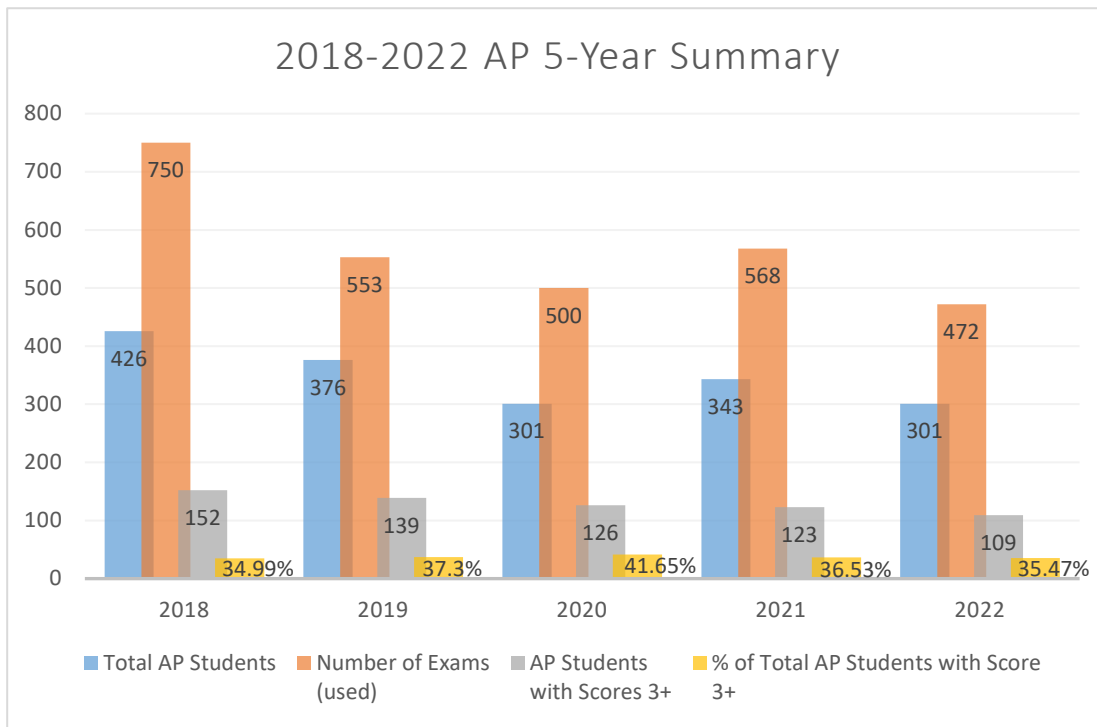

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN LAWTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND KIOWA TRIBE HEAD START PROGRAM

This agreement is between **Lawton Public Schools** and **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** for the period of August 2022 to July 2023. This agreement is binding on the staff members of both agencies, and will be reviewed at least annually. Either agency may revoke this agreement with a notice of at least 30 days.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish working procedures between **Lawton Public Schools** and **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** in the provision of services to preschool children, in compliance with federal and state laws and regulations.

It is the intent of this agreement to:

1. Define which services will be provided by each agency.
2. Ensure that children who are eligible for preschool services receive such services as required by federal and state laws and regulations that will improve their readiness for school.
3. Ensure that each agency cooperatively maintains communication and share leadership relationship responsibilities at the local level to ensure that available resources are utilized in the most effective manner.
4. Ensure that cooperative arrangements between Lawton Public Schools and Kiowa Tribe Head Start are developed, implemented and maintained.

This agreement applies only to preschool children three-years-old to Kindergarten eligible, inclusive, who are eligible for preschool services.

I. PURPOSE

To provide collaboration and coordination activities for eligible children.

II. DURATION

This agreement shall cover from August 2022 through July 2023.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

All parties agree;

Preschool children are best served in environments that provide instruction in their home language and culture.

IV. AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES

Kiowa Tribe Head Start agrees to:

1. Collaborate and coordinate with Lawton Public Schools to improve the availability and quality of services to Head Start children and families.
2. Participate in outreach efforts to identify eligible children.
 - a. Receive parent permission to share information about such children.
 - b. Collaborate with Lawton Public School teachers regarding professional development and instructional strategies.
 - c. Ensure a smooth transition to school for eligible children.
3. Coordinate activities with Lawton Public School including:
 - a. Collaboration on shared use of transportation and facilities, in appropriate cases.
 - b. Collaboration to reduce duplication of services.
 - c. Collaboration to enhance the efficiency of services and increase program participation of underserved populations of eligible children.
 - d. Exchange information on the provision of non-educational services to such children.
4. Plan, coordinate, and biennially review each of the following activities:
 - a. Educational activities, curricular objectives, and instruction.
 - b. Public information dissemination and access to programs for families contacting any of the preschool programs.
 - c. Selection priorities for eligible children to be served by the preschool programs
 - d. Service areas
 - e. Staff training, including opportunities for joint staff training on topics such as academic content standards, instructional methods, curriculum, and social and emotional development.
 - f. Program technical assistance.
 - g. Provision of additional services to meet the needs of working parents, as applicable.
 - h. Communication and parent outreach for smooth transitions to Kindergarten.
 - i. Provision and use of facilities, transportation, and other program elements.
 - j. Other elements mutually agreed to by the parties to the memorandum.

Lawton Public School agrees to:

1. Collaborate and coordinate with **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** to improve the availability and quality of services to Head Start children and families.
2. Participate in outreach efforts to identify eligible children.
 - a. Collaborate with **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** teaching staff regarding professional development and instructional strategies.

 - b. Public information dissemination and access to programs for families contacting any of the preschool programs.
 - c. Selection priorities for eligible children to be served by the preschool programs.
 - d. Service areas
 - e. Staff training, including opportunities for joint staff training on topics such as academic content standards, instructional methods, curricula, and social and emotional development.
 - f. Program technical assistance.
 - g. Provision of additional services to meet the needs of working parents, as applicable.
 - h. Communication and parent outreach for smooth transitions to Kindergarten.
 - i. Provision and use of facilities, transportation, and other program elements.
 - j. Other elements mutually agreed to by the parties to the memorandum.

V. Funding and Financial Responsibility

It is specifically agreed that neither party shall be responsible for costs or expenditures incurred by the other, other than those expenses defined in any separate agreements in writing that may be between the parties cooperating in this program.


VI. Modification of the Agreement

Modification of the agreement shall be made by mutual consent of all parties. Written notification of changes to this document must be presented to all parties 30 days prior to any changes, and all parties must agree to the modification. Termination of the agreement may occur by any party upon a 60-day written notification.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN LAWTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND KIOWA TRIBE HEAD START PROGRAM

This Agreement is between **Lawton Public Schools** and the **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** for the period of August 2022 and July 2023.

I. Purpose Statement

The purpose of the Agreement is to establish working procedures between **Lawton Public Schools** and **Kiowa Tribe Head Start** in the provision of services to Preschool children eligible for special education in compliance with Federal and Oklahoma State laws and regulations.

It is the intent of this agreement to:

1. Define which services will be provided by each agency
2. Ensure that children eligible for preschool special education services receive a free and appropriate public education, as required by law, in the most effective environment.
3. Ensure that each Agency cooperatively maintains communication and share leadership responsibilities at the local level to ensure that available resources are utilized in the most effective manner.
4. Ensure that cooperative arrangements between Lawton Public Schools and Kiowa Tribe Head Start are developed, implemented and preserved.

This agreement applies only to preschool children three years old to Kindergarten age who are eligible for special education services.

II. Program Mandates

1. Provide services to preschool children with disabilities on a mandatory basis following September 1991 (Expanded Requirements under the Individuals with Disabilities Act amended P.L. 102-119)
2. Provide preschool children with disabilities a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) including the development and implementation of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).
3. Place preschool children with disabilities in the least restrictive environment with an opportunity to interact with nondisabled peers to the maximum extent appropriate.
4. Work with appropriate community agencies to provide services to preschool children with disabilities.

Responsibility of Head Start Program:

1. Recruit, enroll and serve eligible children age's three to five. No less than 10 percent of the enrollment opportunities in Head Start Program shall be available for children with disabilities who are eligible to participate.
2. Screen enrolled children for potential problems in the areas of health and development.
3. Refer children found to be at risk to appropriate professionals for diagnostic evaluation.
4. Develop and implement IEP's for children with disabilities (with parent participation) based on diagnostic information.
5. Work closely with other community agencies in order to provide services to children with disabilities.

- a. Provide assistance with professional evaluations and the LEA to strengths, weaknesses and whether child should be diagnosed as having a disability.
- b. Notify parents of meetings with LEA, teachers and Disabilities Manager, professional evaluators and parents
- c. Provide transportation to meetings/appointments as needed

4. Individualized Education Program Development

Lawton Public Schools will:

- a. Provide services as described on the IEP
- b. Provide transportation as needed-required by law
- c. Assist Head Start staff with curriculum, resources as needed to provide service on the IEP

Kiowa Tribe Head Start will:

- a. Provide all Head Start area services, including classroom supplies, equipment, etc. and an appropriate mainstreamed learning environment
- b. Report on child progress, attend IEP meetings and transition planning meetings

5. Procedures for Review/Monitoring Child's Progress

Lawton Public Schools will:

- a. Assist in annual review
- b. Assist in revision if needed

Kiowa Tribe Head Start will:

- a. Review IEP at least annually
- b. Assist in revision if needed

V. Confidentiality

Lawton Public Schools and Kiowa Tribe Head Start shall follow the requirements outlined in the Family Education Right to Privacy Act (FERPA)

VI. Training and Technical Assistance

Lawton Public Schools will:

- a. Notify and provide Head Start staff with invitations to appropriate in-service training
- b. Lend materials for in-service
- c. Provide in-service training if possible

Kiowa Tribe Head Start will:

- a. Notify and provide LEA staff invitations to appropriate in-service trainings
- b. Assure that trainings are provided to parents of special needs children and staff

VII. Transition Activities

Lawton Public Schools and Kiowa Tribe Head Start will:

- a. Assist with transition with parental permission

VIII. Termination/Review

This memorandum of Understanding will be reviewed and revised by the Kiowa Tribe Head Start Disabilities Manager and Lawton Public Schools on an as needed basis or at least annually. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

MEMORANDUM OF TRANSITION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KIOWA TRIBE HEAD START AND LAWTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Kiowa Tribe Head Start and Lawton do hereby establish and implement a Memorandum of Transition Agreement for services to children in accordance with the Head Start Performance Standards for the period of August 2022 to July 2023 Head Start is funded by the American Indian-Alaska Native Program Branch (AIANPB), Administration for Children and Families of the Department of Health and Human Services to prepare children as they transition from Head Start to elementary school.

The Kiowa Tribe Head Start has center-based programs for families in Anadarko, Carnegie, Lawton.

I. PURPOSE STATEMENT

To ease the transition for children and their families from Head Start to Kindergarten, the Kiowa Tribe Head Start in collaboration with Lawton offers this cooperate relationship to implement the transition program.

It is the intent of this Agreement to:

- A. Ensure that each cooperatively maintains communication and share leadership responsibilities at the local level to ensure that available resources are utilized in the most effective manner.
- B. Ensure that cooperative arrangements between Lawton and the Kiowa Tribe Head Start are developed, implemented, and preserved.
- C. Prepare for the continuity of Head Start children's educational process by informing public schools of the children's development through:
 1. An overview of the Head Start curriculum for the Kindergarten teachers.
 2. Availability of the children's health, education, family goals, and special needs records upon request with parental approval.
- D. Include Head Start children in the transition process through:
 1. An orientation to the new environment.
 2. An opportunity to meet Kindergarten teachers, principals, and other school personnel.
- E. Include the parents in the transition process through:

1. An overview of the public school's policies and regulations, including services for special needs children.
2. An opportunity to meet Kindergarten teachers, Principals, and other school personnel
3. An opportunity to pre-enroll their children for entrance to Kindergarten.

II. The Parties agree to the following:

- A. Initiate joint transition-related training for Head Start staff and public school personnel.
 1. Head Start Family Service Manager will develop a schedule of all training sessions with dates, time, and place for Head Start parent/guardians.
 2. Head Start Family Service Manager will conduct training sessions for all the Head Start teaching staff.
 3. The Head Start teachers will be given the opportunity to observe in the public school settings to better prepare the children for transition.
 4. Group sessions will be scheduled for Head Start and public schools personnel to exchange ideas about each program's goals, curriculum, materials, and schedules, and assessments for children.
 5. Head Start staff will notify parents of the training sessions and will provide transportation.
 6. Public school personnel will conduct training sessions on their policies and regulations for Head Start staff.
 7. The Head Start Family Manager will provide training for parents to prepare them for the transition into the public schools.
 8. The Family Service Manager in collaboration with the Disabilities Coordinator will inform the parents of special needs children and transition meeting.
 9. The Head Start staff will provide information with identified special needs children to the public with parental consent.



III. The Kiowa Tribe Head Start and Lawton together with an appropriate representative shall jointly undertake the following:

- A. Lawton and Kiowa Tribe Head Start personnel will meet in the spring of each year to establish procedures for the following transition activities:
 1. Head Start overview for Kindergarten teachers.
 2. Transfer of children's records
 3. Field trips to public school for Head Start children and parents to meet the Principal, Kindergarten teachers, and other school personnel.
 4. Head Start will meet to discuss the dates, times, and procedures of transition activities.

- B. The Head Start center based children will be prepared for the transition process through classroom activities which stimulate play, dramatization and discussions about public school personnel, cafeteria, playground, classrooms, and schedules.
- C. The home based children and parents will be prepared for the transition process through the identification of individual strengths and needs. The children will be provided the opportunity to have classroom socialization's to stimulate play, dramatization, and discuss about public school personnel, cafeteria, playground, classrooms, and schedules.
- D. The Kiowa Tribe Head Start will prepare the environment for the children to learn through active exploration and interaction.
 - 1. Provide activities with learning materials relevant to child's own life experience.
 - 2. Provide opportunities to develop social and self-help skills
 - 3. Provide a multicultural program which is reflective of the Kiowa Tribal language and culture.
 - 4. Provide opportunities for cognitive development.
 - 5. Children's progress will documented for reporting of accomplishments outlining the conceptual learning, self-help activities and school readiness.

This agreement may be amended by mutual agreement in writing, executed by the officials executed by the officials executing this agreement or their successors, and appended herewith.






MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

LAWTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS and GREAT PLAINS TECHNOLOGY CENTER agree to offer courses for academic credit through online curriculum providers, in a blended instruction environment, or through traditional instructional delivery. This agreement is valid for school year 2022-23. Grades as reported by Great Plains Technology Center to Lawton Public Schools will be entered on the student's high school transcript for high school credit.


It should be noted that:

- Curriculum is aligned with Oklahoma state standards.
- Curriculum delivery is via online interactive technology, through blended instruction, or by a traditional means by a Highly Qualified teacher certified by the state of Oklahoma in the specific subject.
- Students may enroll having been granted permission to do so by Lawton Public Schools.
- Priority for enrollment will be given to students that are presently enrolled at GPTC (first priority) and students that have pre-enrolled at GPTC (second priority).
- Any fees charged by GPTC for this purpose will be the responsibility of the student.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION FOR MISUSE OF SCHOOL BATHROOMS AND CHANGING FACILITIES

The board of education has adopted this policy to provide disciplinary action for individuals who refuse to:

- A. Use the multiple occupancy restroom or changing area designed for their Sex;
- B. Designate multiple occupancy restrooms or changing areas for the exclusive use of one Sex; or
- C. Provide access to a single-occupancy restroom or changing area to an individual who does not wish to utilize the multiple occupancy restroom or changing area designed for their Sex; provided that such individual is authorized to be on the school premises.

All individuals are expected to comply with Oklahoma law. Individuals who fail to comply with Oklahoma law regarding the use of school bathrooms or changing facilities may be disciplined as follows:

1. Students. Students may be subject to the disciplinary methods listed in the student discipline code.
2. Staff. Staff members may be subject to disciplinary action. Due process procedures will be followed as required by law or negotiated agreement.
3. Patrons. Patrons may be removed from the premises for interfering with peaceful orderly conduct in accordance with 21 O.S. §§ 1375 and 1376.

If a complaint is filed with the State Department of Education that the district or an employee is not complying with Oklahoma law on this topic, the board of education will have fifteen (15) days to request an opportunity to appear before the State Board of Education and/or submit a written response to address the allegations.
