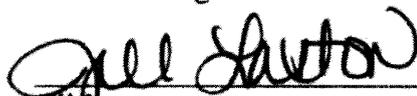

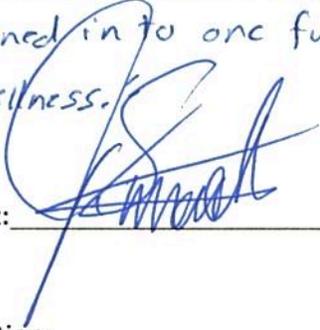

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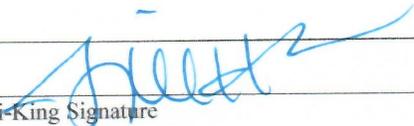

Proposal for Collaboration between Yukon Public Schools and Connections Support Groups by Gayle Jones, School Group Facilitator 2021-2022 School Year

Objective: Yukon Public Schools and Gayle Jones to partner to provide quality life skill support groups to Yukon Public Schools' students, pre-kindergarten through eighth grade.

Rationale: Support groups help children whose lives have been significantly impacted by loss due to the death of a loved one, divorce, military deployment, incarceration, and other major family challenges, such as frequent moves, foster care, and blended families. When children are grieving or stressed, they often find it difficult to focus or concentrate in school which would affect their academics and relationships.

These support group sessions provide children with a safe place to identify and discuss their feelings and learn healthy ways of coping and taking care of themselves while adjusting to change. Children often find it easier to focus on the classroom and to communicate their thoughts and feelings with their teachers, classmates, and families after completing a life skills support group. Support groups are not therapy, nor counseling. However, they will be conducted by a certified teacher with 21 years of experience in education, grief and trauma recovery and violence prevention.

Interventions: Life skills support groups (Connections) will be provided by Gayle Jones, School Group Facilitator.

Benefits for Yukon Public Schools:

- YPS will control the referrals of its students.
- As many as 35 face-to-face support group hours will be provided weekly at no cost to YPS students.
- Support group sessions provide children the opportunity to:
 - Increase their feelings word vocabulary to express what they are experiencing in a safe place in an appropriate manner
 - Identify their individual strengths and areas of challenge
 - Improve their communication skills, i.e., listening, verbal and written expression
 - Learn coping skills and healthy ways of taking care of themselves
 - Become more empathetic to others experiencing similar challenges
 - Learn they are not alone emotionally and that peers are learning and healing also.

Yukon Public Schools Will Identify Needs of Students:

Gayle Jones would like to enter into an agreement with Yukon Public Schools to provide the following services for the 2021-2022 school year at a rate of \$30 per session not to exceed \$6000 for the 2021-2022 school year.

- Groups – 5 hours per week (on average) on a rotating schedule, offered at all PK-8 sites
 - Successful onsite life skill support groups must be developed at the PK-8 grade levels in 6 to 8 week rotations.

- Sign-in sheets will be available at the end of each group for attendance and invoicing purposes for the school counselor's review and signature.
- Age-Appropriate educational materials, documentation, and development of confidentiality protocols.
- Demonstrate appropriate group management skills needed for facilitation.
- Communicate with a designated YPS contact in the case of suicidal/homicidal ideation, self-mutilation or other concerns as needed.
- Communicate with parents, if necessary, in collaboration with the designated YPS contact.
- Potential types of support groups:
 - Grief and Loss issues
 - Life Skills
 - Anger management/conflict resolution
 - Students with incarcerated parents

Potential additional services that may be determined as needed by YPS:

- Additional support group hours as needed.
- Staff training - basic mental health
- Parent University at targeted sites

Plan:

- Life Skill Support Groups: A Yukon Public Schools counselor or other designated faculty member will make a referral for a student to participate in a life skills support group. The YPS School Counselor or designee will work with the parent to receive a signed consent form for participation before beginning group. The YPS School Counselor or designee will coordinate the schedule of groups with Gayle Jones, make any necessary copies for students provided ahead of time via Gayle, and make arrangements for students the day of each group session in a confidential setting. Support groups will be a minimum of five students and a maximum of seven students. An attendance sign in sheet will be available to the counselor for each group, each week. At the conclusion of each life skill support group, Gayle Jones will report the progress made by students in the groups as indicated by student surveys to the site Counselor(s) or designees.
- Insurance: Gayle Jones will provide a background check and documentation of liability insurance to Yukon Public Schools before beginning support groups.
- School Calendar: Gayle Jones will be aware of our school calendar and know when school is out of session or when students are unavailable for group time. School may also be cancelled due to weather or other events which may not be predicted. In these cases, groups will not be able to meet. Gayle Jones will work with the school counselor to make up the group times, if needed.

Expenses:

- Cost will not exceed \$6,000.
- Expenses will be itemized and billed on or before the last Friday of the month.

TOPIC: Student Drug Testing with CRG (Compliance Resource Group)

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends the approval of a contract between Compliance Resource Group and Yukon Public Schools.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The purpose of this agreement is to comply with our Board Policy EN regarding Student Drug Testing.

In an effort to protect the health and safety of its students from illegal and/or performance-enhancing drug use and abuse, the Board adopts the following policy for drug testing of students who participate in competitive extracurricular activities (“Activity Students”) as well as any other student whose parent/guardian voluntarily places the student to be tested. This policy supplements and complements all other policies, rules, and regulations of the District regarding possession or use of illegal and/or performance-enhancing drugs. The District believes that accountability is a powerful tool to help students avoid using illegal and/or performance enhancing drugs and that early detection and intervention can save students’ lives.

Although the Board, administration, and staff desire that every student in the District refrain from using or possessing illegal drugs, District officials realize that their power to restrict the possession or use of illegal and/or performance-enhancing drugs is limited. Therefore, this policy governs performance-enhancing and/or illegal drug use by students participating in competitive extra-curricular activities and those who voluntarily participate in the drug testing program. The sanctions imposed for violations of this policy by an Activity Student will be limited to the opportunity of such students to exercise the privilege of participating in competitive extra-curricular activities. No suspensions from school or academic sanctions will be imposed for violations of this policy.

In addition to Activity Students, parents/guardians may voluntarily place any student who does not participate in any competitive extra-curricular activities to be tested on a random and a reasonable suspicion basis. This would allow parents/guardians to be notified as to a potential drug problem and enable them to seek help.

Participation in school-sponsored competitive extra-curricular activities at the District is a privilege. Students who participate in these activities should be respected by the student body as well as the District and the community they represent. Accordingly, students in competitive extra- curricular activities carry a responsibility to themselves, their fellow students, their parents and their school to set the highest possible examples of conduct, sportsmanship, and

training, which includes avoiding the use or possession of illegal drugs. Illegal and performance-enhancing drug use of any kind is incompatible with the physical, mental, and emotional demands placed upon participants in extra-curricular activities and upon the positive image these students project to other students and to the community on behalf of the District. For the safety, health, and well-being of students in extra-curricular activities, the District has adopted this policy for use by all participants in competitive extracurricular activities in grades 7-12.

The purposes of this policy are five-fold:

1. To educate students as to the serious physical, mental, and emotional harm caused by illegal and/or performance-enhancing drug use.
2. To alert students with possible substance-abuse problems to the potential harms that drug use poses for their physical, mental, and emotional well-being and offer them the privilege of competition as an incentive to stop using such substances.
3. To ensure that students adhere to a training program that bars the intake of illegal and/or performance-enhancing drugs.
4. To prevent injury, illness, and harm for students that may arise from illegal and/or performance-enhancing drug use.
5. To offer students practices, competition and school activities free of the effects of illegal and/or performance-enhancing drug use.

OPTIONS:

1. Approve this contract with Compliance Resource Group
2. Do not approve this contract with Compliance Resource Group

FISCAL NOTE: Compliance Resource Group will charge \$32 per oral fluid drug screen, which is a seven panel screener. This is the same cost per test as in previous years. Three times per year (Fall, Winter and Spring), approximately 2 to 3 percent of the activity students enrolled in the random screening are selected, which is approximately 20-25 students per site. In addition we have a rolling amount of drug contract students entered into the random pool for testing. We would like to maintain the flexibility to possibly randomly test 2 to 3 students from our MOVE program at YALE tested each month. There is also a \$500 charge for CRG to conduct random breathalyzer testing at the Yukon High School Prom. Overall, the total cost of this contract will not exceed \$10,000 out of the General Fund for the SY21-22.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR SERVICES

This agreement is made as of the 21st day of April 2021, by and between **THE COMPLIANCE RESOURCE GROUP, Inc.**, herein known as "CRG" and **YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS** herein known as "Client".

TERM.

The Initial Term of this Agreement shall be for the 2021-2022 school year. Thereafter, this Agreement will renew at the end of the Initial Term and will continue in effect on an Extended Term basis. Either party may cancel this Agreement on thirty (30)-days written notice to the other party by certified mail, return receipt requested, or personal delivery with a signed receipt from the other party.

SERVICES.

CRG is a "Third Party Administrator" (TPA) for substance abuse testing programs, and on behalf of the Client and when notified to do so by the Client or the Client's designee, will provide drug and alcohol testing services for clients of the named Client.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE.

All payments are due in Oklahoma County, OK, within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. Invoices are past due when payment is not received within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. All past due payments may be subject to an additional interest and service charge calculated at the rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month from the date the invoice becomes past due until the payment is received by CRG. If it should become necessary to turn this account to a third party for collection, the client is liable for the cost of such collection, including any legal costs.

CONFIDENTIALITY.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION: This is a continuing contract to provide quality mental health group counseling for students in need of support as well as homicide/suicide assessments for students in crisis. Agreement contains full outline of services gained.

FISCAL NOTE: There is no change in cost from last year. The total cost of the contract will not exceed \$25,000 for school year 21-22.

**Proposal for Yukon Public Schools and Core Counseling Mental Health Services, PLLC Mental Health Collaboration
2021-22 School Year**

Objective: For Yukon Public Schools and Core Counseling Mental Health Services, PLLC to partner together in order to provide quality mental health counseling and supplemental mental health services for Yukon Public Schools' students 4th through 12th grade.

Rationale: According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness, mental health conditions most often begin in adolescence with onset usually occurring by the age of 14. Many children experience trauma and mental health issues much earlier making intervention prior to age 14 necessary. There are one in five youth living with a mental illness with less than half of these receiving needed mental health services.

In a given year 13%-20% of children meet criteria for a mental disorder, but less than 12% receive any services to address this. Students challenged with mental health concerns are at very high risk for disruption in their learning, family, and peer relationships. We know that when students are able to receive appropriate services and treatment, they are able to more effectively learn, grow, develop and be successful. Schools can play an important role in identifying the early warning signs and link students and their families to quality services and supports.

Interventions: Mental health counseling will be provided by Core Counseling Mental Health Services, PLLC in the form of psychoeducational or processing groups and same day Crisis Assessment Intervention. Psychoeducation are groups are grounded in learning. Using Cognitive Behavioral therapy a student will learn to connect thoughts, feelings, and actions based on the group topic. Processing groups allow the students to explore their emotions as they are controlling behaviors. While processing students will have the opportunity to get more in depth to the triggers in their environment and how those are affecting their ability to function in their identified role.

Benefits for Yukon Public Schools:

- YPS will control the referrals of its students.
- YPS will receive the mental health services of licensed clinicians who will see students with mental health needs by conducting psychoeducational and processing groups and will provide same day crisis assessment intervention services when needed.
- As many as 7 hours of face-to-face group counseling will be provided weekly at no cost to YPS students.
- Core Counseling will create data for YPS to identify the number of students receiving services over the 2021-22 school year. The data will show what type of services were utilized by YPS students.

Yukon Public Schools Identified Mental Health Needs for Students:

Core Counseling Mental Health Services would like to enter into an agreement with Yukon Public Schools to provide the following services by Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC) and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists (LMFT) for the 2021-22 school year at a rate of \$25,000 per year.

- Core Counseling Mental Health Services will conduct Crisis assessments and follow-up for suicide/homicide ideation
 - Assessments must be performed on the same day, preferably at the school site.
 - Appropriate educational materials, documentation and confidentiality protocols will be provided to YPS.
 - Communication with designated YPS contact.

- Groups – 7 hours per week
 - Continue successful onsite groups at the middle school (MS) level (7-8th-grade students). High school groups (9-12) may be started as needed.
 - Develop and implement onsite groups at the intermediate level (4-6) at three sites.
 - Sign-in sheets collected at the end of each group for attendance and invoicing purposes.
 - Appropriate educational materials, documentation and development of confidentiality protocols.
 - Demonstrate appropriate group management skills needed for facilitation.
 - Communicate with a designated YPS contact in the case of suicidal/homicidal ideation, cutting or other concerns as needed.
 - Communicate with parents, if necessary, in collaboration with the designated YPS contact.
 - Potential types of groups:
 - Anxiety and Depression
 - Grief
 - Life Skills
 - Anger management
 - Students with Incarcerated parents
 - Coping skills
 - LGBTQ+
 - Support groups for students returning to school after being absent for mental health treatment or inpatient services.

Potential additional services that may be determined as needed by YPS:

- Ability to provide individual counseling services if needed onsite.
- Additional group hours as needed.
- Staff training - trauma, basic mental health.

Plan:

- Crisis Assessment: A Yukon Public Schools counselor or other designated faculty member will initiate contact with Core Counseling Mental Health Services for a same-day assessment. Core Counseling Mental Health Services will communicate that same day with the YPS designee with an action timeline for the assessment and steps to take if the assessment cannot be performed for some reason that same day on site. Core

Counseling will keep a record of Crisis Intervention Services provided throughout the year and this report will be included with the invoice each month for payment.

Core Counseling will provide recommendations based on assessment that the child be sent for inpatient assessment or if the child does not meet criteria. YPS will receive a copy of this report to identify that students are being assessed by proper medical facilities or if a DHS report for medical neglect need to be made. This will be a collaborative effort by YPS and Core Counseling.

- Group Counseling: A Yukon Public Schools counselor or other designated faculty member will make a referral to Core Counseling for a student to participate in either a psychoeducational group or processing group. . The YPS School Counselor or designee will work with the parent to receive a signed consent form for participation before beginning group. The YPS School Counselor or designee will coordinate the schedule of groups with contacts at Core in addition to make arrangements for students the day of each group session. A student sign-in sheet will be collected for each group, each week and will be included with the invoice each month for payment. At the conclusion of each psychoeducational or processing group, Core Counseling will report the progress made by students in the groups as indicated by pre and post group assessment.
- School Calendar: Core Counseling will be aware of school calendar and know when school is out of session. School may also be cancelled due to weather or other events that cannot be predicted. In these cases, groups will not be able to meet.

Documents Core Counseling Group will Provide: Core Counseling will provide the following documentation for each counselor that is contracted:

- Copy of license or supervision agreement
- Copy of malpractice insurance
- Copy of OSBI background check (performed within the last 12 months)
- Signed Release of Liability
- Signed understanding of child abuse reporting
- Core Counseling liability insurance
- Core Counseling release of liability (YPS not responsible for any workman's compensation claims)

Expenses:

- Core Counseling is proposing \$25,000 for the 2021-2022 school year based on the administrative and professional costs associated with providing a licensed therapist for group therapy weekly. The cost includes clinical record keeping, collaboration, and follow up with YPS on services provided. This cost also includes Core Counseling keeping a licensed therapists on-call to provide suicide risk assessments as needed by YPS. Core Counseling will invoice YPS at the end of each month for 9 months making the monthly responsibility of YPS \$2777.77
- Expenses will be itemized and billed on or before the last Friday of the month.

Core Counseling would like to offer, at no cost to YPS, trauma informed in-service training for identifying crisis and verbal de-escalation, twice yearly.

COVID Considerations: As children return to school mental health needs will have changed. We must all address the trauma that we have all experienced. Using a professional counseling staff, it is important to use group and individual experiences to process the pandemic experience and traumas alike. Research is showing the suicide rate has already increased. Counselors will offer opportunities to generate hope, using therapeutic encounters to create an optimistic mood and a sense of excitement as everyone heals. (School Mental Health Project, UCLA)

TOPIC: Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends approval of the agreement between Yukon Public Schools and CompSource Mutual through BancFirst Insurance Services..

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION: Through a competitive process during which we provided multiple vendors with the opportunity to compete for our business, we received the following quotes:

CompSource Mutual (Current Provider) - \$246,385

Zenith Insurance - \$297,000

Comp Risk - \$299,934

LUBA - \$307,055

United Heartland - Declined to Quote

Liberty Mutual - Declined to Quote

Applied Underwriters - Declined to Quote

CompSource Mutual is our current provider. We have had a tremendously successful year thus far in respect to claims costs and claims resolution, as well as collaborating with both CompSource and BancFirst to continue monthly safety walkthroughs and continue to work toward resolution on our existing claims from previous providers.

The consultant assigned to our account, courtesy of BancFirst, has 25 years of experience handling workers' compensation claims, including 4 years as the director of claims with CompSource. We have worked very closely with him beginning in FY19 and have found him to be a tremendous asset and advocate. In comparison, we have previously employed a safety consultant via a rebate program through OSAG and we have for years used a third party claims management company. The experience we have had with BancFirst and CompSource leads us to believe that we are in the continuing stages of a partnership to impact our claims in a positive direction on a long-term basis.

We also believe this is the best possible partnership to impact our Experience Modification Rate (EMod) in a positive manner, something that is critical for our future premium quotes. Our previous year's EMod was 1.51%. This year's EMod is 1.27. A 1.0 EMod is the goal.

Previous Year Premiums:

- FY 17 - \$378,328 (Note: This is the year many districts saw a premium decrease as a result of changing worker's compensation laws. We saw an increase.)
- FY 18 - \$185,262 (Note: This quote was the result of a substantial "performance based" dividend)

- FY 20 - \$233,627.76 (This includes a consulting fee of \$17, 305.76).
- FY21 - \$310,459
- FY22 - \$246, 385 (a savings of \$64,074 for FY 22)

TOPIC: Oklahoma Schools Insurance Group Property & Casualty Quote for FY2022

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends renewing the Oklahoma Schools Insurance Group (OSIG) contract for property and casualty insurance coverages. While most of the regional market is experiencing a +25% increase in premiums, Yukon's increase is close to 18%. We can lower that to 10% by selecting a higher deductible.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION: The insurance refinancing market is forcing premiums upward significantly. The OSIG reinsurers have paid out \$148M in losses vs. \$84M in receipts over the past 6 years. We are opting for a \$50K deductible (from \$25K) for a premium reduction of \$63,683.

BASIC LEGAL SERVICES PROGRAM 2021-2022 AGREEMENT

Yukon Public Schools

Independent School District No. 27 of Canadian County, Oklahoma

Agreement between the school district named above (“District”) and The Center for Education Law, P.C., an Oklahoma professional corporation, (“Center”) for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 (“Fiscal Year”).

IT IS AGREED:

1. Center shall provide legal representation and services to District as directed by the Superintendent or the President of the Board of Education as provided below.
2. District shall pay Center the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) as a participation fee for Center's 2021-2022 Basic Legal Services Program and be entitled to the following:

3. Center will not charge District for any of the following expenses incurred by the Center in the representation of District:
 - a. long-distance telephone charges; and
 - b. facsimile transmissions between Center and District.

4. District shall compensate Center for legal services provided by Center to District on an hourly basis, billed in one-tenth-hour (6 minutes) increments, as follows:

Associate Attorneys	\$ 140.00
Legal Interns/Paralegals	\$ 55.00

5. Travel time will be billed at one-half the rates set forth above for travel outside of Oklahoma County.

6. The following expenses incurred in the representation of District by Center shall be reimbursed by District:

- a. Litigation costs including, but not limited to, filing fees, deposition costs, witnesses and investigation expenses, unless such expenses are covered by applicable insurance;
- b. Photocopies at 15¢ per copy;
- c. Actual charges incurred for out-of-office copy, courier, and express mailing services; and
- d. Mileage for travel per mile from Center's office at the rate approved by the Internal Revenue Service.

7. Center shall submit statements to District for fees and expenses for calendar months in which fees and expenses are incurred. Monthly summaries of fees and expenses will be provided to the Superintendent.

TOPIC: CCEC Alternative Education Contract through the Board of County Commissioners of Canadian County Oklahoma on behalf of Canadian County Children’s Justice Center (CCCJC)

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION: This is a continuing contract for 18 alternative education spots for 7th through 12th graders through Canadian County Education Center. These spots allow us to continue to provide educational services for students needing a more structured, disciplined setting. The contract has no changes from last year.

FISCAL NOTE: Cost analysis: In years past the fee of \$3,500.00 per student for 18 students has been waived. During the 20-21 school year, due to Covid precautions, we only received 10 spots, but the costs were again waived. For the 21-22 school year, the Canadian County Education Center will be charging \$1000 per student, and we will return to our full student load of 18 students. Therefore, YPS CCEC spots will now cost \$18,000, which will come out of the General Fund.

Canadian County Education Center Contract 2021-2022 Fiscal Year

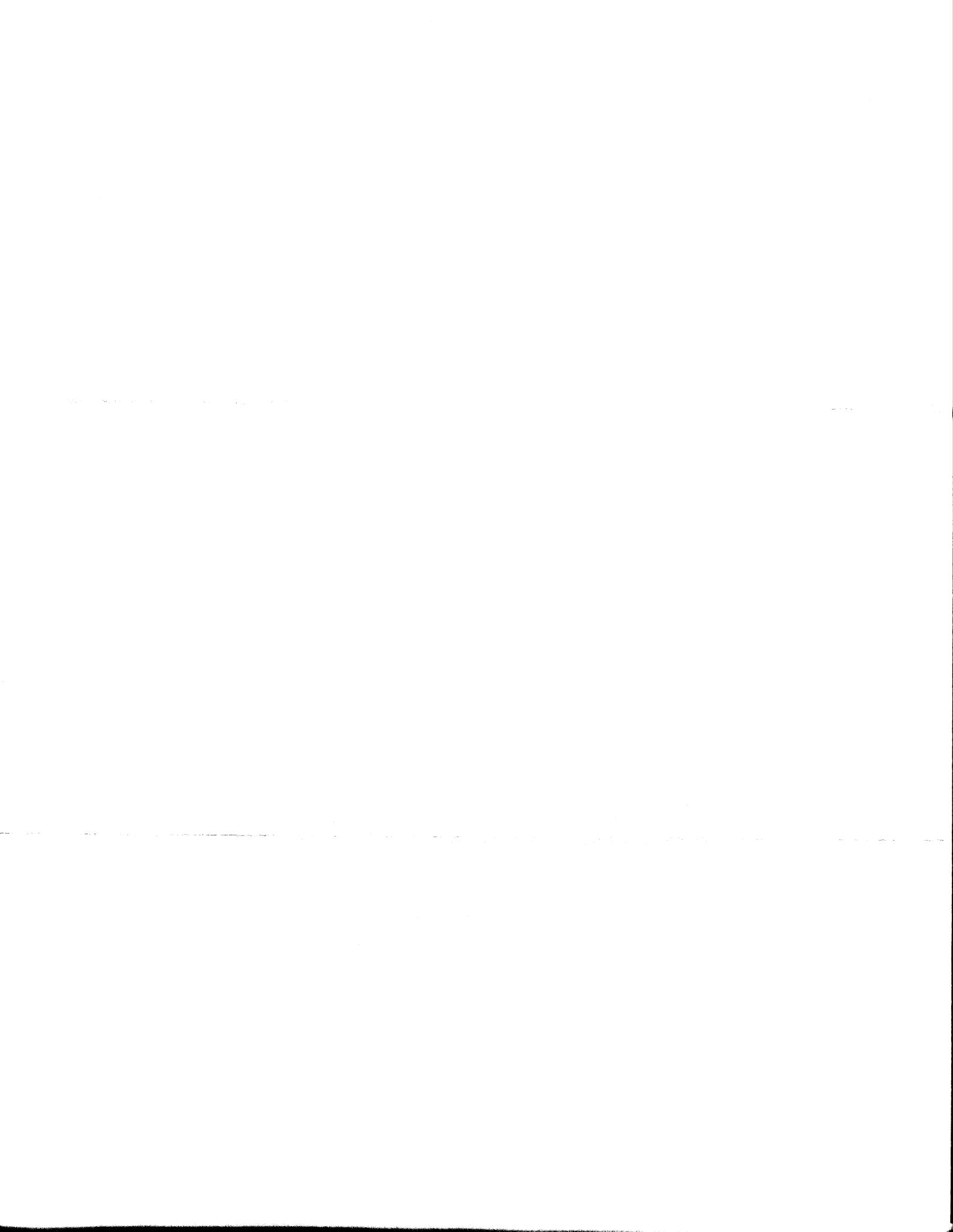
Agreement entered into as of the 1st day of July, 2021, by and between Independent School District No. 09 I027 of Canadian County, Oklahoma, a/k/a **Yukon Public Schools** (herein referred to as YPS) and **the Board of County Commissioners of Canadian County, Oklahoma** (herein referred to as COUNTY) on behalf of the Canadian County Children's Justice Center (herein referred to as CCCJC).

WHEREAS, CCCJC is located within the boundaries of the El Reno Public Schools District (herein referred to as ERPS) who shall serve as the Lead Education Agency (herein referred to as LEA) for CCCJC's school programs.

WHEREAS, CCCJC includes an alternative education facility and school program called the Canadian County Education Center (herein referred to as CCEC) to be used for alternative education students who are in the 6th grade through the 12th grades from various school districts within Canadian County, Oklahoma.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual covenants and obligations, and other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

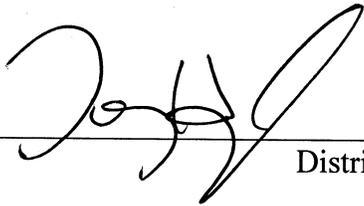
1. CCEC Alternative Education Facility. The County through CCCJC will be responsible for the maintenance of CCEC. The CCCJC will be responsible for providing and maintaining all of CCEC's furnishings, equipment, materials, supplies, textbooks and teaching aides. CCEC will include six (6) classrooms, a commons area, appropriate office space, and access to CCCJC's gymnasium.
2. Education Facility Staff. The staff will consist of a principal and an appropriate number of teachers (estimated to be 6). The staff will be hired by the LEA subject to approval of CCCJC's Director(s) and Director of Student Services. The staff will be employees of the LEA and subject to all applicable policies of the LEA's Board of Education.
3. Staff Qualifications/Certification. The LEA will be responsible for hiring only those persons who have the qualifications and certification required by law to teach in or administrate an Alternative Education program.
4. Program Certification. The LEA and CCEC staff will, through joint efforts, take the steps necessary to obtain and maintain the necessary certification of the program.



5. CCCJC Alternative Education Programs. CCEC's Alternative Education program offered pursuant to this Agreement, will be separate from the Alternative Education services provided to juveniles enrolled in CCCJC's other school programs: Detention, Sanctions, and Fort Reno Adolescent Center. CCEC will meet the requirements developed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education for Alternative Schools.
6. CCEC Students. CCCJC Director(s) and Director of Student Services will establish and enforce CCEC student admission and enrollment criteria. CCEC will provide Alternative Education to qualifying students from school districts who have entered into a contract with the COUNTY for such Alternative Education services. Students in the sixth (6th) through twelfth (12th) grades will be eligible for referral.
7. Status of Students. YPS students who attend CCEC will remain students of YPS and will be subject to the applicable graduation requirements of the YPS district. YPS will be responsible for maintaining the records and submitting the reports required by state and/or federal law for YPS students enrolled in CCEC.
8. CCEC's Program Term. CCEC will provide Alternative Education services to YPS students on the days that the LEA is in session.
9. Number of Students. YPS agrees to send no more than 18 YPS students to CCEC at one time during the 2021-2022 school year. If additional students are in need of CCEC, additional slots may be purchased on a per diem basis, if available and approved by CCCJC's Director(s) and the Director of Student Services.
10. Payment. YPS payment to the COUNTY of \$1000.00 for each slot as designated in paragraph 9.
11. Transportation of Students. During the academic year, YPS will be responsible for transportation of YPS students, if needed, to and from CCEC.
12. Terms of Agreement. This Agreement shall be effective from the date it is executed by the parties through the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year on June 30, 2022. This Agreement may be renewed for subsequent fiscal years, upon mutual ratification of the parties of all terms, including any modifications of the provisions in paragraphs 9 and 10 hereinabove.

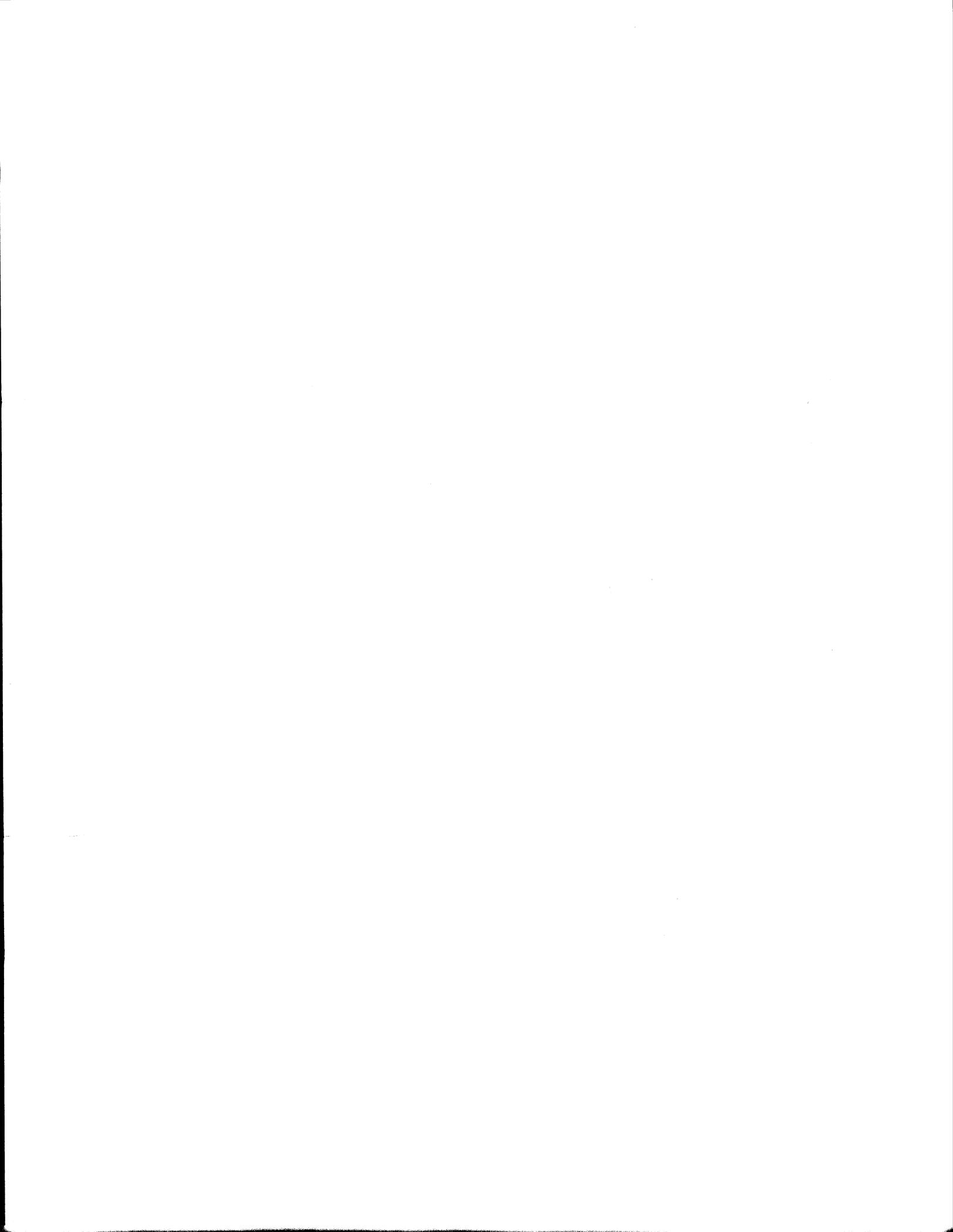

TOPIC: Memorandum of Understanding with Community Health Centers, Inc. for Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) as a universal mental health screener for the 2021-2022 school year.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends approval of the Memorandum of Understanding with Community Health Centers, Inc for the purpose of mental health screening for our 8th and 12th grade students in YPS. (see details in MOU)

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION: Yukon Public Schools and Community Health Centers, Inc would like to partner together in our common interest to promote prevention and intervention with our 8th grade (middle school) and 12th grade (high school) students. This memorandum of understanding outlines the SBIRT (Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment) process. The SBIRT uses the following evidence based screening tools:

AHC HRSN for Health Related Social Needs

CRAFFT for Substance Use

PHQ-A for Depression and Suicide Risk

In general, parents of our 8th and 12th grade students would provide written consent for their student to be screened. The screening process takes a total of 15 minutes and can be pushed out electronically. **All** students, both positive and negative screens, receive a follow up consultation. YMS and YHS will each have a lead counselor over the screening process, but one of the keys to this program's success will be the SBIRT Behavior Health Consultant provided to YPS by Community Health Centers, Inc free of charge.

The early prevention and intervention pieces, as well as the referral to treatment with follow-up for these targeted grades of students (8th & 12th) will allow us to improve the wellbeing of our students/families by reducing disparities of access.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS, INC.

and

YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

BACKGROUND

Yukon Public Schools (YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS) and Community Health Centers of Oklahoma (COMMUNITY HEALTH) share common priorities and interests toward prevention and intervention initiative to support moving students toward academic and social success. Community Health Centers of Oklahoma would like to partner with Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

SBIRT stands for Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment Originally developed for delivery in busy health care settings, SBIRT offers an efficient, evidence-based, and comprehensive service to identify, reduce, and prevent selected mental and behavioral health concerns among adolescents. Although originally designed as a universal prevention approach (Tier 1), SBIRT is readily adapted for delivery in middle and high school settings by COMMUNITY HEALTH School based Behavioral Health Consultants as a selected (Tier 2) or indicated (Tier 3) intervention.

Why deliver SBIRT services in your school?

- SBIRT expands the capacity of student services to effectively and efficiently address a range of behavioral health concerns (e.g., alcohol/drug use, mental health) which, in turn, promotes school engagement and learning outcomes.
- SBIRT fits with a student-centered, strength-based philosophy.
- SBIRT is student friendly, culturally relevant, and highly engaging. No problem recognition is required for a student to benefit from SBIRT. Teenagers rate these services with high levels of satisfaction.
- SBIRT fits with Response to Intervention. Screening provides baseline data, then approximately 30 days later, follow up screening ascertains individual student response to Brief Intervention.
- SBIRT fits with Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports. Services can be delivered as an indicated (Tier 3) or selected (Tier 2) intervention.
- Implementation allows for flexibility. SBIRT Behavioral Health Consultants are trained to use a protocol which guides delivery of services.

Each organization has unique competencies through which it addresses these goals. These organizations realize that by forming a strategic partnership they can capitalize on the individual strengths of each organization to achieve an effective, coordinated, and integrated continuum of care for students.

PURPOSE

This Memorandum of Understanding will establish a mechanism that ensures access to support services and behavioral health consultation for the underserved and uninsured. The MOU will also further both organizations goals to improve the wellbeing of the students/families by reducing disparities and improving access.

Now, Therefore COMMUNITY HEALTH and YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS agree to the following terms and conditions:

SBIRT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

In the short-term (within 6 months), in the target populations expect to see students report:

- Decreased intention to use substances and frequency of substance use;
- Decreased symptoms of depression, self-harm/suicidality, and anxiety; and,

- Increased reports of feeling connected to their school.

Over the long-term we expect to see these changes in symptoms lead to:

- Increased attendance
- Decreased dropout rates
- Increased high school graduation rates.
- Delayed onset of substance use

I. SCOPE OF WORK – YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AGREES TO:

- Manage referral to services for the target populations by providing access to SBIRT Behavioral Health Consultants and/or outreach workers to inform students and parents about program.
- Obtain input and work collaboratively, in the operations of the referral service from YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS project target populations and project collaborators.
- Maintain and update standard policies and procedures governing the process for the referrals.
- Provide confidential office space, access to phone and internet services for screenings and brief intervention and follow up with target population and their families.

II. YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS shall undertake the following activities:

- **May elect to designate a point of contact at each school or for the district as deemed necessary.**
- Review this MOU at the request of COMMUNITY HEALTH when and if necessary.
- Comply with this agreement.
- Maintain records and client information to the highest standards of confidentiality.
- Deliver SBIRT Print Media/ correspondence to target population’s parent via paper or electronic communication.

III. COMMUNITY HEALTH RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

COMMUNITY HEALTH shall undertake the following activities:

- Provide education about **free** program services.
- Provide education and support to enrollees and to students in classroom setting when permissible by YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS administration.
- Contact enrollees directly to schedule and not contact YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS re: scheduling or student/parent missed appointments.
- Provide a SBIRT Behavior Health Consultant in the targeted middle and/or high school to facilitate all SBIRT services to support students.
- Provide related professional development, education, outreach, and support to Yukon Public schools community
- Adhere to HIPAA and FERPA standards
- Review this MOU at the request of COMMUNITY HEALTH when and if necessary
- Comply with this agreement
- Maintain records and student information to the highest standards of confidentiality

IV. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

1. Modification clause: This agreement may be modified by either party in writing.
2. Termination clause: This agreement may be immediately terminated if funding is suddenly eliminated for either party. Written notice must be provided as soon as the party becomes aware of the changes.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE AND SIGNATURE

This MOU shall be in effect upon the signature of Party A’s and Party B’s authorized officials. It shall be in force from: July 1, 2021 to November 30, 2022.

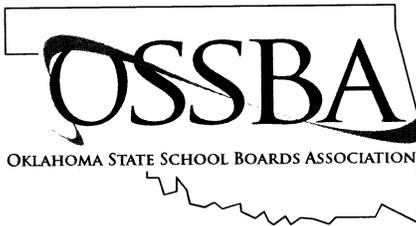

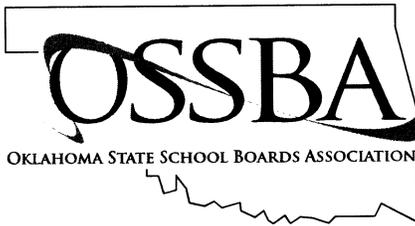

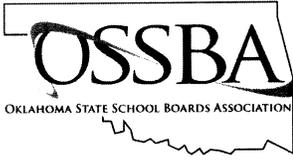

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COMMUNITYCARE EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (EAP) AGREEMENT

This CommunityCare EAP Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into as of the Effective Date set forth on the signature page of this Agreement and is between CommunityCare HMO, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation ("CommunityCare") and YUKON PUBLIC SCHOOLS ("Company").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CommunityCare is a health maintenance organization organized under the laws of the State of Oklahoma and in conformity with the requirements of the Oklahoma Public Health Code, Okla. Stat. tit. 63, § 2501 *et seq.* (Supp. 1992) and in the process of qualifying under the Federal Health Maintenance Organization Act of 1973 (42 U.S.C. § 300(3) *et seq.*);

WHEREAS, a division of CommunityCare is responsible for providing or arranging EAP services for Client Companies and such division is referred to as CommunityCare EAP;

WHEREAS, Company desires to retain CommunityCare to provide EAP services to Company employees as set forth in this Agreement and CommunityCare accepts such engagement in accordance with the terms of this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the agreements and undertakings set forth in this Agreement and in reliance upon the representations contained in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS.

Whenever used in this Agreement, the exhibits hereto, and in any certificates, reports or other documents or instruments made or delivered pursuant to this Agreement, capitalized terms shall have the meanings set forth in Exhibit A.

2. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES.

2.1 Participation. The execution of this Agreement shall qualify CommunityCare and Counselors with whom it contracts to provide EAP services to Company.

2.2 Independent Contractor. The relationship among CommunityCare, Company and Counselors with whom CommunityCare contracts is an independent contractor relationship.

3. OBLIGATIONS OF COMMUNITYCARE. CommunityCare shall provide EAP services. These services are described in a separate document attached hereto as Exhibit B. CommunityCare shall perform all additional acts required to carry out the EAP services.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF COMPANY. The Company shall cooperate with CommunityCare and Counselors in the provision of EAP services under this Agreement. The Company shall designate one Authorized Representative to work with CommunityCare and to expedite communications between Company and CommunityCare. Such Authorized Representative may establish joint working procedures with CommunityCare for the convenient management of the relationship between the parties. Such Authorized Representative shall not have the authority to amend this Agreement. The Authorized Representative is set forth on the signature page.

5. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS.

DOT training and SAP services are provided by Community Care EAP under the terms of this contract.

6. COMPENSATION.

Company agrees to pay for EAP services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, those fees and charges set forth in Exhibit C, entitled "Compensation Schedule." The compensation will be paid no later than the 10th day of the month following the month in which the EAP services were billed.

7. PROPRIETARY INFORMATION.

All CommunityCare agreements, documentation, financial arrangements, policy and procedure manuals and forms related thereto, Company and Client records, files (other than patient medical files), and fee schedules are confidential and proprietary information to CommunityCare. Company shall not disclose or use any proprietary information, trade secrets, or CommunityCare confidential information for its own benefit or gain either during the term of this Agreement or after the termination of this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, Company shall return to CommunityCare all proprietary information in its possession in the manner to be specified by CommunityCare. Company shall cooperate with CommunityCare in maintaining the confidentiality of such proprietary information at all times.

8. SOLICITATION OF COUNSELOR.

Company shall not directly or indirectly solicit CommunityCare's Counselors without CommunityCare's prior written consent. Solicitation shall include any conduct, during the term of this Agreement and continuing for a period of one (1) year after the termination of this Agreement, designed to persuade Counselors to discontinue their arrangements with CommunityCare or to contract directly with Company for EAP services outside of the scope of this Agreement. The breach of this Section 8 during the term of this Agreement shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement pursuant to Section 9 of this Agreement.

9. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMINATION PROTOCOL.

- 9.1 This agreement shall be effective as of the date set forth on the signature page (the "Effective Date") and shall continue in full force and effect until terminated as provided herein.
- 9.2 Either party may, at its option, terminate this Agreement without cause, upon one hundred twenty (120) days' written notice.
- 9.3 Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement with less than 120 day's written notice for Cause; for purposes of this Agreement, "Cause" shall mean:
- 9.3.1 any license or approval of any governmental or regulatory body necessary to enable either party to comply with its obligations under this Agreement, is revoked or materially modified;
- 9.3.2 default by either party in the performance of any obligation contained in this Agreement, and such default shall have continued unremedied for a period of ninety (90) days after it shall have become known to the defaulting party.
- 9.4 Any termination pursuant to Sections 9.2 or 9.3 shall be communicated by Notice of Termination; for purposes of this Agreement a "Notice of Termination" means a written Notice which (i) indicates the specific termination provision in this Agreement relied upon, (ii) sets forth, in the event of termination pursuant to Section 9.3 hereof, in reasonable detail the facts and circumstances that must be cured to avoid termination, and (iii) specifies the termination date of this Agreement.
- 9.5 Any termination by either party pursuant to this Section 9 is not meant as an exclusive remedy and such terminating party may seek whatever action in law or equity as may be necessary to enforce its rights under this Agreement.

10. NOTICES.

All notices, requests, and demands with respect to this Agreement shall be given to or made upon the respective parties hereto as follows:

or in such manner as to either party hereto, as such party may designate by written notice to the other party hereto. All such notices, requests, demands and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall have been deemed to have been duly given if delivered by hand (with proper receipt), by a facsimile transmission (with proper evidence thereof), or mailed, certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, with proper postage prepaid.

11. MISCELLANEOUS.

- 11.1 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, without reference to principles of conflicts of law.
- 11.2 Waiver. No failure on the part of either party to exercise, nor delay in exercising any right hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise by either party of any right hereunder preclude any further exercise thereof, or the exercise of any other right.
- 11.3 Captions. Headings of the Sections are descriptive only and shall not control or affect the meanings or construction of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 11.4 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument and either party hereto may execute this Agreement by signing such counterpart.
- 11.5 Assignment. This Agreement and the rights, interests and benefits hereunder shall not be assigned, transferred, pledged or hypothecated in any way by either party and shall not be subject to execution, attachment or similar process, nor shall the duties imposed be subcontracted or delegated without the written approval of the other party. Notwithstanding this Section 11.5, CommunityCare may assign, transfer, pledge or hypothecate this Agreement and its rights, interests and benefits to any affiliated entity.
- 11.6 Amendment. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by the mutual written consent of the parties.
- 11.7 Entire Agreement. This Agreement states the entire contract between the parties in respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes any oral or written representations or statements not expressly contained in this Agreement.
- 11.8 Client Records. All Client records maintained by CommunityCare and its Counselors are the property of CommunityCare. Client records will be released only in compliance with applicable law.

EXHIBIT A - DEFINITIONS

“CLIENT” means any person who is qualified by a Client Company for services according to the Client Company’s contract with CommunityCare.

“ CLIENT COMPANY” means a company which has contracted for EAP services from CommunityCare.

“CLIENT COMPANY CONTRACT” is a contract between CommunityCare and Client Company setting forth terms and conditions and services to be provided to Clients.

“ COMMUNITYCARE EAP SAIF” means the CommunityCare standardized assessment intake form which contains the assessment procedures to guide Counselor.

“EAP” or employee assistance program means a professional assessment/referral and/or counseling service that is offered by CommunityCare to Clients who may be experiencing personal problems that may impact their job performance.

“EMERGENCY” means a condition of command hallucinations (psychosis), suicidality, homicidally, medical withdrawal detoxification and any other condition for which treatment cannot be delayed for the time required to reach CommunityCare EAP without risking permanent damage to the patient or others.

“SAP” means a Substance Abuse Professional as defined by the Department of Transportation regulations.

“SUPERVISOR” means a management employee of a Client Company.

EXHIBIT B - WORKPLACE INTEGRATION DESCRIPTION

Workplace integration services are those management consultation, training, and promotional services which are required to ensure full understanding, cooperation and effective utilization of the EAP.

A. Management Consultation

1. Policy Statement Development

The CommunityCare Account Manager will meet with the appropriate Company Personnel (Personnel, Training, Employee Benefits, Safety, Security, Legal Representatives) in order to prepare recommendations for the most effective administration of the program. Based on these recommendations, consultation will be provided by the Account Manager to develop and incorporate an internal EAP policy statement into existing Company policies.

2. Key Management Orientation

Following adoption of the policy statement, one or more meetings with key management will occur to describe the program, explain the policy and secure top-level support.

3. Supervisor Training

The EAP constitutes an effective people management tool for all supervisors. Supervisors are important to overall program success because they are in the best position to observe deteriorating job performance related to Drug-Free Workplace or Department of Transportation. Supervisor intervention into job problems must stem from observation and documentation of poor performance patterns, not from unprofessional and risky "diagnosis" of personal problems. Therefore, training must provide information, skill development and a sense of comfort to supervisors to encourage use of an effective means of addressing poor job performance. Basic training will cover essential aspects of EAP:

- Policy and goals
- Integration of the EAP into existing Company procedures
- Intervention mechanics
- Individual case consultation procedures
- Awareness to Alcohol and Drugs in work plan
- Documentation, and
- Identification of Substance Abuse

All training will be developed and delivered in conjunction with the Company training department, and will be performed as follows:

- For companies with 1-50 employees, CommunityCare will provide training monthly at CommunityCare's Downtown Tulsa office;
- For companies with 51-150 employees, CommunityCare will offer one (1) supervisory training session and one (1) general employee training session per quarter at the employer's primary place of business*;
- For companies with more than 150 employees, CommunityCare will offer one (1) supervisory training session and one (1) general employee training session quarterly at up to three (3) of the employer's locations *.

The Company's initial employee count will be determined by the Company and CommunityCare prior to the Effective Date of the Agreement, and then monthly thereafter based on the Company's prior month's invoice from CommunityCare.

(*) For trainings that require overnight stays or travel by CommunityCare's employees beyond 250 miles, the Company will pay reasonable costs of transportation and lodging, such costs to be negotiated and approved in advance by Company.

4. General Workplace Trainings

- One (1) training per quarter for general employees
- These trainings are designed to help create a more productive workforce.
- Additional seminars will be offered or developed to meet the need of the company.
Cost for these seminars will be discussed with internal company personnel prior to presentation.

5. Manager/Supervisor Case Consultation

Individual telephone consultation will be provided to managers/supervisors with regard to:

- Program procedures
- Evolving performance problems of employees
- Intervention approach/plan
- Employee referral
- Case follow-up

It is important that managers/supervisors understand that the EAP is a resource for assisting them in performing their job to maximum effectiveness, and that seeking individualized assistance is encouraged and recognized as a sign of an effective manager/supervisor.

6. In-house Program Coordinator Consultation

Consultation with a designated in-house Program Coordinator is provided relating to all facets of program functioning on a routine basis to assure maximum coordination for maximum impact. This includes ongoing personal contact and accessibility, reports and annual program evaluation.

7. Management Information/Reports

CommunityCare utilizes its own comprehensive, advanced Normative Organization - Management Information System (No-MIS). The Company will be provided information including but not limited to: actual client services provided, client demographics, nature of problems addressed, anonymous phone contact as well as other activities not related to specific cases.

8. Account Management

CommunityCare HMO will assign an Account Manager to the Company account.

a. Qualifications

Account Managers possess a degree in the helping professions (psychology, social work or counseling) and/or have previous EAP experience.

b. Responsibilities

- 1) The Account Manager is the primary contact for all communications with the Company.
- 2) The Account Manager is responsible for the provision of information and technical assistance that support the establishment and maintenance of an effective EAP.
- 3) The Account Manager is responsible for developing and revising as is necessary an annual Internal Marketing Plan to insure proper program promotion and visibility.
- 4) The Account Manager is responsible for developing an evaluation plan to measure the effectiveness and efficiency of the program.
- 5) The Account Manager submits timely reports to the Company management on program utilization and its impact on management operations.

B. Program Promotion

Critical to EAP effectiveness is the manner in which the EAP services are presented, promoted and communicated. An Internal Marketing Plan will be developed initially and revised annually as needed and will be comprised of Awareness Building, Education/Prevention Services and Communications.

1. Awareness Building

The success of an EAP belonging to an organization depends upon many factors, including a Company policy addressing behavioral health problems, thorough management training and ongoing promotion of the program to employees. Employees will utilize the EAP with appropriate understanding of basic facts:

- Most behavioral health problems are treatable.
- Treatment success is often a function of how early treatment is sought.
- The stigma associated with asking for help is mythical and has practically disappeared.
- Employee confidentiality for non-supervisory referrals.

COMMUNITYCARE will work with Company management to tailor the awareness efforts to fit Company needs. Specific awareness building activities will include:

2. Communications

In conjunction with the Company Communication Department, COMMUNITYCARE will disseminate pamphlets and posters designed specifically for the Company regarding the EAP. Promotional materials are recommended to include:

- Program announcement letter, i.e. new telephone number
- Home mailings
- Informational brochures
- Posters in appropriate locations
- Supervisory resource manuals
- In-house newsletter articles
- Other approaches as mutually agreed upon program materials, including all standard and promotional materials as well as special mailers will be delivered in person, through organizational mail or through postal services paid for by the Company.

EAP SERVICES

Clinical Assessment/Referral/Follow-up Services are those direct services provided to employees and dependents who use the program on a self-referral basis or are referred by management because of deteriorating job performance. A dependent is any individual living in the immediate household of an employee or someone for whom the employee is financially responsible.

A. Initial Contact

All initial contacts are by telephone access 24 hours/day 7 days/week. Appointments are offered within three (3) business days unless an emergency requires immediate problem assessment. Outside of normal business hours, calls are received by a live answering service which can contact on-call staff to respond to emergencies.

B. Assessment

The assessment process is the direct clinical service provided to employees and dependents of the company. The assessment is conducted by an appropriately degreed and experienced professional. In most circumstances the interview occurs in person; however, it can be conducted via telephone, if necessary, unless prohibited by applicable state and federal guidelines. During the interview clients are encouraged to describe in detail the nature and extent of their personal problems so that the Counselor can make appropriate recommendations for resolving all of the key issues. The assessment is usually completed in a single interview, however, it may require up to three sessions.

If the problem is of a minor nature and the Counselor feels that the problem can be addressed on a short-term basis and it is clinically appropriate to do so, the Counselor will meet with the client employee for up to 3 sessions at no charge to help resolve the problem.

C. Referral

CommunityCare utilizes the following services: United Way agencies; private practitioners; hospitals; state, county and privately funded services; and self-help groups, i.e. Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, C.A.R.E., AIAnon, NarcAnon, etc.

The agencies or services recommended by the Counselor for referral or aftercare services will be identified based upon:

- Agency's professional standing
- Quality of care provided
- Responsiveness to the client's and/or program's needs
- Client's home and work location
- Availability of transportation
- Cost and/or benefit coverage of treatment
- Waiting period between referral and agency admission
- Demographic characteristics of agency

The Counselor will refer the client to agencies that accept applicable company insurance. In those instances where insurance does not cover services, no insurance is available or insurance limits have been reached, efforts will be made to match the individual with an agency that is willing to negotiate fees based on ability to pay.

An emerging critical component to the success of any EAP is the coordination of the referral procedure with clients subscribing to HMOs in order to maximize proper provision of care to employees.

When a suitable resource is identified, the client (employee or dependent) will be referred to the appropriate agency. The EAP office will contact the referral agency and provide a summary of the findings and problems identified within the limits of the EAP policy statement (as development by the Company) and confidentiality requirements. **In most cases, the Counselor will only need to meet once with the client in order to make an appropriate referral.**

D. Tracking/Follow-up

1. Referral Agency Follow-up

The EAP office will contact the referral source to learn if the employee has kept the appointment. This confirmation will be obtained via written assessment form.

2. Client Follow-up

Client follow-up by telephone or letter will be conducted. A brief reassessment will be conducted and a determination will be made whether to continue to follow up, reestablish EAP intervention, or close the case file. Follow-up categories include:

- All referrals-Four weeks
- Job Performance based on referrals-Weekly throughout treatment
- Return-to-work sessions with supervisory referral requiring treatment or at the request of the employer.

3. Supervisory Follow-up

In management referral situations, all information exchanged with supervisors is subject to Section E (confidentiality) and is limited to: indication of whether the referred employee made contact with the EAP, if the employee indicated willingness to follow the recommendations of the EAP, periodic verbal reports of progress in addressing the problem, and feedback regarding return to acceptable job performance by the manager/supervisor.

E. Confidentiality

To insure the integrity and success of the EAP, confidentiality guidelines of the EAP are as follows:

All records pertaining to the EAP will be treated with a high degree of confidentiality. Information contained in individual EAP files will not be released without the written authorization of the client, or under federal and state guidelines provided in 42 CFR Part II or 760.S. Supp. 1986 Section 19.

When EAP clients are referred to formal and informal treatment programs, the information provided to CommunityCare from these programs falls under federally regulated Confidentiality Guidelines. A release must be obtained for information about an individual's participation in both formal and informal treatment programs.

Once the employee is involved in the EAP, and job performance is the precipitating factor in the initial referral to the program, appropriate Company representative(s) will be informed of the response of the employee to the EAP recommendations when the employee authorized internal release of information. A confidentiality agreement will be entered into between CommunityCare and the Company upon signing the contract.

SAP SERVICES

If your company falls under The Department of Transportation's (DOT) rule, 49 CFR Part 40, then CommunityCare Employee Assistance Program provides SAP services. The Department of Transportation's (DOT) rule, 49 CFR Part 40 describes required procedures for conducting workplace drug and alcohol testing for the federally regulated transportation industry.

SAP Services include:

- Evaluation for employees who have violated a DOT drug and alcohol program regulation
- Recommendations concerning education and/or treatment
- Follow-up testing
- Aftercare recommendations
- Reports to the DER
