Superintendent Dr. Andrew Dick began by thanking the three students who addressed the Board for their leadership and advocacy, and for their support and passion for the great programs and opportunities at Scottsbluff High School.

Dr. Dick stated that a number of district staff members were recognized in the Star-Herald's 2025 Best of the West competition. He shared that Lincoln Heights Elementary was named the Best Elementary School, with Westmoor Elementary and Longfellow Elementary also recognized as favorites. Bear Cub Preschool received the award for Best Preschool, and Scottsbluff Public Schools was named a favorite in the Best Place to Work category. Lincoln Heights Elementary staff received recognition in several categories, with Brooke Fults being named Best School Teacher, Principal Jeremy Behnke recognized as a favorite in the Best Boss category, and secretary Lana Greene winning Best Administrative Assistant. Longfellow Elementary secretary Casie Delgado was named a favorite in the Best Administrative Assistant category, SHS Coach Jud Hall was named a favorite in the Best Coach category, and SHS Resource Officer Ron Wilson was named a favorite in the Best Police Officer category. Dr. Dick congratulated all staff members on their recognitions.

Dr. Dick congratulated Executive Director of Curriculum and Instruction Mike Mason, whose retirement was approved by the Board earlier in the evening, on a very accomplished career. Dr. Dick thanked Mr. Mason for the outstanding job he has done leading and overseeing the Curriculum and Instruction Department. Dr. Dick stated that on a personal level, Mr. Mason has been a very good mentor, noting that he worked under Mr. Mason's leadership at Bluffs Middle School, and then alongside him for a number of years. He also extended his appreciation to Mr. Mason for providing advance notice of his retirement to the District and stated he believes that anytime you have a position of this nature open up that it provides an opportunity to examine roles and responsibilities within the organizational structure. Dr. Dick stated that research on the organizational structure of other districts comparable in size to SBPS has been done, and one thing that has been noticed is that many of these districts have a district level administrator dedicated to human resources. He stated this information is still being reviewed, and next steps will be determined in conjunction with the SBPS Strategic Plan and the needs of the District.

Lastly, Dr. Dick shared that last week, SBPS received the STOP School Violence Grant and extended thanks and congratulations to Executive Director of Student Services, Dr. Wendy

Kemling, for her grant writing skills and efforts. He noted the amount of the grant was just over \$400,000, which provides the District with the opportunity to improve infrastructure within multiple buildings.

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1632 and 77-1633 provides that the Governing Body of Scottsbluff Public Schools passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request; and WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of Scottsbluff Public Schools resolves that: The 2025-2026 property tax request be set at:

General Fund: \$12,499,906.00 Bond Fund: \$2,966,394.00 Special Building Fund: \$1,939,394.00 Qualified Capital Purpose \$635,657.00 Undertaking Fund: The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 9.49% percent. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property would be 0.838121 per \$100 of assessed value. Scottsbluff Public Schools proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be 0.851469 per \$100 of assessed value. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of Scottsbluff Public Schools will increase (or decrease) last year's budget by -2.01 percent. Superintendent Dr. Andrew Dick thanked and congratulated Executive Director of Finance Marianne Carlson for the successful completion of the 2025-2026 budget. He stated there were many changes over the previous seven to eight months, due in large part to shifts and uncertainties at the state and federal level, which required constant monitoring and analysis. Dr. Dick noted some highlights from this year's budget included the District reducing the levy by over 6 cents, or \$60 per \$100,000 of valuation, which when combined with the past two years of levy reductions, is nearly 45 cents of the levy being reduced. Dr. Dick also stated that 91% of the increase in the tax asking for 2025-2026 is within the Bond Fund in order to maintain an aggressive approach to paying off the Scottsbluff High School bonds. He stated these accomplishments would not be possible without the fiscal responsibility and leadership of the Board of Education, as well as that of the entire district leadership team. He commented Marianne would begin work on the 2026-2027 budget in a few short months, and thanked her again for successfully leading this budget process.

APPENDIX TO OPTION ENROLLMENT POLICY

The following is Policy 5006.1 Appendix to Policy 5006 for the current school year. The Board of Education hereby sets forth the optimal number of students for the 2026-2027 school year in any program, class, grade level, or school building or in any special education programs operated by this school district, based upon available staff, facilities, projected enrollment of resident students, projected number of students with which this school district will contract based on existing contractual arrangements, and availability of appropriate special education programs.

Enrolling in school at the start of a new quarter or semester provides a more seamless transition for students; however, Scottsbluff Public Schools recognizes that at times there are extenuating circumstances which may result in an alternate enrollment date. The Board believes that it is in the best interest of our schools to not accept Option Enrollment students after a certain date each semester at the high school level in order to ensure a successful transition. Scottsbluff High School will close twelfth grade options on October 2, 2026, and will not reopen options for the remainder of the school year. Ninth, tenth, and eleventh grades will close options on October 2, 2026, and will reopen at the start of second semester, if capacity has not been met. Furthermore, the Superintendent has the authority to close Scottsbluff High School and/or Bluffs Middle School options, as needed, and reopen at the beginning of the following semester, capacity permitting.

At the December 2024 Board Meeting, the Board approved awarding the Westmoor Elementary School Addition and Renovation Bid to Anderson-Shaw Construction. As we have gone along with the project, change orders have been approved as allowed under Board Policy 3133. A change order has been presented that is over the threshold that allows for the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee to approve, and is being presented for the Board's consideration.

The original design for the addition had the structural beams for the roof exposed and insulated. When the beams arrived on site, they were not insulated. Upon review, it was determined that the original design was not the best solution as condensation could form inside the building and lead to unwanted moisture build-up. JEO has reviewed and brought forward a new design to enclose the roof and ensure it is insulated. The amount for this change order is \$54,532.76.

Scottsbluff Public Schools recently solicited bids for 85 teacher laptop computers. These laptop computers are part of the normal computer replacement cycle and will be used to replace computers at Longfellow, Westmoor, Bear Cub, and other various programs. Current systems in these locations are over four years old and at the end of their life. The older laptop units will be repurposed, if possible.

Bids were solicited from multiple vendors, each provided with a list of minimum hardware specifications. Vendors were encouraged to submit several options. Some vendors offered multiple proposals, including touch-screen models and systems with more powerful processors. After reviewing all the submitted bids and confirming that each computer met the specified requirements, we concluded that the device proposed in Option #1 by Eastern Data satisfied all criteria and offered the best price for our district. Scottsbluff Public Schools has had a successful partnership with Eastern Data for several years.
