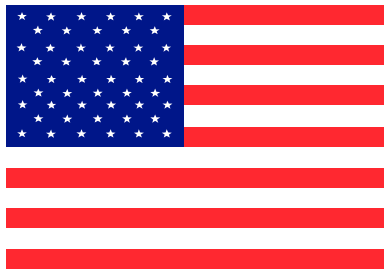

SUBJECT: Board Member Continuing Education

Annually, the board president is required to announce the board members' compliance with continuing education requirements. Please find attached an Overview of Continuing Education Requirements for School Board Members as well as each board member's record of the credits they have received. *(Please note that NSBA Conference credits are not reflected and Toni will re-run the report once TASB has posted them)*

From August 2008 through August 2009, all board members have exceeded their training requirements with the exception of Tier 2. Each board member is required to have three hours of Tier 2 training. Your training on January 22, 2009 only fulfilled two of the three required hours. We have been trying to schedule the Board-Self Assessment which will fall under Tier 2. We hope to have it scheduled for a Saturday later this month so that all board members exceed their training requirements in all three tiers.

As per the *Texas Comprehensive, Developmental Guidance and Counseling Program*, guidance and counseling services should be delivered in compliance with the percentages agreed upon by the campus principal and counselor, or as directed by the state.

Attached you will find the Program Balance Time Distribution Form and description of competencies used by school counselors to carry out their responsibilities. Counselors and principals received training in the *Texas Comprehensive, Developmental Guidance and Counseling Program* during the 08-09 school year.

When determining guidance and counseling services percentages, both principal and counselor(s) work cooperatively to complete the Program Balance Time Distribution Form to obtain the desired campus program percentages. These percentages are based on individual campus need and capacity. The recommended percentages are as follows:
35%-45% guidance curriculum; 30%-40% responsive services; 5%-10% individual planning; 10%-15% system support; 0% non-guidance.

Completed forms from each campus will be summarized by Margarita Armendariz, Executive Director for Student and Community Support, and submitted to the superintendent. Ms. Armendariz will work closely with principals to monitor all aspects of the counseling program, including the mutually determined percentages.

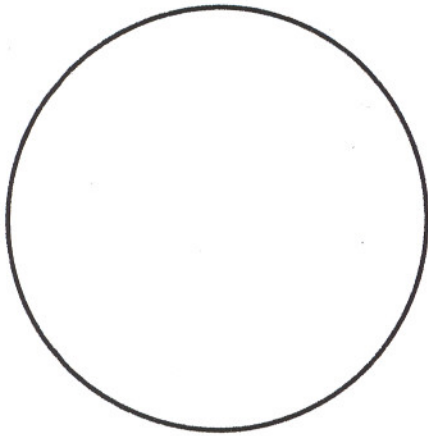

Program Balance Time Distribution Form Elementary Level



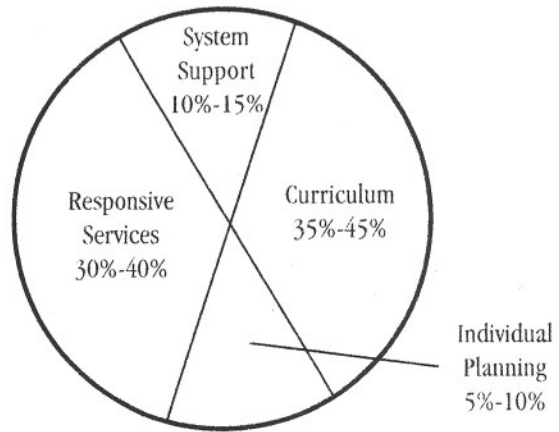

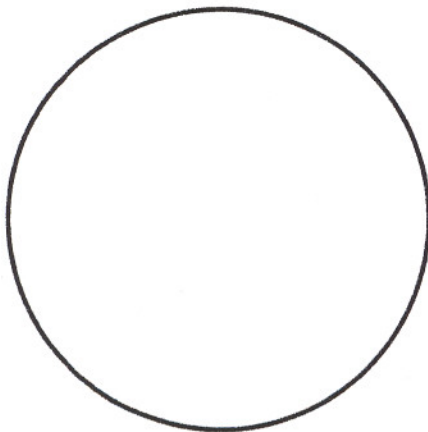

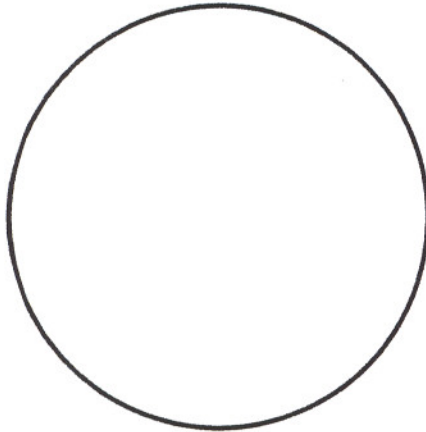

Program Balance Time Distribution Form Middle School/Jr. High Level



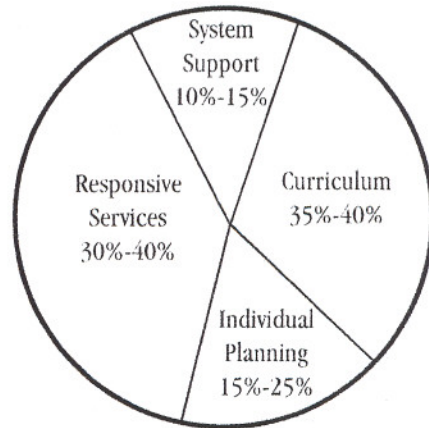

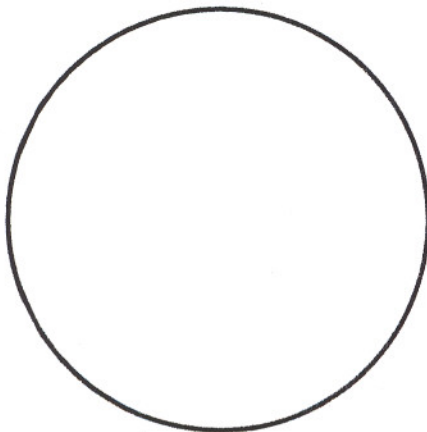

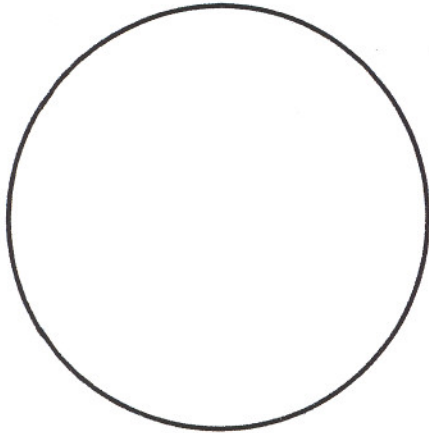

Program Balance Time Distribution Form High School Level



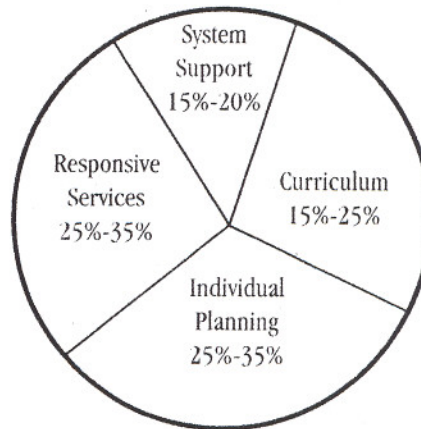

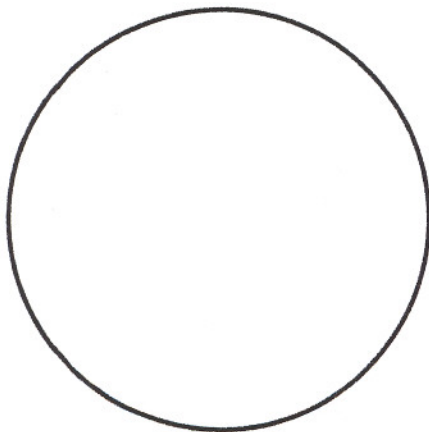

Counselor Job Description and Performance Evaluation

Job Description - A counselor's job description reflects the specific application of the domains and standards appropriate to his or her job assignment within the local comprehensive, developmental guidance and counseling program.

It is important to note that counselors' specific job descriptions vary depending on their work setting and the counselor-to-student ratio. Although every school counselor generally has responsibilities in all eight domains, not all domains are necessarily equally balanced for all counselors. Occasionally a standard listed under a domain in the Counselor Job Description and Performance Evaluation Form may not be applicable to a particular counselor. Hence, an individual counselor's specific responsibilities should be defined collaboratively by the counselor and the administrator in response to the school's and districts needs and priorities. The school counselor is required to be evaluated annually as per Texas Education Code (TEC §21.352 & 21.356).

The counselor evaluation form may be used by the counselor as a self-audit. It may also be used by supervisors to annually evaluate the counselor's performance. This TEA Job Description and Performance Evaluation were developed in cooperation with the Texas Counseling Association and Texas School Counselors Association and is the recommended evaluation form as directed by TEC §21.356. The recommended version includes a system for weighting the ratings. Weighting reflects the relative importance of each domain within an individual counselor's job assignment. A weight is assigned to each domain to reflect how much of a counselor's resources are expected to be appropriated to that domain. Rating reflects the evaluator's judgment about the quality of a counselor's performance on a standard. Details about the rating scale and the application of weights are presented later under "Directions for Completion of the Performance Evaluation Form." A district or campus may choose not to use the weighting system. For additional information, contact TEA Guidance and Counseling at (512) 463-9498.



Economic Outlook

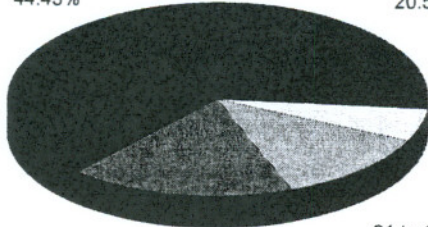
Incoming data continue to suggest a significant abatement in the pace of contraction in economic activity, supporting Federal Reserve Chairman Bernanke's assertion that the economy is beginning to see "green shoots" of improvement. Among the more notable "green shoots" over the past month were: a substantial rise in consumer confidence, especially forward-looking expectations; marked improvement in manufacturing indicators; and more evidence of stabilization in housing activity. Home sales and housing starts may have possibly bottomed. Amidst monthly volatility, single family housing starts have essentially been unchanged since the beginning of the year; likewise for new and existing home sales. Rising affordability, driven largely by lower prices and lower rates, has apparently helped stabilize sales. However, the stability in sales has apparently come at huge price discounts, and much more foreclosure inventory lies in the pipeline. Also, the recent run up in Treasury yields, if it continues and lifts mortgage rates materially, would clearly be a source of downside risk to what is still a fragile housing market.

The outline for the path leading up to the end of the recession has long been one where consumer metrics start to improve, supported by temporary stimulus and gradually improving financial conditions. Better consumer spending and final demand leads to reduced business caution and ultimately to improved labor markets. Data over the past few months have been consistent with all but one element of this central theme: a measurable labor market recovery is yet to materialize.

The combination of fiscal stimulus, reduced inventory cutbacks, reduced drag from housing, easier financial conditions, and the advanced stage of household balance sheet repair should gradually restore growth into positive territory in the second half of 2009. In essence, households will continue to increase savings in response to the \$16 trillion of wealth destruction seen over the six quarters up to first quarter 2009. Short of an improbable and very aggressive rebound in jobs and income and/or house and equity prices, continued household balance sheet repair will restrain consumer spending in the coming quarters. Financial conditions that are still tight are also expected to normalize only gradually. Growth in the range expected is low enough that the unemployment rate will keep rising into mid-2010, and disinflation will remain a key feature of the economic backdrop.

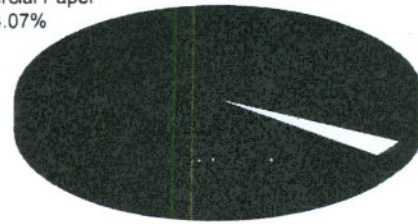

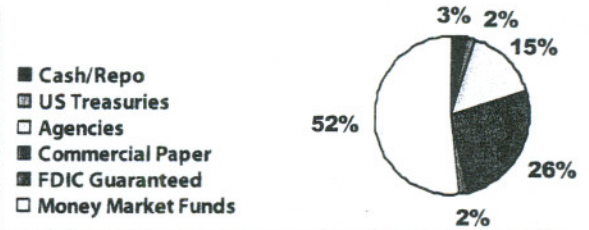
Lone Star Investment Pool Quarterly Position Report—May 31, 2009

Treasury bonds maturing beyond two-years traded sharply lower in the three-month period ending May 31. Yields rose 35 to 63 basis points on the five to 30-year part of the curve. The curve became steeper during the period as the spread between the two-year Treasury note and 30-year Treasury bond widened to 342 from 273 basis points. The equity markets rallied sharply during the period as the Dow, NASDAQ and S&P 500 indexes gained 20.4, 28.8 and 25.0 percent, respectively. The labor market showed significant weakness during the period as the U.S. economy lost 1.5 million jobs, resulting in an increase in the unemployment rate to 9.4 percent. The first revision of first quarter GDP was slightly better than the original estimate as the economy shrunk by an annual pace of 5.7 percent. As expected, the Federal Reserve left the Fed Funds target unchanged in a range of zero to 0.25 percent at both the March and April FOMC meetings. The next FOMC meeting is scheduled for June 24.

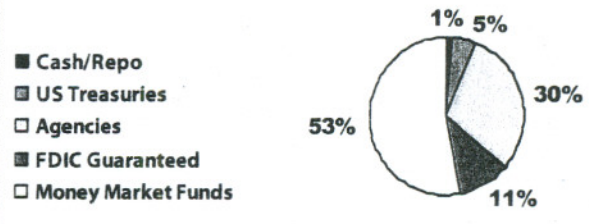
U.S. Treasury Yield Curves



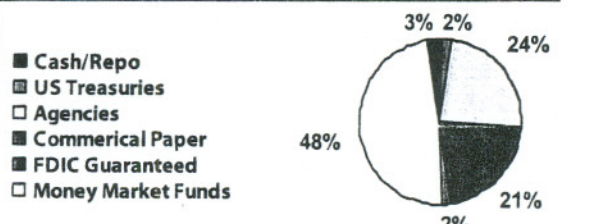

Economic Commentary



Market Commentary for May 2009

Economy Worsens at a Slower Pace

The decline of the United States economy showed further signs of softening in May. Leading economic indicators were mixed, however there were few signs that the economy is getting markedly worse. U.S. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the first quarter of 2009 was revised slightly upward from the initial estimate of negative 6.1 percent growth to negative 5.7 percent. This means that real GDP has declined 2.5 percent year-over-year, the largest since 1982. On the more positive side, corporate profits rose in the first quarter for the first time since the second quarter of 2007. The Dow Jones Industrial Average has also stabilized and remained in the 8000s for the month of May.

The unemployment rate rose from 8.9 percent in April to 9.4 percent in May. Payroll employment fell by 345,000 jobs, which is a far smaller decline than was seen in April (504,000), March (652,000), and February (681,000). This indicates a moderation in job losses and suggests that companies are nearly finished making their planned cuts. Even so, the unemployment rate is high and nearly 6 million jobs have been shed since the beginning of the recession at the end of 2007. Moody's expects that the U.S. economy will not see significant job creation until mid 2010.

Consumer confidence continues to rise rapidly. The Conference Board's index of consumer confidence rocketed up more than 14 points in May to 54.9 from April's 40.8. This follows a nearly 14 point jump in April, making for the largest two month increase since the index was started in 1977. As with April, May's surge was largely due to the expectations component of the index which measures consumers' economic attitudes about the future, however the present conditions component also rose 3.4 points. Likewise, the University of Michigan's Consumer Sentiment index climbed 3.6 points in May to 68.7. These figures suggest that consumers are feeling that the recession may be petering out. It should be noted, however, that the massive rise in the Conference Board's index came from historic lows, so it is too early to say that consumers will increase their spending. Indeed, the savings rate rose to 5.7 percent in April compared to just 2.5 percent six months ago. Personal income rose 0.5 percent in April, while spending fell 0.1 percent. The core consumer price index (CPI) increased by 0.3 percent in April and 2.0 percent year-over-year, meaning that neither inflation nor deflation are serious issues in the economy yet.

The picture is also mixed on the business front. Retail sales (MARTS) fell 0.4

percent in April and the March figures were downwardly revised to a decrease of 1.3 percent from February. Once again, the decrease in April was broad based throughout the retail economy but led by electronics and appliances. Factory orders increased in April by 0.7 percent, but orders are still down 22.8 percent from a year ago. Even so, it appears that the deterioration of the manufacturing sector is slowing. Durable goods orders increased 1.9 percent in April after a 2.1 percent decrease in March. The Institute for Supply Management's (ISM) manufacturing index, which measures the state of general manufacturing in the U.S. increased 2.7 points to 42.8 in May. This increase is welcome, and the index has been steadily rising since its December low of 32.9, but any number below 50 is generally indicative of a recession in the sector. Furthermore, a big unknown variable for manufacturing is the effect of the bankruptcy of General Motors, which will mean more job losses and production cuts.

The housing market is showing further signs of stabilization. Existing home sales rose 2.9 percent in April to an annualized rate of 4.68 million units. This lies within the range of 4.5 to 5.0 million units annualized that the existing home sales market has experienced for the last 6 months, which strongly suggest that this part of the housing sector has bottomed out. New home sales increased by 0.3 percent in April. Sales are hovering around 350,000 units annualized, which also suggests a bottom as formed, albeit a near historic low one.

The Federal Open Market Committee has not met since its April 28-29 meeting discussed in last month's edition. Therefore the fed funds target rate remains between zero and 0.25 percent. Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke has recently expressed concern on Capitol Hill that the projected massive government budget deficits could threaten financial stability. He told the House Budget Committee that, "Unless we demonstrate a strong commitment to fiscal sustainability in the longer term, we will have neither financial stability nor healthy economic growth." Most lawmakers and Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner seem to agree. Geithner has pledged to cut the deficit in the long term. At the same time, Bernanke expressed confidence in the Fed's own policies, saying that he is "comfortable with the policy actions that the Federal Reserve has taken... We are comfortable that we can exit from those policies at the appropriate time without inflationary consequences."

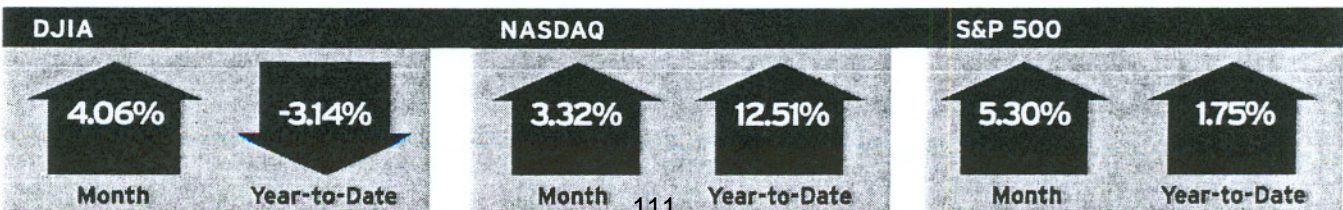
Sector Review

U.S. Treasuries: Treasuries had a difficult month as concerns rose regarding how much Treasury note supply was going to be issued throughout 2009. This, in part, caused prices to decrease along with apprehension that the government budget deficit may be difficult to address without the continued issuance of more debt. The 10-year note yield increased to a 3.50 percent yield from a 3.12 percent yield over the prior month. The two-year note yield edged upwards to a 0.92 percent yield from a 0.90 percent yield while the three-month bill saw yields remain priced at 0.13 percent, just as they were at the end of April. (Rates and prices maintain an inverse relationship. Prices decrease as yields increase).

Commercial Paper: Commercial paper (CP) and certificates of deposit (CDs) continued to realize some improvement in pricing as investors tried to stay ahead of the drop in the London Interbank Offered Rate (LIBOR). The decrease in LIBOR yields was in part attributable to the continued thawing of the credit markets, although some more challenged banks are still compelled to pay higher yield premiums for deposits than more economically stable banks. One-month, top-tier, higher quality asset-backed commercial paper (ABCP) names traded between 0.30 percent and 0.75 percent and three-month paper traded between 0.35 percent and 1.00 percent.

U.S. Government Agencies: Agency securities and government backed Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) paper continued to see some price improvements as investors moved to try and lock in as much yield in the six month to 12 month area of the curve as LIBOR continued to decrease in yield throughout the month. Agency yields at month-end on three-month paper yielded near 0.14 percent, six-month paper yielded 0.25 percent, and 12-month paper yielded 0.40 percent.

Strategy: The Federal Reserve continued to maintain its Federal Funds target range between 0.00 and 0.25 percent. While there are some subtle signs of reduced pressure on the economy, slow growth remains evident in the remaining quarters of 2009 (if any positive growth is achieved per estimates of certain Wall Street economists) as the recessionary environment continues. In this uniquely challenging environment we continue our focus on being highly defensive. We intend to do this by attempting to maintain ample cash while trying to be very selective in identifying approved issuers and implementing trade opportunities to add yield when possible that is available in the longer part of the money market curve.



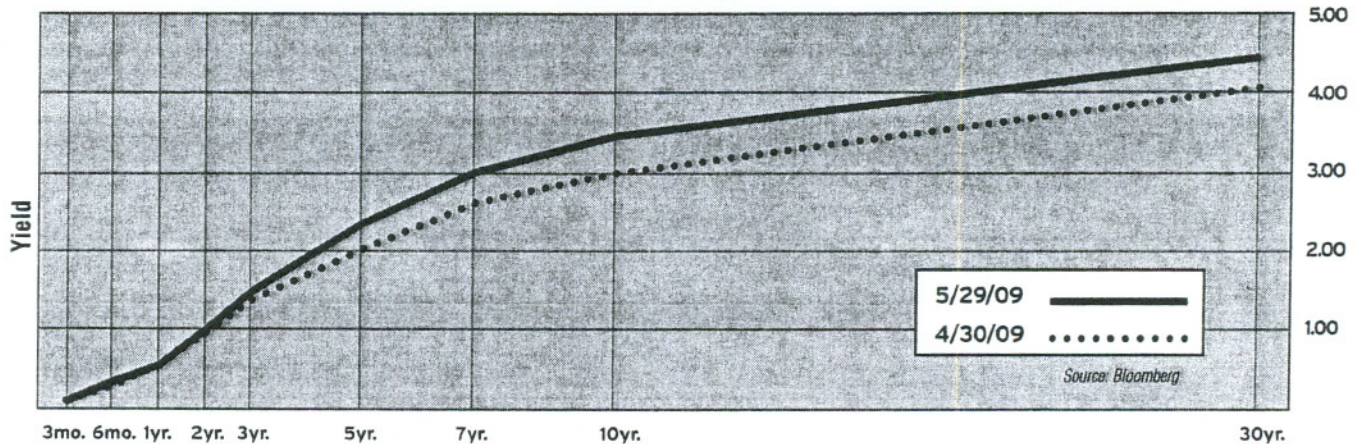

Historical Yield Curve

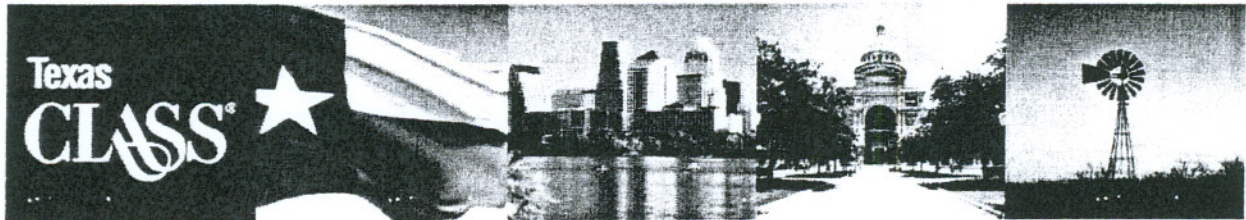

Economic and Market Commentary – April 30, 2009

Perhaps nothing better illustrates the nation's stunningly atypical economic environment than the fact that few investors anticipated or even noticed the Federal Reserve's regularly scheduled policy meeting in late April. After slashing benchmark interest rates to virtually zero late last year, the Fed is widely viewed as having run out of traditional monetary ammunition. Of course, the U.S. central bank is still a key player in the ongoing attempts to engineer an economic recovery through its daily market operations and numerous unconventional lending facilities.

Still, the cash yield curve is now influenced more by extraneous factors, some of which are of a temporary and technical nature. Last month, for example, Treasury and agency yields declined from already-skinny levels as broker-dealers and banks rushed to acquire government collateral ahead of a rule change set to take effect on May 1st that relates to so-called failed trades. The additional demand more than offset a bulge in supply and pushed yields on three-month Treasury paper down from 0.20% on March 31 to just 0.09% at the end of April. Agency securities experienced a similar drop in yields, especially at the longer end of the curve. These changes impacted the reinvestment rate for TexPool, whose gross yield fell to 0.49% from 0.60% at the end of March.

Libor rates also declined, partially in sympathy with trends in the government market but also due to a further easing of economic fears worldwide. One-month LIBOR fell by nine basis points to 0.41% while three-month Libor declined 17 basis points to about 1.00%. Not unexpectedly, lower LIBOR rates were evident in the drop in TexPool Prime's gross yield, which finished the month at 0.75% compared to 0.82% on March 31. Given our view that cash yields are likely to rebound modestly in coming weeks as the technical factors noted earlier subside, we trimmed average weighted maturities from 41 to 38 days in TexPool and from 38 days to 29 days in TexPool Prime.

On a macro level, we believe that the U.S. economy could emerge from recession somewhat earlier than had been previously believed. To be sure, the current economic data is not good — it is simply less bad. Yet there are scattered indications that suggest the deepest part of the recession has passed. In our view, however, the onset of a new monetary tightening cycle is not yet in sight, suggesting that cash yields will remain well below historical norms over the foreseeable future. As always, we will remain vigilant in monitoring changes to the still-fluid credit environment and are prepared to move quickly to protect principal and capitalize on opportunities.

Economic Commentary

Incoming data continue to suggest a significant abatement in the pace of contraction in economic activity, supporting Federal Reserve Chairman Bernanke's assertion that the economy is beginning to see "green shoots" of improvement. Among the more notable "green shoots" over the past month were: a substantial rise in consumer confidence, especially forward-looking expectations; marked improvement in manufacturing indicators; and more evidence of stabilization in housing activity. Home sales and housing starts may have possibly bottomed. Amidst monthly volatility, single family housing starts have essentially been unchanged since the beginning of the year; likewise for new and existing home sales. Rising affordability, driven largely by lower prices and lower rates, has apparently helped stabilize sales. However, the stability in sales has apparently come at huge price discounts, and much more foreclosure inventory lies in the pipeline. Also, the recent run up in Treasury yields, if it continues and lifts mortgage rates materially, would clearly be a source of downside risk to what is still a fragile housing market.

The outline for the path leading up to the end of the recession has long been one where consumer metrics start to improve, supported by temporary stimulus and gradually improving financial conditions. Better consumer spending and final demand leads to reduced business caution and ultimately to improved labor markets. Data over the past few months have been consistent with all but one element of this central theme: a measurable labor market recovery is yet to materialize.

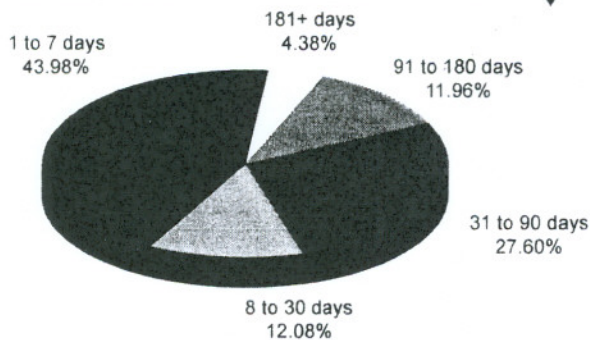
The combination of fiscal stimulus, reduced inventory cutbacks, reduced drag from housing, easier financial conditions, and the advanced stage of household balance sheet repair should gradually restore growth into positive territory in the second half of 2009. In essence, households will continue to increase savings in response to the \$16 trillion of wealth destruction seen over the six quarters up to first quarter 2009. Short of an improbable and very aggressive rebound in jobs and income and/or house and equity prices, continued household balance sheet repair will restrain consumer spending in the coming quarters. Financial conditions that are still tight are also expected to normalize only gradually. Growth in the range expected is low enough that the unemployment rate will keep rising into mid-2010, and disinflation will remain a key feature of the economic backdrop.

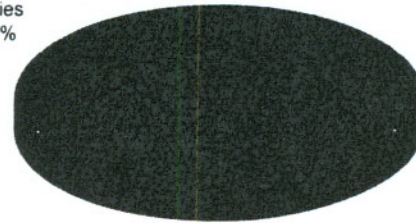

Portfolio by Type of Investment As of May 31, 2009



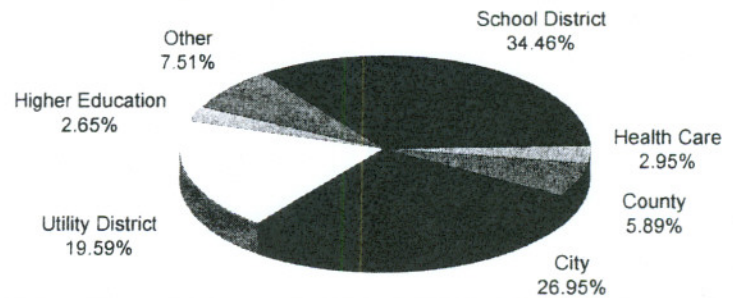
