Questions/Comments	Response
<i>Will we be formally a Title I school with funding?</i>	As of right now, that is Mr. Anderson's plan.
<i>How was it determined as to how each school was going to be used?</i>	A few different ideas were thrown around. When the boards met this summer, each got to see in detail the facilities. Administration came to the decision of grade placement based on "best fit" for the secondary with the understanding that the Exeter site would get an addition to better serve elementary students.
<i>When will decisions on curriculum be made?</i>	Many of the decisions on curriculum have already been made and the two districts already share commonalities in curriculum. Decisions that still need to be made will involve teacher input and discussion. This will be one of the many topics after the vote in April.
<i>Statement made about teacher position.</i>	As administration continues to work on what the consolidated district would look like, most teachers would be in similar positions as they are now. There may be some slight movement with secondary staff in terms of wearing fewer hats. However, the goal is to have a massive majority of teachers teach what they are teaching now or something they are certified in. Discussions with some of the teachers whose jobs would look different have already begun to happen.
<i>Comment on block scheduling</i>	Since Mr. Anderson came from a district in which he helped get rid of block scheduling, this is probably not going to happen. We run into a lot of problems with time usage with Social Studies, Language Arts and Math. A modified block for certain areas of instruction could be a discussion item.
<i>Will we be able to add Business/Finance/Accounting classes at the High School Level?</i>	Yes! That is Mr. Anderson's goal. Not only to have a business teacher, but to increase opportunities for job shadowing, career exploration and internships.
<i>Comment on Middle School Concept before High School</i>	The goal is to create a middle school concept to help with the awkward and difficult transitions of early adolescence. This would create a place where higher expectations are expected, with a little bit more of the grace that students have at the elementary level.
<i>Comment made on paint and carpet at the Exeter site</i>	As with any building, the board of education and Mr. Anderson look at priorities every year and work to

	<p>make the necessary changes for students. This would fall under the processes and procedures that Mr. Anderson and the board of education are already familiar with.</p>
<p><i>What will we do with the elementary wing of our school?</i> <i>Can we build where the playground is?</i> <i>Do we want to save the playground?</i> <i>Can we build a bigger weightroom?</i> <i>Do we need to expand our campus and classrooms here?</i></p>	<p>The elementary wing of the current Friend site would be updated and transformed to be used for Preschool and Middle School. At this point with having two Preschool sites, we would need to keep the playground. It also serves the community during nonschool hours. Down the road, Mr. Anderson would love to work on a weight room. Academics comes first in terms of the transition. We also need to be aware of our daycare needs in the town. At this point, updates to the science lab as well as the FCS room would be next on the list for the Friend site.</p>
<p><i>Is there a possibility of departmentalizing the upper elementary?</i> <i>Will there be any traveling staff members who are needed in both locations?</i> <i>How will we determine which students are with which teacher in the elementary school?</i> <i>Will we have a new behavior system?</i> <i>What evaluation will be used?</i></p>	<p>The elementary decisions (departmentalizing and behavior system) will be taken into consideration with Mr. Anderson and Mrs. Kroll as she will be the elementary principal. Mrs. Stutzman, Mr. Anderson, and Mrs. Kroll will split up the students in the elementary classrooms (Liz and Derek have done this a lot in previous districts), splits will be based on academics, behaviors, IEPs, best student-teacher fit, gender, and personalities. There will be as few traveling teachers as possible. Lori Klooz and our two music teachers will be traveling. At this time, Mr. Anderson does not foresee any others. The FPS Evaluation system has been created through much time and effort on Mr. Anderson's part. SUMMARY - This document clarifies the scope and budget for a Phase two HVAC upgrade project that could be implemented in 2023/24 school year.

A Phase one project was previously implemented that installed a roof mounted air handling unit to heat and cool the old gymnasium and took advantage of ESSER funding.

Present Situation

Most of the HVAC systems serving the multiple buildings at Friend Schools are at or near the end of their useful life.

- The steam heating system and window A/C units serving the 1940's building are extremely outdated and inefficient. Original 1940's steam boiler is still being utilized. Steam piping systems in tunnels are becoming un-useable due to corrosion and clogging.
- The boiler and fan coil units serving the Elementary School were installed in the 1990's and have a life expectancy of approximately 20 years. They have been in service for 26 years and have experienced numerous issues.
- The rooftop units serving the newest 2010 addition are experiencing breakdowns and repairs at an increasing rate. This brand of equipment has proven to not hold up well over time. The District should be aware replacing these units will be necessary within the next few years.



PHASE 2 Recommended Solutions

Elementary School

The Elementary School HVAC system was last updated in 1997. This system uses a single standard efficiency (80%) boiler and one hot water circulating pump to serve the building. There are (11) fan coil units located in the attic that serve the classrooms and (1) unit on the roof that serves the multipurpose room. All these systems are served by air cooled condensing units located on the roof.

We have **two options** for updating the HVAC equipment in this building.

1. Replace existing boiler with new (2) new high efficiency boilers and add glycol to the system.
..... **\$245,000**
2. Eliminate boilers and the hydronic piping system and replace with attic mounted high efficiency gas furnaces **\$465,000**

Option 1 scope of work

- Drain hot water loop and remove existing boiler.
- Install two new high efficiency condensing boilers on the wall or fabricated stand in boiler room.
- Modify hot water and gas piping, intake and exhaust flues, electrical and controls for a complete turnkey installation.
- Add glycol anti-freeze to hot water system to prevent freezing coils.
- New pipe insulation on all new piping.
- New control valves on fan coil units.
- Rebuild existing hot water pump with new bearings and seals.

Option 2 scope of work

- Drain hot water loop and remove existing boiler.
- Remove all existing equipment from roof & attic space.
- Install new high efficiency gas furnaces and evaporator coils in attic space.
- Install new condensing units on roof.
- Install new gas/dx RTU on existing roof curb to serve multipurpose room.
- Install new PVC exhaust and intake piping from furnaces through the roof.
- Fabricate and install auxiliary drain pans for all units in the attic space.
- Install new gas meter and piping to serve RTU and attic furnaces.
- Install new electric entry way heater, and attic heaters.



1940's building classroom HVAC Project

The construction of the original 1940's era building is both a blessing and a curse. The blessing is that the building was so well constructed it has served the district well and has the potential to last another 100 years if properly maintained. The curse is the thick concrete walls of the structure make it difficult to route new ductwork and or piping through the structure as required for new HVAC equipment to be installed.

Based on the building's construction it is our opinion that the best system to install is a Variable Refrigerant Flow (VRF) system. These types of systems use ductless cassette modules that mount directly on the walls or ceilings to provide conditioned air to the occupants. The refrigerant, condensate, and electrical piping required for this installation is much smaller than other typical systems requiring extensive ductwork.

While a VRF system can adequately heat and cool each space it cannot provide the required fresh air for building occupants as required by modern codes. Fresh air still needs to be delivered and stale air exhausted to each space using traditional sheet metal ductwork. This fresh air ductwork is much smaller in size than would be required if the spaces were heated and cooled using ducted air. The smaller duct sizing aids in the installation however it still requires numerous openings be cut through the thick concrete walls of the 1940's building.

For redundancy and ease of installation our plan divides the VRF equipment into four separate systems. Two systems will serve the upper and two will serve the lower floor classrooms and offices. The condensing units for these systems will be mounted on the roof near the existing elevator shaft.

Two new Dedicated Outside Air System (DOAS) air handling units will be roof mounted and provide conditioned fresh air to the occupied spaces. DOAS units will incorporate energy recovery systems to improve efficiency. One unit will be installed to serve the spaces for each floor. New ductwork will be routed down the hallways and ducted through each classroom wall. Some hallway areas will have new drop ceilings and lighting installed to conceal the ductwork and refrigerant piping.

Two ductless mini-split heat pump systems will be installed to serve the old locker-storage areas below the gym bleachers. These rooms still have active plumbing and a heating system is required to prevent freezing pipes in these areas.

Finally, an electric unit heater will be installed in the front entrance to take place of the existing steam radiator by the front entrance.

There are multiple options for the demolition of the original steam system. All the old equipment can be removed in its entirety, abandoned in place, or a combination of both. Due to the age of the boiler it has asbestos covering the exterior shell, and we also expect to find it in the gaskets and refractory brick. Our suggestion would be to demo the radiators and piping visible in the classrooms to free up floor space and abandon the boiler and tunnel piping in place.



A cost saving option would be for the School District to manage the demolition on their own. This type of project does not require any skilled labor and there may be local “scrappers” that would perform the work inexpensively for the scrap metal recovery. Of concern is the risk of health or property damage during demolition. Whoever performs this work should be adequately insured.

Finally, all the window air conditioners can be removed to improve appearance and seal up the exterior envelope. An insulated foam board or other material could be installed over the window openings. It is assumed new windows will be installed in a future building improvement project.
