BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Adams County School District 01-0018, a/k/a Hastings Public School District, hereinafter referred to as "School District", as follows:

- 1. That the Board of Education of this School District hereby finds and determines that this School District is fully organized as a Class III School District under Chapter 79, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, maintaining kindergarten through twelfth grades under the direction of a single Board of Education.**

- 2. That the Board of Education of this School District hereby finds and determines that registered voters or legal voters qualified to vote at the election herein called include persons qualified to vote for the members of the School Board and Board of Education of this School District.**

- 3. That the Board of Education of this School District hereby finds and determines that it is necessary and appropriate that this School District exceed the maximum levy provided by Section 77-3442, as hereinafter stated, and that a proposition to such effect shall be submitted at the election as called by this resolution.**

- 4. That the Board of Education of this School District hereby calls and orders a special election to be held in this School District on May 14, 2019, at which there shall be submitted to all the legal voters of this School District as provided herein the following proposition:**

PROPOSITION

Shall the Board of Education of Adams County School District 01-0018, a/k/a Hastings Public School District be allowed to levy a property tax not to exceed seven (7) cents per \$100.00 value of taxable valuation in excess of the limits prescribed by law for the following five (5) fiscal years for the purposes of general operations, building or capital construction, remodeling, repair or site acquisition, or any other lawful purpose, such excess levy to be in addition to any tax levies for exemptions to the levy limits allowed by law?

A vote "FOR such proposition" on the issue grants authority to the

Adams County School District 01-0018, a/k/a Hastings Public School District to exceed the statutory property tax levy limits as described above.

A vote "AGAINST such proposition" on the issue denies authority to the Adams County School District 01-0018, a/k/a Hastings Public School District to exceed the statutory property tax levy limits as described above.

5. That pursuant to Section 32-559 it is preferred and requested that such special election be held by mail as provided in Sections 32-952 to 32-959; and that the election shall be conducted by the County Clerk of Adams County or such other clerk or clerks or election commissioner(s) as required by law; and that the notice of election shall be given to all the legal voters of this School District as required by law; and that a copy of the sample ballot shall be published as required by law, such notice and sample ballot shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in this School District and the secretary or any other board member of this School District or the Adams County Clerk or Election Commissioner shall be and are hereby directed to cause such notice and sample ballot to be published and printed along with any other required publications or actions prior to the special election.

6. That the secretary or any other board member of this School District shall be and are hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the County Clerk or Election Commissioner of Adams County who shall conduct the special election by mail as provided in Sections 32-952 to 32-959 or designate the polling places, appoint the election officials, publish notice and all other required publications and otherwise conduct the election as provided by law. That this School District does hereby agree to reimburse said County Clerk or Election Commissioner for the expenses of publication and conducting the election. Ballots for voting at said election shall be certified across county lines for all legal voters of this School District in counties other than Adams County and shall be counted and canvassed in the manner required by law, to the extent necessary or appropriate.

7. That the form of ballot and form of notice of election shall be substantially in the sample forms submitted to this meeting, copies of such sample forms are on file with official records of this School District and are incorporated herein by this reference as though set forth in full. That the secretary or any other board member of this School District or the County Clerk or Election Commissioner are hereby authorized and directed to arrange for the printing of the necessary ballots for said election and to do all other things and take all other action appropriate or necessary in order to cause said proposition to be submitted to all the legal voters of this School District as defined in this resolution and

as provided herein.

Questions/Answers Election to Override the Levy

Why would HPS hold an election to override the levy?

Nebraska does not provide many options to school districts with less property value than they need to adequately serve students. At present, funding to equalize taxes and educational opportunity has fallen short of the needs of our students. To address this, districts are allowed to use an early retirement incentive program and/or to override the General Fund levy limitation of \$1.05 per \$100 of assessed property value. Because the Hastings Public Schools may be looking at a \$2 million to \$2.5 million shortfall this coming year, the Board needs to consider every solution possible. Other districts have passed override levy questions.

Can HPS reduce expenditures sufficiently to avoid an override of the levy?

HPS may reduce expenditures and use existing funds to limit the impact of reductions on the classroom. The Superintendent has proposed an Overall Program Plan that reduces expenditures by \$830,780.00 for fiscal year 2019-20. In addition, the Superintendent has called for the use of Cooperative Fund and Cash Reserve dollars to lower the District's reliance on the General Fund by nearly \$2.5 million. Again, this is for the 2019-20 school year.

Unfortunately, shortfalls of \$2 million to \$2.5 million are projected to follow in 2020-21 and beyond.

While HPS could reduce expenditures by that amount, the learning program for students would have to be reduced beyond what the community may be willing to support. As understood at this time, HPS cannot maintain an acceptable educational program for students and a well-managed district without increasing General Fund revenues *and* making reductions.

Will an override of the levy increase my taxes?

It could, but the Superintendent and his administrative team believes a "levy neutral" levy override is appropriate.

How is it possible to have a levy neutral levy override?

The District has been extremely successful in paying down the District's bonded indebtedness at a faster rate than projected or agreed to by the community through the successful passage of two bond questions. The District has been able to do this given property valuation growth, one-time federal funding that has been used to lower building costs, and better than anticipated interest rates. Sound management has placed the District in a position where the community could slow down our bond payments in order to free up some funding to support our General Fund. The District cannot take advantage of the successful management of our bonded indebtedness without passing a levy override.

To be more specific, our present General Fund Levy is at \$1.05 per \$100 of assessed valuation. This is the maximum levy allowed. Our Bond Fund levy is \$0.292 making our combined levy \$1.342 per \$100 of assessed valuation. If the community votes to override our General Fund levy limitation of \$1.05, the District could, for example, increase the General Fund Levy to \$1.12 and decrease the Bond Fund levy to \$0.222. This would maintain the present total levy of \$1.342 while increasing the amount of revenue available to the District to support the General Fund.

If the above example became reality, how much would this help the District's General Fund?

This would generate about \$750,000.00 per year for the next five years.

Does a General Fund levy override stay in place indefinitely?

No. A General Fund levy override stays in place only for five years. For the override to last another five years, voters would have to approve another levy override question.

How does this impact the District's ability to pay off the District's bonded indebtedness?

The District's bonded indebtedness was scheduled to be paid by 2046. However, advantageous circumstances and sound management shortened the time needed to pay of the bonds to around 2035. Even if we slow down payments using the example above, it appears the District could still pay off the bonds early. At this time, the projection would be 2040. This is five years longer than hoped for but six years earlier than originally proposed. In short, the District would pay more interest than it would have had we been adequately funded by the State but would still be paying less than it agreed to through the bond questions that were passed.

What does HPS have to do in order to have an override levy special election?

The Board would have to pass a resolution by two-thirds of the membership (six votes in favor) at least 50 days prior to the election being held. Should the Board pass a resolution to cause a special election, a special election using mail in ballots could be scheduled for an appropriate time. If a resolution is passed at the March Board Meeting, a special election could be held anytime from May until August.

How much would a special election cost?

While HPS has tried to avoid additional costs for election questions pertaining to the District, an additional cost cannot be avoided this time. This election would cost the District approximately \$20,000.00. This would provide the ballots as well as the postage needed to return the ballots.

ENROLLMENT OPTION: MAXIMUM STUDENT ENROLLMENT LIMITATIONS

REGULAR EDUCATION PROGRAMMING

According to Policy 503.03, the most recent applicable policy pertaining to option enrollment, the Board of Education at the March meeting will determine the maximum number of option students the Hastings School District No. 18 may receive in any program, class, grade level, or school building.

The following resident student maximums are recommended for the 2019-2020 school year. However, as reasonable, the District may accept option students above these limitations if additional sections are added to accommodate the growth of resident student enrollment.

SPECIAL SERVICES PROGRAMMING

To meet the diverse needs of resident students, the District operates a number of programs collectively called "student services." This programming includes, but is not limited to, services for students with disabilities, high-ability learners, and students learning English through the English Language Learners Program (EL). Because all such programming is in addition to programming provided all students, all student services must be limited to the specific staff, facilities, and equipment of the District made necessary by resident students. Given this, each student that applies as an option student requiring and/or qualified for special services programming will be allowed to enroll as an option student only when the services to be provided may be delivered within the existing capacity (staff, facilities, financial resources, and equipment) of the District to serve resident students. Parents and/or guardians with students requiring and/or qualifying for special services programming and seeking to use option enrollment to place a student in the Hastings Public Schools must supply appropriate District personnel with any and all relevant information, as requested, to determine the needs of the student and to determine whether those needs may be served within the existing capacity of the District. **As provided in Rule 503.03, "The District will not accept students for whom a contracted, out-of-district program is required." "Contracted, out-of-district" programming includes contracted services. In addition, as provided in Rule 503.03, "Parents or legal guardians of option students are responsible for transportation to and from school."**

Travel Project Title : Costa Rica ISLS Travel and Family-Stay Program 2020

1. What purpose will this travel address?

Students will have the opportunity to stay with a Costa Rican family (hired/approved through the language school) and will be able to improve their Spanish communication skills by being immersed in the language and using it in a natural environment as well as at the ISLS formal language school. Through the immersion, students will experience Costa Rican/Hispanic culture as they view and participate in the daily family routine. Thirdly, students will have the opportunity to experience the ecological diversity of Costa Rica firsthand.

2. How is this purpose related to the learning of the classroom?

Students will be given a first-hand opportunity to develop an understanding and appreciation for the Spanish language and culture during their family stay and through a formal study in a Spanish language school. Through this, students will be able to compare the Costa Rican/Hispanic culture with their own. Students will also be immersed in the language and will be able to put to use what they have learned in the classroom. Students will also experience a “living biological laboratory” as they visit many of the ecological wonders that Costa Rica has to offer (tropical rain forest, regional animals and flowers, beach and coastal regions, etc.)

3. What is the itinerary for this travel project from beginning to end?

Day 1 (March 5, 2020) Depart for Costa Rica; night at Hotel Villa Tournon in San Jose
Day 2 Travel to Puerto Viejo, visit Jaguar Rescue Center, spend the night in Hotel La Isla Inn
Day 3 Visit Playa Cocles Beach; night #2 in Hotel La Isla Inn
Day 4 Cahuita Snorkeling and National Park Tour; Transport to Turrialba, Spanish Language Testing at the ISLS language School, Host family meeting and first supper
Day 5 Family Stay / ISLS language school – walking tour of Turrialba
Day 6 Family Stay / ISLS language school; Ziplining and Canyoning tour
Day 7 Family Stay / ISLS language school; cooking class at the school; El Centro souvenir shopping

Day 8 Family Stay / ISLS language school; Latin dance classes at the school
Day 9 Family Stay / Full Day River Rafting Tour on the Pacuare River
Day 10 (March 14th, 2020) Transport to airport for return flight to Hastings

4. Are commercial agents involved? Yes

Dana Garrison (co-owner/President of ISLS (Institute for Spanish Language Studies) will arrange / provide :

- Round trip air transportation
- Bus transportation to and from airport in Costa Rica, for all tours, and to Turrialba
- Arrange stay in ISLS guesthouse
- Arrange family stays for students and sponsors with families hired, supervised, and evaluated through the language school
- Arrange all tours and weekend / after school activities
- Provide travel and medical insurance (as well as optional cancellation insurance as requested by parents)

5. What arrangements need to be made for food, lodging, and transportation?

All lodging and meals are arranged by Dana Garrison and are included in the cost of the trip (with the exceptions below). All transportation between Omaha and Costa Rica and in Costa Rica is being arranged by the ISLS representative and is included in the cost of the trip. Students will need school transportation to and from the airport in Omaha. Students will be responsible for their meals on the travel days (2-3 meals on day 1 and lunch and dinner on day 10).

6. How will students be supervised on this trip?

Students and supervisors will stay in ISLS selected/approved/monitored family stays where they are expected to observe the strict ISLS/HHS codes of conduct and regulations for minors (curfew; abstention from alcohol, tobacco use; buddy system, etc.) Students and Supervisors will be in attendance at the language institute from 8:30 – 12:30 on days 5 – 8. Students and supervisors will participate in activities and go on other school excursions as a group on the weekend and after school. Supervisors will also be in contact with all host parents by phone to further ensure that students are obeying strict guidelines. When not with supervisors, students will have 24-hour phone access to trip leaders.

7. What will the trip cost the District?

- Bus transportation to / from Omaha Eppley Airfield
- Cost of substitute teacher for 4 days x 2 (plus more for possible extra sponsors as needed)
- Partial/full cost for 3rd supervisor; dependent on final # of student participants (Full cost = approximately \$2900)

-Phone coverage while in Costa Rica (approximately \$50) to be able to communicate with students while they are with their host families or in case of emergency

8. What will this trip cost individual students and/or their parents?

Quoted price = \$2845 (pricing for 10-15 students - if more students travel the cost will reduce)

9. What fund raising activities are planned to cover District and/or individual student costs?

All students have had the opportunity to participate in annual fundraisers since freshman year. The last few years we have sold Barn Candles, wax melts, etc. 2020 travelers are participating in a Great American Fundraiser event in February 2019 and again in the fall of 2020.

There will also be some scholarship money for travelers from the World Language Department account from funds raised by students in graduating classes 2018 and 2019 who chose not to travel. This is a needs based scholarship.

10. How will the trip be evaluated?

-All students will complete an evaluation form for the language school and a post-trip evaluation form developed by the trip leaders. Quantitative and qualitative data collected from trip participants will be analyzed by trip leaders and help inform future trip decisions.

11. Are there pre-travel meetings that students must attend?

-All students / one parent are / were to attend an informational meeting Feb. / March 2019

-All students / one parent must attend a meeting in Jan. 2020

-All students must attend a final pre-departure meeting Feb. 2020

-Required weekly student meetings starting Feb. 2020 up until time of departure
