BOARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

Annual Meeting

The regular meeting in January shall be called the Annual Meeting and shall be the organizational meeting for the Board. At this meeting, any new members will be seated, a President and Vice President will be elected, a Secretary/Treasurer appointed, Board standing committee members appointed, and other business conducted according to the following procedure:

1. Any new members sworn in by the Board's legal counsel.
2. With legal counsel acting as chair, nominations for the office of president will be made by written ballot. Voting will be by written ballot on all members nominated and repeated until a plurality is achieved. If a tie is not broken after five ballots, the chair will determine the winner by a flip of the coin.
3. The President will assume the chair immediately upon election.
4. The election of vice president will be by the same method used for the election of president.
5. By motion and majority vote, the Board will appoint the Secretary/Treasurer.
6. By motion and majority vote, the Board will adopt an order of business to guide in the preparation of agendas and conduct of meetings for the coming year.
7. The Board will review existing standing committees and by individual consent will fill committee positions.
8. By motion and majority vote, the Board will affirm the current policy and regulation manual as the governing rules of the District.

The remainder of the meeting will follow the Order of Business for regular meetings.

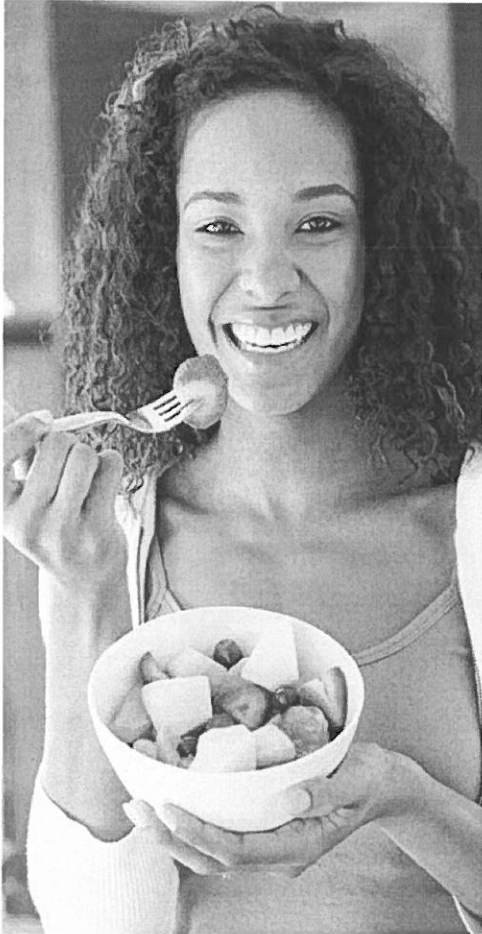
