The purpose of this MOU is to provide additional emergency leave to Bartlesville Public Schools support employees so they will not experience a loss of benefits and compensation during the COVID-19 school closure. An emergency day will be provided to each support employee for every non-working day during the school closure, as long as the school closure is mandated by the state Board of Education or the Board. A "non-working day" is defined as each day that a support employee is not called to work during the school closure to perform essential duties. The Superintendent shall have the authority to determine which duties are essential and which employees are necessary to carry out those duties. The leave will be non-cumulative and will have no cash value, if not utilized.

VII. Adopt a resolution rescinding that part of the previous election resolution adopted by the Board of Education on October 21, 2019 (agenda item VII.B) calling a general election for Election District Number Six for Tuesday, April 7, 2020, and rescheduling the general election for Election District Number Six to Tuesday, June 30, 2020

On March 18, 2020, the Secretary of the Oklahoma State Election Board issued a Declaration of Election Emergency pursuant to Title 26, Section 22- 101 of the Oklahoma Statutes, declaring that an election emergency exists in all counties in Oklahoma, including Washington County, due to the ongoing Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, and finding that such emergency circumstances could make substantial compliance with state and federal election laws impossible or unreasonable, or could disrupt voter registration, voting, the tabulation of votes or the certification of election results. For this reason, the Oklahoma State Election Board authorized the governing body of any public body that called an election for Tuesday, April 7, 2020, to pass a resolution rescinding that election date and rescheduling the election to June 30, 2020.

Board of Education Meetings Teleconferencing or Videoconferencing Regulations

Until November 15, 2020 or the Governor declaring the state of emergency to be terminated, whichever comes first, the board of education may hold meetings by either teleconference or videoconference if each member of the school board is audible or visible to each other and the public. If at any time the audio connection is disconnected, the meeting shall be stopped and reconvened once the audio connection is restored.

Agendas shall be posted on the district’s website at www.bps-ok.org/home/district/boardofeducation and at the principal office of the school district in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. The board is not required to make the notice of the meeting available to the public in the principal office of the district or at the location of the meeting during normal business hours.

The meeting notice and agenda shall indicate if the meeting will include teleconferencing or videoconferencing. The notice and agenda shall also indicate each member of the board who will be appearing remotely and whether the member will be attending via videoconference or teleconference. The notice and agenda shall also include the identity of the member or members who will be physically present at the meeting site, if any.

After the meeting notice and agenda are prepared and posted as required by law, members of the board cannot alter their method of appearance unless a member who was planning to attend remotely would like to physically appear at the meeting site.

The public shall be allowed to participate and to speak at meetings, in the same manner and to the extent possible as the public is allowed to participate or speak under the district’s public participation policy.

Any materials that will be shared electronically between members of the board of education during a meeting utilizing teleconferencing or videoconferencing shall be immediately available to the public in the same form shared with the members of the public body. The only exception to this would be any documents that are shared in a lawfully convened executive session under an appropriately worded agenda item.

All votes of the board shall be via roll call vote and shall be recorded in the minutes.

The board of education can conduct an executive session utilizing teleconference or videoconference. The meeting notice and agenda shall indicate if the executive session will include teleconferencing or videoconferencing. The notice and agenda shall also state:

1. The identity of each member appearing remotely,
2. The method of each member's remote appearance,
3. And whether any member will be physically present at the meeting site, if any, for the executive session.

The public meeting held by videoconference or teleconference shall be recorded either by written, electronic, or other means.

Board of Education Meetings and Notification Procedures

The Bartlesville Board of Education shall comply with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. ~~No meetings will be held by teleconference.~~ A meeting may be either regular, special, or emergency meetings, defined as follows:

Regular Meeting - The regular meetings of the Bartlesville Board of Education shall be held at the time, date and place specified in the annual notice to the County Clerk.

Special Meeting - a meeting called between scheduled regular meetings to consider specific topics as listed on the agenda. Business transacted at any special meeting may be for either a specific or a general purpose.

Special meetings of the board may be called by the board president at any time, and the superintendent shall call special meetings whenever so requested, in writing, by any three members of the board.

Emergency Meeting - a meeting held only for dealing with situations involving either injury to persons or damage to public or personal property or an immediate financial loss so severe that the 48-hour notice period of a special meeting would be impractical and increase the likelihood of injury or damage or immediate financial loss.

Notification of Meetings

Notice of all meetings of the board of education shall be made in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Procedures for ensuring proper notice, preparing agendas, etc., are as follows:

1. Prior to December 15 each year, the board of education shall provide the county clerk a listing of the time, date, and place of all regular meetings for the coming calendar year.
2. Any change in the date, time, or place of a regular meeting shall be provided in writing to the county clerk at least ten days prior to implementing the change.
3. At least 24 [1] hours prior to a regular or special meeting, an agenda shall be posted which shall include the date, time, and place of the meeting and the business to be undertaken at the meeting.
4. Notice of the time, date, and place of a special meeting shall be provided to the county clerk in person, in writing, or by telephone at least 48 hours prior to the meeting.
5. Emergency meetings may be held without the required public notice if it is reasonably believed that delay would increase the likelihood of personal injury, property damage, or immediate financial loss to the district. The person calling an emergency meeting shall give as much advance notice as is possible in person or by telephone.

6. Any person, newspaper, wire service, radio station, and/or television station may file a written request with the board clerk to receive written notice of meetings of the board of education. Such requests must be renewed annually. Persons or entities requesting written notification will not be charged a notification fee.

Board of Education Meeting Public Participation

All regular, special and emergency meetings of the Bartlesville Board of Education shall be open to the public.

The board wishes to hear the viewpoints of citizens throughout the district and considers the responsible presentation of these viewpoints vital to the efficient operation of the school system. The board also recognizes its responsibility for the proper governance of the schools and the need to conduct its business in an orderly and efficient manner. The board, therefore, establishes the following procedures to receive input from the citizens of this district:

1. Any individual wishing to address the board of education shall communicate such wish to the president of the board by filling out a request card. The card must state the nature of the matter to be discussed and the full name of the person making the request. The card must be received by the president of the board prior to the regularly scheduled meeting. Persons desiring to address an item on the agenda will have the opportunity to speak during the "Public Comment" section of the board agenda. Persons desiring to address an item not on the agenda will have the opportunity to speak after the "New Business" section of the board agenda.
2. The president of the board shall recognize speakers, maintain proper order, and adhere to the five-minute time limit established by the board.
3. Board members and administrative staff will not respond to questions from the public at the board meeting. Questions requiring investigation shall be referred to the superintendent for later report to the board. The board will not, in most instances, be able to vote on matters brought forward by the public during public participation time if such matters are not specific agenda items. Such items may be placed on the agenda for the next meeting.
4. Members of the public will not normally be recognized while the board is conducting its official business. However, the president has the right to recognize or limit spontaneous patron comments.

Until November 15, 2020 or the Governor declares the state of emergency to be terminated, whichever comes first, the board of education may be conducting meetings via teleconference or videoconference. Members of the public shall be allowed to submit requests to address the board in the same manner that they were allowed at physical meetings of the board. In order to expedite these requests, those requests may be emailed to the superintendent or board president at

Resolution to Grant Emergency Powers to the Superintendent

Whereas on March 15, 2020, Governor Kevin Stitt declared a state of emergency due to the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of the State of Oklahoma; and

Whereas, on March 16, 2020, the state Board of Education voted to enact mandatory, statewide closure of all public schools for purposes of providing instructional services or activities until April 6, 2020

Whereas under 70 O.S. §§ 5-106 & 5-117, the Board of Education of each school district in Oklahoma has general control and supervision of all matters pertaining to the public schools; and

Whereas under 70 O.S. 5-106 the Board of Education has the authority to prescribe the duties of the Superintendent, subject to such limitations set forth in the law; and

Whereas the Board of Education finds that the current state of emergency requires that the Superintendent be granted greater flexibility to respond quickly and appropriately to the evolving crisis; and

Whereas the Board of Education under board policy BE, may delegate its executive powers to the Superintendent and provide the Superintendent freedom to manage the school district within the Board policies; and

Whereas, the Board of Education may by majority vote of the Board members present at a Board meeting held in compliance with law and Board policies grant to the Superintendent the authority to suspend temporarily the operation of any section or sections of Board policies not established by law or contract.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bartlesville Public Schools Board of Education grants to the Superintendent the following temporary powers to address the COVID-19 emergency:

1. Authority to temporarily waive such Board policies or provisions of Board policies as the Superintendent shall deem necessary to comply with guidance from appropriate health or governmental authorities or necessary for other effective response, provided such action is consistent with all applicable State and Federal laws.
2. Authority to take any lawful actions necessary to ensure the continuation of public education, to provide for the health and safety of students and employees, or to respond to direction from appropriate health and government authorities. Such actions may include, but are not limited to: adjustments to the curriculum and the

provision of alternative educational program options; adjustments to employee work schedules and assignments; modifications to the school calendar; adjustments to the delivery of school-provided meals; limitations on access to property owned or controlled by the Board of Education; applying to any governmental body for financial or other aid as may be available; and applying to any governmental body for waiver of regulations or requirements, compliance with which is affected by the COVID-19 emergency, provided such action is consistent with all applicable State and Federal laws.

3. Authority to enter into contracts without prior Board approval for any dollar amount necessary for the purchase of materials, equipment, supplies, or services for sanitation, cleaning, technology, or other needs directly related to the COVID-19 emergency situation, provided such action is consistent with all applicable State and Federal laws.

NOW, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is directed to keep the Board of Education informed of any actions taken under this emergency authority as soon as is practicable in light of the circumstances.

NOW, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the temporary powers authorized by this Resolution are in effect for the duration identified in Governor's Order 2020-07 of March 15, 2020, and any subsequent extension of that order, unless otherwise rescinded or extended by the Board upon a majority vote.

NOW, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that execution of this Resolution is conclusive evidence of the Board's approval of this action and of the authority granted herein.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
Bartlesville Public Schools Board of Education
and
Bartlesville Education Classified Personnel Organization

1. **Parties.** This **one-time** Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as “MOU”) is made and entered into by and between the Bartlesville Public Schools Board of Education (hereinafter referred to as “Board”) and the Bartlesville Education Classified Personnel Organization (hereinafter referred to as “Association”).
2. **Definitions.** For the purpose of this MOU, a support employee is defined as a current employee of the Board who has served on a support contract for any number of days during the 2019-2020 school year.
3. **Purpose.** The purpose of this MOU is to provide additional emergency leave to Bartlesville Public Schools support employees so they will not experience a loss of benefits and compensation during the COVID-19 school closure. **An emergency day will be provided to each support employee for every non-working day during the school closure, as long as the school closure is mandated by the state Board of Education or the Board.** A “non-working day” is defined as each day that a support employee is not called to work during the school closure to perform essential duties. The Superintendent shall have the authority to determine which duties are essential and which employees are necessary to carry out those duties. The leave will be non-cumulative and will have no cash value, if not utilized.
4. **Term of MOU.** This MOU will be retroactively effective beginning March 23, 2020 and shall remain in effect until June 30, 2020 OR until the Superintendent, on behalf of the Board, determines it is safe for Bartlesville Public Schools to resume regular operations, whichever occurs first.
5. **Responsibilities of the Board / Designees.**
 - Board designees will communicate the terms of the MOU with all district support employees.
 - Board designees will ensure emergency leave is appropriately applied to the payroll/leave records of all support employees.
 - Board designees will recall employees to work, if days remain in their contract, once regular school operations resume.
 - Board designees will notify Association representatives immediately when the MOU is no longer in effect.
6. **Responsibilities of Association.** Not applicable.

BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTION RESOLUTION

TO: Washington County Election Board

FROM: The Bartlesville Public School District, Independent School
District No. 30 of Washington, County, Oklahoma

The Board of Education of the Bartlesville Public School District has approved the following resolution calling for an election to be submitted to the voters of the district.

Date of the Election:

A Board of Education General Election shall be held on June 30, 2020, pursuant to Title 26, Section 22- 101 of the Oklahoma Statutes, declaring that an election emergency exists in all counties in Oklahoma, including Washington County, due to the ongoing Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, and finding that such emergency circumstances could make substantial compliance with state and federal election laws impossible or unreasonable, or could disrupt voter registration, voting, the tabulation of votes or the certification of election results. For this reason, the Oklahoma State Election Board authorized the governing body of any public body that called an election for Tuesday, April 7, 2020, to pass a resolution rescinding that election date and rescheduling the election to June 30, 2020. The polling places shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Board Member Position on Ballot:

The voters shall elect a board member for board position No. 6, which has a 4-year term of office.

Qualifications of Candidates for Office:

To be eligible to be a candidate for member of the board of education of a school district, a person must have resided in the district for at least six months preceding the first day of the filing period, and have been a registered voter registered with the county election board at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the district for six months preceding the first day of the filing period. In school districts that have been divided into election districts, a candidate must have resided in the district for six months preceding the first day of the filing period and have been a registered voter registered with the county election board at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the election district for six months preceding the first day of the filing period.

No person shall be eligible to be a candidate for or elected to be a member of the board of education of a school district unless the person has been awarded a high school diploma or certificate of high school equivalency.

A person who has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving embezzlement or a felony under the laws of this state or of the United States or who has entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to such misdemeanor involving embezzlement or felony or who has been

convicted of a crime in another state which would have been a misdemeanor involving embezzlement or a felony under the laws of this state or has entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to such crime shall not be eligible to be a candidate for or be elected to any school board office for a period of fifteen years following completion of his sentence or during the pendency of an appeal of such conviction or plea.

No person shall be eligible to be a candidate for or serve on a board of education if he or she is currently employed by the school district governed by the board of education or is related within the second degree by affinity or consanguinity to any other member of the board of education or to any employee of the school district. The following are relatives within the second degree: A candidate's spouse, child, parent, grandchild, grandparent, brother, sister, spouse's child, spouse's grandchild, spouse's brother, spouse's sister, spouse's grandparent, grandchild's spouse, parent's spouse, and child's spouse. The prohibitions in this paragraph shall not apply if the board member candidate is related within the second degree of affinity or consanguinity to an individual employed as a substitute teacher by the school district or as a temporary substitute support employee if the school district has an Average Daily Membership of less than five thousand (5,000).

Candidates must affirm that upon being elected as a new member of the Board of Education, within fifteen (15) months of election, they will complete at least twelve (12) hours of instruction on education issues, including school finance, Oklahoma education laws, and ethics, duties and responsibilities of district board of education members. Three (3) of these twelve (12) credits must be earned as follows: one (1) credit in ethics, one (1) credit in open meeting act and open records act, and one (1) credit in school finance. Incumbents must affirm that they will complete six (6) hours of instruction within fifteen (15) months of election emphasizing changes in school law. Three (3) of these six (6) credits must be earned as follows: one (1) credit in ethics, one (1) credit in open meeting act and open records act, and one (1) credit in school finance.

Voters Eligible to Vote:

To be eligible to vote, a voter must be registered with the county election board at an address within the geographical boundaries of the district.

The ballot to be submitted to the voters shall call for the voters to:

OKLAHOMA STATE ELECTION BOARD

DECLARATION OF ELECTION EMERGENCY 2020-01

WHEREAS on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization classified the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) as a pandemic; and

WHEREAS on March 13, 2020, President of the United States Donald J. Trump declared the ongoing Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant an emergency declaration for all states, tribes, territories, and the District of Columbia pursuant to section 501 (b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the "Stafford Act"); and

WHEREAS Governor J. Kevin Stitt issued Executive Order 2020-07 on March 15, 2020, as amended on March 17, 2020, declaring an emergency for all 77 Oklahoma counties caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of this State and the public's peace, health, and safety; and

WHEREAS Governor J. Kevin Stitt issued Executive Order 2020-08 on March 17, 2020, urging Oklahomans to follow *The President's Coronavirus Guidelines for America*, which includes the recommendation to avoid gatherings in groups of more than ten (10) people; and

WHEREAS declarations of local states of emergency have been issued by numerous counties and municipalities across the State of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS Paragraph 1 of Subsection A of Section 22-101 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes authorizes the Secretary of the State Election Board to "declare an election emergency for any area of the state" when a national or local emergency "has occurred or is imminent, and such circumstances could make substantial compliance with state and federal election laws impossible or unreasonable, or could disrupt voter registration, voting, the tabulation of votes or the certification of election results;" and

WHEREAS the Secretary of the State Election Board agrees with recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") and other health experts that large public gatherings should be limited in an effort to decrease the risk of the community spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS the Secretary of the State Election Board finds that national and local emergencies currently exist that could make substantial compliance with state and federal election laws impossible or unreasonable, or that the existing emergencies could disrupt voter registration, voting, the tabulation of votes or the certification of election results

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Paul Ziriak, Secretary of the Oklahoma State Election Board, pursuant to the power vested in me by Paragraph 1 of Subsection A of Section 22-101 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes, hereby declare and order the following:

1. An election emergency exists for the elections scheduled for Tuesday, April 7, 2020, in the following counties in the State of Oklahoma: Adair, Alfalfa, Atoka, Beaver, Beckham, Blaine, Bryan, Caddo, Canadian, Carter, Cherokee, Choctaw, Cleveland, Coal, Comanche, Cotton, Craig, Creek, Custer, Delaware, Dewey, Ellis, Garfield, Garvin, Grady, Grant, Greer, Harmon, Harper, Haskell, Hughes, Jackson, Johnston, Kay, Kingfisher, Kiowa, Latimer, LeFlore, Lincoln, Logan, Love, McClain, McCurtain, McIntosh, Major, Mayes, Murray, Muskogee, Noble, Nowata, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Okmulgee, Osage, Ottawa, Pawnee, Payne, Pittsburg, Pontotoc, Pottawatomie, Pushmataha, Roger Mills, Rogers, Seminole, Sequoyah, Stephens, Texas, Tillman, Tulsa, Wagoner, Washington, Washita, Woods, and Woodward.

2. No later than March 19, 2020, the Secretary of the County Election Board in each county that has elections scheduled on April 7, 2020, shall provide a copy of this election emergency declaration to the governing body of each entity in the county that has scheduled an election on that date. Types of entities that may have called statutory, regular, or special elections on April 7, 2020, include counties, municipalities, school districts, and technology center districts.

3. The governing body of any entity that called a regular or statutory election on Tuesday, April 7, 2020, is hereby authorized to reschedule the election to Tuesday, June 30, 2020. To reschedule the election, the governing body shall provide a resolution to the appropriate County Election Board Secretary no later than Monday, March 30, 2020, that (a) rescinds the portion of the original resolution that called the Tuesday, April 7, 2020, election and that (b) reschedules the election to June 30, 2020.

4. Alternatively, the governing body of any entity that called a special election on Tuesday, April 7, 2020, is hereby authorized to reschedule the election on any election date allowed by Section 3-101 of Title 26. To reschedule the election, the governing body shall provide a resolution to the appropriate County Election Board Secretary no later than Monday, March 30, 2020, that (a) rescinds the Tuesday, April 7, 2020, election date and (b) reschedules the election on any election date allowed by Section 3-101 of Title 26.

5. A County Election Board Secretary who receives a resolution that conforms to the requirements of items 3 and 4 shall accept the resolution and take the necessary action to reschedule the election as provided in the resolution.

6. Any entity that reschedules the election shall continue to be responsible for paying all election costs incurred by the County Election Board for the April 7, 2020, election as

required by statute, as well as the expenses to be incurred by the County Election Board on behalf of the entity for the rescheduled election.

7. A rescheduled election involving candidates or questions shall remain exactly the same as candidates and questions appeared on the ballot for the April 7, 2020, election.


Copies of this election emergency declaration shall be provided to each of the 77 county election board secretaries, the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Secretary of State, the Director of Emergency Management, and the Oklahoma State Health Commissioner.
