Overview:

The MAP assessment is given three times a year (beginning, middle, and end) in the Santee Community. This report focuses on MAP tests based on a continuum of skills in Mathematics and Reading from low skill levels to high skill levels. MAP assessments help teachers identify the instructional level of the student and also provide context for determining where each student is performing in relation to local or state standards and national norms. MAP reports allow teachers to better target instruction based on students' strengths and needs.

Results

Strengths:

- Eleventh graders recorded the highest percent of students meeting the benchmark for both reading and math.
- Reading scores are stronger than math scores.
- In reading the percent of students meeting benchmark scores improved for current third graders (Fall 2019 8% to 15% in Fall, 2020) and for current eighth graders (Fall 2019 8% to 22% in Fall, 2020).
- In math the percent of students meeting benchmark scores improved for current ninth graders (Fall 2019 8% to 15% in Fall, 2020).

Areas for Improvement:

- Approximately 75% of students tested are not meeting grade level benchmarks in reading.
- Five out of the nine grade levels tested in mathematics had zero percent of the students meeting grade level benchmarks.
- For the majority of grades tested students did not improve from Fall, 2019 to Fall, 2020.

Next Steps:

- Continue to create a testing environment that is conducive to accurately portraying student achievement.
- Continue to implement the ELA curriculum.
- Revise mathematics curriculum.

Overview:

As required by the Nebraska Department of Education all students in grades K-3 who are not reading on grade level must have an individualized reading plan. Parents/ Guardians of students who are below grade level must receive these plans on an annual basis.

Santee Community School utilizes two assessments, the DIEBLs and MAP to identify individual reading needs. A sample of the plan is included in this report.

Results:

Currently, 55 students have been identified as needing a plan. Last year at this time we had 74 students who had a plan.

Next Steps:

- Continue to implement a literacy model that focuses on small group and individual conferring with students.
- Implement the new ELA curriculum that was developed this summer.
- Continue to provide classroom level interventions designed to keep students in the classroom while meeting instructional needs.
