February 13, 2024. Tree Board meeting minutes

Attendance: Joanne Langabee, Don Preister, Tom Mruz, Nancy Scott, and Deborah Woracek were present. Graham Herbst, Community Forest Specialist of the Nebraska Forest Service was a guest. Craig Kimball and Scott Evans were excused. Rob Clatterbuck and Jim Shada did not attend the meeting.

Jo reminded all to turn their volunteer time and mileage to Deborah.

Tom motioned to approve the January 2024 meeting minutes. Jo second. All approved of the January minutes. **Deborah will send them to the City Clerk to be filed.**

There was no **park report** as Jim Shada did not attend the meeting or send one.

Old Business: Jo reported that the **Tree City, USA** forms were sent in with a few minor changes due to the new Arbor Day Foundation format. Graham mentioned that the foundation is moving toward looking at ordinance reviews for future points. Jo suggested we look at our city Tree Ordinance to see if it may need revising. Nancy thinks this would be a good winter project for the Board. Don reminded us that the Arbor Day Foundation may send out a new set of parameters for Tree City, USA. Graham works with the Foundation template every year. He announced a new workshop to be held in late summer or early fall. It will be called Trees, People, and Towns. The Tree City, USA ceremony will be held at this workshop. The workshop is still in the planning stage. Jo asked Graham about the possibility of getting more signs for Bellevue entrances, such as Highway 370 and Cornhusker Road. **Graham asked Jo to email him to send her the Foundation contact who can help with the signs.**

Year End Report status: The Year End Report is at the City Clerk. Don asked Deborah to verify that it was received, since it was not on the last agenda. **Deborah will do so after the meeting. Addendum: The report was emailed by Deborah to the city on Jan. 10, 2024, and before the Council on January 16.**

Arbor Day: Don reported that Birchcrest Elementary school is interested in having us plant a tree with their students. He is waiting for Mission Jr. High to give him the name

of the teacher to set up planting a tree at that school. **Don will send requests to the Mayor for the proclamation to be generated then read at each planting.**

Earth Day: Don announced that we may have a table at the community-wide Earth Day event in Omaha and a smaller event in Bellevue. The dates are 27 April for Omaha and 14 April for Bellevue. **We are to mark our calendars for those event dates.**

Tree Festival Work: Prior to today's meeting Don sent an email of the grant being written by Diana Fiala, to fund the festival. The Tree Festival will be October 5th with a rain date of October 12th at Banner Park. Don reminded us, Jim Meier, NE Memorial Forest, is arranging it with us. **Don will gather information for publication as a Save the Date document to be passed out to the public. He will also ask the Mayor for his updated approval of our plans.** We will plant up to 50 trees with memorials on 50 total park trees in Banner Park for the Veteran's Memorial Forest Nebraska. The memorials will also include police and fire fighters who died in the line of duty. There will be a QR code at the park which will include a map of the memorials. Don explained that the tree festival will also have various table vendors such as Green Bellevue, County Extensions, NFS, Arbor Day Foundation, possibly Papillion and Gretna's tree boards, and Fontenelle Forest all with information. Native plant groups, pollinator groups, Bee City USA and bee clubs, etc. will also be invited. The tables may cost \$25 for non-profits and \$50 for others. The vendors will have their information available during the hours of the festival. We will give away 100 trees to people at the event. Tentative plans include a tree planting demonstration at 9:30 am prior to volunteers planting trees. A second demonstration will be done with the tree given away at 11 am. Nancy asked Graham to arrange for the portable sawmill to come. A discussion about finding suitable trees for it followed, with a suggestion to ask Rob Clatterbuck or Parks about saving a cut tree for this. The festival should be posted to the City, Green Bellevue and other web sites.

Workshops with Graham Herbst: Oak Wilt Workshop – Jo and Graham announced that Justin Matlock of Rainbow Tree Care in Missouri will co-host the Oak wilt workshop. Justin will treat the Bellevue Cemetery Oaks, that have the wilt, for free in conjunction with introducing new products that treat wilt. The event is in August or early September. Jo reported that we have permission from the city to meet at the Reed Center, then walk over to the cemetery for the demonstrations. The Bellevue Tree Board, Bellevue City Parks Department and Green Bellevue will host and will invite other tree boards and city workers to attend.

Tree Pruning Workshop – Graham said that spring is better for tree pruning. He is concerned about the size of the trees at BWHS as they were planted several years ago. Jo would like to see a bench and more signage put into the BWHS plantings. They look great due to the ROTC watering them for the first 4 years. Don believes the school has an environmental club. **Jo will contact the school about funding and doing this.** Jo would like to have the pruning workshop held at Am. Heroes Park. Graham asked if **Rob Clatterbuck or the city can bring a cherry picker to the workshop? Tom Mruz volunteered to lead this workshop's planning.** We set tentative dates of the 6th of April or the 13th of April as the rain date. This will give us time to make contacts, etc.

Graham would like to look into pruning at BWHS, possibly with Rob Clatterbuck's help, if needed. Graham pointed out that there are numerous up-coming workshops such as the Tree, People, and Towns workshop.

Don asked Graham the status of the grant for Tree Plotter software and tablets for us to do our inventory. The grant was approved for the city last October, but Jo has not heard of anything further. Don asked if the delay was due to Sarpy County GPS. Graham said no awards were made yet. Rachel Ormseth of Tree Plotter will have a webinar about using the software on March 5th. **Jo will send that information to Jim Shada, Dave Goedeken, and Mark Blackburn, City Parks, so they can plan to attend.**

Jo thanked Graham, on behalf of the board, for attending to share all his information.

Deborah suggested adding the following to the President's Role document: Attend all meetings possible to provide consistency in leadership. All approved of doing this.

There being no further business, Nancy and Don moved and seconded that we adjourn the meeting. All present approved. Our next Tree Board meeting will be March 12, 2024 at 9am in the conference meeting room on Wall Street. **Jo will reserve the room. She told Tom that she has a 10 am Zoom meeting that she must attend so he, as Vice President, will need to complete the meeting, if needed.**

G. PURPOSE OF REQUEST:

The purpose of this request is to obtain approval of a rezoning with site plan approval and preliminary plat for the purpose of residential and commercial development.

H. SIZE OF SITE:

The site is approximately 57.89 acres.

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

A. EXISTING CONDITION OF SITE:

The site is vacant and covered in vegetation. It has most recently been used agriculturally.

B. GENERAL NEIGHBORHOOD/AREA LAND USES AND ZONING:

1. **North:** OPPD Substation/Dist. #3 Fire Station, RS-72
2. **East:** Single Family Residential, RS-72 (across S. 36th Street)
3. **South:** Commercial/Vacant, BG and AG (across Cornhusker Rd)
4. **West:** Vacant, AG

C. REVELANT CASE HISTORY:

On January 25, 2024, the Planning Commission recommended approval of a request to rezone Lots 1 through 116, and Outlots A through E, Cornhusker Creek, being a platting of Tax Lot 30A1, from RS-72 to RD-60-PS, RG50-PS, RG-20-PS, MU, and BG and preliminary plat Lots 1 through 116, and Outlots a through E, Cornhusker Creek.

D. APPLICABLE REGULATIONS:

1. Section 5.11, Zoning Ordinance, regarding RD-60 uses and requirements.
2. Section 5.12, Zoning Ordinance, regarding RG-50 uses and requirements.
3. Section 5.14, Zoning Ordinance, regarding RG-20 uses and requirements.
4. Section 5.19, Zoning Ordinance, regarding MU uses and requirements.
5. Section 5.22, Zoning Ordinance, regarding BG uses and requirements.

6. Section 5.17, Zoning Ordinance, regarding -PS uses and requirements.
7. Chapter 3, Subdivision Regulations, regarding Preliminary Plats.
8. Chapter 6, Subdivision Regulations, regarding Minimum Design Standards.

III. ANALYSIS

A. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan designates this area as commercial along Cornhusker Road, with medium-density residential for the remainder of the property.

B. OTHER PLANS:

None

C. TRAFFIC AND ACCESS:

1. The 2020 MAPA traffic data indicates 18,219 vehicles per day along Cornhusker Road near the intersection of South 36th Street. The data indicates 6,632 vehicles per day along South 36th Street near the intersection of Cornhusker Road.
2. Access is proposed from three newly created points: Barbara Circle and Tamarac Drive off South 36th Street, and South 38th Street off of Cornhusker Road.

D. UTILITIES:

All utilities are available or will be constructed to serve this development.

E. ANALYSIS:

1. Tim Tran, on behalf of Cornhusker Creek, LLC, has submitted a request to preliminary plat Lots 1 through 116, and Outlots A through E, Cornhusker Creek, for the purpose of residential and commercial development.
2. The applicant is also requesting a change of zone (with site plan approval) from RS-72 to RD-60-PS, RG-20-PS, RG-50-PS, MU, and BG for the purpose of residential and commercial development.

The applicant is proposing medium-density residential lots with single-family residences and duplexes, as well as multi-family residential.

The RD-60 (Duplex Residential) and RG-50 (General Residential) zoning districts are intended to permit single-family and two-family residential developments and

other compatible uses on smaller-sized lots.

The RG-20 (General Residential) zoning district is intended to permit moderately high-density development and uses that are typical and compatible in the operation of apartment houses.

The -PS zoning overlay allows for the construction of multiple buildings on one lot, in addition to encouraging the creative design of new living areas. With the -PS zoning overlay, site plan approval is required.

The MU zoning district is intended to accommodate projects that combine several compatible land uses into an integrated development and to allow for flexibility in the siting of buildings and the layout of lots. The district permits mixing residential areas with workplaces and services.

The intent of the BG district is to provide for a wide range of retail and service establishments.

Proposed Lots 1 through 9 would be developed with duplexes. Lots 10 through 113 will be constructed with single-family residences. Lot 114 would be utilized as a small commercial lot. Proposed Lot 115 would be developed as a mixed-use property with both multi-family residential and commercial/retail space. Lot 116 will be for a future high-density residential development. The proposed zoning will require site plan approval at a later date. Site plan approval is not being requested for that lot at this time.

3. The MU (Mixed Use) development proposal on Lot 115 consists of 180 multi-family units in three buildings. The buildings are a mix of studio, one-, two-, and three-bedroom units.

In addition, the first floor of Building 3 (along 36th/Cornhusker) will contain 15,000 square feet of retail space.

4. The site plan shows 347 surface parking stalls for the development, in addition to 95 garage spaces, for a total of 442 parking spaces. Seventy-five parking stalls are provided for the retail/commercial space.

The number of parking spaces exceeds the minimum required by ordinance.

5. The applicant is proposing a dog park and a clubhouse (within one of the buildings) with community space as amenities for its residents.

6. The landscape plan for the MU district on Lot 115 has been reviewed by staff and meets the intent of the ordinance. The landscape plan has also been reviewed by OPPD for compliance in relation to their easements.

7. As part of the requirements of the MU district, the applicant has provided a building elevation which is attached to this report. Specific building material information needs to be provided by the applicant's architect prior to finalization of the Mixed Use Development Agreement. The proposed buildings will need to meet the requirements of Section 8.12, Zoning Ordinance, regarding design standards.

A draft Mixed Use Development Agreement has been submitted and is under review by the City Attorney.

8. The applicant intends to develop this area as a Sanitary and Improvement District. A draft Subdivision Agreement has been submitted and is under review by the City Attorney.

9. This application was sent out to the following departments for review: Public Works, Permits and Inspections, Chief of Police, Offutt Air Force Base, Fire Inspector, Sarpy County Public Works, Metropolitan Utilities District, Cox Cable, Black Hills Energy, CenturyLink, Sarpy County GIS/911, OPPD, MAPA, Papio-Missouri River NRD, and the Bellevue Public School District. The cover letter indicated a deadline to send comments back to the Planning Department, and also stated if the requested department did not have comments pertaining to the application, no response was needed.

Bellevue Public Works Engineering Manager John Krager requested technical revisions to the preliminary drainage study, sanitary sewer calculations, and the plat. Public Works asked for additional minor revisions to the paving plan for the South 36th Street improvements, as well as additional information on the lift station proposed to handle the sanitary sewer for this development. The proposed sanitary sewer will gravity flow to an existing city lift station south of The Landings Apartments on South 36th Street. This lift station will require some minor upgrades as a result. The city and developer have agreed to cost share for these improvements. Additional engineering has been done to determine the extent of the necessary upgrades and overall cost. This expense has been updated on the Source and Use of Funds. As part of the draft Subdivision Agreement, the city and applicant have agreed to proceed with an interlocal agreement once final costs are determined.

Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) Engineer Ty Kuper requested a CAD file of the grading showing the existing transmission easements.

Offutt Air Force Base Community Planner Jacob Jambor stated "The southwest corner of the property is within Offutt's 65 dB noise contour. Development within and adjacent to this area may be subject to elevated noise levels and disturbances due to Aircraft activity. It is suggested that planned development take this into account and consider noise mitigation options or designate that part of the property for compatible development, such as water retention systems, drainage corridors, or open green space."

The applicant's detention systems are provided in this area. Typical construction standards will be sufficient to mitigate this additional noise.

No other comments were received on this case.

10. A traffic study was required by Public Works and submitted with this application. City Staff reviewed the traffic study conducted by Felsburg Holt & Ullevig (FHU) and concurred with its findings.

As part of this development, a full intersection will be allowed at proposed South 38th Street and Cornhusker Road. This intersection will need to be signalized upon buildout (2028) of the development. Site related traffic is anticipated to make up approximately 11% of the total traffic at the intersection. The SID will participate in a cost share for the traffic light when warranted.

Improvements are also necessary to South 36th Street as a result of this development. Northbound and southbound left-turn lanes are warranted at the stop-controlled intersections of 36th Street and Tamarac Drive. The developer has included the cost of this improvement in his proposed Source and Use of Funds, as well as the draft Subdivision Agreement.

11. The developer is providing a trail along the south side of Tamarac Drive as requested by staff. This will provide a future connection to the west. Internal sidewalks will provide connectivity throughout the development and are also shown along the proposed outlots.

12. This is a difficult site to develop due to topography, floodway/floodplain, and existing OPPD infrastructure/easements. Staff agrees with the justification for the -PS overlay for these reasons.

13. A small portion of this property is currently in the floodplain. This impacts the southwest corner of the development, and a portion of this ground will be utilized as detention under the proposed plat. FEMA is in the process of releasing updated mapping for this area. The draft maps propose a slight decrease of the floodplain for this property.

14. Based upon the number of acres, this development will require a contribution to the Park Fund in the amount of \$31,967.50. This includes a credit of \$300 per acre due to the proposed trail costs. This fee must be paid prior to the filing of the final plat.

15. Staff believes this development is compatible with the surrounding area.

16. This property is designated for commercial and medium-density residential use in the Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan. With the proposed mixed-

use development along Cornhusker Road, Staff believes this development is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

Staff does not recommend amending the Future Land Use Map as the city is currently undergoing a Comprehensive Plan update and this area will be reviewed as part of that process.

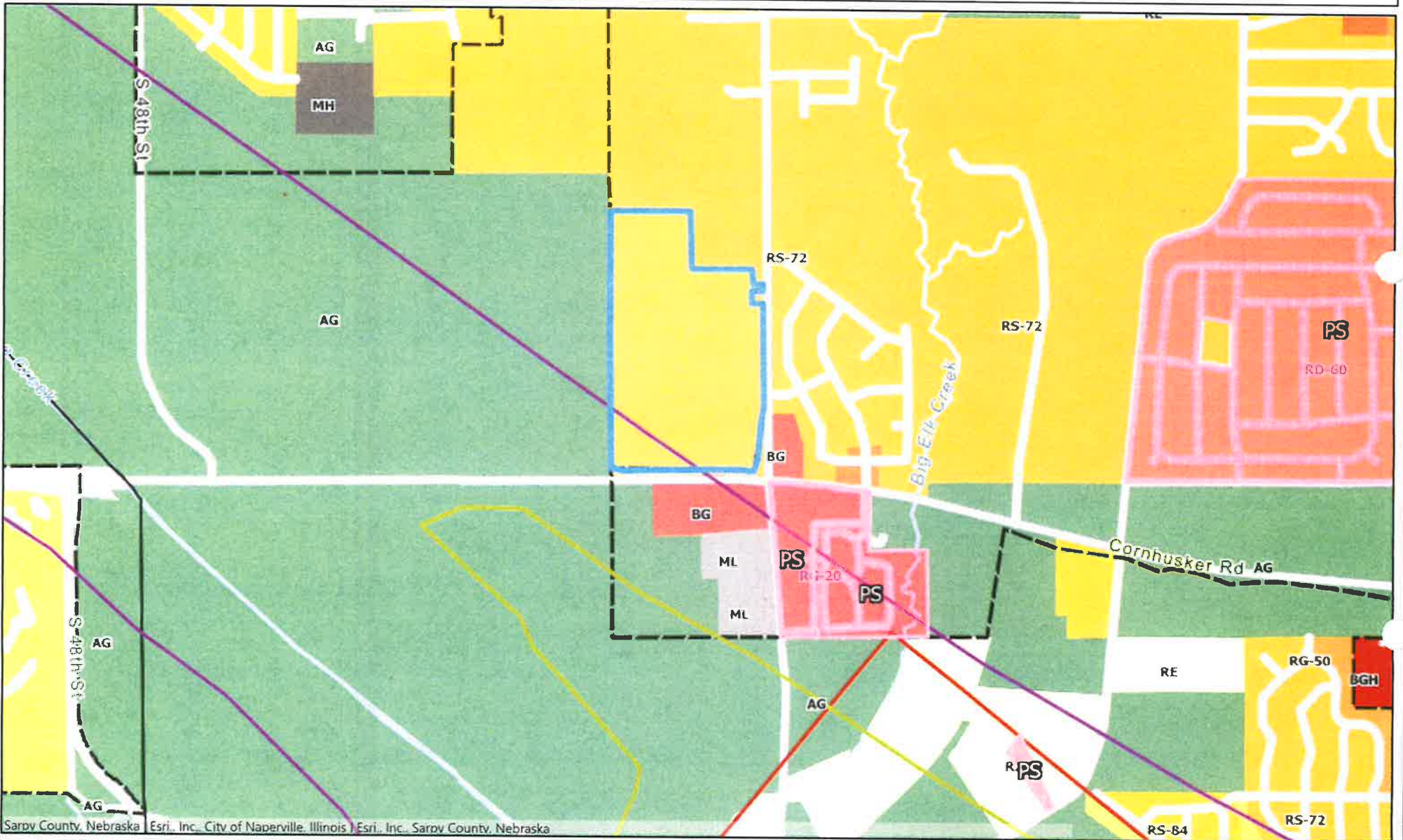

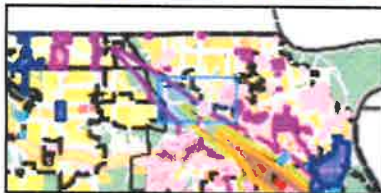

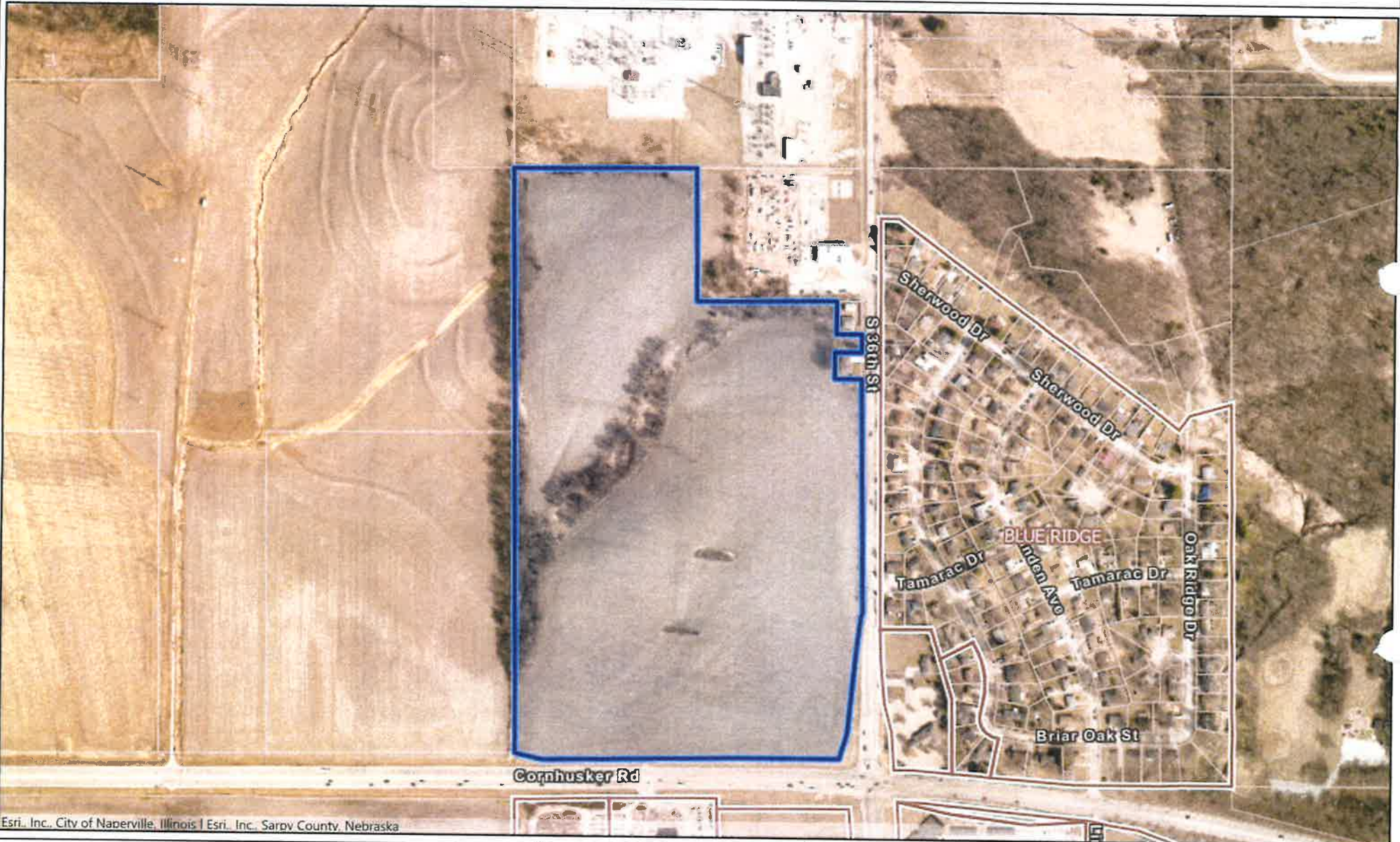

Ms. Palm:

The applicant, Cornhusker Creek LLC, for the proposed Cornhusker Creek subdivision is requesting a PS overlay for the lots within the proposed zoning of RD-60, RG-50, and RG-20. Below is a description of the proposed variances to each corresponding zoning area:

1. The lots for proposed zoning of RD-60 (Lots 1-9) do not meet the minimum lot width of 45 feet and the minimum area requirement of 6,000 square feet once the lots are split in half for the planned duplex dwellings. Upon splitting, these lots will use a minimum lot width of 35 to 40 feet and a minimum lot area that is between 5,000 and 6,000 square feet.
2. The lots for proposed zoning of RG-50 (Lots 10-113) shall have a front yard setback of 25 feet.
3. The lot for proposed zoning of RG-20 (Lot 116) shall have a 15-foot setback on all sides to achieve parking requirements for the intended RG-20 density.

The above listed requests are necessary to create a feasible project on this property. The subject property has several distinct features which make it difficult to develop. Those features include, but are not limited to, a power transmission line and easement running through the entirety of the property (north/south), a gas transmission line and easement running through the entirety of the property (east/west), and a lack of access to gravity flow sanitary sewer.

In addition to the above listed site features, there are several improvements costs that are beyond the typical costs for similar developments. These improvements include east and west bound left turn lanes on Cornhusker Road, traffic signal improvement at the 38th Street and Cornhusker Road intersection, widening of 36th Street for north and south bound left turn lanes, and a sanitary sewer lift station and force main. The costs for these improvements and limited ability to get reimbursements from adjacent properties make it necessary for the added density created by the PS Overlay request. These requests allow for the density needed to adequately develop the project.

Hello, Tammi

This is in response to Cornhusker Creek, LLC's application for residential and commercial zoning (Case# Z-2307-13 and S-2307-12) as I am not certain we will be able to attend the hearing tonight, January 25th.

As a resident of Blue Ridge for the last 18 years it was a real gut punch to receive the notice of a potential commercial/residential development being proposed across the street. The area has been a typically quiet area of town that we fell in love with and resulted in the purchase of our home.

As time has gone on and Bellevue has grown by resident and business offerings, 36th and Cornhusker intersection has become more and more busy with vehicles with 36th often being used as a detour for people avoiding driving Cornhusker between 25th and Highway 75 during peak times. Reviewing the plans for Cornhusker Creek has made it clear that this will only get worse as five apartment buildings (and their residents), over 100 residential lots, and two proposed commercial lots are added to the mix. Based on the plans it doesn't even appear there are plans to widen 36th Street to accommodate and I'm not sure there is much widening that can occur with the homes, fire house, and OPPD locations that sit near the roadway as it is today. Add this to the fact that plans only show two main entrance/exits for this development (not counting the small circle with a few residential plots with near exclusive traffic), the residents and commuters will be adding much traffic to an already bustling intersection (speaking to the 36th and Cornhusker intersection AREA, not the immediate vicinity) making it more difficult to get home or leave Blue Ridge for the current residents as homes and businesses add to the congestion.

The traffic burden outline above does not take into account three additional potential issues see with the addition of a development. In no particular order;

One, the potential home valuation affect of having commercially zoned plots so close to the existing residential zones. While there are commercially zones plots on the southwest end, these are smaller businesses that do not add much traffic (outside of Trees, Shrubs, and More during the warmer months). What kinds of guarantees are available that the planned plots are not big traffic drivers or environmental affectors such as gas stations, manufacturing, or more unnecessary car washes? When businesses apply to build here (if they have not already) will nearby residents get a say or will those decisions lie directly on the property owner(s) and the people that actually live nearby and actually "deal" with the ramifications these businesses introduce?

Two, this area is within the Omaha Public Schools District NOT Bellevue Public Schools. That district (and many in the country) is overburdened as it is and those tax dollars are not benefitting the city itself, the district, it's students, the families, or staffs. Why add more residents (and students) to this area when the field across Cornhusker is actually within BPS bounds, or near Twin Creek and resident tax dollars can be used to benefit the school district AND city. All the talk about our children are the future and we aren't making a choice to benefit them, their education, and theirs or ours futures.

Three, this area is below the direct flight path that Offutt AFB utilizes for its landings and takeoffs. What should happen, in the rare but actually possible, occurrence that disaster strikes during one of these routine maneuvers? Those homes, lives, and businesses are potentially lost and forever changed. We are lucky to not be in the stats for an occurrence like this the way that Nellis AFB near Las Vegas or Lake Worth near the Forth Worth Air Reserve base. While I understand

this is a rare and potentially unlikely occurrence, the fear of it does still loom over even us while not DIRECTLY in the flight path.

SUBJECT:

Ordinance No. 4152 to Amend Chapter 18 of the Bellevue Municipal Code by Amending Section 18-95 Regarding Parking of Trucks and to Provide and Effective Date

SYNOPSIS/BACKGROUND:

Code Enforcement recommends this amendment to Section 18-95 of the City Code to add certain language to the current ordinance, which currently results in a possible misapplication of the ordinance's intended purpose. Section 18-95 of City Code intends to prohibit semi trucks, dump trucks, and large trucks of the like from being stored on the street. Currently, the ordinance only applies to those trucks that have exactly a five-ton sticker and does not encompass any truck that could have a seven or ten ton sticker, for example. The proposed "or greater" language, would include trucks that have tonnage stickers exceeding five-tons, and ensure the ordinance is applied as intended.

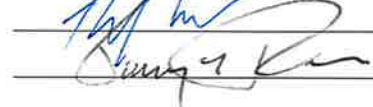

CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT (the "Contract") is made and entered into this 19th day of March 2024 and between the City of Bellevue Nebraska, a municipal corporation of the first class and a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("City"), and Topkote Inc. ("Contractor"). Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Party" shall mean City or Contractor, individually, and the term "Parties" shall mean the City and Contractor, collectively.

WHEREAS, Contractor submitted a bid proposal ("Proposal") to City in response to the solicitation or invitation to perform certain work for certain project(s), (as the work and project(s) are more particularly identified in Paragraph 2 of this Contract); and

WHEREAS, Contractor was selected to perform such work subject to the terms, conditions and other provisions of this Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Contract/Contract Documents. Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Contract Documents" shall mean and include this Contract, and (i) the published notice inviting or soliciting bids or proposals in connection with the Work or Projects; (ii) City's request or solicitation for bids or proposals together with all addenda, drawings, schedules, exhibits, manuals, materials and documents attached or relevant to or referenced in such request or solicitation, including all Instructions, Plans, Specifications, Provisions, General or Special Conditions; (iii) Contractor's Bid or Proposal, together with all addenda, drawings, schedules, exhibits, materials and documents attached or relevant to or referenced in such Bid or Proposal; (iv) all payment, performance, labor, materials, maintenance or other bonds or Contract security; and (v) all written change orders, modifications or supplementary terms, conditions or instructions from City pursuant to paragraph 14(g) of this Contract. All Contract Documents shall be considered to be an integral part of this Contract whether or not attached to this written Contract; provided that in the event there shall be any conflict between this written Contract and any of the other Contract Documents, the provisions of this written Contract shall prevail.

2. Contractor's Work. Except to the extent expressly undertaken by City pursuant to the Contract Documents, (i) Contractor shall perform all site preparation and security, labor, supervision, direction, testing, and other services or work ("Work") necessary or appropriate for completion of the 2024 Chip Seal Projects ("Project") in accordance with the requirements of the Contract Documents; (ii) Contractor shall furnish at its sole cost and expense all bonds, barricades, materials, supplies, equipment, tools, power, water, light, heat, utilities, transportation and all other services, facilities (whether permanent or temporary) and resources required for the Work; (iii) except to the extent otherwise expressly stated in the Contract Documents, Contractor shall be responsible for all means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures, including coordination of all Work. Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Work" shall include all Corrective Work, unless the context otherwise requires. Contractor shall commence the Work within ten (10) days ("Commencement Date") after

receiving a Written Notice to Proceed from City. Contractor shall notify City in writing of the Commencement Date prior to undertaking any work.

3. Quality of Work. Contractor shall perform all Work in a good and workmanlike manner using qualified personnel and any equipment and materials required by the Contract Documents.

4. Site Inspection. Contractor acknowledges that it has inspected the Project site. Contractor waives any claim for additional time, costs, expenses, compensation or other amounts in connection with any condition (known, apparent, or concealed), which it may encounter at the Project site.

5. Contractor's Warranties. All Work is warranted by Contractor to be of highest quality, to be free from any faults or defects and to conform in all respects with the requirements of the Contract Documents.

6. Time of Essence/Liquidated Damages. Time schedules, limits or requirements specified in the Contract Documents are of the essence to this Contract. All Work shall be completed in accordance with the "Specifications", as attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference, unless (i) extended by City, in its sole discretion, or (ii) prevented (assuming, in all such events, Contractor's use of its best efforts to timely complete such Work) by the act or neglect of City or by an act of God or for other reasons beyond the control of Contractor, in which event time shall be extended for such reasonable time as City may determine. Whenever any Work shall not be so completed, then as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, Contractor shall pay City, within five (5) days of demand, the sum of Five Hundred and no/100ths Dollars (\$500.00) per day for each and every calendar day that the Work shall remain uncompleted.

7. Contractor's Compensation/Retainage. City shall pay the Contractor in current U.S. funds for the Contractor's performance of the Work. All Work, including any unit cost shall be undertaken at and performed in accordance with Contractor's Bid or Proposal. Subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the aggregate cost of the Work shall not exceed One hundred and ten thousand five hundred and forty-six and 88/100 Dollars (\$ 110,546.88) ("Contract Sum").

Upon completion of Work at the Project site, Contractor shall submit an invoice requesting payment ("Application for Payment") based upon the amount of Work actually completed at the Project site and Contractor shall set forth in detail the Work performed at the rate specified on Contractor's Bid or Proposal. Unless withheld by city because the Project Site Work does not comply with the Contract Documents or because the Contractor's failure to otherwise comply with the requirements of this contract as they may apply to any of the Work, City shall pay contractor ninety percent (90%) of the invoice within thirty (30) days of its receipt. Final payment constituting the entire unpaid balance of the Contract Sum shall be made by City to Contractor when the Contract has been fully performed and accepted, including Contractor's responsibility to correct nonconforming Work and to satisfy other requirements, if any, which necessarily survive final payment. Prior to final payment, Contractor shall provide evidence that

all employees, subcontractors, material suppliers and other persons or entities have been paid in full for any labor, materials, supplies or equipment used in connection with the Work; such evidence shall consist of receipts, releases, and waivers of liens, claims, security interests, or encumbrances arising out of the Work, to the extent and in such form as may be designated by City. At any time Contractor submits an Application for Payment, it shall constitute a representation by Contractor that all Work is completed as warranted by paragraph 5 of this Contract.

8. Corrective Work. Whenever discovered prior to the expiration of the Warranty Period, Contractor shall promptly correct any Work (“Corrective Work”), which is found to be substandard, defective or otherwise not in accordance with this Contract whether or not such Work or Corrective Work has been completed, installed or constructed. Contractor shall bear all costs and expense of Corrective Work, including all professional, testing, removal or inspection costs.

9. Risk of Loss. Contractor shall bear all risk of loss of or damage to all Work until (i) all Work has been satisfactorily completed and accepted; and (ii) in the case of Corrective Work, until the Corrective Work has been completed to the satisfaction of the City.

10. Contractor’s Indemnity. Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold City, its agents and employees harmless from and against any claims, damages (including damages for any personal injury, bodily injury, including death, or property damages), losses and expenses, including any reasonable attorney fees, of any person or entity arising or resulting from or out of (i) Contractor’s performance under this Contract; (ii) any breach or default in or any violation or nonperformance of any covenant, term, provision, condition or agreement (“Default”) in this Contract to be kept, observed, satisfied or performed by Contractor; (iii) any alleged act, error, omission or negligence of Contractor, its employees, subcontractors, agents, or any other person acting on behalf of Contractor; (iv) any material misrepresentation by Contractor; or (v) Contractor’s operations in or about any Project site while Contractor is performing Work on such Project site except to the extent such claims result or arise from or out of, solely and proximately, from City’s negligence, unlawful conduct or material breach of this Contract.

11. Termination for Default. In addition to any other remedies at law or in equity, City may terminate this Contract whenever Contractor (i) repeatedly refuses to materially comply with any reasonable requirement of City; (ii) fails to timely make any payment required by this Contract; or (iii) fails or refuses to cure any other Default within seven (7) days from written notice from City specifying such Default. Termination shall be effective immediately upon notice from City; provided, however, City may, without prejudice to any of its other rights or remedies under this Contract or otherwise, correct such Default in which event Contractor shall reimburse City for all costs and expenses incurred in undertaking such cure or to collect such reimbursement from Contractor.

12. Survival of City’s Rights. All indemnity obligations of Contractor under this Contract and the Contractor’s obligations under Paragraphs 5, 8 and 10 of this Contract shall survive the completion of all Work and the expiration or termination of this Contract.

13. Bonds and Insurance. Contractor shall furnish to the Department of Public Works for City at least five days prior to commencing any Work under this Contract a Performance Bond in an amount equal to 100% of the Contract Sum and a 100% Labor and Material Bond and all other Contract security and all policies or certificates of insurance which are required by the Contract Documents.

Contractor will maintain and provide evidence of the following insurance coverages from insurance companies acceptable to the city:

- Commercial General Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate, City of Bellevue named as an Additional Insured including completed operations, Waiver of Subrogation in favor of City of Bellevue.
- Commercial Auto Liability - \$500,000 combined single limit.
- Workers Compensation/Employers Liability – Statutory limits \$100,000, \$500,000, \$100,000 limits, Waiver of Subrogation in favor of City of Bellevue.
- Commercial Umbrella Liability - \$2,000,000 minimum limit, City of Bellevue named as Additional Insured.
- Builders Risk/Installation Floater – Limit equal to completed value of project. Coverage must apply to City's and all subcontractors interests in property and project.

14. Miscellaneous.

a. Contractor shall promptly pay all persons or entities that have furnished any services, labor, material, equipment or supplies in connection with any of the Work.

b. Contractor shall secure and pay for all permits, fees, and licenses for execution and completion of the Work.

c. Contractor shall perform all Work in compliance with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations applicable to such performance. Contractor shall comply at all times with the Fair Employment Practices Act (Nebraska Revised Statutes, Sections 48-1101 *et seq.*). Contractor shall pay the Unemployment Compensation Fund of the State of Nebraska any unemployment contributions and interest due under provisions of the Nebraska Revised Statutes (Sections 48-601 *et seq.*).

d. Contractor shall provide City or its representatives access to all Work (including Work in progress) for inspection or other appropriate purposes during all reasonable times. Contractor shall uncover any Work which has not been inspected at its sole cost and expense unless due to the neglect of City.

e. Contractor shall keep the Project site(s) free from accumulation of rubbish, debris and hazards. Upon completion of Work at each Project site, Contractor shall remove all surplus materials, all tools, equipment, machinery, waste, rubbish and other items not constituting a part of the completed Work.

f. Contractor shall be responsible for all acts, errors, omissions or neglect of Contractor's agents and employees, including Contractor's subcontractors and its agents or employees.

g. City shall have the right to make minor changes in the Work, including Drawings, Plans, and Specifications, at no additional compensation or consideration to Contractor by notice in writing to Contractor. All other changes in Work shall be by written Change Order executed by the Project representative of each Party. City and Contractor each represents that its Project representative is authorized to execute such Change Order and shall be bound by the same; provided, however, that prior approval of the Bellevue City Council shall be required for (i) any Change Order resulting in an adjustment to the Contractor's compensation of more than \$10,000, or (ii) any Change Order or series of Change Orders which in the aggregate increase Contractor's compensation by ten percent (10%) or more of the original compensation.

h. Neither (i) City's payment of any invoice, nor (ii) the presence of City or its representatives on any Project site, nor (iii) the inspection or approval of any Work shall constitute acceptance of such Work as compliant or otherwise being in accordance with the Contract Documents and shall not be construed to waive any right to indemnity or any other right or remedy of City for any Default of Contractor.

i. Contractor may not assign or subcontract all or any portion of the Work, except as specified in the Bid or Proposal, without City's prior written consent, which may be withheld in City's absolute discretion.

j. Contractor shall not assign any moneys due or to become due under this Contract without the prior written consent of City, which may be withheld in City's absolute discretion.

k. Contractor warrants that Contractor has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Contractor, to solicit or secure this Contract, and that he has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract.

l. Contractor shall take reasonable precautions for safety of, and shall provide reasonable protection and warnings to prevent damage, injury or loss to employees, subcontractors and any other persons, such as pedestrians or motorists, who may be present upon or within the vicinity of a Project site while Work is being performed or in progress.

m. Any approval, notice or communication to a Party required or permitted by this Contract shall be sufficient only if made in writing.

(i) Any notice which may be permitted or required to be given pursuant to this Contract shall be delivered personally or shall be sent by United States certified mail, postage prepaid addressed as set forth below:

(ii) Each Party may from time to time change its address for receipt of notices by sending a notice in the manner provided to the others specifying the new address.

(iii) Each notice given by certified mail shall be deemed delivered on the date of delivery as shown on the return receipt, or if delivery is attempted at the last address specified and if the notice is returned, notice shall be deemed delivered on the date the notice was originally sent. Each notice delivered in any other manner shall be deemed delivered as of the time of actual receipt thereof. In the event the Parties utilize "facsimile" transmitted signed documents, the Parties hereby agree to accept and to rely upon such documents as if they bore original signatures. Each Party acknowledges and agrees to provide to the other Party, within 72 hours of transmission, such documents bearing the original signatures.

n. City's Project representative shall be the Public Works Director, or his designee.

- o. A failure by a Party to enforce any of its rights under this Contract shall not at any time constitute a waiver of such right or any other right, and shall not modify any rights, remedies or obligations of such Party under this Contract or otherwise.
- p. The Contract Documents form the entire agreement of the Parties and supersede any prior oral or written agreements of the Parties in connection with the subject matter of this Contract. Neither this Contract, nor any of the Contract Documents, shall be modified or amended except in a writing duly executed by City.
- q. Contractor shall comply with: (i) the provisions of Executive Order 11246 entitled "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order 11375 and as supplemented by Department of Labor regulation (41 C.F.R., Part 60); (ii) the Copeland "Anti-kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874), as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (20 C.F.R., Part 3); and (iii) all applicable provisions of the Regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce (Part 8 of Subtitle 15 of the C.F.R.) issued pursuant to the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all applicable federal, state and local laws.
- r. The Contractor represents that no gratuities (in the form of entertainment, gifts or otherwise) were offered or given to any officer, agent, employee or representative of the City with a view towards securing a contract or securing favorable treatment with respect to the wording, amending or the making of any determination with respect to the performance of this Agreement.
- s. By executing this Contract, Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with City's Affirmative Action Equal Opportunity Policy Statement, as attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- u. References to any document or other instrument includes all amendments and replacements thereof and supplements thereto. References to provisions of law shall be construed as references to those provisions as respectively amended, extended, consolidated or reenacted or as their application is modified by other provisions from time to time and shall include any provisions of which they are reenactments (whether with or without modification), any orders, regulations, instruments, or other subordinate legislation made under the relevant statute.

v. Each Party agrees that it has been given the opportunity to thoroughly discuss all aspects of this Contract with an attorney of its choosing and that each Party has carefully read and fully understands all of the provisions of this Contract. Each Party further represents and acknowledges that in executing this Contract it has not relied upon any representation or statement of the other Party or the other Party's officers, directors, employees, agents, council members or attorneys with regard to the subject matter, basis or effect of this Contract outside of the content of this Contract.

w. The provisions of this Contract are intended to be performed in accordance with, and only to the extent permitted by, all applicable requirements of law. If any provision of this Contract or the application of the Contract to any person or circumstance shall, for any reason and to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, neither the remainder of this Contract nor the application of this Contract or such provision to any other person or circumstance or other instruments referred to in this Contract or affected provision shall be affected thereby but, rather, the same shall be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law. In the event that any provision of this Contract, or the application thereof, is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unenforceable, the Parties shall attempt in good faith to agree upon an equitable adjustment in order to overcome to the greatest extent possible the effect of such illegality or unenforceability.

x. The failure of any Party to insist upon the strict observance and performance of the terms, provisions or conditions of this Contract shall not be deemed a waiver of other obligations hereunder, nor shall it be considered a future or continuing waiver of the same terms, provisions or conditions.

y. This Contract may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

z. If there occurs a conflict between or among this Contract, the Specifications and General Conditions, the Bid Schedules and a part hereof or any Addenda, the prevailing provisions, as between the Parties, shall be: first, those contained in this Contract; second, those contained in the applicable Specifications and General Conditions and Bid Schedules to the extent not inconsistent with this Contract; and third, those continued in any applicable Addenda to the extent not inconsistent with this Contract or such Specifications and General Provisions and Bid Schedules. Thereafter, if further interpretation is needed, the Parties acknowledge Contractor having bid for this Contract via the Bid Documents prepared by City Engineer, City of Bellevue.

aa. Contractor shall not be entitled to terminate this Contract or suspend any of the Work for any reason whatsoever, including any breach of this Contract by City.

bb. E-Verify The Contractor is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. A federal immigration verification system means the electronic verification of the work authorization program authorized by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, 8 U.S.C. 1324a, known as the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department

of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee.

If the Contractor is an individual or sole proprietorship, the following applies:

1. The Contractor must complete the United States Citizenship Attestation Form, available on the Department of Administrative Services website at www.das.state.ne.us
2. If the Contractor indicates on such attestation form that he or she is a qualified alien, the Contractor agrees to provide the US Citizenship and Immigration Services documentation required to verify the Contractor's lawful presence in the United States using the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program.
3. The Contractor understands and agrees that lawful presence in the United States is required and the Contractor may be disqualified or the contract terminated if such lawful presence cannot be verified as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. §4-108.

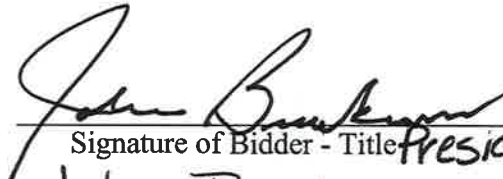

ORDINANCE NO. 4152

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 18, OF THE BELLEVUE MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 18-95 REGARDING PARKING OF TRUCKS AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That Chapter 18, Section 18-95 of the Bellevue Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 18-95 PARKING OF TRUCKS.

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person to park a truck, semi-trailer, tractor, or truck tractor with a five-ton or greater license certificate or plate and which exceeds eight (8) feet in width or twenty-one (21) feet in length on any street within the city except for that period of time necessary for loading and unloading, delivery or collection of goods, wares and merchandise. In no event shall this period of time exceed two hours.

(B) Subsection (A) shall not apply to trucks or motor vehicles being used within the city in connection with construction, repair, service or moving operations.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force fifteen (15) days after passage of the same.

We recently had PA409 in our shop for a preseason inspection and service. PA409 is a 2015 Jacobson mower with 2330 hours on it. During inspection it was found that the hydraulic reservoir had an extreme amount of aluminum and brass shavings. This machine has 3 hydraulic pumps, 11 hydraulic blade motors and 4 hydraulic drive motors all of which share the hydraulic reservoir. After testing the system all the motors show the same amount of wear. This machine has had a history of hydraulic system component failures. With this being said, at any time this machine could experience catastrophic failure that could cost up to half the machine's value. I would recommend looking into selling/trading-in this machine for a like machine as soon as funds allow. With what was found this machine will no doubt have an extended amount of down time and high repair cost in the near future.

CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT (the "Contract") is made and entered into this 19th day of March 2024 and between the City of Bellevue Nebraska, a municipal corporation of the first class and a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("City"), and Topkote Inc. ("Contractor"). Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Party" shall mean City or Contractor, individually, and the term "Parties" shall mean the City and Contractor, collectively.

WHEREAS, Contractor submitted a bid proposal ("Proposal") to City in response to the solicitation or invitation to perform certain work for certain project(s), (as the work and project(s) are more particularly identified in Paragraph 2 of this Contract); and

WHEREAS, Contractor was selected to perform such work subject to the terms, conditions and other provisions of this Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Contract/Contract Documents. Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Contract Documents" shall mean and include this Contract, and (i) the published notice inviting or soliciting bids or proposals in connection with the Work or Projects; (ii) City's request or solicitation for bids or proposals together with all addenda, drawings, schedules, exhibits, manuals, materials and documents attached or relevant to or referenced in such request or solicitation, including all Instructions, Plans, Specifications, Provisions, General or Special Conditions; (iii) Contractor's Bid or Proposal, together with all addenda, drawings, schedules, exhibits, materials and documents attached or relevant to or referenced in such Bid or Proposal; (iv) all payment, performance, labor, materials, maintenance or other bonds or Contract security; and (v) all written change orders, modifications or supplementary terms, conditions or instructions from City pursuant to paragraph 14(g) of this Contract. All Contract Documents shall be considered to be an integral part of this Contract whether or not attached to this written Contract; provided that in the event there shall be any conflict between this written Contract and any of the other Contract Documents, the provisions of this written Contract shall prevail.

2. Contractor's Work. Except to the extent expressly undertaken by City pursuant to the Contract Documents, (i) Contractor shall perform all site preparation and security, labor, supervision, direction, testing, and other services or work ("Work") necessary or appropriate for completion of the 2024 Chip Seal Projects ("Project") in accordance with the requirements of the Contract Documents; (ii) Contractor shall furnish at its sole cost and expense all bonds, barricades, materials, supplies, equipment, tools, power, water, light, heat, utilities, transportation and all other services, facilities (whether permanent or temporary) and resources required for the Work; (iii) except to the extent otherwise expressly stated in the Contract Documents, Contractor shall be responsible for all means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures, including coordination of all Work. Whenever used in this Contract, the term "Work" shall include all Corrective Work, unless the context otherwise requires. Contractor shall commence the Work within ten (10) days ("Commencement Date") after

receiving a Written Notice to Proceed from City. Contractor shall notify City in writing of the Commencement Date prior to undertaking any work.

3. Quality of Work. Contractor shall perform all Work in a good and workmanlike manner using qualified personnel and any equipment and materials required by the Contract Documents.

4. Site Inspection. Contractor acknowledges that it has inspected the Project site. Contractor waives any claim for additional time, costs, expenses, compensation or other amounts in connection with any condition (known, apparent, or concealed), which it may encounter at the Project site.

5. Contractor's Warranties. All Work is warranted by Contractor to be of highest quality, to be free from any faults or defects and to conform in all respects with the requirements of the Contract Documents.

6. Time of Essence/Liquidated Damages. Time schedules, limits or requirements specified in the Contract Documents are of the essence to this Contract. All Work shall be completed in accordance with the "Specifications", as attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference, unless (i) extended by City, in its sole discretion, or (ii) prevented (assuming, in all such events, Contractor's use of its best efforts to timely complete such Work) by the act or neglect of City or by an act of God or for other reasons beyond the control of Contractor, in which event time shall be extended for such reasonable time as City may determine. Whenever any Work shall not be so completed, then as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, Contractor shall pay City, within five (5) days of demand, the sum of Five Hundred and no/100ths Dollars (\$500.00) per day for each and every calendar day that the Work shall remain uncompleted.

7. Contractor's Compensation/Retainage. City shall pay the Contractor in current U.S. funds for the Contractor's performance of the Work. All Work, including any unit cost shall be undertaken at and performed in accordance with Contractor's Bid or Proposal. Subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the aggregate cost of the Work shall not exceed One hundred and ten thousand five hundred and forty-six and 88/100 Dollars (\$ 110,546.88) ("Contract Sum").

Upon completion of Work at the Project site, Contractor shall submit an invoice requesting payment ("Application for Payment") based upon the amount of Work actually completed at the Project site and Contractor shall set forth in detail the Work performed at the rate specified on Contractor's Bid or Proposal. Unless withheld by city because the Project Site Work does not comply with the Contract Documents or because the Contractor's failure to otherwise comply with the requirements of this contract as they may apply to any of the Work, City shall pay contractor ninety percent (90%) of the invoice within thirty (30) days of its receipt. Final payment constituting the entire unpaid balance of the Contract Sum shall be made by City to Contractor when the Contract has been fully performed and accepted, including Contractor's responsibility to correct nonconforming Work and to satisfy other requirements, if any, which necessarily survive final payment. Prior to final payment, Contractor shall provide evidence that

all employees, subcontractors, material suppliers and other persons or entities have been paid in full for any labor, materials, supplies or equipment used in connection with the Work; such evidence shall consist of receipts, releases, and waivers of liens, claims, security interests, or encumbrances arising out of the Work, to the extent and in such form as may be designated by City. At any time Contractor submits an Application for Payment, it shall constitute a representation by Contractor that all Work is completed as warranted by paragraph 5 of this Contract.

8. Corrective Work. Whenever discovered prior to the expiration of the Warranty Period, Contractor shall promptly correct any Work ("Corrective Work"), which is found to be substandard, defective or otherwise not in accordance with this Contract whether or not such Work or Corrective Work has been completed, installed or constructed. Contractor shall bear all costs and expense of Corrective Work, including all professional, testing, removal or inspection costs.

9. Risk of Loss. Contractor shall bear all risk of loss of or damage to all Work until (i) all Work has been satisfactorily completed and accepted; and (ii) in the case of Corrective Work, until the Corrective Work has been completed to the satisfaction of the City.

10. Contractor's Indemnity. Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold City, its agents and employees harmless from and against any claims, damages (including damages for any personal injury, bodily injury, including death, or property damages), losses and expenses, including any reasonable attorney fees, of any person or entity arising or resulting from or out of (i) Contractor's performance under this Contract; (ii) any breach or default in or any violation or nonperformance of any covenant, term, provision, condition or agreement ("Default") in this Contract to be kept, observed, satisfied or performed by Contractor; (iii) any alleged act, error, omission or negligence of Contractor, its employees, subcontractors, agents, or any other person acting on behalf of Contractor; (iv) any material misrepresentation by Contractor; or (v) Contractor's operations in or about any Project site while Contractor is performing Work on such Project site except to the extent such claims result or arise from or out of, solely and proximately, from City's negligence, unlawful conduct or material breach of this Contract.

11. Termination for Default. In addition to any other remedies at law or in equity, City may terminate this Contract whenever Contractor (i) repeatedly refuses to materially comply with any reasonable requirement of City; (ii) fails to timely make any payment required by this Contract; or (iii) fails or refuses to cure any other Default within seven (7) days from written notice from City specifying such Default. Termination shall be effective immediately upon notice from City; provided, however, City may, without prejudice to any of its other rights or remedies under this Contract or otherwise, correct such Default in which event Contractor shall reimburse City for all costs and expenses incurred in undertaking such cure or to collect such reimbursement from Contractor.

12. Survival of City's Rights. All indemnity obligations of Contractor under this Contract and the Contractor's obligations under Paragraphs 5, 8 and 10 of this Contract shall survive the completion of all Work and the expiration or termination of this Contract.

13. Bonds and Insurance. Contractor shall furnish to the Department of Public Works for City at least five days prior to commencing any Work under this Contract a Performance Bond in an amount equal to 100% of the Contract Sum and a 100% Labor and Material Bond and all other Contract security and all policies or certificates of insurance which are required by the Contract Documents.

Contractor will maintain and provide evidence of the following insurance coverages from insurance companies acceptable to the city:

- Commercial General Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate, City of Bellevue named as an Additional Insured including completed operations, Waiver of Subrogation in favor of City of Bellevue.
- Commercial Auto Liability - \$500,000 combined single limit.
- Workers Compensation/Employers Liability – Statutory limits \$100,000, \$500,000, \$100,000 limits, Waiver of Subrogation in favor of City of Bellevue.
- Commercial Umbrella Liability - \$2,000,000 minimum limit, City of Bellevue named as Additional Insured.
- Builders Risk/Installation Floater – Limit equal to completed value of project. Coverage must apply to City’s and all subcontractors interests in property and project.

14. Miscellaneous.

a. Contractor shall promptly pay all persons or entities that have furnished any services, labor, material, equipment or supplies in connection with any of the Work.

b. Contractor shall secure and pay for all permits, fees, and licenses for execution and completion of the Work.

c. Contractor shall perform all Work in compliance with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations applicable to such performance. Contractor shall comply at all times with the Fair Employment Practices Act (Nebraska Revised Statutes, Sections 48-1101 *et seq.*). Contractor shall pay the Unemployment Compensation Fund of the State of Nebraska any unemployment contributions and interest due under provisions of the Nebraska Revised Statutes (Sections 48-601 *et seq.*).

d. Contractor shall provide City or its representatives access to all Work (including Work in progress) for inspection or other appropriate purposes during all reasonable times. Contractor shall uncover any Work which has not been inspected at its sole cost and expense unless due to the neglect of City.

e. Contractor shall keep the Project site(s) free from accumulation of rubbish, debris and hazards. Upon completion of Work at each Project site, Contractor shall remove all surplus materials, all tools, equipment, machinery, waste, rubbish and other items not constituting a part of the completed Work.

f. Contractor shall be responsible for all acts, errors, omissions or neglect of Contractor's agents and employees, including Contractor's subcontractors and its agents or employees.

g. City shall have the right to make minor changes in the Work, including Drawings, Plans, and Specifications, at no additional compensation or consideration to Contractor by notice in writing to Contractor. All other changes in Work shall be by written Change Order executed by the Project representative of each Party. City and Contractor each represents that its Project representative is authorized to execute such Change Order and shall be bound by the same; provided, however, that prior approval of the Bellevue City Council shall be required for (i) any Change Order resulting in an adjustment to the Contractor's compensation of more than \$10,000, or (ii) any Change Order or series of Change Orders which in the aggregate increase Contractor's compensation by ten percent (10%) or more of the original compensation.

h. Neither (i) City's payment of any invoice, nor (ii) the presence of City or its representatives on any Project site, nor (iii) the inspection or approval of any Work shall constitute acceptance of such Work as compliant or otherwise being in accordance with the Contract Documents and shall not be construed to waive any right to indemnity or any other right or remedy of City for any Default of Contractor.

i. Contractor may not assign or subcontract all or any portion of the Work, except as specified in the Bid or Proposal, without City's prior written consent, which may be withheld in City's absolute discretion.

j. Contractor shall not assign any moneys due or to become due under this Contract without the prior written consent of City, which may be withheld in City's absolute discretion.

k. Contractor warrants that Contractor has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Contractor, to solicit or secure this Contract, and that he has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract.

l. Contractor shall take reasonable precautions for safety of, and shall provide reasonable protection and warnings to prevent damage, injury or loss to employees, subcontractors and any other persons, such as pedestrians or motorists, who may be present upon or within the vicinity of a Project site while Work is being performed or in progress.

m. Any approval, notice or communication to a Party required or permitted by this Contract shall be sufficient only if made in writing.

(i) Any notice which may be permitted or required to be given pursuant to this Contract shall be delivered personally or shall be sent by United States certified mail, postage prepaid addressed as set forth below:

(ii) Each Party may from time to time change its address for receipt of notices by sending a notice in the manner provided to the others specifying the new address.

(iii) Each notice given by certified mail shall be deemed delivered on the date of delivery as shown on the return receipt, or if delivery is attempted at the last address specified and if the notice is returned, notice shall be deemed delivered on the date the notice was originally sent. Each notice delivered in any other manner shall be deemed delivered as of the time of actual receipt thereof. In the event the Parties utilize "facsimile" transmitted signed documents, the Parties hereby agree to accept and to rely upon such documents as if they bore original signatures. Each Party acknowledges and agrees to provide to the other Party, within 72 hours of transmission, such documents bearing the original signatures.

n. City's Project representative shall be the Public Works Director, or his designee.

o. A failure by a Party to enforce any of its rights under this Contract shall not at any time constitute a waiver of such right or any other right, and shall not modify any rights, remedies or obligations of such Party under this Contract or otherwise.

p. The Contract Documents form the entire agreement of the Parties and supersede any prior oral or written agreements of the Parties in connection with the subject matter of this Contract. Neither this Contract, nor any of the Contract Documents, shall be modified or amended except in a writing duly executed by City.

q. Contractor shall comply with: (i) the provisions of Executive Order 11246 entitled "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order 11375 and as supplemented by Department of Labor regulation (41 C.F.R., Part 60); (ii) the Copeland "Anti-kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874), as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (20 C.F.R., Part 3); and (iii) all applicable provisions of the Regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce (Part 8 of Subtitle 15 of the C.F.R.) issued pursuant to the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all applicable federal, state and local laws.

r. The Contractor represents that no gratuities (in the form of entertainment, gifts or otherwise) were offered or given to any officer, agent, employee or representative of the City with a view towards securing a contract or securing favorable treatment with respect to the wording, amending or the making of any determination with respect to the performance of this Agreement.

s. Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee, or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of the Work, because of race, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin, with respect to the hire, tenure, terms, conditions, privileges or employment of such employee or applicant.

t. Within thirty (30) days of the date of this Contract, Contractor shall adopt an affirmative action policy and program for equal employment opportunity similar to but not limited to the Equal Employment Action Program of City. Further, within ninety (90) days of the date of this Contract, assuming this Contract is of a duration of at least ninety (90) days, and annually thereafter for the duration of this Contract, Contractor shall submit an affirmative action report to City. By executing this Contract, Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with City's Affirmative Action Equal Opportunity Policy Statement, as attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference.

u. References to any document or other instrument includes all amendments and replacements thereof and supplements thereto. References to provisions of law shall be construed as references to those provisions as respectively amended, extended, consolidated or reenacted or as their application is modified by other provisions from time to time and shall include any provisions of which they are reenactments (whether with or without modification), any orders, regulations, instruments, or other subordinate legislation made under the relevant statute.

v. Each Party agrees that it has been given the opportunity to thoroughly discuss all aspects of this Contract with an attorney of its choosing and that each Party has carefully read and fully understands all of the provisions of this Contract. Each Party further represents and acknowledges that in executing this Contract it has not relied upon any representation or statement of the other Party or the other Party's officers, directors, employees, agents, council members or attorneys with regard to the subject matter, basis or effect of this Contract outside of the content of this Contract.

w. The provisions of this Contract are intended to be performed in accordance with, and only to the extent permitted by, all applicable requirements of law. If any provision of this Contract or the application of the Contract to any person or circumstance shall, for any reason and to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, neither the remainder of this Contract nor the application of this Contract or such provision to any other person or circumstance or other instruments referred to in this Contract or affected provision shall be affected thereby but, rather, the same shall be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law. In the event that any provision of this Contract, or the application thereof, is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unenforceable, the Parties shall attempt in good faith to agree upon an equitable adjustment in order to overcome to the greatest extent possible the effect of such illegality or unenforceability.

x. The failure of any Party to insist upon the strict observance and performance of the terms, provisions or conditions of this Contract shall not be deemed a waiver of other obligations hereunder, nor shall it be considered a future or continuing waiver of the same terms, provisions or conditions.

y. This Contract may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

z. If there occurs a conflict between or among this Contract, the Specifications and General Conditions, the Bid Schedules and a part hereof or any Addenda, the prevailing provisions, as between the Parties, shall be: first, those contained in this Contract; second, those contained in the applicable Specifications and General Conditions and Bid Schedules to the extent not inconsistent with this Contract; and third, those continued in any applicable Addenda to the extent not inconsistent with this Contract or such Specifications and General Provisions and Bid Schedules. Thereafter, if further interpretation is needed, the Parties acknowledge Contractor having bid for this Contract via the Bid Documents prepared by City Engineer, City of Bellevue.

aa. Contractor shall not be entitled to terminate this Contract or suspend any of the Work for any reason whatsoever, including any breach of this Contract by City.

bb. E-Verify The Contractor is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. A federal immigration verification system means the electronic verification of the work authorization program authorized by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, 8 U.S.C. 1324a, known as the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department

of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee.

If the Contractor is an individual or sole proprietorship, the following applies:

1. The Contractor must complete the United States Citizenship Attestation Form, available on the Department of Administrative Services website at www.das.state.ne.us
2. If the Contractor indicates on such attestation form that he or she is a qualified alien, the Contractor agrees to provide the US Citizenship and Immigration Services documentation required to verify the Contractor's lawful presence in the United States using the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program.
3. The Contractor understands and agrees that lawful presence in the United States is required and the Contractor may be disqualified or the contract terminated if such lawful presence cannot be verified as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. §4-108.

SYNOPSIS/BACKGROUND:

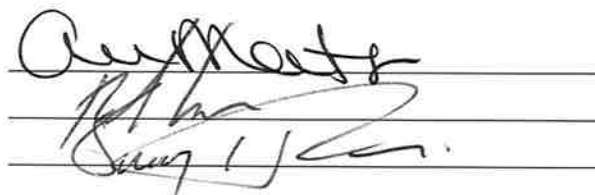
