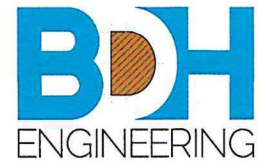

PROPOSAL

Ref: Santee School Renovation and MEP Upgrades

Dear Mr. Shepard:

In accord with your request and our discussions, BDH Engineering (BDH) is pleased to provide this Fee Proposal for the referenced project assignment.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The effort by BDH will consist of providing Architectural, Structural, Civil, mechanical, electrical, plumbing systems, and fire protection (MEP/FP) design, and construction period services (CPS) in accord with the Scope of Work (SOW) as listed below. The project will consist of full A/E design for a 27,000 SF existing school building and a new 4,000SF Laundry Facility per the scope of work spelled out below:

AE DESIGN SERVICES:

1. The project delivery method for this project assignment will be design-bid-build.
2. Project Budget is understood to be \$2,000,000 for this phase.
3. Scope of work within the existing school building is understood to include:
 - a. Existing building encompasses the original building constructed approximately 1970, the scope excludes the kitchen area and the multipurpose area.
 - b. Mechanical scope includes removal of the existing VRF and ERV system and replacement with new packaged air-cooled rooftop VAV units and terminal units with either electric or hot water reheat.
 - c. All ductwork in this area will be replaced with new ductwork and insulation.
 - d. All lighting within the scope of work will be replaced with LED lighting with lighting controls.
 - e. New power will be provided for the new rooftop units and the new electric reheat coils (as required).
 - f. Existing open classroom space will be renovated to divide the space into two classrooms approximately 500Sf each.
 - g. Exterior wall and bump-out in this area will remain as-is.
 - h. New lay-in ceilings will be provided throughout. All existing soffits will remain.
4. Scope of work for the new Laundry Addition includes:
 - a. New addition will be a free-standing building at the Northeast portion of the site.
 - b. This area will serve as a laundry facility for use by the community and will include up to six (6) commercial groups of units.
 - c. The new addition will be a free-standing structure that will tie into the existing building exterior façades.
 - d. All MEPF will be provided for the new addition.
 - e. Existing utilities will be tapped as necessary to provide utilities to the new structure.
 - f. Site utility survey for this scope of work will include site survey for the Laundry building.
5. Specifics for BDH's efforts for architectural, structural, civil, mechanical, electrical, plumbing and fire protection engineering, design, bidding/negotiation and construction administration are proposed to be as follows:
 - a. Record documents from original construction and subsequent remodel phases do not appear to readily available. Existing facility information will be gathered via on-site investigation. Design team will be granted access to all areas within the scope of work to accommodate the on-site field investigative phase. Any areas that cannot be accessed during the site investigation may need to be looked at in a follow up site investigation and could incur additional fees.

- b. Sizes of infrastructure distribution systems will be determined where possible on site; however, not all locations, sizes, etc., may be able to be determined because of lack of access. If destructive investigation appears warranted to establish existing conditions, BDH will suggest that effort as a potential need to adequately develop the design documents. Destructive demolition to allow visual viewing of existing conditions will be by others. And, if additional site investigation trips to the site are required following destructive demolition, those trips may be considered additional services.
- c. The school district or others will provide guides and assistance at all times with opening hatches, access doors and panels, and various other opening covers' efforts to allow visual access to the conduits, ducts, pipes, etc., contained behind the covers during site investigations.
- d. Review meetings involvement by BDH will be at the SD and CD reviews via teleconference.
- e. Opinions of possible construction costs for the submittal phases as noted in the SOW are **NOT** included in BDH's efforts. BDH will review the opinions of probable cost provided by others and provide feedback.
- f. Bidding/negotiations' support by BDH consists of answering questions and narrative addenda preparation. BDH attendance at the pre-bid meeting(s) is not included.
- g. Construction administration by BDH will consist of RFI responses and shop drawing review.
- h. LEED certification assistance, special studies (short circuit, coordination studies, etc.) and systems (MEP/FP) commissioning (Cx) are currently not included in this scope, but may be added as an additional service subject to additional fees.
- i. If required, others will provide the necessary clean up after site investigation work is completed in the various areas.
- j. The BDH design documents will be prepared through all phases of the planning and design via REVIT BIM.
- k. If required, asbestos testing and abatement design will be by others

BASIC SERVICES:

We agree to provide the services for this project assignment as noted in the "Scope of Work" for the stipulated lump sum fees as follows:

1. Part IA – Field Investigations (FI), Studies, and Schematic Design Documents Preparation: Sixty-Three Thousand Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$63,450)
2. Part I – Contract Drawings and Specifications: One Hundred and Fifty-Nine Thousand and Four Hundred Dollars (\$159,400)
3. Part II – Construction Period Services (CPS) (Shop drawing review, record drawing preparation, etc.): Twenty-Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$22,600)
4. TOTAL: Two Hundred and Forty-Five Thousand Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$245,450)

SYSTEMS COMMISSIONING SERVICES:

Not included in BDH's services but may be added subject to additional fees.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES:

1. Infill Building AE Design Services: AE proposes to provide the design services for the future Infill building connector bridge, located between the main building and the addition to the south, during fiscal year 2027 for a fee of approximately: One Hundred and Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$104,500). This fee is subject to future approval and subject to change based on the official scope of work.
2. Additional Construction Observation Site Trips and reports beyond what is outlined above: Construction site observation trips by one (1) BDH architect/engineer during the construction phase will be Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$2,400.00) per trip.
