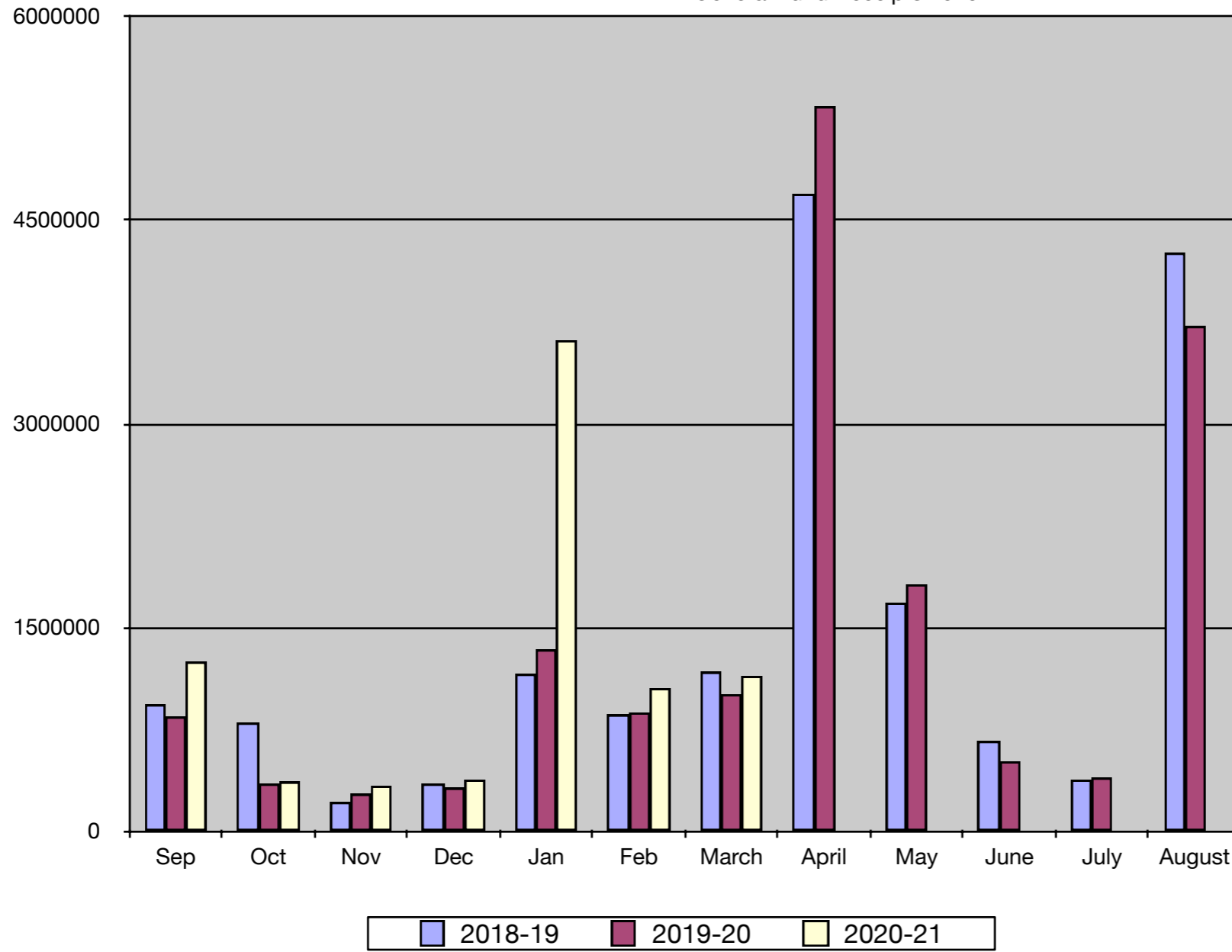
General Fund Balance 2020-21



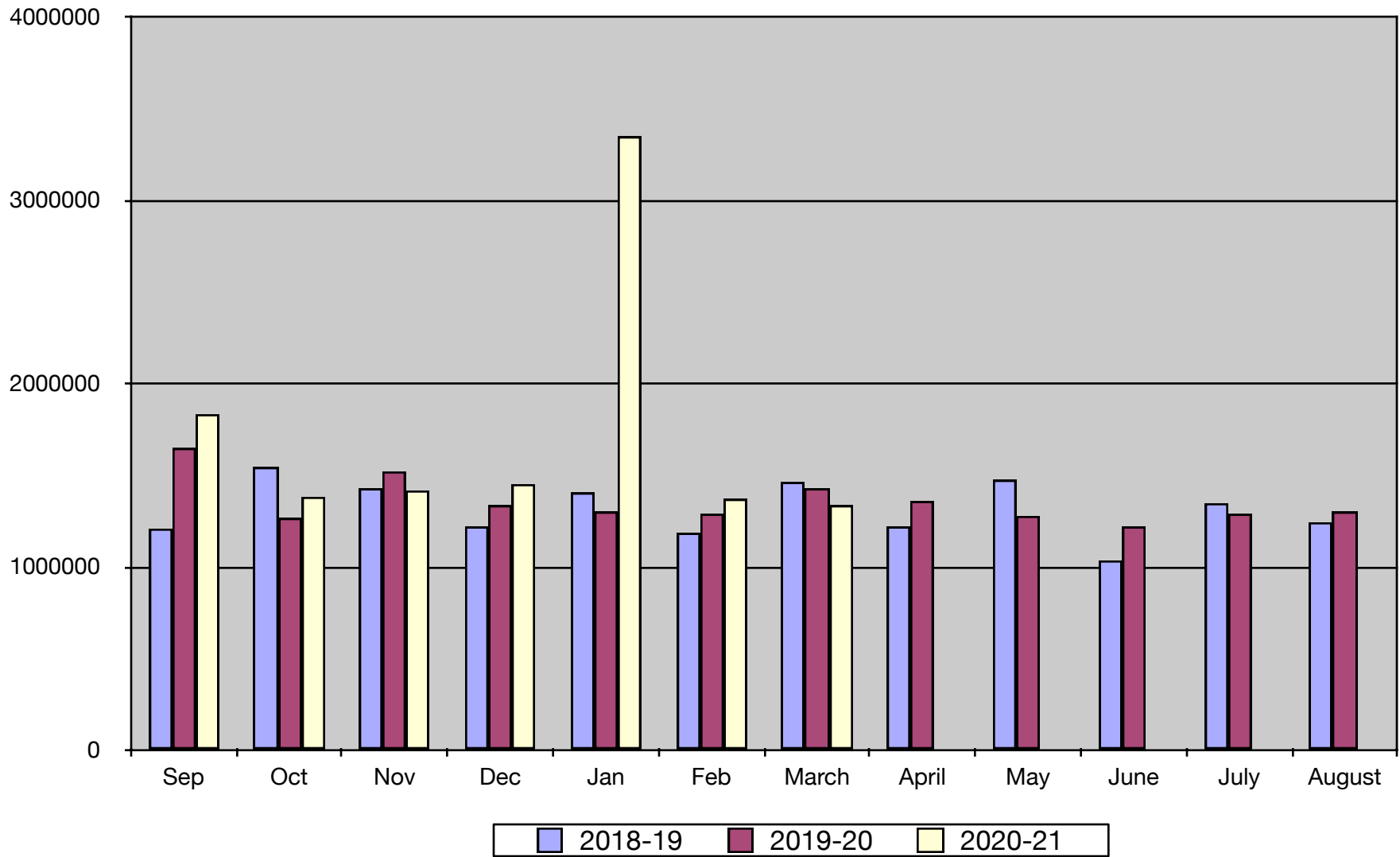
General Fund Tax Draws 2020-21

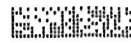

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SARPY COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT 0046 (SPRINGFIELD-PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS) IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sarpy County School District 0046 (Springfield-Platteview Community Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) previously issued its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2012, dated November 15, 2012, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$3,365,000 (the “**Series 2012 Bonds**”), of which \$840,000 in aggregate principal amount are presently outstanding. The District issued the Series 2012 Bonds pursuant to a resolution (the “**Series 2012 Resolution**”) adopted by the District’s Board of Education (the “**Board**”) for the purpose of (a) advance refunding a portion of the District’s outstanding General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2009, dated June 9, 2009 (the “**Series 2009 Bonds**”) and (b) paying certain costs of issuing the Series 2012 Bonds. The District issued the Series 2009 Bonds to refund the District’s outstanding General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2003, dated January 7, 2003 (the “**Series 2003 Bonds**”). The Series 2003 Bonds were authorized by the required majority of the qualified voters of the District at a special election held on October 1, 2002 and were issued for the purpose of paying the costs of constructing additions to and renovations of the District’s existing school facilities and providing for necessary furniture, equipment and apparatus for said facilities.

Section 2. As set forth in the Series 2012 Resolution, the Series 2012 Bonds maturing on December 15, 2017 and thereafter are subject to redemption and prepayment at any time on or after November 15, 2017, as a whole or in part, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2012 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date of redemption.

Section 3. Subject to the conditions set forth herein, the Board hereby authorizes the redemption of the following outstanding Series 2012 Bonds (the “**Refunded Bonds**”) on such date (the “**Redemption Date**”) as shall be determined by the President of the Board or the Superintendent of Schools (each, including any person authorized to act on his or her behalf, an “**Authorized Officer**”), all in accordance with redemption provisions set forth in the Series 2012 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease:

Any Authorized Officer may determine that one or more maturities of the Refunded Bonds listed above shall not be redeemed on the Redemption Date. Such determinations shall be set forth in a certificate of such Authorized Officer.

Section 4. On the Redemption Date, the principal of the Refunded Bonds, together with all accrued interest to but not including the Redemption Date, shall be paid upon presentation and surrender thereof at the corporate trust office of Union Bank and Trust Company, Lincoln, Nebraska, as paying agent and registrar for the Refunded Bonds (the “**Registrar**”).

Section 5. In accordance with the Series 2012 Resolution:

(a) not later than 35 days prior to the Redemption Date (or such other date as may be acceptable to the Registrar), the Authorized Officers, or each individually, are hereby directed to file a copy of this Resolution with the Registrar; and

(b) upon receipt of this Resolution, the Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice of the redemption of the Refunded Bonds to each registered owner thereof not less than 30 days prior to the Redemption Date (or such shorter period as may be acceptable to the then registered owners of the Refunded Bonds); and

(c) not later than 10 business days following its mailing of the redemption notice, the Registrar is further directed to file such redemption notice with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board and its EMMA portal.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage as provided by law. The redemption of the Refunded Bonds authorized by this Resolution is subject to the prior issuance by the District of its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2021B (the “**Refunding Bonds**”). This Resolution shall have no force and effect if the Refunding Bonds are not issued within one year of the date hereof.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE BY SARPY COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT 0046 (SPRINGFIELD-PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS) IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA OF ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2021B, IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$900,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF REFUNDING CERTAIN OUTSTANDING BONDS OF THE DISTRICT; PRESCRIBING THE FORM AND DETAILS OF SUCH BONDS; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN OFFICIALS TO DETERMINE THE FINAL AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT, MATURITIES, RATES, REDEMPTION PROVISIONS, TERMS AND OTHER DETAILS OF SUCH BONDS; IMPOSING AN AD VALOREM TAX ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE DISTRICT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND THE INTEREST ON SUCH BONDS; DESIGNATING THE BONDS AS QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS; AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER THEREOF; ADOPTING CERTAIN POST-ISSUANCE TAX COMPLIANCE AND DISCLOSURE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES WITH RESPECT TO THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS AND DOCUMENTS; AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SARPY COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT 0046 (SPRINGFIELD-PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS) IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA:

Section 1. The Board of Education (the “**Board**”) of Sarpy County School District 0046 (Springfield-Platteview Community Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) hereby makes the following findings and determinations:

(a) The District is duly organized as a Class III School District under Sections 79-102 and 79-407, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended; the District maintains both elementary and high school grades under the direction of a single board of education; and the District embraces territory having a population of not more than 150,000 inhabitants.

(b) The District previously issued its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2012, dated November 15, 2012, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$3,365,000 (the “**Series 2012 Bonds**”), of which \$840,000 in aggregate principal amount are presently outstanding. The District issued the Series 2012 Bonds pursuant to a resolution (the “**Series 2012 Resolution**”) adopted by the Board for the purpose of (a) advance refunding a portion of the District’s outstanding General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2009, dated June 9, 2009 (the “**Series 2009 Bonds**”) and (b) paying certain costs of issuing the Series 2012 Bonds. The District issued the Series 2009 Bonds to refund the District’s outstanding General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2003, dated January 7, 2003 (the “**Series 2003 Bonds**”). The Series 2003 Bonds were authorized by the required majority of the qualified voters of the District at a special election held on October

1, 2002 and were issued for the purpose of paying the costs of constructing additions to and renovations of the District's existing school facilities and providing for necessary furniture, equipment and apparatus for said facilities.

(c) As set forth in the Series 2012 Resolution, the Series 2012 Bonds maturing on December 15, 2017 and thereafter are subject to redemption and prepayment at any time on or after November 15, 2017, as a whole or in part, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2012 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date of redemption.

(d) Since the issuance of the Series 2012 Bonds, the rates of interest available in the markets have declined such that the District can effect a savings in interest costs by providing for payment of all or part of the Series 2012 Bonds through the issuance of its general obligation refunding bonds pursuant to Sections 10-142 and 10-717 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (collectively, the "Act").

(e) By resolution of the Board adopted on April 12, 2021, the District has duly authorized the redemption of all or a portion of the outstanding Series 2012 Bonds maturing on December 15, 2021 and thereafter (the "**Refunded Bonds**") on such date as may be determined by an Authorized Officer in accordance with such resolution (the "**Redemption Date**") of the Refunded Bonds, together with all interest accrued to such date, all in accordance with redemption provisions set forth in the Series 2012 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease. Any Series 2012 Bonds not constituting Refunded Bonds shall be paid upon maturity thereof. The redemption of the Refunded Bonds is conditioned upon and subject to the District's issuance of the refunding bonds described herein.

(f) The District has on hand no debt service or other sinking fund moneys for the payment of principal and interest on the Refunded Bonds other than moneys, if any, which are to be deposited in accordance with Section 7 of this Resolution.

(g) To provide funds for the redemption of the Refunded Bonds, it is necessary and advisable that the District issue its general obligation refunding bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Act, which bonds will be payable from a tax to be levied against the taxable property of the District.

(h) It is necessary that the District adopt (i) policies and procedures to satisfy all applicable requirements of federal income tax law in order to preserve, post-issuance, the tax-exempt status of the bonds described herein and (ii) policies and procedures to satisfy the issuance and post-issuance disclosure requirements of Rule 15c2-12 (as described herein).

(i) All conditions, acts, and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to the issuance of bonds pursuant to the Act do exist and have been done as required by law.

Section 2. (a) The Board hereby authorizes the issuance and delivery of one or more series of the District's negotiable general obligation refunding bonds in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000), designated as "General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2021B" (the "**Series 2021B Bonds**"), or such other designation as shall be made by the President of the Board and the Superintendent of Schools (each, including any person authorized to act on their behalf, an "**Authorized Officer**"), or each individually. Unless otherwise determined by an Authorized Officer, the Bonds shall mature and shall bear interest calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months from the date of original issue or the most recent Interest Payment Date, whichever is later, until maturity or early redemption, shall be issued only as fully registered bonds, without coupons, on the books of the Registrar and Paying Agent designated herein (the "**Registrar**") in denominations of \$5,000 or whole multiples thereof not exceeding the principal amount due on a given date of maturity, and shall be numbered consecutively from one upward in order of issuance.

(b) The Authorized Officers, or each individually, are authorized and directed, in the exercise of such officer's independent judgment and absolute discretion, to hereafter, from time to time, specify, set, designate, determine, establish and appoint with respect to each series of Series 2021B Bonds herein authorized, as the case may be, and in each case in accordance with and subject to the provisions of this Resolution: (i) the dated date and the delivery date, (ii) the aggregate principal amount to be issued, not exceeding the aggregate principal amount set forth in this Section 2, (iii) the dates and years in which each principal maturity shall occur and the principal amount to mature or to be paid in each of such years, which shall not be later than December 15, 2022, (iv) the date or dates upon which such series shall be sold, which shall not be later than one year from the date of this Resolution, (v) the rate or rates of interest to be carried by each maturity of the Series 2021B Bonds, provided that such rates generate positive debt service savings, (vi) the method by which such rate or rates of interest shall be calculated, (vii) the dates on which interest shall be paid, (viii) the redemption dates and prices and all terms relating thereto, including the amount and maturity date of any Series 2021B Bonds issued as "term bonds" and the amount of each sinking fund installment therefor, and all terms relating thereto, if any, (ix) the form, content, terms and provisions of any bond purchase agreement entered into by the District with an Underwriter or any loan agreement between the District and the Lender, all as set forth in Section 6 hereof, (x) the identity of the Underwriter, the Placement Agent or the Lender of the Series 2021B Bonds, as applicable (each, a "**Purchaser**"), in accordance with Section 6 hereof, (xi) the fee of the Purchaser, which shall not be more than 2.00% of the aggregate principal amount of each series, (xii) the purchase price, which shall not be less than 97.00% of the aggregate principal amount of each series (inclusive of the Purchaser's discount and any original issue discount), (xiii) the form and contents of any preliminary and final official statement or other offering materials of the District utilized in connection with any offering or sale of each series to the public or of any term sheet or request for lenders in connection with any loan, (xiv) the identity of the Registrar, (xv) the form, content, terms, and provisions of any closing and other documentation executed and delivered by the District in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of each series and (xvi) all of the other terms relating to each series not otherwise determined or fixed by the provisions of this Resolution.

(c) (i) The Series 2021B Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity as determined by an Authorized Officer, as a whole, or in part in such principal amounts and from such maturity or maturities as the District in its sole and absolute discretion shall

determine, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount so redeemed, together with the interest accrued thereon to the date fixed for redemption, with or without a premium as may be determined by such Authorized Officer. If less than all Series 2021B Bonds of any maturity are to be called for redemption pursuant to this Resolution, the Registrar shall select by lot the particular Series 2021B Bonds of such maturity to be redeemed.

(ii) Any Authorized Officer may designate in a certificate certain Series 2021B Bonds as “**Term Bonds**”, portions of which are to be redeemed on such dates of the years (each such date being herein referred to as a “**Sinking Fund Payment Date**”) and in the amounts (hereinafter referred to as a “**Mandatory Sinking Fund Payment**”) set forth in such certificate. The Registrar shall select and call for redemption, in accordance with this subsection (c), from the Term Bonds the amounts specified by the Authorized Officer in the certificate, and the Term Bonds selected by the Registrar shall become due and payable on such date. If Term Bonds are redeemed at the option of the District pursuant to Section 2(c)(i), the Term Bonds so optionally redeemed may, at the option of the District, be applied as a credit against any subsequent Mandatory Sinking Fund Payment with respect to Term Bonds otherwise to be redeemed thereby, such credit to be equal to the principal amount of such Term Bonds redeemed pursuant to Section 2(c)(i), provided that the District shall have delivered to the Registrar not less than 45 days prior to such Sinking Fund Payment Date a District certificate stating its election to apply such Term Bonds as such a credit. In such case, the Registrar shall reduce the amount of Term Bonds to be redeemed on the Sinking Fund Payment Date specified in such District certificate by the principal amount of Term Bonds so redeemed pursuant to Section 2(c)(i). Any credit given to Mandatory Sinking Fund Payments pursuant to Section 2(c)(i) shall not affect any subsequent Mandatory Sinking Fund Payments, which shall remain payable as otherwise provided in this subsection (c), unless and until another credit is given in accordance with the provisions hereof.

(iii) Series 2021B Bonds subject to redemption shall be redeemed in denominations of \$5,000. If any Series 2021B Bond is in a denomination in excess of \$5,000, portions of the principal amount thereof in installments of \$5,000 or any whole multiple thereof may be redeemed, and if less than all of the principal amount thereof is to be redeemed, in such case upon the surrender of such Series 2021B Bonds there shall be issued to the registered owner thereof without charge therefor, for the then unredeemed balance of the principal amount thereof, Series 2021B Bonds of like series, maturity and interest rates in any of the authorized denominations provided by this Resolution.

(iv) The Registrar shall give notice of redemption of Series 2021B Bonds stating their designation, date, maturity, principal amounts and the redemption date by mailing such notice via first-class mail, postage prepaid, not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the registered owners (or such shorter period as may be acceptable to the then registered owners) at their most recent addresses appearing upon the books of the Registrar. Failure to give notice to any particular registered owner or any defect in the notice given to such owner shall not affect the validity of the proceedings calling the Series 2021B Bonds or the redemption of any Series 2021B Bonds for which proper notice has been given. Notice of redemption need not be given to the holder of any Series 2021B Bonds, whether registered or not, who has waived notice of redemption. Notice of redemption having been

given as provided above or notice of redemption having been waived by the owners of Series 2021B Bonds called for redemption who have not been given such notice as provided above, the Series 2021B Bonds so called for redemption shall become due and payable on the designated redemption date. The District shall give written notice to the Registrar of its election to redeem Series 2021B Bonds at least 45 days prior to the said redemption date, or such shorter period as shall be acceptable to the Registrar. If on or before the said redemption date funds sufficient to pay the Series 2021B Bonds so called for redemption at the applicable redemption price and accrued interest to said date have been deposited or caused to have been deposited by the District with the Registrar for the purposes of such payment and notice of redemption thereof has been given or waived as hereinbefore provided, then from and after the date fixed for redemption interest on such Series 2021B Bonds so called shall cease to accrue and become payable. If such funds shall not have been so deposited with the Registrar as aforesaid no later than the date fixed for redemption, such call for redemption shall be cancelled, and the Series 2021B Bonds so called for redemption shall continue to be outstanding as though they had not been so called; such Series 2021B Bonds shall continue to bear interest until paid at such rate as they would have borne had they not been called for redemption and shall continue to be protected by this Resolution and entitled to the benefits and security hereof.

(d) Interest on the Series 2021B Bonds at the respective rates for each maturity is payable on each interest payment date determined in accordance with this Section 2 (each of said dates, an “**Interest Payment Date**”) by check or draft mailed by the Registrar or its successor on such Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2021B Bond at such registered owner’s address as it appears on the bond register maintained by the Registrar or its successor as of the close of business on the 15th day (whether or not a business day) immediately preceding each Interest Payment Date (the “**Record Date**”) subject to the provisions of the following paragraph. The principal on the Series 2021B Bonds and the interest due at maturity or upon redemption prior to maturity is payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners thereof upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2021B Bonds to the Registrar at its designated corporate trust office.

If any payments of interest due on the Series 2021B Bonds on an Interest Payment Date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the Series 2021B Bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Registrar whenever moneys for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest become available.

If the date for payment of the principal of or the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which banking institutions in the city in which the designated corporate trust office of the Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal payment date.

(e) The Series 2021B Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the District by the manual or facsimile signatures of the President and the Secretary of the Board (including such other persons

authorized to sign on their behalf). In case any officer whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Series 2021B Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of any Series 2021B Bonds, such signature or facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery. Notwithstanding such execution, no Series 2021B Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or entitled to any security or benefit under this Resolution unless and until a certificate of authentication on such Series 2021B Bond has been duly executed by the manual signature of an authorized representative of the Registrar. Certificates of authentication on different Series 2021B Bonds need not be signed by the same representative. The executed certificate of authentication on each Series 2021B Bond shall be conclusive evidence that it has been authenticated and delivered under this Resolution.

(f) If any Series 2021B Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed, the District shall execute a new Series 2021B Bond of like date, maturity and denomination to that mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, provided that, in the case of any mutilated Series 2021B Bond, such mutilated Series 2021B Bond shall first be surrendered to the Registrar and, in the case of any lost, stolen, or destroyed Series 2021B Bonds, there first shall be furnished to the Registrar evidence of such loss, theft, or destruction satisfactory to the Registrar, together with an indemnity satisfactory to it. If such Series 2021B Bond shall have matured, instead of issuing a duplicate Series 2021B Bond, the District may pay the same without surrender thereof upon the performance of such requirements as it deems fit for its protection, including a lost instrument bond. The District and the Registrar may charge the owner of such Series 2021B Bond with their reasonable fees and expenses for such service.

(g) Unless otherwise directed by the Purchaser, the Series 2021B Bonds shall be issued initially as “book-entry-only” bonds under the services of The Depository Trust Company (the “**Depository**”), with one typewritten bond per maturity being issued to the Depository. In such connection the officers of the District are authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representations (the “**Letter of Representations**”) in the form required by the Depository, for and on behalf of the District, which shall thereafter govern matters with respect to registration, transfer, payment and redemption of the Series 2021B Bonds. If the Series 2021B Bonds are issued as “book-entry-only” bonds, the following provisions shall apply:

(i) The District and the Registrar shall have no responsibility or obligation to any broker-dealer, bank or other financial institution for which the Depository holds Series 2021B Bonds as securities depository (each, a “**Bond Participant**”) or to any person who is an actual purchaser of a Series 2021B Bond from a Bond Participant while the Series 2021B Bonds are in book-entry form (each a “**Beneficial Owner**”) with respect to the following:

(A) the accuracy of the records of the Depository, any nominees of the Depository or any Bond Participant with respect to any ownership interest in the Series 2021B Bonds,

(B) the delivery to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any notice with respect to the Series 2021B Bonds, including any notice of redemption, or

(C) the payment to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any amount with respect to the Series 2021B Bonds. The Registrar shall make payments with respect to the Series 2021B Bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository or its nominee, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the obligations with respect to such Series 2021B Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No person other than the Depository shall receive an authenticated Series 2021B Bond, except as provided in (v) below.

(ii) Upon receipt by the Registrar of written notice from the Depository to the effect that the Depository is unable or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange Series 2021B Bonds requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts. Whenever the Depository requests the Registrar to do so, the Registrar will cooperate with the Depository in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (A) to arrange, with the prior written consent of the District, for a substitute depository willing and able upon reasonable and customary terms to maintain custody of the Series 2021B Bonds or (B) to make available Series 2021B Bonds registered in whatever name or names as the Beneficial Owners transferring or exchanging such Series 2021B Bonds shall designate.

(iii) If the District determines that it is desirable that certificates representing the Series 2021B Bonds be delivered to the ultimate beneficial owners of the Series 2021B Bonds and so notifies the Registrar in writing, the Registrar shall so notify the Depository, whereupon the Depository will notify the Bond Participants of the availability through the Depository of bond certificates representing the Series 2021B Bonds. In such event, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates representing the Series 2021B Bonds as requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts and in authorized denominations.

(iv) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution to the contrary, so long as any Series 2021B Bond is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such Series 2021B Bond and all notices with respect to such Series 2021B Bond shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.

(v) Registered ownership of the Series 2021B Bonds may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Registrar, and the Series 2021B Bonds may be delivered in physical form to the following:

(A) any successor securities depository or its nominee; or

(B) any person, upon (I) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (II) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section and the terms of the Registrar and Paying Agent's Agreement.

(vi) In the event of any partial redemption of a Series 2021B Bond unless and until such partially redeemed Series 2021B Bond has been replaced in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, the books and records of the Registrar shall govern and establish the principal amount of such Series 2021B Bonds as is then outstanding and all of the Series 2021B Bonds issued to the Depository or its nominee shall contain a legend to such effect.

If for any reason the Depository resigns and is not replaced, the District shall immediately provide a supply of printed bond certificates, duly executed by manual or facsimile signatures of the President and Secretary of the Board, for issuance upon the transfers from the Depository and subsequent transfers or in the event of partial redemption. If such supply of certificates shall be insufficient to meet the requirements of the Registrar for issuance of replacement certificates upon transfer or partial redemption, the District agrees to order printed an additional supply of such certificates and to direct their execution by manual or facsimile signatures of its then duly qualified and acting President and Secretary of the Board.

Section 3. (a) The Registrar designated pursuant to Section 2(b) hereof shall serve in the capacities of registrar and paying agent under the terms of an agreement entitled “**Registrar and Paying Agent Agreement**” between the District and the Registrar; provided, however, that if the District Treasurer is designated as Registrar, then the District and the District Treasurer need not enter into a Registrar and Paying Agent Agreement. The Authorized Officers, or each individually, or such other officer of the Board or the District is hereby authorized to execute said agreement in such form as such officer shall deem appropriate or necessary. The Registrar shall have only such duties and obligations as are expressly specified by this Resolution and the Registrar and Paying Agent Agreement, and no other duties or obligations shall be implied to the Registrar, except as may be set forth in a written agreement between the District and a successor Registrar.

(b) The District reserves the right to remove the Registrar upon 30 days’ notice and upon the appointment of a successor Registrar, in which event the predecessor Registrar shall deliver all cash and Series 2021B Bonds in its possession to the successor Registrar and shall deliver the bond register to the successor Registrar. The Authorized Officers, or each individually, are authorized to remove the Registrar as provided herein if such officer determines such removal is in the best interest of the District. Upon such removal, the Authorized Officers, or each individually, are authorized to appoint a successor Registrar and to execute a Registrar and Paying Agent Agreement with such successor Registrar in a form substantially similar to that approved by the Board pursuant to this Resolution, but with such changes as such officer shall deem appropriate or necessary.

(c) The Registrar shall keep and maintain for the District books for the registration and transfer of the Series 2021B Bonds at its designated corporate trust office. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Series 2021B Bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Series 2021B Bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the office of the Registrar by surrender of such Series 2021B Bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to the Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner’s duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Registrar on behalf of the District will deliver at such office (or send by registered mail to the transferee

owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of the transferee owner or owners, a new Series 2021B Bond or Series 2021B Bonds of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity, bearing numbers not contemporaneously then outstanding. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the Series 2021B Bonds by this Resolution, one Series 2021B Bond may be transferred for several such Series 2021B Bonds of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such Series 2021B Bonds may be transferred for one or several such Series 2021B Bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a Series 2021B Bond, the surrendered Series 2021B Bond shall be canceled and destroyed. The Registrar may impose a charge sufficient to defray all costs and expenses incident to registrations of transfer and exchanges. In each case the Registrar shall require the payment by the owner requesting exchange or transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer. Series 2021B Bonds issued upon transfer or exchange of Series 2021B Bonds shall be dated as of the date six months preceding the Interest Payment Date next following the date of registration thereof in the office of the Registrar, unless such date of registration shall be an Interest Payment Date, in which case they shall be dated as of such date of registration; provided, however, that if, as shown by the records of the Registrar, interest on the Series 2021B Bonds shall be in default, the Series 2021B Bonds issued in lieu of Series 2021B Bonds surrendered for transfer or exchange may be dated as of the date to which interest has been paid in full on the Series 2021B Bonds surrendered; and provided further, that if the date of registration shall be prior to the first Interest Payment Date, the Series 2021B Bonds shall be dated as of their date of original issue. All Series 2021B Bonds issued upon transfer of the Series 2021B Bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the District evidencing the same obligations as the Series 2021B Bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this Resolution to the same extent as the Series 2021B Bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The District and the Registrar shall not be required to transfer any Series 2021B Bond during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following Interest Payment Date or to transfer any Series 2021B Bond called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

(d) The Registrar shall also be responsible for making the payments of principal, premium, if any, and interest as the same fall due upon the Series 2021B Bonds from funds provided by the District for such purposes. Payments of interest due upon the Series 2021B Bonds prior to maturity or redemption shall be made by the Registrar by mailing a check in the amount due for such interest on each Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2021B Bond to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration as required to be maintained under this Section 3. Payments of principal due at maturity or at any date fixed for redemption prior to maturity, together with any accrued interest then due and premium thereon, if any, shall be made by the Registrar upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2021B Bond. As provided in Section 11 hereof, on or before each principal or interest due date, without further order of the Board, the Treasurer of the Board or an Authorized Officer shall transmit from the Bond Fund (hereinafter established) to the Registrar money sufficient for payment of all principal, premium, if any, and interest then due. The District and the Registrar may treat the registered owner of any Series 2021B Bond as the absolute owner of such Series 2021B Bond for purposes of making payments thereon and for all other purposes. All payments on account of interest, principal or premium, if any, made to the registered owner of any Series 2021B Bond shall be valid and

effectual and shall be a discharge of the District and the Registrar in respect of the liability upon the Series 2021B Bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

The issuance of the Bonds has been duly authorized pursuant to Sections 10-142 and 10-717 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, and a resolution duly adopted by the Board of Education of the District (the "Bond Resolution"). The District issued the Refunded Bonds to refinance the certain of its outstanding indebtedness that was used to finance the costs of constructing, improving, equipping and furnishing certain of the District's existing school facilities following approval by the voters at a bond election held pursuant to Section 10-701 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended.

The Bonds are issued as fully registered bonds, without coupons, in denominations of \$5,000 or whole multiples thereof. Subject to the limitations and upon payment of the charges provided in the Bond Resolution pursuant to which the Bonds have been issued, this Bond is transferable by the Registered Owner hereof or his or her attorney duly authorized in writing, at the office of the Registrar, but only in the manner, subject to the limitations and upon payment of the charges as set forth in the Bond Resolution, upon surrender and cancellation of this Bond. Upon such transfer, a new registered Bond or Bonds of the same maturity and of authorized denomination or denominations for the same aggregate principal amount will be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor. The District and the Registrar may deem and treat the Registered Owner hereof as the absolute owner hereof (whether or not this Bond shall be overdue) for the purpose of receiving payment of or on account of principal hereof and premium, if any, and interest due hereon and for all other purposes, and neither the District nor the Registrar shall be affected by any notice to the contrary.

[The Bonds are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities.]

[The Bonds maturing on or prior to December 15, 20__ are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. Section 5. (a) After being executed by the President and the Secretary of the Board in accordance with Section 2(e) hereof, the Series 2021B Bonds shall be delivered to the Registrar for registration and authentication. The Authorized Officers, or each individually, are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to effect the delivery of the Series 2021B Bonds to the Registrar and then to the Purchaser, inclusive of the power and authority to execute such orders, certificates, receipts and other documents as may be necessary or desirable to effect such delivery and to receive the purchase price for the Bonds.

(b) The Superintendent of Schools is directed to make and certify a transcript of the proceedings of the District precedent to the issuance of the Series 2021B Bonds, which transcript shall be delivered to the Purchaser of the Series 2021B Bonds.

(c) The Authorized Officers, or each individually, shall certify to the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts the taxable valuation, the number of children of school age residing in the District and the total bonded indebtedness of the District.

Section 6. (a) The District is authorized to sell the Series 2021B Bonds to D.A. Davidson & Co., as original purchaser of the Series 2021B Bonds (the “**Underwriter**”), in accordance with Section 2 of this Resolution. Delivery of the Series 2021B Bonds shall be made to the Underwriter as soon as practicable after the adoption of this Resolution, upon payment therefor in accordance with the terms of sale. The District is authorized to enter into a Bond Purchase Agreement (the “**Purchase Agreement**”) between the District and the Underwriter in form and substance acceptable to the Authorized Officers, or each individually. Such Authorized Officer is authorized to execute the Purchase Agreement, in form and substance acceptable to such Authorized Officer, for and on behalf of the District, such officer’s signature thereon being conclusive evidence of such official’s and the District’s approval thereof. The Underwriter shall have the right to direct the registration of the Series 2021B Bonds and the denominations thereof within each maturity, subject to the restrictions of this Resolution. Such Underwriter and its agents, representatives and counsel (including bond counsel) are hereby authorized to take such actions on behalf of the District as are necessary to effectuate the closing of the issuance and sale of the Series 2021B Bonds, including, without limitation, authorizing the release of the Series 2021B Bonds by the Depository at closing.

(b) The District is further authorized to place the Series 2021B Bonds with a private purchaser (the “**Private Purchaser**”) with the assistance of D.A. Davidson & Co., as placement agent of the Series 2021B Bonds (the “**Placement Agent**”), in accordance with Section 2 of this Resolution. The Private Purchaser shall have the right to direct the registration of the Series 2021B Bonds and the denominations thereof within each maturity, subject to the restrictions of this Resolution. The Placement Agent and its agents, representatives and counsel (including bond counsel) are hereby authorized to take such actions on behalf of the District as are necessary to effectuate the closing of the issuance and placement of the Series 2021B Bonds.

(c) The District is further authorized to (i) issue the Series 2021B Bonds directly to a bank or other institutional lender (the “**Lender**”) to evidence or secure a loan from such Lender to the District or (ii) enter into a loan agreement with a Lender in lieu of issuing the Series 2021B Bonds, in accordance with Section 2 of this Resolution and subject to the other restrictions of this Resolution. Such Lender may be identified with the assistance of the Placement Agent. The Lender shall have the right to direct the registration of the Series 2021B Bonds and the denominations thereof within each maturity, subject to the restrictions of this Resolution. The Placement Agent and its agents, representatives and counsel (including bond counsel) are hereby authorized to take such actions on behalf of the District as are necessary to effectuate the closing of the issuance of the Series 2021B Bonds.

Section 7. (a) Proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds, together with funds of the District held for the payment of the Refunded Bonds and other District moneys, if necessary, shall be deposited with Union Bank and Trust Company, Lincoln, Nebraska, as registrar and paying agent with respect to the Refunded Bonds (the “**Refunded Bonds Registrar**”), to be applied to redeem the Refunded Bonds on the Redemption Date at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest on such principal amount to the Redemption Date. If requested by the Purchaser, such moneys may be deposited with an escrow agent acceptable to the District and the Purchaser prior to their deposit with the Refunded Bonds Registrar. The District hereby covenants and agrees to take all steps necessary and appropriate to provide for the calling and redemption of the Refunded Bonds on the Redemption Date.

(b) Accrued interest, if any, received upon closing of the Series 2021B Bonds shall be deposited in the Bond Fund described herein and applied to interest falling due on the Series 2021B Bonds on the first Interest Payment Date.

(c) Proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds may be disbursed by the District to pay the costs of issuing the Series 2021B Bonds. The District may also pay such costs from its general fund.

Section 8. The holders of the Series 2021B Bonds shall be subrogated to all rights of the holders of the Refunded Bonds as described in this Resolution, except for their rights to payment from the deposit with respect to the Refunded Bonds as described in Section 7 hereof.

Section 9. The Series 2021B Bonds shall be direct, general obligations of the District, and the District irrevocably pledges the full faith and credit and the taxing power of the District, including the special levy of taxes described in this Section 9 and all receipts therefrom, to the

prompt payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds as the same become due. The District represents, warrants and covenants that it shall cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes on all the taxable property in the District, without limitation as to rate or amount, sufficient to pay the interest on, premium, if any, and the principal of the Series 2021B Bonds as and when such interest, premium, and principal, respectively, become due, which taxes shall be in excess of and in addition to all other taxes now or hereafter authorized to be levied by the District. Such tax levy and all receipts therefrom to all payments due on the Series 2021B Bonds are pledged to the payment of debt service on the Series 2021B Bonds. The District further agrees to direct the application of such tax levy moneys held by the County Treasurer of Sarpy County and the county treasurer of any other county in which portions of the District may lie to the payment of the Series 2021B Bonds so that not later than each maturity date and/or Interest Payment Date with respect to the Series 2021B Bonds, there shall be on hand with the Registrar sufficient funds to make the payments of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Series 2021B Bonds as they fall due.

Section 10. (a) The District hereby establishes a 2021 Bond Fund of the District (the “**Bond Fund**”), into which there shall be deposited as and when received all proceeds of the tax levy described in Section 9 hereof. So long as any Series 2021B Bonds are outstanding, all amounts paid and credited to the Bond Fund shall be expended and used by the District for the sole purpose of paying the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Series 2021B Bonds as and when the same become due, including any redemption date, and paying the usual and customary fees and expenses of the Registrar.

(b) The District Treasurer or any Authorized Officer is authorized and directed to withdraw from the Bond Fund and forward to the Registrar sums sufficient to pay principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Series 2021B Bonds as and when the same become due, and also to pay the charges made by the Registrar for acting in such capacity in the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds, and the charges shall be forwarded to the Registrar over and above the amount of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Series 2021B Bonds. If, through the lapse of time, or otherwise, the owners of Series 2021B Bonds shall no longer be entitled to enforce payment of their obligations, it shall be the duty of the Registrar to return the funds to the District. All moneys deposited with the Registrar shall be deemed to be deposited in accordance with and subject to all of the provisions contained in this Resolution.

(c) Any moneys or investments remaining in the Bond Fund after the payment or the defeasance of all the Series 2021B Bonds shall be transferred to the general fund of the District.

Section 11. (a) The District covenants and agrees that (i) it will comply with all applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “**Code**”), including Sections 103 and 141 through 150, necessary to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds and (ii) it will not use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds or any other funds of the District nor take or permit any other action, or fail to take any action, if any such action or failure to take action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds. In addition, the District will adopt such other resolutions and take such other actions as may be necessary to comply with the Code and with all other applicable future laws, regulations, published rulings and judicial decisions, in order to ensure that the interest on the Series 2021B Bonds will

remain excluded from federal gross income, to the extent any such actions can be taken by the District.

(b) The District covenants and agrees that (i) it will comply with all requirements of Section 148 of the Code to the extent applicable to the Series 2021B Bonds, (ii) it will use the proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds as soon as practicable and with all reasonable dispatch for the purposes for which the Series 2021B Bonds are issued, and (iii) it will not invest or directly or indirectly use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds or any other funds of the District in any manner, or take or omit to take any action, that would cause the Series 2021B Bonds to be “arbitrage bonds” within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code.

(c) The District covenants and agrees that it will pay or provide for the payment from time to time of all amounts required to be rebated to the United States of America pursuant to Section 148(f) of the Code and any Treasury Regulations applicable to the Series 2021B Bonds from time to time. This covenant shall survive payment in full or defeasance of the Series 2021B Bonds. The District specifically covenants to pay or cause to be paid to the United States of America the required amounts of rebatable arbitrage at the times and in the amounts as determined by its Federal Tax Certificate. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Federal Tax Certificate may be amended or replaced if, in the opinion of counsel nationally recognized on the subject of municipal bonds, such amendment or replacement will not adversely affect the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the Series 2021B Bonds.

(d) The District covenants and agrees that (to the extent within its power or direction) it will not use any portion of the proceeds of the Series 2021B Bonds, including any investment income earned on such proceeds, directly or indirectly, in a manner that would cause any Series 2021B Bond to be a “private activity bond”.

(e) The District makes the following representations in connection with the exception for small governmental units from the arbitrage rebate requirements under Section 148(f)(4)(D) of the Code:

(i) the District is a governmental unit under Nebraska law with general taxing powers;

(ii) none of the Series 2021B Bonds, the Series 2012 Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds or the Series 2003 Bonds is a private activity bond as defined in Section 141 of the Code;

(iii) ninety-five percent or more of the net proceeds of the Series 2012 Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds and the Series 2003 Bonds were used for local governmental activities of the District;

(iv) the Series 2012 Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds and the Series 2003 Bonds were exempt from arbitrage rebate under the “small-issuer exception” of Section 148(f)(4)(D) of the Code;

(v) the weighted average maturity of the Series 2021B Bonds will not exceed the remaining weighted average maturity of the Series 2012 Bonds; and

(vi) no Series 2021B Bond matures more than 30 years after the issuance date of the Series 2003 Bonds (January 7, 2003).

(f) Series 2021B Bonds Deemed Designated as Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations. The District hereby deems the Series 2021B Bonds as qualified tax-exempt obligations and pursuant to such designation represents that:

(i) the Refunded Bonds were designated as “qualified tax-exempt obligations” pursuant to Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Code;

(ii) the average maturity date of the Series 2021B Bonds will not later than the average maturity date of the Refunded Bonds; and

(iii) the Series 2021B Bonds will have a final maturity date which is not later than the date which is 30 years after the date the Series 2003 Bonds were issued (January 7, 2003).

The Authorized Officers, or each individually, are authorized to take such other action as may be necessary to make effective the designation in this subsection (f).

Section 12. The use and public distribution of any official statement, offering circular, term sheet, request for lenders or any other offering document (including any preliminary thereof, the “**Offering Document**”) by the Underwriter or the Placement Agent in connection with the reoffering of the Series 2021B Bonds is hereby authorized. Any Authorized Officer is authorized to approve the final Offering Document as so supplemented, amended and completed and the use and public distribution of the final Offering Document by the Underwriter or the Placement Agent in connection with the reoffering of the Series 2021B Bonds is hereby authorized. Any Authorized Officers is hereby authorized to execute and deliver a certificate pertaining to such Offering Document as prescribed therein, dated as of the date of payment for and delivery of the Series 2021B Bonds.

The District agrees to provide to the Underwriter or the Placement Agent within seven Business Days of the date of the sale of the Series 2021B Bonds sufficient copies of the final Offering Document to enable the Underwriter or the Placement Agent to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12(b)(4) of the Securities and Exchange Commission and with the requirements of Rule G-32 of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, if applicable.

Section 13. If so required by the Underwriter, the District (a) authorizes and directs the Authorized Officers, or each individually, to execute and deliver, on the date of the issuance of the Series 2021B Bonds, a continuing disclosure agreement or certificate (the “**Undertaking**”) in such form that satisfies the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 and is acceptable to the Underwriter and bond counsel and (b) covenants that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Undertaking. The Authorized Officers, or each individually, may engage a dissemination agent to assist the District with its obligations pursuant to the Undertaking. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Resolution, failure of the District to comply with the Undertaking will not be

considered a default under this Resolution or the Series 2021B Bonds; however, any Bondholder or Beneficial Owner may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandate or specific performance by court order, to cause the District to comply with its obligations under this Section 13 and the Undertaking. For purposes of this Section 13, “Beneficial Owner” means any person who (i) has the power, directly or indirectly, to vote or consent with respect to, or to dispose of ownership of, any Series 2021B Bonds (including persons holding Series 2021B Bonds through nominees, depositories or other intermediaries), or (ii) is treated as the owner of any Series 2021B Bonds for federal income tax purposes.

Section 14. The District reserves the right to issue refunding bonds and provide for the investment of the proceeds thereof for purposes of providing for the payment of principal and interest on the Series 2021B Bonds in such manner as may be prescribed by law from time to time but specifically including the provisions of the Act.

Section 15. The District’s obligations under this Resolution shall be fully discharged and satisfied as to the Series 2021B Bonds authorized and issued hereunder, and said Series 2021B Bonds, or portions thereof, shall no longer be deemed outstanding hereunder when payment of the principal thereof plus interest thereon to the date of maturity or redemption thereof (a) shall have been made or caused to have been made in accordance with the terms thereof and hereof, or (b) shall have been provided for by depositing in escrow with a national or state bank having trust powers in trust solely for such payment (i) sufficient money to make such payment and/or (ii) direct general obligations of, or obligations the principal and interest of which are unconditionally guaranteed by, the United States of America, or obligations of any agency of the United States of America (herein referred to as “**Government Obligations**”), in such amount and with such maturities as to principal and interest as will insure the availability of sufficient money to make such payment, and thereupon such Series 2021B Bonds shall cease to draw interest from the date of their redemption or maturity and, except for the purposes of such payments, shall no longer be entitled to the benefits of this Resolution; provided that, with respect to any Series 2021B Bonds called or to be called for redemption prior to the stated maturity thereof, notice of redemption shall have been duly given or provided for. If money or Government Obligations shall have been deposited in accordance with the terms hereof with the escrow agent in trust for that purpose sufficient to pay the principal of such Series 2021B Bonds and all interest due thereon to the due date thereof or to the date fixed for the redemption thereof, all liability of the District for such payment shall forthwith cease, determine and be completely discharged, and all such Series 2021B Bonds shall no longer be considered outstanding.

Section 16. Without in any way limiting the power, authority, or discretion elsewhere herein granted or delegated, the Board hereby (a) authorizes and directs the Authorized Officers and all other officers, employees and agents of the District to carry out, or cause to be carried out, and to perform such obligations of the District and such other actions as they, or any one of them shall consider necessary, advisable, desirable, or appropriate in connection with this Resolution and the issuance, sale, and delivery of the Series 2021B Bonds, including, without limitation and whenever applicable, the execution and delivery thereof and of all other related documents, instruments, certificates, and opinions; and (b) directs, authorizes and delegates to each of the Authorized Officers, the right, power, and authority to exercise such officers’ own independent judgment and absolute discretion in determining and finalizing the terms, provisions, form and

contents of each of the foregoing. The execution and delivery by any Authorized Officer or by any other officer, officers, agent, or agents of the District of any such documents, instruments, certifications, and opinions, or the doing by them of any act in connection with any of the matters which are the subject of this Resolution, shall constitute conclusive evidence of both the District's and their approval of all changes, modifications, amendments, revisions, and alterations made therein, and shall conclusively establish their absolute, unconditional, and irrevocable authority with respect thereto from the District and the authorization, approval, and ratification by the District of the documents, instruments, certifications, and opinions so executed and the action so taken.

Section 17. Moneys in each of the funds and accounts created and established by this Resolution shall be deposited, invested and secured in accordance with the laws of the State of Nebraska. Moneys held in such funds and accounts may be invested by the District or at its direction in such amounts and maturing at such times as shall reasonably provide for moneys to be available when required in the accounts or funds; provided, however, that no such investment shall be made for a period extending longer than to the date when the moneys invested may be needed for the purpose for which such fund or account was created; and provided further that such investments shall be subject to the covenants and provisions of Section 11 hereof. All interest on any authorized investment held in any fund or account shall accrue to and become a part of such fund or account.

Section 18. If any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution should be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to law, then such provisions shall be deemed severable from the remaining provisions of this Resolution and the invalidity thereof shall in no way affect the validity of the other provisions of this Resolution or of the Series 2021B Bonds and the owners of the Series 2021B Bonds shall retain all the rights and benefits accorded to them under this Resolution and under any applicable provisions of law.

If any provision of this Resolution shall be held or deemed to be or shall, in fact, be inoperative or unenforceable or invalid in any particular case in any jurisdiction or jurisdictions, or in all cases because it conflicts with any constitution or statute or rule of public policy, or for any other reason, such circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the provision in question inoperative or unenforceable or invalid in any other case or circumstances, or of rendering any other provision or provisions herein contained inoperative or unenforceable or invalid to any extent whatever.

Section 19. The District hereby adopts the Post-Issuance Tax Compliance Procedures attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A to ensure that all applicable post-issuance requirements of federal income tax law needed to preserve the tax-exempt status of the Series 2021B Bonds are met. The District reserves the right to use its discretion as necessary and appropriate to make exceptions or request additional provisions as it may determine. The District also reserves the right to change these policies and procedures from time to time without notice.

Section 20. The District hereby adopts the Disclosure Policies and Procedures attached to this Resolution as Exhibit B to ensure that the District satisfies the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 and the Undertaking. The District reserves the right to use its discretion as necessary and

appropriate to make exceptions or request additional provisions as it may determine. The District also reserves the right to change such policies and procedures from time to time without notice.

Section 21. To the extent any portion of any and all prior resolutions of the District with respect to the Series 2021B Bonds is in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, to the extent of such conflicts, the same are hereby repealed.

Section 22. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage as provided by law; provided, however, that no Series 2021B Bonds shall be sold later than one year from the date of this Resolution.

EXHIBIT A

POST-ISSUANCE TAX COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES

General

In connection with the issuance by the District of its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2021B (the “**Bonds**”), Sarpy County School District 0046 (Springfield-Platteview Community Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) will execute a tax compliance certificate (the “**Tax Certificate**”) that describes the requirements and provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “**Code**”) that must be followed in order to maintain the tax-exempt status of interest on the Bonds. In addition, the Tax Certificate will contain the reasonable expectations of the District at the time of issuance of the Bonds with respect to the use of the gross proceeds of the Bonds and the assets to be financed or refinanced with the proceeds thereof. These Procedures supplement and support the covenants and representations made by the District in the Tax Certificate. In order to comply with the covenants and representations set forth in the Bond documents and in the Tax Certificate, the District tracks and monitors the actual use of the proceeds of the Bonds, the investment and expenditure of the Bond proceeds and the assets financed or refinanced with the proceeds of the Bonds over their life.

Designation of Responsible Person

The District’s Superintendent of Schools of (the “**Superintendent**”) shall maintain an inventory of the Bonds and assets financed which contains the pertinent data to satisfy the District’s monitoring responsibilities. Any transfer, sale or other disposition of Bond-financed assets must be reviewed and approved by the Superintendent.

Post-Issuance Compliance Requirements

External Advisors/Documentation

The District shall consult with bond counsel and other legal counsel and advisors, as needed, throughout the Bond issuance process to identify requirements and to establish procedures necessary or appropriate so that the Bonds will continue to qualify for tax-exempt status. Those requirements and procedures shall be documented in the Tax Certificate and/or other documents finalized at or before issuance of the Bonds. Those requirements and procedures shall include future compliance with applicable arbitrage rebate requirements and all other applicable post-issuance requirements of federal tax law throughout (and in some cases beyond) the term of the Bonds.

The District also shall consult with bond counsel and other legal counsel and advisors, as needed, following issuance of the Bonds to ensure that all applicable post-issuance requirements in fact are met. This shall include, without limitation, consultation in connection with future contracts with respect to the use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets.

The District shall train and employ or otherwise engage expert advisors (a “**Rebate Analyst**”) to assist in the calculation of arbitrage rebate payable in respect of the investment of Bond proceeds, unless the Tax Certificate documents provide that arbitrage rebate will not be applicable to the Bonds.

Unless otherwise provided by the resolution or other authorizing documents relating to the Bonds, unexpended Bond proceeds shall be held in a segregated account by a trustee, and the investment of Bond

proceeds shall be managed by the District. The District shall prepare (or cause the trustee to prepare) regular, periodic statements regarding the investments and transactions involving Bond proceeds.

Arbitrage Rebate and Yield

Unless the Tax Certificate documents provide that arbitrage rebate will not be applicable to the Bonds, the District shall be responsible for:

- engaging the services of a Rebate Analyst and, prior to each rebate calculation date, causing the trustee or other account holder to deliver periodic statements concerning the investment of Bond proceeds to the Rebate Analyst;
- providing to the Rebate Analyst additional documents and information reasonably requested by the Rebate Analyst;
- monitoring efforts of the Rebate Analyst;
- assuring payment of required rebate amounts, if any, no later than 60 days after each 5-year anniversary of the issue date of the Bonds, and no later than 60 days after the last Bond is redeemed;
- during the construction period of each capital project financed in whole or in part by the Bonds, monitoring the investment and expenditure of Bond proceeds and consulting with the Rebate Analyst to determine compliance with any applicable exceptions from the arbitrage rebate requirements during each 6-month spending period up to 6 months, 18 months or 24 months, as applicable, following the issue date of the Bonds; and
- retaining copies of all arbitrage reports and account statements as described below under “Record Keeping Requirements”.

The District, in the Tax Certificate and/or other documents finalized at or before the issuance of the Bonds, has agreed to undertake the tasks listed above (unless the Tax Certificate documents provide that arbitrage rebate will not be applicable to the Bonds).

Use of Bond Proceeds and Bond-Financed or Refinanced Assets:

The District shall be responsible for:

- monitoring the use of Bond proceeds and the use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets (*e.g.*, facilities, furnishings or equipment) throughout the term of the Bonds to ensure compliance with covenants and restrictions set forth in the Tax Certificate;
- maintaining records identifying the assets or portion of assets that are financed or refinanced with proceeds of the Bonds, including a final allocation of Bond proceeds as described below under “Record Keeping Requirements”;
- consulting with bond counsel and other legal counsel and advisers in the review of any contracts or arrangements involving use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets to ensure compliance with all covenants and restrictions set forth in the Tax Certificate;
- maintaining records for any contracts or arrangements involving the use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets as described below under “Record Keeping Requirements”;

- conferring at least annually with personnel responsible for Bond-financed or refinanced assets to identify and discuss any existing or planned use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets, to ensure that those uses are consistent with all covenants and restrictions set forth in the Tax Certificate; and
- to the extent that the District discovers that any applicable tax restrictions regarding use of Bond proceeds and Bond-financed or refinanced assets will or may be violated, consulting promptly with bond counsel and other legal counsel and advisers to determine a course of action to remediate all nonqualified bonds, if such counsel advises that a remedial action is necessary.

The District, in the Tax Certificate and/or other documents finalized at or before the issuance of the Bonds, has agreed to undertake the tasks listed above.

All relevant records and contracts shall be maintained as described below.

Record Keeping Requirements

The District shall be responsible for maintaining the following documents for the term of the Bonds (including refunding bonds, if any) plus at least three years:

- a copy of the Bond closing transcript(s) and other relevant documentation delivered to the District at or in connection with closing of the Bonds, including any elections made by the District in connection therewith;
- a copy of all material documents relating to capital expenditures financed or refinanced by Bond proceeds, including (without limitation) construction contracts, purchase orders, invoices, trustee requisitions and payment records, draw requests for Bond proceeds and evidence as to the amount and date for each draw-down of Bond proceeds, as well as documents relating to costs paid or reimbursed with Bond proceeds and records identifying the assets or portion of assets that are financed or refinanced with Bond proceeds, including a final allocation of Bond proceeds;
- a copy of all contracts and arrangements involving the use of Bond-financed or refinanced assets;
- copies of all trustee statements and reports, including arbitrage reports, prepared with respect to the Bonds; and
- a copy of all records of investments, investment agreements, arbitrage reports and underlying documents, including trustee statements, in connection with any investment agreements, and copies of all bidding documents, if any.

EXHIBIT B

DISCLOSURE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Purpose of Disclosure Policies and Procedures

The issuance and sale of certain municipal bonds, notes, certificates of participation or other obligations (collectively, “**Obligations**”) are subject to certain federal and state securities laws, including Rule 15c2-12 (the “**Rule**”) promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the “**Exchange Act**”). The Rule requires that an underwriter, prior to purchasing or selling an issue of Obligations in a principal amount of \$1,000,000 or more, obtain a written agreement from the issuer of such Obligations to provide certain financial information or operating data on an annual basis and notices of the occurrence of certain enumerated events with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (“**MSRB**”) using the MSRB’s Electronic Municipal Market Access system (“**EMMA**”).

Sarpy County School District 0046 (Springfield-Platteview Community Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) has previously issued or may in the future issue Obligations subject to the Rule, and in connection with such issuances the District has entered and/or will enter into one or more Continuing Disclosure Certificates or Continuing Disclosure Agreements (collectively, the “**Undertakings**”) in accordance with the Rule. Pursuant to such Undertakings, the District has covenanted or will covenant to comply with the Rule by timely making the required filings. These Policies and Procedures are intended to assure that all filings required under the Rule are made timely and completely and meet all requirements of the Rule.

Designation of District Representative; Maintenance of List and Files

The “**District Representative**” for the District shall be the District’s Superintendent of Schools and any alternate or assistant as such Superintendent shall appoint. The District Representative is directed to employ the policies and procedures described herein. The District Representative shall be knowledgeable and familiar with the provisions of each Undertaking as to the type, format and content of the financial information or operating data to be included in each Annual Report required to be made thereunder, the instances in which notice of the occurrence of certain events must be given, and the timing requirements for the filing thereof. The District and the District Representative recognize and acknowledge that the terms, requirements and filing deadlines may vary by Undertaking.

The District Representative shall maintain a current list for each fiscal year identifying each issue of Obligations of the District outstanding during such fiscal year setting forth the name, original principal amount, date of issuance and CUSIP numbers for each such issue and the dates by which the Annual Reports are required to be submitted to the MSRB using EMMA, such list to be accompanied by copies of the related Undertakings.

Dissemination Agents

The District and the District Representative may utilize the services of a financial institution or other provider to act as dissemination agent (each, a “**Dissemination Agent**”) in filing the disclosures and notices described herein and performing the duties of the Dissemination Agent in accordance with the terms of the applicable Undertaking. The Dissemination Agent shall review and be familiar with the contents and filing requirements of the particular Undertaking and with the procedures for making the filings required under such Undertaking with the MSRB using the EMMA system. The District Representative shall coordinate the preparation and submission of the required information with such Dissemination Agent

to ensure full compliance with the requirements of the Rule and the applicable Undertakings.

Annual Financial Filings

The District Representative will review the Undertaking related to each outstanding issue of Obligations to determine the financial information required to be included in the Annual Report (i.e., the District's Audited Financial Statements and certain other financial information or operating data with respect to the District, if applicable (the "**Annual Report**")) required to be filed annually with the MSRB using the EMMA system, and the deadline by which such information must be filed. If the filing requirements of two or more Undertakings are identical, the Issuer Representative may file identical Annual Reports with respect to each issue of the Issuer's Obligations. If two or more Undertakings have different filing requirements, the Issuer Representative may file a separate Annual Report with respect to the applicable Undertaking or may file a single, comprehensive Annual Report with respect to all of such Undertakings. The District Representative shall be knowledgeable and familiar with the specific requirements for the filing of a Notice of Failure to File the Annual Report by the date(s) required under the terms of each Undertaking, if applicable.

The District Representative shall timely initiate the process of preparing the financial information or operating data required to be submitted under each Undertaking as part of the Annual Report. The District Representative shall assemble the information as soon as it becomes available and determine the scope of additional information to be required and also contact the auditors to establish a schedule for completion and submission for the Audited Financial Statements.

The District Representative will timely file the Annual Report, or will cause the Dissemination Agent to file the Annual Report, with the MSRB using the EMMA system. If the Audited Financial Statements are not then available by the filing deadline of a particular Undertaking, unaudited financial information may be filed with the MSRB using EMMA and the Audited Financial Statements shall be filed within 10 business days of their receipt and acceptance.

Listed Event Filings

The District Representative will review the Undertaking related to each outstanding issue of Obligations for the listed events which, upon the occurrence thereof, require prompt notices to be filed with the MSRB using the EMMA system. The District Representative will monitor the Obligations and the District's operations for occurrences of any such events and will actively evaluate whether an event may be a listed event as set forth in the District's outstanding Undertakings. After obtaining actual knowledge of such an event, the District Representative will promptly contact the District's bond counsel and the Dissemination Agent, if any, to determine whether the District must file notice of the event with the MSRB under one or more of its Undertakings. Upon a determination that the District must file such notice, the District Representative will file the appropriate notice, or will cause the Dissemination Agent to file such notice, with the MSRB using the EMMA system within ten (10) business days after the occurrence of the listed event or as the District's bond counsel may otherwise direct.

Reports of District Representative; Record Retention

The District Representative shall provide to the District's Board of Education, any Dissemination Agent and the underwriter each issue of Obligations, confirmation from EMMA received upon the filing of each Annual Report and any other filings made with the MSRB using the EMMA system promptly upon receipt of each such confirmation.

The District Representative shall maintain records with respect to the filings with the MSRB using EMMA, including, but not limited to, EMMA posting receipts showing the dates and nature or contents of all filings for each issue of Obligations outstanding during each fiscal year. Such records shall be kept for at least 5 years after the respective issue of Obligations is no longer outstanding.

Familiarity with EMMA Submission Process

The District Representative shall register with EMMA and review the on-line process of filing with EMMA located at www.emma.msrb.org in order to submit the required information. The MSRB Market Information Department can also be contacted at 703.797.6668. A tutorial is available at the website and a practice submission is available as well. The District Representative also shall enroll the District in EMMA's reminder system to ensure timely performance of its responsibilities and obligations.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the District has retained a Dissemination Agent to assist with making the filings required by the District's Undertakings and to remind the District of its filing deadlines, the District Representative need not register with EMMA or enroll in EMMA's reminder system.

Training

To ensure adequate resources to comply with the Rule, the District Representative shall develop a training process aimed at providing additional assistance in preparing required information. The training process shall be conducted at least annually and shall encompass a review of the EMMA submission process and an understanding of the timing requirements necessary for full compliance. The retention by the District of a Dissemination Agent to assist it with compliance under its Undertakings and the Rule may be deemed part of such training process.

Review of Offering Document in Connection with Primary Offerings

In connection with a new issue of Obligations, the District Representative, together with such District officials as the District Representative deems appropriate, shall promptly review upon receipt the offering document by which such Obligations shall be offered and sold. For any issue of Obligations subject to the Rule, prior to the distribution of the related offering document the District shall deem the information concerning the District in such offering document as accurate and complete in all material respects (except for such information as permitted to be omitted by the Rule) as of the date of such offering document. The District shall confirm prior to the final pricing of the Obligations that the information concerning the District in the offering document does not contain an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state any material fact necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

RESOLUTION APPOINTING LEASING CORPORATION BOARD MEMBERS

A RESOLUTION REMOVING CERTAIN DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS OF THE SPRINGFIELD PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS LEASING CORPORATION AND APPOINTING CERTAIN SUCCESSOR DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS OF SAID CORPORATION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SARPY COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT 0046 (SPRINGFIELD-PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS) IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA:

Section 1. The Board of Education (the “**Board**”) of Sarpy County School District 0046 (Springfield-Platteview Community Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) hereby makes the following findings and determinations:

(a) The District is duly organized as a Class III school district pursuant to Sections 79-102 and 79-407, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended; the District maintains both elementary and high school grades under the direction of a single board of education; and the District embraces territory having a population of more than one thousand and less than one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants, including such adjacent territory as may be included therein for school purposes.

(b) Pursuant to a resolution adopted by its Board on March 12, 2018, the District ratified the creation of the Springfield Platteview Community Schools Leasing Corporation (the “**Corporation**”), which Corporation was established to acquire, construct, improve and/or equip, on behalf of the District, certain educational facilities located within the geographical boundaries of the District.

(c) Pursuant to Article VI of the Corporation’s Bylaws (the “**Bylaws**”), a director of the Corporation’s board of directors (the “**Corporation Board**”) shall resign at the request of the District, and the District may appoint a successor for such director.

(d) Existing Corporation Board directors Brett Richards, Brenda Sherman, and Brian Wichman are moving out of the District, retiring, or are otherwise unable to serve in their roles as directors, and the District desires to appoint new individuals as successor directors.

Section 2. In accordance with Article VI of the Bylaws, the Board hereby requests that Brett Richards, Brenda Sherman, and Brian Wichman each resign as directors of the Corporation Board and directs the Corporation Board to accept such resignations. The Board further appoints Kyle Fisher and Lisa Roseland as successor directors of the Corporation Board and directs the Corporation Board to accept such appointments. The Board further confirms the existing appointment of Brian Osborn as director of the Corporation Board.

Section 3. The provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be separable and, if any section, phrase or provision shall for any reason be declared to be invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the sections, phrases or provisions.

Section 4. All resolutions, orders and other instruments, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed only to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage as provided by law.

SUPERINTENDENT'S CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT SPRINGFIELD PLATTEVIEW COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

THIS CONTRACT is made by and between the **Board of Education of Springfield Platteview Community Schools Community Schools**, legally known as **Sarpy County School District 77-0046**, and referred to as "the Board" and "the District" respectively, and Dr. Ryan Saunders, referred to herein as "the Superintendent". In accordance with its action taken and recorded in the minutes of a duly advertised board meeting, the Board agrees to employ the Superintendent, and the Superintendent agrees to accept such employment, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Section 1. Term of Contract. The Superintendent shall be employed for a period of **2 years beginning on July 1, 2021, and expiring on June 30, 2023**. References to "contract year" shall mean the period from July 1st through June 30th. The Superintendent will work all days necessary to complete the Superintendent's duties. The Superintendent shall keep complete and accurate records of working days and shall provide the Board of Education with a report of the accumulated working days at least quarterly.

Section 2. Renewal of Contract. If a Board representative does not inform the Superintendent in writing on or before **the seventh day after the regular January 2023 board meeting (and each January thereafter)** of the Board's intention to consider the nonrenewal or amendment of this contract, the contract will automatically renew for a period of **one year** from and after the expiration date provided in Section 1 of this contract. The Superintendent shall remind the Board in writing of this provision no later than **its regular December meeting** of each year of this contract and shall make the renewal of the Superintendent's employment contract an agenda item for the regular **January** board meeting during each year of this contract. At the time of each contract renewal and/or amendment, the Superintendent shall be responsible for taking all necessary steps to ensure that the District has complied with the Superintendent Pay Transparency Act.

Section 3. Salary. The Superintendent's salary for the contract year shall be \$165,000.00 which shall be paid in 12 equal monthly installments consistent with the District's regular payroll cycles. The Board shall not reduce the Superintendent's salary during the term of the contract, but may increase it and/or the benefits during the term of this contract, as an amendment to the contract, without the amendment constituting a new contract, requiring a hearing, or extending the term of this contract.

Section 4. Deductions. This contract shall conform to the statutes and regulations governing deductions from compensation and shall be subject

to the School Employees Retirement Act. The Superintendent authorizes the District to deduct or withhold from each and every period of pay any amounts necessary to offset any damages caused by the Superintendent or the value of property or money entrusted to the Superintendent or owed by the Superintendent to the District during the course of or as a result of the Superintendent's employment, if such property or money have not properly been returned to the District. The District shall withhold other deductions as the Superintendent and Board may agree.

Section 5. Professional Status. The Superintendent affirms that the Superintendent is not under contract with any other board of education covering any part or all of the term provided in this contract. Throughout the contract term, the Superintendent will hold a valid and appropriate certificate to act as a superintendent of schools in the State of Nebraska which the Superintendent will register and maintain on file in the District's central administrative office. This contract shall not be valid and the Board will not compensate the Superintendent for any service performed prior to the date that the Superintendent registers the certificate. The Superintendent represents that: (1) all information provided in connection with the Superintendent's application for employment with the District was true and accurate at the time of application, and if there is or has been a material change in such information, the Superintendent will advise the Board immediately; (2) the Superintendent has never been convicted of or plead no contest to a felony as defined in Title 92, Chapter 21, Sections 003.11 and 003.13 of the Nebraska Administrative Code ("Rule 21"), or any offense involving moral turpitude, abuse, neglect, or sexual misconduct, as defined in Title 92, Chapter 21, Sections 003.12 and 003.13 of the Nebraska Administrative Code; and (3) the Superintendent has not had any professional licenses or certificates suspended or revoked.

Section 6. Superintendent's Duties. The Superintendent's duties shall be as prescribed by statute and by Board policies, rules, regulations and directives. The Superintendent agrees to devote the Superintendent's time, skill, labor and attention to all required duties throughout the contract term. The Superintendent shall be subject to the direction and control of the Board at all times and shall perform such administrative duties as the Board assigns. By agreement with the Board, the Superintendent may undertake consultative work, speaking engagements, writing, lecturing, or other professional duties and obligations as long as they do not interfere with carrying out the Superintendent's duties and obligations to the District.

Section 7. Board-Superintendent Relationship. The Board shall be primarily responsible for formulating and adopting policy. The Superintendent shall be the chief administrative officer for the District and shall be responsible

for implementing Board policy. The Superintendent shall organize the administrative and supervisory staff, and select, place, and transfer personnel with the concurrence of the Board. The Superintendent is responsible for administering the instruction of students and the business affairs of the District. The Board members agree, individually and collectively, to promptly refer all criticisms, complaints, and suggestions called to their attention to the Superintendent for action, study and/or recommendation, as appropriate.

Section 8. Cancellation or Mid-Term Amendment. The Board may cancel or amend this contract during its term for any of the following reasons: (a) the cancellation, termination, revocation, or suspension of the Superintendent's certificate (Nebraska Administrative and Supervisory Certificate, or the Nebraska Professional Administrative and Supervisory Certificate) by the State Board of Education; (b) any of the reasons set forth in this contract; (c) the breach of any of the material provisions of this contract; (d) incompetence; (e) neglect of duty; (f) unprofessional conduct; (g) insubordination; (h) conduct involving moral turpitude; (i) physical or mental incapacity; (j) immorality; (k) conviction of a felony; (l) any conduct that substantially interferes with the Superintendent's continued performance of the Superintendent's duties; (m) any arrest, criminal charge, or criminal conviction of Superintendent or the failure to report the same; (n) any filing against the Superintendent under NEB. REV. STAT. § 43-247 or any other provision of the Nebraska Juvenile Code for child abuse and/or neglect or the failure to report the same; (o) knowingly falsifying District records or documents; (p) misrepresentation of fact to the District and its personnel in the conduct of its official business; (q) the use or possession of illegal drugs or controlled substances except as prescribed by a physician; or (r) being under the influence of illegal drugs, controlled substances, or alcohol while on school grounds, at school events, or in a vehicle owned, leased or contracted by the District except as prescribed by a physician. The procedures for cancellation or amendment shall be in accordance with state statutes. The parties agree that the Superintendent's failure to comply with the obligations in the Renewal of Contract or Evaluation provisions of this contract shall constitute a material breach of this contract.

Section 9. Disability. If the Superintendent is unable to perform any of the Superintendent's duties by reason of illness, accident or other disability beyond the Superintendent's control, and the disability continues for a period of more than 120 calendar days, or if the disability is permanent, irreparable, or of such a nature as to make performance of the Superintendent's duties impossible, the Board may initiate action to cancel this contract, whereupon the respective rights, duties and obligations of the parties hereunder shall terminate, with the exception of any benefits to be paid to the Superintendent under any insurance coverage furnished by the District.

Section 10. Transportation. The Board shall provide the Superintendent with transportation or reimburse the Superintendent for mileage required in the performance of official duties at the rate approved by the Board.

Section 11. Fringe Benefits. The Board shall provide the Superintendent with the following fringe benefits:

a. Health Insurance. Family health insurance that is available to certificated staff through the District's health insurance carrier.

b. Dental Insurance. Family dental insurance that is available to certificated staff through the District's health insurance carrier.

c. Sick Leave. The Superintendent shall be entitled to 10 days of sick leave per year which may accumulate to a total of 60 days. Sick leave may only be used for personal illness or as otherwise provided in District policy. If the Superintendent is absent for more than 5 consecutive days because of illness or injury, the Board may require a doctor's certificate confirming that the absence was a reasonable and necessary consequence of the illness or injury as a condition of payment of the leave. If the Superintendent qualifies for disability pay under any applicable disability policy, the Superintendent shall be required to take the disability pay instead of sick leave pay. The Superintendent shall keep complete and accurate records of sick days accrued and used and shall provide the Board with a report of accumulated sick days at least quarterly and upon request. The Superintendent shall not be compensated for unused days of sick leave upon the ending of employment with the District.

d. Disability Insurance. The Superintendent shall purchase long-term disability insurance from the District's carrier at the Superintendent's own expense.

e. Vacation. The Superintendent shall have 20 vacation days for the initial contract year which the Superintendent may use at times the Superintendent chooses so long as the absence does not interfere with the proper performance of

the Superintendent's duties. Any extended vacation period while school is in session will require advance approval by the Board, and the parties will cooperate in arranging vacation time so as to cause the least inconvenience to the normal operation of the District. After the initial contract year, the Board shall give the Superintendent the number of vacation days necessary to restore the total to 20 days. For example, if the Superintendent uses 12 days of vacation one year, the Board will provide the Superintendent with 12 days the following year to bring the total vacation days back to 20. The Superintendent shall develop a system for recording use of vacation days and shall keep such records current and on file in the District's central office. The Superintendent shall keep complete and accurate records of all vacation days and shall provide the Board of Education with a report of accumulated vacation days at least quarterly and upon request. The Board may require the Superintendent to use vacation days and shall compensate the Superintendent for unused vacation days upon the conclusion of employment at a rate of **\$100.00** per day.

f. Professional Development. The Superintendent is expected to continue and seek professional development and to participate in relevant learning experiences. With the approval of the Board, the Superintendent may attend appropriate professional meetings at the local, state, regional and national level; and the Board will pay for valid expenses of attendance. If the Superintendent attends a national convention and does not return following the initial year of employment as Superintendent, the Superintendent agrees to repay the District in full for national convention expenses paid by the District.

g. Professional Dues. The District will pay the annual dues for the Superintendent's membership in Nebraska Council of School Administrators (NCSA), the national superintendent's organization (AASA), and any others the Board agrees to pay for upon request of the Superintendent.

h. Bereavement Leave. The superintendent shall be allowed up to ten (10) working days per year for Bereavement Leave. Any days used for Bereavement will be subtracted from Sick Leave days available.

- i. Holidays.** The following days shall be holiday days and not working days: President's Day, Easter, Memorial Day, and July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and day after Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.
- j. Cell Phone.** The Superintendent shall be required to purchase and maintain a cellular phone so that the Superintendent can be reached at all times for work-related emergencies or while away from school grounds during the work day. The District will reimburse the Superintendent up to a maximum of \$100 per month for the actual cost of a cellular phone service plan.
- k. Moving Expenses.** The Board will pay the Superintendent up to \$3,000 for moving expenses associated with relocating to the District.
- l. Life Insurance.** The District shall purchase a term life insurance policy insuring the Superintendent having a primary death benefit of \$50,000, with the beneficiary of such policy to be determined by the Superintendent.
- m. Expense Reimbursement.** The Board shall pay or reimburse the Superintendent for expenses that are actually, necessarily, and reasonably incurred in attending educational seminars, conventions, and workshops; conferences; training programs; official school functions, hearings or meetings, provided that such payment or expense is authorized by the Local Government Miscellaneous Expenditures Act (NEB. REV. STAT. § 13-2201 *et seq.*) or some other provision of law.

Section 12. Residence/Domicile in District. The Superintendent shall establish domicile and principal residence within the boundaries of the District as they exist on the first duty day under the terms of this contract; and, the Superintendent shall maintain domicile and residence within the boundaries of the District during the term of this contract, or any renewal, amendment, or continuation thereof, except as otherwise provided herein. If the Superintendent does not establish domicile and principal place of residence within the District at the commencement of employment, the Superintendent shall move the Superintendent's domicile and principal place of residence into the corporate limits of the District before the expiration of the first six months from the Superintendent's first duty day under this contract. It is the purpose

of this paragraph to require the Superintendent to, at all times during such employment, live and maintain domicile and principal place of residence in the District to encourage the Superintendent: (1) to be highly motivated and deeply committed to the District's educational system; (2) to speak to and vote on ballot issues affecting the District as a legal voter of the District; (3) to be involved in school and community activities bringing the Superintendent in contact with parents and community leaders and be committed to the future of the District and its schools; (4) to be accessible to parents and students, and allow parents and students to become personally acquainted with the Superintendent; and, (5) to gain sympathy and understanding for the cultural basis of the community, and the social, economic, and environmental problems of the children of the school community and are thus less likely to be considered isolated from the community in which the Superintendent is the educational leader.

Section 13. No Penalty for Release or Resignation. There shall not be a penalty for the release or resignation of the Superintendent from this contract; provided no resignation shall become effective until the expiration of the contract unless it is accepted by the Board, and the Board shall fix the date at which the resignation shall take effect.

Section 14. Compensation Upon Termination. Upon lawful termination of this contract for any reason, the compensation to be paid hereunder shall be an amount which bears the same ratio to the annual salary specified as the number of months or fraction thereof to the date of such termination bears to the 12 months in the annual salary period in which termination occurs. The Superintendent shall refund any portion of the salary paid but not earned prior to the date of termination of this contract.

Section 15. Evaluation. The Board shall evaluate the Superintendent twice during the Superintendent's first year of employment and at least once each year thereafter. The first evaluation during the first year of employment and the yearly evaluations after the first year of employment shall occur no later than the **regular December meeting**. The Superintendent shall: remind the Board members in writing of this provision no later than its **regular November meeting**; make the Superintendent evaluation an agenda item for the regular **December** Board meeting during each year of this contract; and provide the Board members with the written evaluation instrument that is on file with the Nebraska Department of Education.

Section 16. Legal Actions. The Board will support the Superintendent if there is a legal dispute caused by carrying out the Superintendent's duties properly. If a legal action, including a professional practice complaint, is threatened or filed against the Superintendent as a result of the

Superintendent's performance of duties or position as the Superintendent of the District, the Board will provide the Superintendent with a legal defense to the maximum extent permitted by law so long as the Superintendent acted in good faith and in a manner which the Superintendent reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the District and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe that the Superintendent's conduct was unlawful.

Section 17. Physical or Mental Examination. The Superintendent agrees that, at the request of the Board, the Superintendent will have a comprehensive physical and/or mental examination performed by one or more licensed physicians or psychologists of the Board's choosing during the term of this contract. In deference to the requirements of state and federal law, the physician's report to the Board must address whether the Superintendent is able to perform the "essential functions" of the position.

Section 18. Disciplinary Action. The parties agree that the Board president may place the Superintendent on paid leave by delivering written notice of the same when the Board president determines it is in the best interests of the District to do so. The paid leave shall continue unless and until a majority of the Board determines otherwise at a duly convened meeting. The Board may suspend the Superintendent without pay for a period not to exceed thirty (30) working days. Prior to suspending the Superintendent without pay, the Board president or secretary shall deliver a written notice to the Superintendent advising the Superintendent of the alleged reasons for the proposed action and provided the opportunity to present the Superintendent's version of the facts. Within seven calendar days after receipt of such notice, the Superintendent may make a written request to the secretary of the school board for a due process hearing under section 79-832. If such a request is not delivered within such time, the action of the Board shall become final.

Section 19. Governing Laws. The parties shall be governed by all applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations in performance of their respective duties and obligations under this contract.

Section 20. Amendments to be in Writing. This contract may be modified or amended only by a writing duly authorized and executed by the Superintendent and the Board.

Section 21. Severability. If any portion of this contract is declared invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not affect the validity or enforcement of the remaining provisions of this contract.

CONSULTING AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT is made by and between the **Board of Education of Springfield Platteview Community Schools**, legally known as **Sarpy County School District No. 77-0046**, and referred to as "the Board" and "the District" respectively, and **Dr. Ryan Saunders**, referred to herein as "Consultant".

WITNESSETH: The District agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to accept such employment subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Springfield Platteview Community Schools' Approval of Agreement as Condition Precedent on the School District's Obligations. All of the District's obligations hereunder are expressly conditioned upon the board of education for Millard Public Schools, Consultant's current employer, affirmatively approving the consultant relationship as contemplated herein. Consultant shall furnish to the District evidence demonstrating his current district's approval of his consultative services no later than the first date on which he undertakes any of the duties contained in this Agreement.

2. Commencement of Employment. This Agreement shall commence on or about the 12th day of April, 2021.

3. At-Will Nature of Employment; Status as Exempt Employee. The Consultant is hired on an "at will" basis. The Consultant's duties and extent of employment are subject to assignment by the Board President, in collaboration with the District's current Superintendent. The Consultant agrees at all times to perform all of his duties faithfully, industriously, and to the best of his ability, experience, and talents.

4. Days and Hours of Employment. The days and hours of employment shall be coordinated with the Board President as needed to complete the duties of the Consultant. At no time will the Consultant exceed any limits set by his current employing school district, and he will be able to seek compensation from the District for up to 5 days of consultative services. Any additional consulting days must be approved by the Board and the Consultant's current employing school district.

5. Compensation. The Consultant's compensation shall be \$700.00 per day. The Consultant shall also be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary temporary lodging and mileage expenses that the Consultant incurs fulfilling the duties of this Agreement. To seek reimbursement for those expenses, the Consultant must comply with the District's policies and practices for expense reimbursements, and all applicable laws.

6. Fringe Benefits. There are no fringe benefits under this Agreement.

7. Policies, Rules and Regulations. The Consultant agrees to be governed by the policies of the Board, the rules and regulations of the District, and the directives of the Board President and the Board's President designees. These policies, rules and regulations may be changed at any time, with or without notice to the Consultant.


8. Termination of Employment. This Agreement creates no property right in continued employment and may be terminated by the District with or without cause and without a hearing. The Board President may, acting upon his or her own initiative, terminate the Consultant's employment; and such termination will be effective upon the date of the decision.

9. Compensation Upon Termination. The Consultant agrees that, upon termination of employment for any reason, any portion of compensation, whether in the form of wages or fringe benefits, paid or provided but not earned prior to the date of termination of this contract shall be refunded to the District by the Consultant and may be withheld by the District from any payments to the Consultant.

10. Deductions. The Consultant authorizes the District to deduct or withhold from each and every period of pay any amounts necessary to offset any damages caused by him, the value of property or money entrusted to the Consultant or owed by the Consultant to the District during the course of his employment or owed by him to the District during the course of employment. No deductions shall be made for retirement purposes.

11. Entirety of Agreement and Amendments. The Consultant certifies that he has read the foregoing Employment Agreement, fully understands its terms and conditions, and agrees that it constitutes the entire agreement; and that any representations, promises, agreements or undertakings, written or oral, that are not contained herein shall not be of any force or effect. This Agreement may be modified only by a written instrument signed by the Consultant and the Board President.

12. Applicable Law. This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Nebraska.

**COVID 19: License and Management Agreement
for Use of Municipal Property for Sports
or Other Recreational Activities**

This License and Management Agreement (the "License"), dated for reference purposes only as of the 12th day of April, 2021, is entered into by and between the City of Springfield, Nebraska, a Municipal Corporation ("Licensor"), and Springfield Platteview Community Schools, a Political Subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("Licensee").

RECITALS

- A. Licensor owns the real estate legally described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Real Property").
- B. The Licensee desires to license a portion of the Real Property during the times and on the dates as identified on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Premises").
- C. The Premises includes a playing field, court, or other grounds suitable for sports and other recreational activities, and may include associated improvements and structures included therewith, all as more particularly described on Exhibit "B".
- D. Licensee is involved in organizing junior high and high school boys' baseball in the municipality.
- E. Licensor recognizes the additional requirements associated with operating the Premises as a result of the ongoing COVID-19 and novel coronavirus situation and is not able to ensure that operation of the Premises during all practices, games, and other events follows the current applicable rules for safe operation.
- F. Licensee desires to utilize the Premises for junior high and high school boys' baseball and is willing to enter into this License in order to manage the Premises in accordance with the applicable rules for safe operation.
- G. Licensor and Licensee entered into an Agreement dated May 13, 2013, outlining responsibilities for the operation and maintenance of the ball field at Buffalo Park, which Agreement shall still be valid and enforceable upon execution of this License. To the extent that the May 13, 2013, Agreement and the License are inconsistent, this License Agreement shall be controlling.
- H. Licensor desires to enter into this License whereby Licensee shall license and manage the Premises for Licensor, subject to the following terms.

NOW THEREFORE, Licensor and Licensee agree as follows:

1. Licensed Premises. Licensor desires to license to Licensee the Premises, as defined above, consisting of approximately 4.2 acres of real property at Buffalo Park and 4 acres of real property at City Park during the times and on the dates as further described on Exhibit "B". Such area includes the municipal playing field(s), court(s), grounds, and/or the structures and improvements associated with the playing field(s), court(s), or grounds, including, but not limited to, the bleachers, stands, restroom facilities, drinking fountain(s), and concession stand. Licensor licenses the Premises to Licensee, and Licensee licenses the Premises from Licensor, for the License Term, and Licensee agrees to pay the license fee, and to perform all of Licensee's obligations described herein.

2. Management. The parties acknowledge and agree that Licensee shall be solely responsible for the operation and management of the Premises during the License Term when the Premises are being utilized pursuant to this License. Licensee shall be responsible for operating and managing the Premises in accordance with all applicable rules and regulations of any governmental entity with jurisdiction over the Premises, including, but not limited to, any guidelines that may be promulgated by the State of Nebraska or Sarpy/Cass Health Department regarding sports or other recreational activities, and any amendments, replacements, or supplements thereto, any applicable directed health measure, and all resolutions and ordinances of Licensor (collectively the "Rules"). Licensee represents and covenants to Licensor that Licensee is familiar with the Rules and that Licensee shall operate and manage the Premises in accordance with the Rules. Licensee shall ensure that all coaches or appropriate personnel utilizing the Premises shall conduct themselves and their teams in accordance with the Rules. Licensee agrees to provide training and education as appropriate to all coaches or team managers to ensure that the Rules are followed. Licensee is responsible for ensuring that each player, coach, umpire, official, concession stand worker, restroom attendant, parent volunteer assisting with dugout management and other participant signs the Participation Agreement entitled "COVID-19: Participants Agreement for Sports or Other Recreational Activities," (hereinafter "Participation Agreement") as provided in Springfield City Council Resolution No. 2020-19 dated June 2, 2020, prior to participant's involvement. A copy of the Participation Agreement is attached as Exhibit "C." Upon request, copies of these documents must be made available to the City of Springfield during the term of this Agreement. Licensee shall maintain copies of said Participation Agreements for the duration of this Agreement. At the end of this Agreement, Licensee shall remit all Participation Agreements to the City of Springfield.

3. Term. The License shall become effective upon execution of this Agreement by both parties and delivery of the certificate of insurance required under Section 9 of this Agreement and shall terminate July 31, 2021. Either party shall have the right to terminate this License by providing the other party with no less than ten (10) days prior written notice. Such notice shall specify the date that the License shall terminate. Notwithstanding the foregoing or any other provision herein, the parties acknowledge and agree that Licensor retains the right, at

any time, to terminate this License by written notice to Licensee if such termination is required under the applicable Rules or any amendment, replacement, or supplement thereto, or in the event Licenser determines, in Licenser's discretion, that Licensee has failed to manage and operate the Premises in accordance with the Rules. Any such termination shall not relieve the Licensee of the obligations of Licensee hereunder that have occurred or accrued hereunder prior to the termination.

4. License Fee. Licensee agrees to pay Licenser a license fee of \$0.

5. Acceptance of Premises. By taking possession of the Premises, Licensee accepts the Premises in its current condition. Licensee further agrees that Licenser has not provided Licensee with any warranty or representation as to the condition of the Premises and that Licensee has investigated the Premises and has determined to Licensee's satisfaction that the Premises is satisfactory for Licensee's proposed use. Licensee also acknowledges and agrees that Licensee is only utilizing a portion of the Real Property that is described herein as the Premises and that Licenser and other parties also shall have the right to use the Real Property during the License Term, subject to the reasonable licensing discretion of Licenser. Licensee shall secure Licenser's permission prior to making any improvements or alterations of any nature to the Premises. Licenser reserves the right to withhold its consent in Licenser's sole discretion.

6. Real Estate Taxes. If applicable during the License Term, Licenser shall pay all real property taxes and assessments, improvement bonds, and other governmental levies ("Taxes") imposed on or with respect to the Premises, if any exist. Licensee shall pay all personal property taxes imposed on or with respect to Licensee's equipment and personal property located on the Premises, if any exist.

7. Utilities. Licensee acknowledges that the utilities necessary for the operation of the Premises are provided by Licenser and Licensee shall use such utilities in the manner required for the proper operation of the Premises and shall not unreasonably use the same or cause any damage thereto. The cost of the utilities applicable to the Premises shall be paid by Licenser before the same become due. Licensee is responsible for reimbursement of utility costs to Licenser as per the Agreement between the two parties dated May 13, 2013.

8. Maintenance. Licensee shall, during the term of this License, and at its sole expense, keep the Premises in good order and repair, reasonable wear and tear excepted. Licensee shall be responsible to maintain the Premises in accordance with the Rules so that the Premises may be utilized for the purposes set forth in this License. Such obligation shall include, but not be limited to, cleaning and disinfecting restroom facilities regularly while players and fans are present, and placing markings on the ground to ensure individuals waiting to use the restroom are spaced six (6) feet apart, if any such restroom facilities are included and open for use on the Premises. Licensee shall also ensure that the concession stand, if any, is only allowed to open if all requirements set forth in the Rules are followed. Licensee shall ensure that the

stands, bleachers, or other facilities are only utilized in accordance with the applicable Rules and that any spectators are those permitted to be in attendance at the Premises in accordance with the Rules. Licensee shall be responsible for removal of all trash generated from their use of the property and shall dump all trash into the main park dumpster at the end of every practice or game. Licensor shall be responsible for any mowing, irrigation, or application of fertilizer or weed control on the Premises in accordance with past practices of Licensor. Provided, however, Licensee shall be responsible for any of the same if they are caused by Licensee's misuse or damage to the Premises. Licensee agrees to promptly notify Licensor of any maintenance or repair that is the responsibility of Licensor hereunder.

9. Insurance. During the License Term, Licensee shall, at its own cost and expense, procure and continue in force such insurance policies as are required by Licensor. Such insurance shall, at a minimum include commercial general liability insurance with a combined policy limit of at least \$1,000,000 or such other amount as is reasonably agreed to by the parties. Licensor shall be named as an additional named insured on all such policies of insurance. A renewal policy shall be procured not less than ten (10) days prior to the expiration of any policy. Each original policy or a certified copy thereof, or a satisfactory certificate of the insurer evidencing insurance carried with proof of payment of the premium, shall be deposited with Licensor prior to the commencement date of the term hereof and within ten (10) days of the each anniversary date thereafter. If possible and financially feasible, Licensee shall endeavor to have the foregoing insurance policy provide coverage for issues related to COVID-19, novel coronavirus, or similar issues. Licensee shall provide workers' compensation and employer liability coverage as may be required by the State of Nebraska.

10. Licensee's Indemnification. Licensee agrees to indemnify and hold Licensor harmless from and against any and all claims, damages, or causes of action and all liability, cost or expense specifically including court costs and all reasonable attorney fees to the extent the same arise out of or in any way connected with Licensee's or Licensee's agents' use of the Premises during the term hereof, whether the same are raised during the term hereof or after. Without limiting the foregoing, the parties acknowledge and agree that the foregoing indemnification specifically includes any claims, damages, or causes of action and all liability, cost or expense specifically including court costs and all reasonable attorney fees for any COVID-19, novel coronavirus, or related issues.

11. Assignment. Licensee shall not assign, sub-license, or otherwise transfer, by operation of law or otherwise, this License or any interest herein without the prior written consent of Licensor, which consent may be withheld in Licensor's sole discretion.

12. No Re-license. Licensor's consent to any assignment, encumbrance, sub-license, occupation, or other transfer shall not release Licensee from any of Licensee's obligations hereunder or be deemed to be a consent to any subsequent assignment, sub-license, or occupation unless Licensor agrees in writing. The collection or acceptance of the license fee or

other payment by Licensor from any person other than Licensee shall not be deemed the acceptance of any assignee or sub-licensee as the Licensee hereunder or a release of Licensee from any obligation under this License.

13. Events of Default. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute an Event of Default: (i) the failure by Licensee to make any payment of the license fee or any other payments required to be made by Licensee under this License when due; and (ii) the failure by Licensee to observe or perform any of the provisions of this License to be observed or performed by the Licensee if such failure continues for a period of ten (10) days, or such other period if this License specifically provides a different period for a particular failure, after written notice by Licensor to Licensee of such failure; provided, however, that with respect to any failure which cannot reasonably be cured within ten (10) days, an Event of Default shall not be considered to have occurred if Licensee commences to cure such failure within such ten (10) day period and continues to proceed diligently with the cure of such failure.

14. Remedies. On the occurrence of an Event of Default, Licensor may at any time thereafter, with or without notice or demand and without limiting Licensor in the exercise of a right or remedy which Licensor may have by reason of such default or breach, exercise any rights or remedies Licensor may have at law or in equity, including, but not limited to, one or more of the following:

- A. declare the License at an end and terminated;
- B. sue for the license fee due and to become due under the License;
- C. sue for any damages sustained by Licensor;
- D. cure any breaches of Licensee's obligations to pay utilities, provide insurance, or properly maintain the Premises.

15. Non-Exclusive Remedies. The remedies of Licensor set forth in Section 14 shall not be exclusive, but shall be cumulative and in addition to all rights and remedies now or hereafter provided or allowed by law or equity, including, but not limited to, the right of Licensor to seek and obtain an injunction and the right of Licensor to damages in addition to those specified herein.

16. Default by Licensor. Licensor shall not be liable to Licensee if Licensor is unable to fulfill any of its obligations under this License, if Licensor is prevented, delayed, or curtailed from so doing by reason of any cause beyond Licensor's reasonable control. Licensor shall not be in default unless Licensor fails to perform obligations required of Licensor within a reasonable time, but in no event later than thirty (30) days after written notice by Licensee to Licensor, specifying Licensor's failure to perform such obligation; provided, however, that if the nature of Licensor's

obligation is such that more than thirty (30) days are required for performance, then Licensor shall not be in default if Licensor commences performance within such thirty (30) day period and thereafter diligently prosecutes its efforts to satisfy such obligation.

17. Entry by Licensor. Licensor and its agents and employees shall have the right to enter the Premises at all reasonable times and during normal business hours, to examine the same, to make such maintenance and repairs of the Premises and such maintenance, repairs, alterations, decorations, additions, and improvements to other portions of the Premises as Licensor requires.

18. Notices. Any notices required or permitted to be given under this License shall be in writing and may be delivered personally or by certified mail to the other party at the address set forth below. Any notice given by mail shall be deemed received two (2) business days following the date such notice is mailed as provided in this Section. Any notice given by electronic mail or personally delivered shall be effective upon receipt. Either party may change its address for purposes of this Section by giving the other party written notice of the new address in the manner set forth above.

19. Applicable Laws. This License shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Nebraska.

20. Modification. This License contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the Licensor and Licensee with respect to the Premises. All prior negotiations, correspondence, and agreements are superseded by this License and any other contemporaneous documents. This License may not be modified or changed except by written instrument signed by Licensor and Licensee.

21. Relationship of Parties. Neither the method of computation of the license fee nor any other provisions contained in this License nor any acts of the parties shall be deemed or construed by the parties or by any third person to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of any association between Licensor and Licensee, other than the relationship of Licensor and Licensee.

22. Waiver. The acceptance of the license fee or other payments by Licensor, or the endorsement or statement on any check or any letter accompanying any check for the license fee or other payment shall not be deemed an accord or satisfaction or a waiver of any obligation of Licensee regardless of whether Licensor had knowledge of any breach of such obligation. Failure to insist on compliance with any of the terms, covenants, or conditions hereof shall not be deemed a waiver of such terms, covenants, or conditions, nor shall any waiver or relinquishment of any right or power hereunder, at any one time or more times, be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of such rights and powers at any other time or times or under any other circumstance(s).

23. Partial Invalidity. If any term or provision of this License or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall to any extent be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this License or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this License shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

24. Interpretations. Any uncertainty or ambiguity existing herein shall not be interpreted against either party because such party prepared any portion of this License, but shall be interpreted according to the application of rules of interpretation of contracts generally.

25. Memorandum of License. Licensee shall not be permitted to file a memorandum of the License or other documents in the real estate records of the County including the Premises.

26. Binding Effect. This License shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of Licensor, Licensee, and their respective successors and assignees.

27. Counterparts. This License may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

28. Non-Discrimination of Employment. No party to this agreement shall discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment to be employed in the performance of this agreement with respect to his or her hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of his or her race, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin.

29. Non-Discrimination of Licensor Property. No party to this agreement shall directly or indirectly refuse, withhold from, deny, or attempt to refuse, withhold or deny, to any other person any of the accommodations, advantages, facilities, services or privileges on Licensor's property on the basis of race, creed, color, sex, religion, national origin or ancestry.

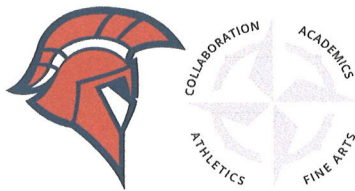

A. This Reorganization Plan (the "Plan") is being initiated under and pursuant to the Learning Community Reorganization Act found at Neb. Rev. Stat §§ 79-4,117 to 79-4,129 (the "Act") and/or other Nebraska laws, by Sarpy County School District 77-0046, a/k/a Springfield Platteview Community Schools, hereinafter referred to as "SP," an accredited Class III School District, under the laws and statutes of the State of Nebraska, and Sarpy County School District 77-0027, a/k/a Papillion LaVista Community Schools, hereinafter referred to as "PLCS," also an accredited Class III School District, under the laws and statutes of the State of Nebraska, (collectively, both school districts are herein sometimes referred to as the "School Districts"). The School Districts are members of the Learning Community of Douglas and Sarpy Counties (the "LC") and present the Plan for approval to the State Committee for the Reorganization of School Districts (the "State Committee") or others as required by law for review and action under the Act or other laws. Both School Districts have conditionally approved the Plan and hereby request approval from the State Committee or others according to the Act or other laws for submission back to the School Districts for their final approval and implementation by the Sarpy County Clerk or others. This Plan involves the transfer and attachment to an established district of part of the territory of one or more districts under Neb. Rev. Stat § 79-4,120 or other laws and a change in boundaries of the School Districts solely within the LC and no territory is being transferred out of the LC. SP and PLCS are not part of an affiliation of school districts or an affiliated school system as provided by Nebraska law.

B. The undersigned School Districts by this Plan, petition, agree, state and represent that it is considered to be in the best interests of SP, PLCS and the LC, that the boundaries of each of the School Districts be changed in accordance with this Plan and Agreement, and in furtherance thereof, do hereby request the State Committee and County Officials or others as required to whom this Plan and Agreement is directed or their successors in interest, to approve same enter an order changing the boundaries of SP and PLCS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat § 79-4,128, and/or other Nebraska laws, so as to transfer the following-described territory from SP and PLCS shall be as follows:

1. A DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF THE

REORGANIZED DISTRICTS AND A DESIGNATION OF THE CLASS FOR EACH DISTRICT.

A description of the Property to be transferred from SP to PLCS is contained on attached legal descriptions and maps.. Both School Districts are Class III school districts.

2. SUMMARY OF REASONS FOR PROPOSED CHANGE, EXPLANATION OF STATUTORY COMPLIANCE AND STATUTORY ASSURANCE.

The reasons for the proposed transfer and attachment of Property by a change of boundaries pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat § 79-4,120 or other laws as provided herein involve consideration being given to: (1) the educational needs of the learning community, (2) economies in administration costs, (3) the future use of existing satisfactory school buildings, sites, and play fields, (4) the convenience and welfare of pupils, (5) transportation proximity, (6) the equalization of the educational opportunity of pupils, (7) the amount of outstanding indebtedness of each district and proposed disposition thereof, (8) the equitable adjustment of all property, debts, and liabilities among the districts involved, (9) any additional statutory requirements for learning community organization, and (10) any other matters which, in the School Districts' judgment, are of importance. This Plan complies with statutory requirements in that no property is leaving the LC and for the reasons stated above. This Plan does not increase the geographic size of any school district that has more than twenty-five thousand students.

3. SUMMARY OF TERMS OF REORGANIZATION.

The terms of this Plan involve a transfer and attachment of Property by a change of boundaries pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat§ 79-4,120 or other laws as described herein. As this Plan only involves such transfer and attachment according to the Act or other laws and there is no new district being created, the school boards, school board wards or districts, if any, and classifications of the School Districts involved are unchanged and shall remain the same and the State Committee or others will not need to determine initial school board districts or wards, or appoint an initial school board.

4. STATEMENT OF FINDINGS ON LOCATION AND UTILIZATION OF SCHOOLS AND TRANSPORTATION

The terms of this Plan involve a transfer and attachment of Property by a change of boundaries pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat§ 79-4,120 or other laws as described herein. As this Plan only involves such transfer and attachment according to the Act, there is no change with respect to the location of schools, the utilization of existing buildings, the construction of new buildings, or the transportation requirements of the School Districts involved.

5. MAPS SHOWING BOUNDARIES

Maps showing the boundaries of established school districts and the boundaries proposed under this Plan are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as EXHIBIT.

6. OTHER MATTERS

The effective date of the change of boundaries and the transfer of the Property from SP to PLCS shall be upon final approvals and entry of an order by the appropriate County Officials whose order is necessary to effect the change in boundaries and Property transfer set forth herein, or according to law, whichever occurs later in time. All assets, including budget authority and unbonded liabilities of each School District shall remain the same on such transfer and attachment hereunder and shall not be transferred to PLCS. The transferred land shall continue to be liable for any bonded indebtedness voted or incurred by SP prior to the boundary change order effective date and such transferred land shall not be liable for any bond indebtedness voted or incurred by PLCS prior to the effective date of the boundary change order. The transferred land shall be responsible for future bonded indebtedness, if any, voted or incurred by PLCS after the effective date of the boundary change order. All uncollected real estate taxes due and payable on such transferred land prior to the effective date of the boundary change order shall remain the property of SP. All real estate taxes levied and assessed on such transferred land after the effective date of the boundary change order shall be the property of PLCS.

Upon completing the transfer the Sarpy County Clerk shall file the order, certificates or other appropriate notice documents with the Sarpy County Assessor, Treasurer, the State Committee and all other appropriate county or state officials so that taxing records, voting records, and the like, may be changed to reflect such action, and so that such records and any appropriate maps can be changed accordingly. DISTRICT NURSE CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT made by and between the Springfield Platteview Community Schools, in the County of Sarpy, in the State of Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as the District and **Kelli L. Haynes**, a legally qualified nurse, hereinafter referred to as Nurse.

WITNESSETH: That the Board of Education of the District hereby agrees to employ the District Nurse above named in the schools of the District for one year, which shall begin on or about September 1, 2021, and end on or about August 31, 2022, and shall consist of 205 contract days and that the District Nurse hereby agrees to accept such employment at a rate of **\$35.00 per hour*** and under the following conditions.

FIRST: Hours will be paid the pay period they are earned. The first payment shall be made on the 20th day of September, 2021, and the remaining payments shall be made on the 20th day of each month thereafter.

SECOND: The nurse hereby agrees to be governed by the policies of the Board of Education of the District and the rules, regulations, and directives of the Administration and that the duties to be performed by him/her under this contract shall be subject to assignment of the Superintendent of the District with the approval of the Board of Education of the District; and further agrees to devote full time, during days of school to his/her position in all respects, to diligently and faithfully perform the assigned duties as Nurse to the best of his/her professional ability.

THIRD: In addition to the nursing duties set forth herein, the Nurse may be assigned such "extra duty" assignments as defined from time to time by the parties of this agreement which shall be upon such terms and conditions and at such additional stated rate of compensation as the Nurse and the District may from time to time agree upon.

FOURTH: This contract may be cancelled or amended by a majority of the members of the school board during the school year for any of the following reasons: (a) upon cancellation, termination, revocation or suspension of the nurse's certificate by the State Board of Education; (b) breach of any of the material provisions of this contract; (c) for any reason set forth in this contract; (d) incompetency; (e) neglect of duty; (f) unprofessional conduct; (g) insubordination; (h) immorality or (i) physical or mental incapacity. Cancellation or amendment under this contract shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Nebraska Revised Statutes.

FIFTH: That upon termination of this contract for just cause, or upon the release of the Nurse from this contract, the compensation paid or to be paid hereunder shall be the hourly amount of hours actually worked.

SIXTH: There shall be no penalty for release or resignation by the Teacher from this contract; provided no resignation shall become effective until the close of the school year unless accepted by the Board of Education of the District and the Board shall fix the time at which the resignation is to take effect.

SEVENTH: This contract shall conform to the regulation governing deductions from the above stated compensation with reference to Withholding Tax, Social Security and Nurse's Retirement. Other deductions may be withheld as agreed to by the parties to this contract.

EIGHTH: The Nurse hereby affirms that he/she is not under contract with another School Board or Board of Education within this State covering a part or all of the same time of performance as is contemplated by this agreement. The Teacher further affirms that at the beginning of the term of this contract he/she holds or will hold a valid Nebraska Special Services Certificate. It is understood and agreed that this contract is not valid until the Certificate, as herein listed, is registered in the office of the District Superintendent of Schools in the District and that the Teacher shall not be compensated for any services performed prior to the date of registration of this certificate.

NINTH: Terms and conditions set forth in this agreement shall be subject to such wages and conditions of employment as may, from time to time, be mutually agreed upon by and between the Board and nurse or a duly recognized collective bargaining agent for said nurse, and said agreement, when reduced to writing, and executed by the parties, shall be deemed to be included herein by reference and shall become a part hereof.

TENTH: Nurse's failure to return a signed copy of the contract or renewal agreement to the Superintendent of Schools or Secretary of the Board of Education of the District on or before May 12, 2021, shall constitute a rejection of this offer of employment.
