Our athletic trainer is very helpful and is there whenever needed. During concession tests she will take the lead to get students in an out quickly. Takes the burden off of the coaches.



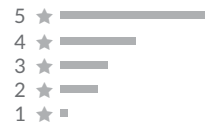
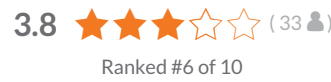
Educating parents on sleep and how important it is for their children. Kids cannot learn if they're falling asleep in class.



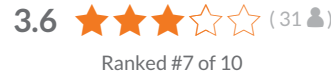
Stress to parents the importance of sufficient sleep, nutrition, and adequate homework space. Better engagement of students preparedness for school day



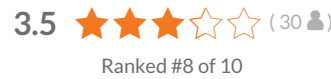

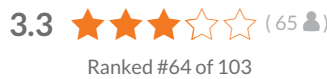
We discussed that we need a standard definition of what intervention time looks like and what needs to be done during that time. Each teacher is currently doing intervention in a different way. Does it need to be the same?



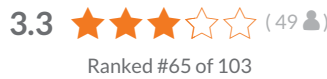
