Nebraska Association of School Boards Board of Education / Code of Conduct

This Code has been developed and revised by the Nebraska Association of School Boards to help school boards carry out the important education decision-making role while maintaining effective relationships with school administrators, staff, and community members. Given the complexity of the education governance structure, nothing is more important than clarifying appropriate roles and responsibilities for the school board, superintendent, and principal(s).

A school board member has no legal powers unless participating at a meeting that complies with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act, or acting on behalf of the school board after the board formally grants authority to do so. Thus, it is essential that every school board member work as a member of the broader leadership team to perform board duties and act in a manner consistent with the Code.

Board members can demonstrate personal commitment to the Code by signing this document signifying agreement to uphold the principles of the Code, both, in letter and spirit.

Many school boards post a copy of the signed Code in the front entrance of the school(s). This public display of school leadership team commitment sends a powerful message and sets the tone for how the business of education will be conducted in the community.

As citizens of the United States, board members have certain Constitutional rights, including freedom of speech that cannot be taken away, whether or not you choose to sign this document. The only sections of this Code that require legal compliance are the “*conflict of interest*” and “*act only as a member of the board.*” All other sections represent effective practice.

BOARD GOVERNANCE

- Attend all regularly scheduled board meetings, insofar as possible, and review advance materials provided.
- In consultation with the principal, teachers, and superintendent, set education goals for the school(s).
- Maintain confidentiality of information and discussion conducted in executive/closed session.

- Review essential facts, consider others' ideas, and then present personal opinions during board deliberations but, once the board vote has been taken, support board decisions regardless of how individuals voted.
- Act only as a member of the board and do not assume any individual authority when the board is not in session, unless otherwise directed by the board.
- Rely on school policies that are continually updated and aligned with Nebraska and federal education laws, and guidance from the superintendent, when making board decisions.
- Request recommendations from the superintendent and seek legal counsel, when required for full and informed board consideration of issues requiring legal expertise.
- Expect an equitable amount of board meeting time be spent both learning about educational programs and conducting the business of the board.
- Maintain a priority board focus on increasing student achievement and ensuring efficient use of education resources.

BOARD-ADMINISTRATION RELATIONS

- Provide policy support for school administrators in the performance of their duties and delegate authority commensurate with those responsibilities.
- Expect the superintendent to keep the board adequately informed through regular written and oral reports.
- Refer complaints, requests, and concerns to the superintendent or other appropriate staff members.
- Avoid making commitments that may compromise the decision-making ability of the board or administrators.
- Maintain open and candid communication with the superintendent.
- Hold the superintendent accountable by jointly creating job performance standards and at least annually perform a comprehensive evaluation process based on the job description, contract, and identified performance standards.
- Recognize that a board member's responsibility is to see that schools are well run, but not to run them.

BOARD MEMBER RELATIONS

- Retain independent judgment and refuse to surrender that judgment to individuals or special interest groups.
- Voice opinions respectfully and maintain good relations with other board members, administrators, school staff, and members of the public.

PERSONNEL RELATIONS

- Seek to employ the most qualified school staff and insist on regular, impartial employee evaluations.
- Hire no superintendent, principal or teacher already under contract with another school district unless assurance is first secured from the proper authority that the person can be released from his or her contract.
- Individual board members shall not give directives to any school administrator or employee, publicly or privately.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- Perform a liaison communications role by interpreting the attitudes, wishes, and needs of both the community and the school.
- Consider the needs of the entire community and vote for what is best for students.
- Encourage collaboration between the school and community.
- Request that periodic surveys be conducted with the community to assess the quality of education services and use the data to establish and monitor goals.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- Do not solicit or receive directly or indirectly any gift or compensation in return for making a recommendation or casting a vote.
- Do not receive anything of value by contract or otherwise, from the school district you serve unless it is received:
 - as a result of a contract accepted after a public bid.
 - in public recognition of service or achievement.
 - as expenses allowed by law for official duties performed as a member of such board.
- Follow the school board conflict of interest policy regarding the appearance of conflict of interest.

BOARD PREPARATION AND TRAINING

- Be informed about educational issues through individual study and by participating in board development opportunities such as those sponsored by the Nebraska and National School Boards Associations, the Nebraska Department of Education, and other education organizations.
- Support new school board members by sharing your experience and knowledge.
- Ensure that adequate board orientation and team building opportunities are available for board members and administrators.

- Associate with board members from other school districts to discuss school problems and collaborate on school improvement initiatives.

General Information - Filing Requirements

I. What is a Potential Conflict of Interest? - A public official has a potential conflict of interest if he or she is faced with taking an official action or making an official decision which may result in a financial benefit or a financial detriment to the public official; a member of his or her immediate family; or a business with which he or she is associated. The financial effect of the action or decision must be distinguishable from the financial effect on the general public or a broad segment of it.

II. Who Must File:

- A. An official of a city or village holding elective office who has a potential conflict of interest. An official of the cities of Lincoln or Omaha holding elective office who has a potential conflict of interest should not file this form, but instead should use Form C-2.
- B. An official of a school district holding elective office who has a potential conflict of interest.
- C. An elective office is a public office normally filled by an election. A person appointed to fill a vacancy in a public office normally filled by election holds an elective office.

III. When and Where to File:

- A. This form should be filed as soon as the person holding elective office is aware that he or she may have a potential conflict of interest and prior to the time that the action is to be taken or the decision made.

- B. This form should be filed with the person who normally keeps records for the governing body of the official holding elective office. For example, the person who keeps records for a city or village may be the city clerk or village clerk. **This form does not need to be filed with the Commission.**
- C. The person filing the form should abstain from participating in or voting on the matter in which he or she has a potential conflict of interest. However, if the person wants an opinion from the Commission as to whether he or she has an actual conflict of interest requiring abstention or non-participation, he or she may send a copy of the form to the Commission along with request for an opinion.

Disclosure of Contractual Interests by Local Officers. If you are a local elected official disclosing an interest in a contract or an open account in which a local governing body on which you serve is a party, use NADC Form C-3, Contractual Interest Statement.

Disclosure of the Employment of Immediate Family Members. If you are disclosing the employment of an immediate family member, use NADC Form C-4, Employment of Immediate Family Members Disclosure Statement.

Definitions

Immediate family shall mean a child residing in your household, your spouse or an individual claimed by you or your spouse as a dependent for federal income tax purposes.

Business shall mean any corporation, partnership, limited liability company, sole proprietorship, firm, enterprise, franchise, association, organization, self-employed individual, holding company, joint-stock company, receivership, trust, activity, or entity. NOTE: The definition includes for profit and non-profit entities.

Business with which you are associated shall mean a business: (1) of which you are the sole proprietor; (2) or in which you are a partner, director, or officer; (3) or in which you or a member of your immediate family is a stockholder of closed corporation stock worth \$1,000 or more at fair market value or which represents more than a 5 percent equity interest, or is a stockholder of publicly traded stock worth \$10,000 or more at fair market value or which represents more than a 10 percent equity interest.

Elective office shall mean a public office filled by an election, except for federal offices. A person who is appointed to fill a vacancy in a public office which is ordinarily elective holds an elective office.

Person means a business, individual, proprietorship, firm partnership, joint venture, syndicate, business trust, labor organization, company, corporation, association, committee, or any other organization or group of persons acting jointly.

Statutory Authority: Section 49-1499.03 Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

Guiding Principle I: Infrastructure and Shared Leadership

Objective: Establish a vision for achieving educational equity through core beliefs and norms, team structures and routines, clarity of roles and data-based decision-making process, professional learning, and system alignment.

- The District Leadership Team did not meet during the month of December. We have yet to meet in January. There is no activity to report at this time.
- We received feedback from NDE for our Indicator 13 Additional Findings corrective action plan. We were found to be in compliance. This corrective action plan is completed without further action needed.
- Our Focused Monitoring corrective action plan was submitted on January 6 (due date is January 15). This was a very rigorous corrective action plan with multiple activities completed by our special education staff. One of the requirements was to reconvene two specific IEP meetings. Those files are currently being reviewed for compliance. NDE will request to review additional files to ensure compliance. Files selected can be for any student with an IEP in grades pk-12.
- This past week, we had “Call to Greatness” professional development with all certified and classified staff. The theme was practicing self care during the phase of disillusionment. Practices included gratitude, humor, and kindness. To do this, staff made karaoke song dedications. Each group brought two dips to share. A secret taste tester chose the winning dip. Although karaoke is not everyone’s cup of tea, we did laugh a lot and enjoy time together.
- This past week, we also had explicit instruction professional development. The topic was design of instruction. We reflected on our district data from the explicit instruction survey staff completed at the beginning of the school year. Discussion included areas each building could improve on when considering instructional design.

What happened:

On December 28th, PowerSchool became aware of a potential cybersecurity incident involving unauthorized access to certain information on their servers using a compromised credential. The school was notified on January 7th that our data was potentially involved. On January 8th it was confirmed that our data was involved.

The data taken involves 2 files – one with student/parent information and one with teacher information. Both files contain names, addresses, phone numbers, emails, and some social security numbers. The student file also contained basic medical information like allergies and asthma protocols, as well as the names and phone numbers of doctors.

Previously, it was common practice to collect and store social security numbers to use for identification purposes in the system. This is no longer the case; the school has not collected social security numbers for a few years now. But numbers taken in the past were still in the file.

PowerSchool is assuring us they have done what they can to retrieve the data. This excerpt is from a FAQ document that is only accessible by the technical contacts at schools.

“PowerSchool engaged the services of CyberSteward, a professional advisor with deep experience in negotiating with threat actors. With their guidance, PowerSchool has received reasonable assurances from the threat actor that the data has been deleted and that no additional copies exist.”

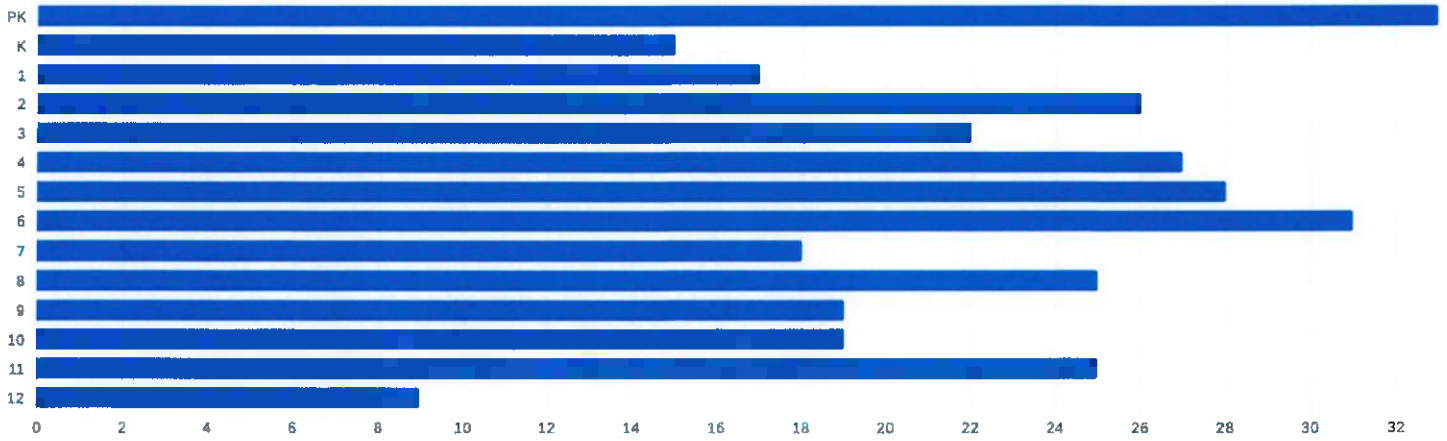
Even with the assurances, PowerSchool and CyberSteward will still be monitoring the web to make sure the data is not released. PowerSchool will be sending out a detailed report, but we are being told it will be at least January 17th, maybe even later depending on how long it takes them to go through the logs.

What we are doing:

We are working on notifying those individuals whose SSNs were compromised. Mr. Farup sent an email on the 10th to current families of the district, Mrs. Ziska sent an email that same day to those staff members involved. We are still working on how we will notify previous students as we do not necessarily have current contact information for them. PowerSchool has said they will send out more information and resources, including credit monitoring or identity protection services **if applicable**.

We will be removing the SSNs from our files. We do not need that information anymore so it will be cleared out

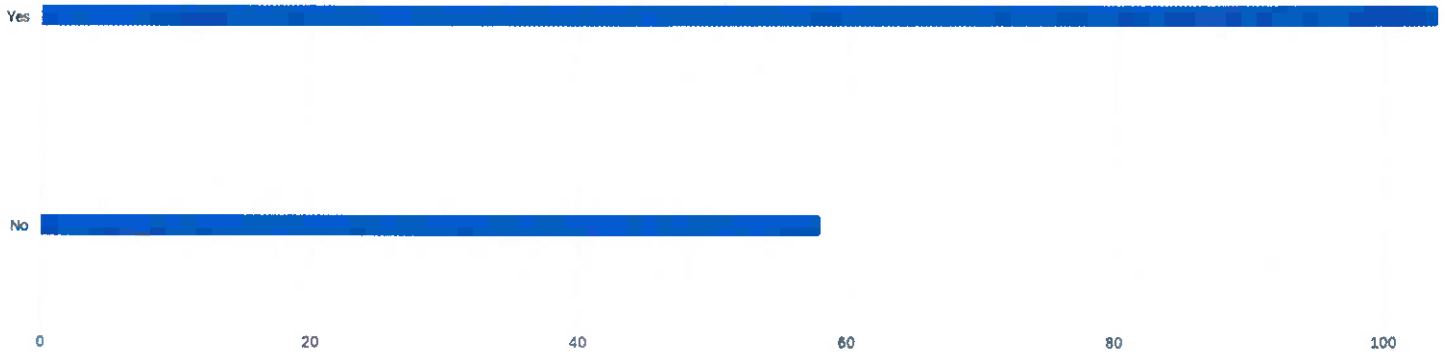

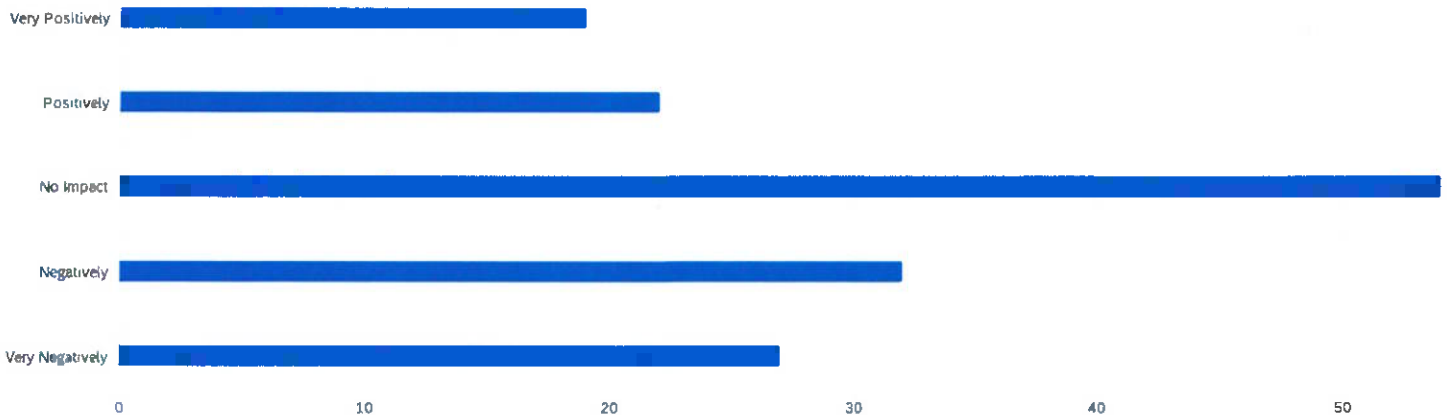

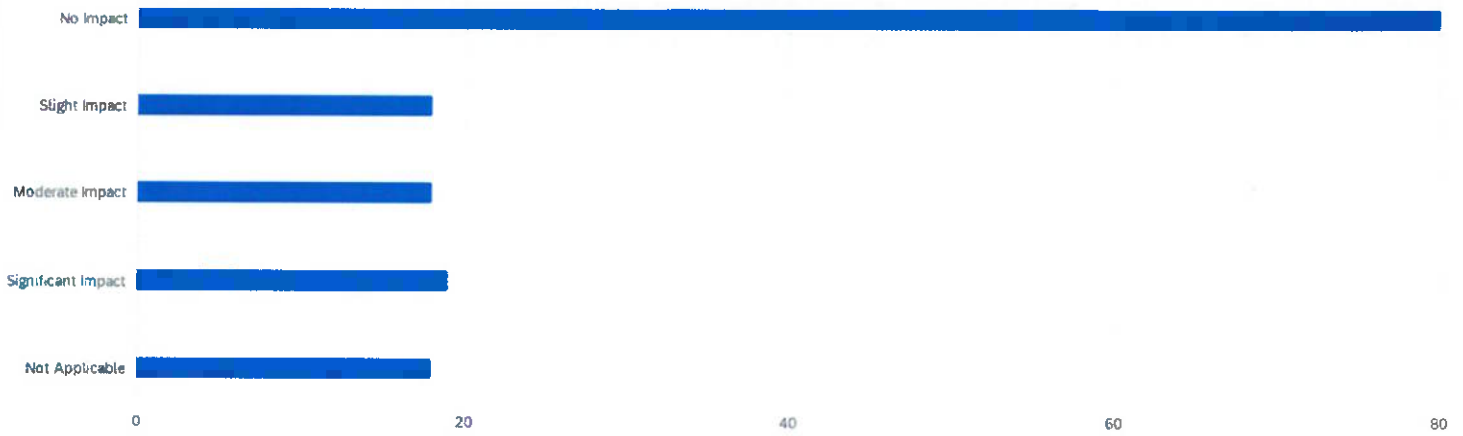

District Program Director Report – Mrs. Zach

- The District Leadership Team met during the November in-service. We completed writing action steps within our continuous improvement plan.
- The special education determinations ad hoc team met to finish our corrective action plan. The action plan was submitted for review to NDE on December 1st. It has been stated that we should not expect any feedback from NDE regarding our plan.
- The District Leadership Team is excited to have Cathy Hoffart join our team. Cathy will be filling the role of data steward for our district. Her main responsibility as a data steward will be to maintain our district's data profile.

Superintendent Report – Mr. Farup

- On Wednesday, November 27th, the Nebraska Department of Education released the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS) and Accountability for a Quality Education System (AQuESTT) classifications for the 2023-2024 school year. The results show a slight decline in student performance over the previous year, a testament to the district's challenges in pursuing improvement and academic excellence. The district remains committed to continuous improvement, meticulously analyzing data to identify areas for growth. This data-driven approach ensures every student can access the quality education they deserve.
- In addition to assessment results, Nebraska released accountability ratings. State and federal law require the NDE to annually classify and designate schools to provide signals for specific supports. Nebraska's system, AQuESTT - helps ensure all students across all backgrounds and circumstances have access to opportunities and success. AQuESTT annually classifies schools and districts as Excellent, Great, Good, and Needs Support to Improve. The Wakefield District, Middle School, and Elementary School all received a classification of Good for the 2023-2024 school year. The High School received a classification of Great for the 2023-2024 school year.
- I attended a Restorative Practice Day 3 Training virtually. Attending the restorative practice conference provided a deep dive into creating supportive school environments.
- The Finance Committee, Becky, and I met with the district auditor and went through the 2023-2024 district audit. He informed us that we are where we need to be as far as cash reserves are concerned. However, cash flow is always a concern.

Discuss, consider and take all necessary action on a resolution to reduce and reorganize the curricular programs offered by Wakefield Community School District beginning in the 2025–2026 school year.

According to Board Policy 4037: *The board of education may determine that a reduction in force of certificated staff members is appropriate due to declining enrollment in a grade or grades, changes in financial support, changes in curricular programs, a decline in the taxable value of property located within the school district, increased costs of operating the school district, or another change or changes in circumstances.* The district's financial situation is currently stable. Our recent discussion with the auditor confirmed that having approximately 3.5 months of expenses in cash reserve is a wise financial decision. However, our enrollment is currently down 31 students from last school year. We are anticipating a large decrease in State Aid for next school year, and given the challenges that were had during the fall taxation conversations, the consensus of the board is that we have burdened our taxpayers as much as we can. Last month the board gave Mr. Farup the directive to reduce staff without eliminating programs. The district will face challenges as the duties of the eliminated positions will not go away, but will need to be absorbed by other staff. The proposed resolution of Reduction in Force has the savings potential of approximately \$636,000 based on 2024-25 information.

The board of education is committed to providing the students and patrons of the Wakefield Community School District with an educational program that is of high quality and efficient. The board of education believes that the school district may provide some education programs on a reduced basis. Beginning with the 2025–2026 school year, the programs listed below will be reduced by the full-time equivalent (FTE) percentage set out below and the superintendent will make necessary assignments and reassignments:

To present, discuss, and gather feedback on the possibility of a 4-day school week schedule for Wakefield Community Schools.

Adopting a four-day school week requires careful consideration of several factors to ensure it benefits students, staff, and the community. Key aspects to evaluate include:

1. Educational Impact:

- Academic Performance: Research indicates mixed outcomes regarding the effect of a four-day week on student achievement. Some studies suggest potential declines in areas like math proficiency, while others show minimal impact. It's crucial to assess how reduced instructional days might affect learning outcomes.
- Instructional Time: Nebraska mandates a minimum of 1,032 instructional hours for elementary students and 1,080 hours for high school students. Transitioning to a four-day week often involves extending daily hours to meet these requirements.

2. Teacher Recruitment and Retention:

- **Attracting Educators:** Districts like Weeping Water have adopted a four-day week to address teacher shortages, finding it beneficial for recruitment and retention. The additional day off can serve as an incentive for educators seeking better work-life balance.

3. Financial Considerations:

- **Cost Savings:** Some districts have reported savings in transportation, utilities, and operational costs by reducing the school week. However, these savings can vary and may not be substantial enough to justify the change solely on financial grounds.

4. Community and Parental Impact:

- **Childcare Needs:** A shorter school week may pose challenges for working parents needing childcare on the fifth day. Engaging with the community to address these concerns is essential.
- **Student Activities:** The additional day off can provide opportunities for students to engage in extracurricular activities, part-time employment, or family time, which may be viewed positively by the community.

5. Implementation Logistics

- **Scheduling Adjustments:** Extending the length of the remaining school days is typically necessary to meet state instructional hour requirements. This change can affect transportation schedules, meal services, and after-school programs. The Student day would have to be 8 hours and 15 minutes.
- **Professional Development:** The additional day can be designated for teacher planning and professional development, offering opportunities to enhance instructional quality. The Teacher PD Day would consist of 8 hours. However, it's likely there will be a shortfall in meeting the 1,480 contracted hours (185 days x 8 hours) under a 185-day contract. What policy should be implemented to address this discrepancy in hours?

6. Stakeholder Engagement:

- **Community Input:** Conduct surveys and hold forums to gather feedback from parents, students, staff, and community members to ensure that the decision reflects the community's needs and concerns.

6038 Artificial Intelligence

As used in this policy, artificial intelligence tools (“AI Tools”) mean machine-based resources that use computer science, algorithms, large language models, and/or machine learning to perform tasks, answer questions, collect information, and respond to human-directed tasks, queries, and objectives. AI Tools include, but are not necessarily limited to, commercially-available resources like ChaptGPT, Google Bard, and other chatbots.

The board recognizes that among other resources, when properly used, AI Tools may provide valuable source information to students and teachers in relation to the district’s academic curriculum and assignments. Student use of AI Tools should focus on using such tools as a resource and for background material, rather than using the AI Tools to complete the assignment. Therefore, AI Tools may only be used by students in accordance with the following requirements:

1. Unless an individual teacher specifically tells students that AI Tools may be used for a specific assignment, then AI Tools may not be used. Individual teachers will decide for each individual assignment the extent to which students may use AI Tools for such assignment.
2. If a student uses any AI Tools in connection with a school assignment, the student must comply with the following:
 - a. The student must explicitly disclose to the teacher in writing that the student used an AI Tool and the specific AI Tool used.
 - b. In any student work (whether hard copy, electronic, digital, or otherwise), the student shall give proper attribution to the AI Tool(s) used to the same extent that students are expected to give proper attribution to other sources of information such as books, texts, encyclopedias, secondary sources, and other traditional media. Such attribution may include, but is not necessarily limited to, accurate quotations, citations, footnotes, endnotes, and/or bibliography entries.
 - c. In no instance may the output from one or more AI Tools be copied and placed within a student’s work as if the student wrote such section himself or herself.

3. A student's failure to meet the requirements stated in this policy will constitute a violation of the district's prohibitions against cheating plagiarism, and/or academic dishonesty, including but not necessarily limited to such prohibitions stated in the Student Handbook, which violation will subject the student to discipline up to and including expulsion.

4. The student requirements stated above are the minimum requirements for any student assignment. An individual teacher may impose more stringent requirements for any specific academic assignment or coursework.
